



# Environmental studies prompt no fishing warning

Through environmental studies and testing, two locations on Kwajalein are now posted as 'No Fishing' areas.

The first area is the harbor area between the Fuel Pier and Echo Pier and the reef area adjacent to the solid waste landfill is the second 'No Fishing' area.

According to Ken Sims, USAKA Environmental Office chief, it is "to keep the community safe."

Sims said sand-blasting paint from ships near the docks, which started after WWII, washed heavy metals into the harbor area. Also, unknown contaminants in the landfill are leaching into the groundwater and entering the ocean at the shoreline.


USAKA Environmental studied

the sediment, marine life and waters in the areas of concern and determined that heavy metals such as lead, copper, silver and arsenic are present in the marine life and sediment.

manent signs will soon be posted in both English and Marshallese stating "No Fishing in the Harbor Area per USAKA Regulation 385-9. Potential health risks exist from heavy metals in the fish, water and sediment." The old signs only advised the public that fishing in the harbor area was for recreational use only not for human consumption.

However, people are taking fish caught in this area home for eating, Sims said. The area at the landfill is a new area to be off-limits for fishing based on new information.

Heavy metal "is not something you are going to see," Sims said. "Number one, we want to protect our public. I think the community will understand we have their best interest at heart. Further studies are underway to determine the best methods to clean up the heavy

# Olympics to get extensive TV coverage

As the 2004 Olympics approach, Kwajalein residents will be treated to two channels dedicated entirely to showing live and taped coverage of the Olympics.

From Aug. 12-30, the Armed Forces Network is set to show a total of 584 hours of Olympic coverage according to Larry Sichter, chief, Affiliate Relations/Program Operations Division, Defense Media Center. Throughout the two-week period, residents will see Olympics coverage on four AFN channels.

AFN is also starting the AFN Family and Movie Channels early, to provide additional Olympic coverage, Sichter explained.

Richard Feagler, AFN operations chief, said the prime three hours of Olympic coverage from the USA

television network is set to be on the Sports Channel. The Family Channel is hosting the Bravo TV network, and the Movie Channel is hosting the MSNBC and CNBC networks. The AFN Family and Movie Channels are the only channels scheduled to show the Olympics 24 hours per day. The AFN Entertainment Channel will also host prime NBC Olympics coverage.

According to Feagler, the Family and Movie Channels are showing additional bonus Olympic coverage, while the Sports and Entertainment Channels are showing the prime Olympics coverage.

AFN Family and Movie Channels are scheduled to begin their regular programming on Sept. 3.

"There's going to be a lot of coverage [of the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens]," Feagler said.







#### PUBLIC NOTICE APPOINTMENT OF PART-TIME UNITED STATES MAGISTRATE JUDGE FOR THE DISTRICT OF HAWAII AT KWAJALEIN MISSILE RANGE

The Judicial Conference of the United States has authorized the appointment of a part-time United States magistrate judge for the United States District Court for the District of Hawaii at Kwajalein Missile Range.

The duties of the position are demanding and wide-ranging, and include: (1) the conduct of most preliminary proceedings in criminal cases; (2) the trial and disposition of misdemeanor cases; (3) the conduct of various pretrial matters and evidentiary proceedings on delegation from the judges of the district court; and (4) the trial and disposition of civil cases upon consent of the litigants. The basic authority of a United States magistrate judge is specified in 28 U.S.C. Section 636.

To be qualified for appointment an applicant must:  
(1) Be, and have been for at least five years, a member in good standing of the bar of the highest court of a state, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Territory of Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, or the Virgin Islands of the United States, and have been engaged in the active practice of law for a period of at least five years (with some substitutes authorized), or have a degree from a college or university of recognized standing, with a minimum of 5 years of progressively responsible administrative experience in public service or business;

(2) Be competent to perform all the duties of the office; be of good moral character; be emotionally stable and mature; be committed to equal justice under the law; be in good health; be patient and courteous; and be capable of deliberation and decisiveness;  
(3) Be less than seventy years old;  
(4) Not be related to a judge of the district court; and  
(5) Reside on Kwajalein.

A merit selection panel composed of attorneys and other members of the community will review all applicants and recommend to the judges of the district court in confidence the five persons it considers best qualified. The court will make the appointment following an FBI full-field investigation and an IRS tax check of the applicant selected by the court for appointment. An affirmative effort will be made to give due consideration to all qualified applicants, including women and members of minority groups. The current annual salary of the position is \$3,662. The term of office is four years. More information on the magistrate judge position may be obtained from the Clerk of the U.S. District Court or the chairperson of the selection panel.

# CASCOM changes consistent with future force requirements

*Editor's note: This is part of a series of articles on the Army's 17 immediate focus areas. The changes planned under Army Chief of Staff Gen. Peter Schoomaker's Active-Component/Reserve-Component Balance focus area will mean more civil affairs, military police, transportation and port operations Soldiers in the Army, and fewer artillerymen, air defense troops and Ordnance Soldiers.*

FORT MONROE, Va. – As the Army changes the way it does business, the U.S. Army Combined Arms Support Command must also change. It is imperative that the world's greatest fight force has the necessary equipment and supplies, and it is the job of CASCOM to provide the materiel needed for sustainment.

The Army has created 17 focus areas to ensure the Army remains the best in the world. One of the newest focus areas is Task Force Logistics, which includes logistician and support personnel from all branches of the military. CASCOM is a large piece of the TF Logistics puzzle and therefore plays a major part in the task of supplying the troops.

According to CASCOM and Fort Lee, Va., commanding general Maj. Gen. Terry E. Juskowiak, TF Logistics will handle the task.

"Task Force Logistics is the newest of the Army's focus areas," he

said during a February interview with TNS. "Task Force Logistics was formed to review and redesign how a land-component commander is sustained. The scope of this review extends from CONUS support to support of deployed forces; includes support to the Army, how the Army provides support to sister components once deployed; and how the Army will contribute to a Joint logistics capability."

During the annual Combat Service Support Commanders and Command Sergeants Major Conference, which was held April 8-9 at Fort Lee, Va., Juskowiak pointed out that CASCOM is prepared for the changes that are taking place within the force.

improve their fighting skills.

"[The conference] was a chance for us to review what happened, what went well and on what we need to put new emphasis," Juskowiak said following the conference.

He added that Jointness and modularity present positive changes in the logistical spectrum, as all services and organizations will work together to ensure Soldiers' needs are taken care of.

He also explained that if logisticians and battle commands are given the same "data points," such as where a hotbed of conflict is burning, the logistician could use the information to avoid sending a supply convoy through the

middle of that battle scene. Or a petroleum shipment could be redirected to where it is more urgently needed.

"We're looking at how we do logistics from the foxhole back,"

Juskowiak said. "When I say back, I mean all the way back to the CONUS national level. What we do in the foxhole is very green, very Army-oriented. But as you go back, it becomes more and more purple -- that is, more [of a] Joint [concept]. That's because more Joint aspects will be put into the force."

According to a report by the Petersburg, Va. Progressive-Index, the increased use of computer technology in Army logistics is a very near possibility.

The report went on to say that commanders and sergeants major in attendance were told of the possibility of using computer simulations designed for military logisticians in the same manner that combat Soldiers use them to
