Section C - Descriptions and Specifications

STATEMENT OF WORK**“Continuation of USSTRATCOM Intelligence, Surveillance, & Reconnaissance Contract Support”**

1.0 SCOPE. This document specifies the tasks required to support the Government in planning, implementing, sustaining, and improving USSTRATCOM’s Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (ISR) mission.

When referred to in this document, USSTRATCOM comprises its headquarters, Joint Functional Component Commands (JFCCs), service components, centers, and liaison offices, and JFCC-ISR Forward Elements at U.S. Combatant Commands (i.e., USPACOM, USSOCOM, USCENTCOM, USNORTHCOM, USEUCOM, and USSOUTHCOM).

1.1 BACKGROUND> USSTRATCOM has the responsibility for planning, integrating, and coordinating Department of Defense (DOD) ISR in support of strategic and global operations; and also the tasking and coordinating of Command, Control, Communications, and Computers (C4) ISR capabilities in support of strategic force employment for the Command's missions such as Global Strike and Integration, Integrated Missile Defense, and Information Operations/Network Warfare, and Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) Counterproliferation. Global ISR, to include manned and unmanned airborne, space-based, maritime surface and subsurface, and terrestrial sensors and systems; coupled with streamlined and effective Tasking, Collection, Processing, Exploitation, and Dissemination (TCPED); and net-centric information sharing and collaboration will play a major role in determining the intentions, plans, and capabilities of state and non-state actors throughout the spectrum of global engagement.

Main mission areas include:

- Redefinition of ISR as a weapon system.
- Seamless ISR support for all USSTRATCOM missions such as Global Strike and Integration, Integrated Missile Defense, Information Operations/Network Warfare, and WMD Counter-proliferation.
- Effective management of appropriate Sensitive Reconnaissance Operations (SRO) and non-sensitive ISR operations.
- Development and implementation of processes for global ISR and/or Intelligence campaign/support planning.
- Senior Analytical support and advice on potential ISR and/or Intelligence campaign/support planning for all USSTRATCOM missions; whether the Command is in a supporting or supported role.
- Optimal situational awareness regarding the readiness status of all DOD ISR sensors and associated PED assets.
- Development, implementation, assessment, and improvement of a process to optimize PED resources through distribution of missions, whether in times of crisis or periods of standard vigilance.
- Provide specialized ISR planning expertise and training for Combatant Commands (COCOMs).
- Advocacy for ISR/TCPED capabilities and future concepts for warfighting community.

1.2 TASKS. The contractor shall support CDR USSTRATCOM’s establishment, sustainment, and improvement of the DOD Global ISR mission as follows:

1.2.1 Support USSTRATCOM ISR Campaign/Support Planning

- Support development and implementation of a DOD global ISR Campaign Concept
- Assist in defining an ISR campaign/support plan and associated processes that:
 - Seamlessly plan, integrate, and synchronize national and DoD intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance assets and platforms, ground assets and supporting infrastructures in support of COCOMs
 - Link the full spectrum of global ISR capabilities, expertise, data, and information--from collection and analysis to dissemination, a near-real time common operating picture, and centralized intelligence databases
 - Synchronize operations between air-breathing ISR platforms and overhead national ISR systems
 - Ensure that ISR systems focus on COCOM priorities and National Command Authority information requirements
 - Assess adequacy and effectiveness of the support provided by air, ground, sea, space, and cyber-space ISR systems
 - In collaboration with combatant commanders and the Joint Staff, plan, coordinate, monitor and report on ISR campaign execution, in support of UCP assigned missions and as directed by SECDEF
- Develop and monitor the performance of a process for integrating and coordinating STRATCOM-led ISR support plans with DOD, COCOM, and national adaptive planning efforts
- Team with HQ USSTRATCOM and/or planners from other JFCCs in developing relevant ISR support plans for various OPLAN scenarios

1.2.2 Provide ISR System Integration, Knowledge Management, and Technical support.

Provide ISR Common Operating Picture (COP) and Portal management for integrated global ISR situation awareness and decision-making.

- Provide integration and day-to-day management of ISR COP and Portal tools such as BVI, GCCS, CMMA, JDISS, DCGS, and similar ISR and collection management related tools and applications
- Support ISR COP integration displays in HQ USSTRATCOM, JFCCs (e.g. JFCC-ISR), service components, centers, and liaison offices (such as those at the Pentagon and at Headquarters, US Joint Forces Command)
- Provide system support to stand-up and sustainment of server infrastructure to support sharing of data to mission partners and natural evolution of the COP
- Provide architectural support to data management, data storage, and network architecture

1.2.3 Provide DOD ISR Global Situation Awareness (SA) support

- Support integration, synthesizing, and display of disparate ISR information including that which impacts ISR operations
- Support identification and implementation of solutions providing an intuitive, easy-to-use information display capable of integrating and synthesizing information for DOD ISR SA and decision-making
- Dynamically identify and maintain requirements for a DOD ISR SA capability
- Support production of project management documentation required to: identify requirements, build solutions, acquire resources, and integrate DOD ISR SA capabilities

1.2.4 Support DoD Global ISR Integration by providing DOD Global ISR Support Plan Development

- Assist DOD, Combat Support Agencies, COCOMs, and STRATCOM entities in establishing criteria within Intelligence, Operational, or Conceptual Plans for the optimal employment of DOD ISR resources (e.g. sensors and associated PED)

- Support development of a comprehensive list of relevant databases and establish a plan to access those databases
- Support identification and integration of communication architectures and accesses needed to allow visibility into the tasking, collection, processing, exploitation, and dissemination (TCPED) process by combatant commanders, DOD agencies, and other appropriate mission partners
- Support planning and integration activities related to DOD Global ISR management

