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Section C - Descriptions and Specifications

A SOW

“Analytical Support for Homeland Security Operational Capabilities”

1.0 The objective of this project is to identify operational capabilities required to execute the HLS mission and to enable the development of the JROC-approved HLS OC/OA development scheduled to begin in FY 03. The effort will leverage the FDPAD HLS JMAA/JMNA. The overarching objective of this project is the continuation of an assessment of Homeland Security (HLS) and related topics assigned by the JROC to support the FY04 Budget development and CPR 03.

2.0 Terms of reference for this assessment include Homeland Security consisting of two major elements: Homeland Defense and Civil Support. Homeland Defense (HLD) is defined as the protection of US territory, domestic populations, and critical defense infrastructure against external threats and aggression. For the purposes of this study missile defense is inherent in HLD and includes defense against ballistic missile and defense against cruise missile attacks to the United States its territories, allies and friends. Civil Support (CS) is defined as DOD support to US civil authorities for domestic emergencies and for designated law enforcement and other activities. CS primary mission areas are Consequence Management (CM) and Chemical Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, High Yield Explosive (CBRNE) Crisis Management (CrM). Emergency Preparedness is defined as those planning activities undertaken to ensure DoD processes, procedures, and resources are in place to support the President and Secretary of Defense in a designated National Security Emergency. Critical Infrastructure Protection (CIP) is the identification, assessment, protection and assurance of cyber and physical mission critical capabilities essential to the execution of the National Security Strategy. Information Operations are those actions taken to affect an adversary's information and information systems while defending one's own information and information systems.

3.0 In general, the assessment scope will encompass all activities tied to two main efforts to identify HLS operational capabilities: (1) reviewing the HLS functional area assessment, mission area analysis and mission needs analysis to determine specific capabilities required to perform the HLS mission within DoD; and (2) reviewing existing threat evaluations, requirement determination processes, and existing capability assessments. If there are discrepancies between DOD requirements and capabilities, the FDP Joint Warfighting Capabilities Assessment (JWCA) Team will offer alternative courses of action.

4.0 The contractor shall perform the following tasks:

4.1 Identify HLS Operational Capabilities. The contractor shall identify military tasks, or functional groupings of tasks that provide a significant and key contribution to the HLS joint mission area. The contractor shall identify operational capabilities of current and planned DOD HLS capabilities. The contractor shall provide qualitative and quantitative analytical support of the proposed operational capabilities to the JWCA and review, analyze, compare, and contrast data available within OSD, Joint Staff, CINC, and Services relative to HLS capabilities. The contractor shall attend meetings with Service, CINC, Joint Staff, OSD and Federal agency representatives and the results of those meetings and analysis will be presented in the form of trip reports and briefings. The contractor shall identify and compile those operational capabilities that must be performed to meet the HLS mission area objectives consistent with national security and national military strategy.

4.1.1 Conduct an Operational Capabilities Conference. As directed by the T/OM, the contractor shall plan and conduct conferences with Services and Combatant Command participation from USNORTHCOM, USJFCOM, USELENORAD, USSOCOM, USSOUTHCOM and USSPACECOM to review, analyze, compare and contrast data available within DOD relative to desired HLS capabilities.

4.1.2 Develop and Operational Capabilities Briefing. As directed by the T/OM, the contractor shall develop and conduct briefings for the USNORTHCOM that provides the results of analysis prior to submission of analysis results to FDPAD.

4.2 Identify current and emerging Operational Concepts (OC) and Architectures (OA) that support or enable execution of the HLS mission. The contractor will identify, compare and contrast existing or emerging operational concepts and architectures for Interagency Homeland Air Security (IHAS) and Military Support to Civil Authorities (MSCA) for further consideration and development by USNORTHCOM. The contractor shall provide qualitative and quantitative analytical support of the proposed OC/OA identification to the JWCA and review, analyze, compare, and contrast data available within OSD, Joint Staff, CINC, and Services relative to selected OC/OA efforts.

4.3 Recommend Operational Capability Alternatives: Based on the identification of operational capabilities and analysis IAW Task 4.2, the contractor shall recommend actions as required to expand the operational concept into an established mission area in accordance with CJCSI 3170.01B.

4.4 Work Group Presentations: The contractor shall be required to facilitate conferences for senior leaders (05-08). Facilitation will consist of time-keeping duties, sustaining group focus, recording tasking and findings, and production and the distribution of meeting minutes. The contractor shall conduct a minimum of one HLS Joint Working Group meeting per month.
