

USAKA regulation designates drinking areas

Regulation 210-21 establishes policies and procedures for the control of possession, purchase, transfer and consumption of alcoholic beverages at the US Army Kwajalein Atoll-Reagan Test Site.

Among other things, this regulation covers several areas which include places where alcoholic beverages can and cannot be consumed, drinking age, what constitutes an open container and penalties.

"KPD doesn't make up the laws and regulations," said Capt. Denise Morrow, deputy chief of police. "We are just here to enforce them."

According to Morrow, regulation 210-21 was implemented for numerous reasons. It is for the safety of those who drink and for the safety of those around them. It also helps to deter underage drinking and helps to prevent black marketing of alcohol. These are just some of the reasons for the regulation, she added.

One area stressed by Morrow is when transporting an alcoholic beverage from one location to another, it must be in a closed container. She added that a travel mug or sippy cup is not a closed container.

Individuals cannot readily drink from the container in which the alcoholic beverage is being transported.

Morrow said if residents plan to transport alcohol from one location to another, they should keep it closed until they get to a designated drinking area.

She added, "North Point is not an authorized drinking area."

Morrow added, drinking and riding a bike is the same as drinking and driving a car. She stressed residents should not drink and then ride a bike.

Regulation violations are generally handled administratively. If the situation warrants, a verbal warning is given.

Morrow said, "However, if a citation is written, a copy will be sent to the site manager of the sponsoring contractor or Host Nation. Additionally, the Command can initiate a 'Bar Action' even if it is a first offense."



- Refusal to show proof of age as 21 years old.
- Underage individuals possessing, consuming or attempting to purchase an alcoholic beverage.