1.2.5 Provide **USSTRATCOM Campaign Development and Integration support at USJFCOM**. The contractor will work as a USSTRATCOM liaison with USJFCOM to:

- Coordinate development of ISR Campaign/Support Plan Concepts
- Jointly define ISR Campaign Support Plans and associated processes
- Create processes for integrating and coordinating USSTRATCOM ISR Plans with DoD and national collection management plans
- Assist with developing the collection operations focus with USJFCOM to aid in developing and integrating standard collection processes
- Provide USSTRATCOM Global ISR representation at USJFCOM meetings related to ISR
- Assist with integration of USSTRATCOM and USJFCOM capabilities supporting Global ISR management, operations, planning, assessment, and advocacy

1.2.6 Provide **ISR Modeling and Simulation** support

- Support USSTRATCOM J8 and JFCC-ISR in its role of providing ISR modeling and simulation support for the USSTRATCOM ISR mission as follows:
 - Review pertinent documents and perform “strategy to tasks” and/or functional task analyses to identify areas needing more detailed study to optimize ISR system and process performance
 - Establish and maintain relationships with USSTRATCOM staff, JFCCs, service components, centers, and liaison offices, as well as segments of the Intelligence Community and DoD to ensure connectivity and maintain currency on pertinent issues
 - Assist with selection of modeling and simulation tools and their operations

1.2.7 Provide support to **Global ISR Operations**

- Support the DoD dynamic Global ISR asset allocation process
- Support development and assessment of the DOD ISR Sensitive Reconnaissance Operations (SRO) Book process
- Assist COCOMs through an ISR asset advocacy process and with priority intelligence and operational requirements definition
- Provide intelligence assessments supporting DOD Global ISR operations
- Provide support to special access program management
- Support establishing processes for assessing and trending the efficiency and effectiveness of the DOD Global ISR enterprise

1.2.8 Provide support to **ISR Integration Planning and Global ISR Advocacy Efforts**

- Support development of ISR visualization requirements and integration
- Assist in development of PED management plans and strategies
- Assist in developing Global ISR systems integration plans and strategies
- Advocate DOD ISR capabilities and resources on behalf of Combatant Commanders
- Provide ISR exercise planning and execution support
- Assist with integration of specialized intelligence support, e.g., MASINT


- Support ISR future concept development and planning

1.2.9 Provide support to JFCC-ISR Forward Elements located at U.S. Combatant Commands (USPACOM, USSOCOM, USCENTCOM, USNORTHCOM, USEUCOM, and USSOUTHCOM)

- Represent USSTRATCOM JFCC-ISR in U.S. Combatant Commands' Joint Intelligence-Operations Centers (JIOCs).
- Advises on, analyzes, studies, and coordinates various policies, issues, and requirements associated with DOD ISR platforms and operations.
- Analyzes the U.S. Combatant Command's ISR requirements and assists the JIOC with processing effective, tailored, and coordinated ISR requests for forces.
- Maintains insight into requirements levied against the U.S. Combatant Command's ISR platforms and sensors to identify gaps, successes, and lessons learned to aid assessment of global DOD ISR employment.
- Conducts fact-finding and analysis to provide assessments of key DOD ISR issues related to the U.S. Combatant Command.
- Conducts liaison with the U.S. Combatant Command on behalf of JFCC-ISR regarding ISR availability and employment requirements, issues, and concerns.
- Monitors the location and status of all of the U.S. Combatant Command's ISR platforms and sensors as well as associated deployable ground processing and exploitation systems.
- Researches, prepares, and coordinates special studies and projects related to the U.S. Combatant Command's ISR issues, sensors, and programs.
- Maintains cognizance of the U.S. Combatant Command's war planning efforts and other predictors of DOD ISR requirements, processes, and procedures
- Coordinates and advocates USSTRATCOM JFCC-ISR positions, requirements, and objectives orally and through written documentation.

1.2.10 Crisis Operations and Response/Exercise Support. When the government declares a crisis situation, the contractor shall be prepared to provide 24x7 technical support for services deemed essential for performance under the Air Force implementation of Department of Defense Instruction 3020.36. The contractor shall be notified as soon as possible that a USSTRATCOM entity is operating on a 24x7 basis and shall be required to adhere to these duty hours for the duration of the crisis.

1.3 SECURITY



1.4 TRAVEL. Contractor analysts shall attend meetings, conferences, workshops, working groups, etc., for conduct of work in their respective task areas. Government approval shall be obtained prior to the start of travel. A trip report is due to the government within five (5) working days after completion of travel. The contractor shall be responsible for obtaining all passenger transportation, lodging, and subsistence, both domestic and overseas, required in the performance of this contract.

1.5 CONTRACT SUPPORT ENVIRONMENT


1.5.1 Place of Performance. Work is to be performed on-site at Offutt AFB, NE; at the contractor's facility in the Omaha, NE; on-site at the JFCC-ISR (Bolling AFB, D.C. or the Pentagon), on-site with the Joint Staff, Pentagon; on-site at HQ USJFCOM, Norfolk, VA; on-site with JFCC-ISR Forward elements at the COCOMs (i.e., USPACOM, USSOCOM, USCENTCOM, USNORTHCOM, USEUCOM, and USSOUTHCOM); with the exception of travel.

2.0 DELIVERABLES

2.1 Monthly Performance Report. In conjunction with the Monthly Activity Report, the contractor shall generate a monthly performance report that describes performance trends for each area. The Government and contractor will jointly define the manner in which the information should be presented for each area. The contractor may also suggest supporting metrics to be included in the performance reports, and the reports are not limited to the required metrics. The Government and contractor will agree to the graphical design of the reports and frequency with which the reports will be reviewed with the supplier. The Government shall identify the types of decisions the reports are intended to support.
