

# Adios to Aloha

## Hawaiian based airline drops contract for Marshall Island, Pago Pago routes

Aloha Airlines announced on Thursday that it will discontinue its twice-weekly flights to the Marshall Islands and American Samoa. The airline will operate its last flight between Honolulu, Kwajalein and Majuro on Jan. 10.

According to a press release, "the inconsistent traffic pattern failed to generate sufficient revenue to cover

out, heard Friday night, was confirmed in a press release Saturday morning.

McCrary attributes the move to an attempt by Aloha to restructure and become profitable again. He also cites that the appointment of a new company president Nov. 2 may have been a contributing factor.

McCrary expressed

out and during Christmas break," Groth said. "We didn't have one oversold flight last summer on either Continental or Aloha because of the extra flight Continental added," Groth said.

The effect on Groth's department, which employs 24 on Kwajalein and four on Roi-Namur, is expected to be minimal.

"We have one open

operating expenses, making this action necessary."

Reservations will be taken through the last day of travel and passengers booked on future Aloha flights to and from those destinations will be re-accommodated.

"In these challenging times when the airline industry is feeling the financial impact of soaring fuel costs, carriers are being forced to make difficult business decisions driven by more tactical use of their aircraft resources in markets that better serve their customer base and bring proven returns to the bottom line," said David A. Banmiller, Aloha's president and chief executive officer, via press release.

"We regret having to take this action. The airline did its best to be responsive to island communities in the remote Pacific region but can no longer use valuable assets with a consistently negative return," he added.

The announcement "was completely unexpected" according to Maj. Jud McCrary, director of Logistics and Community Activities. McCrary said recent talks with Aloha had centered on changes to their schedule in terms of times and, more recently, days of the week. The rumor about Aloha pulling

concerns about what the announcement means for residents and added that effects of the move extend beyond Kwajalein.

"Majuro is affected too," McCrary said. "Majuro and Kwajalein are the only places commercial airlines fly in the Marshall Islands."

We will engage in conversation [with Aloha] to see if there's something we can do...don't know how much leverage we have," he said. "We're dealing with an international airline." McCrary said that no plans exist for a different airline to take Aloha's place.

Donna Groth, terminal supervisor, considers the move a loss of service for the community and said that the announcement was absolutely unexpected.

"Aloha is still flying through the busy times of Christmas and there are three oversold flights after the mission," Groth said. "When we start back for summer, Continental may add a fourth flight as they've done two years running."

Groth added that Continental has a reliable record, new planes and they are good about adding extra flights.

"Flights from here don't normally go out full, except right after school gets

position, which I'll recommend not filling - and hope for no other effects," Groth said. "The only thing that will change here is our employee schedule."

Groth said that passengers with tickets on Aloha beyond Jan. 10 would need to have their tickets endorsed over to Continental or request a refund, and that the two companies have a co-chair partnership enabling them to work together in this fashion.

Contractors may fly on Air Mobility Command from Kwajalein to Honolulu and back, but the rates are locked. With AMC prices at about \$600 more per roundtrip than Continental, Groth does not foresee a switch to use of the military carrier.

Aloha began serving the Marshall Islands in September 1999. For more than four years, the service was operated via Johnston Atoll using Boeing 737-200 aircraft.

Following the closure of the military facility at Johnston in December 2003, Aloha began flying Next Generation Boeing 737-700 aircraft to Kwajalein and Majuro. However, Aloha said inconsistent passenger loads were insufficient to sustain 700 service to the two Marshall Island destinations.

# Range mission scheduled for Thursday

A range operation is scheduled for Thursday. Caution times are from 12:01 p.m. through 8:01 p.m. in conjunction with this operation. A caution area will exist within the Kwajalein Atoll.

The caution area is bounded on the north by Boked Island on the east reef and Yabbernohr Island on the east reef to a point at latitude 08 54.2N, longitude 167 45.8E, then to a point at latitude 08 52.8N, longitude 167 45.8E, and then to a point north of the high tide mark on Ninni Island on the west reef. Bigej Island and the waters off surrounding Bigej are off limits for this mission. An additional caution area extending from the Kwajalein Atoll north into the broad ocean area is defined in the map below.





In order to ensure clearance of non-mission support personnel from the

mid-atoll corridor by the window opening time, Kwajalein Police Department island clearance procedures began at approximately 7:30 a.m. Monday and will continue until evacuation has been accomplished. Egress of all air and sea craft will be required when requested by authorized clearance personnel. Subsequent to lagoon clearance, the hazard area will be in effect until mission completion.

In conjunction with this operation, a Kwajalein Met Rocket is scheduled as soon as possible after the launch from Meck Island on Thursday. The caution areas are identified on maps below.

In the event of a mission slip, the caution times and areas will be in effect from 12:01 p.m. through 8:01 p.m., Friday and from 12:01 p.m. to 8:01 p.m. on Saturday.

# Host Nation position perfect fit for 'Kwaj Kid'



Growing up on Kwajalein gives kids a different perspective. As the first "Kwaj Kid" to become a civil servant on Kwajalein, Alan Taylor brings with him nearly 40 years of exactly that.

As RMI Relations Specialist with Host Nation, Taylor interacts with the command, the RMI workforce, local governments and the national government. His fluency in Marshallese is of daily use.

"This is a really unique environment and a unique job and I thought I was uniquely qualified to do it," Taylor said.

Taylor was sworn in as a civil servant on Nov. 16 by Maj. David Coffey, Host Nation chief. What appeals to him most is the fact that, at this job, every day is different.

"It's not going to be repetitive," Taylor said. "It appears as if there's going to be a new, unexpected twist on a daily basis."

Taylor said his workdays are often unpredictable. For instance, in a typical day, he may coordinate the move of excess property, to which the RMI government has first right of refusal, resolve an issue with an employee who needs answers to some questions and communicate with the national government at the Joint Committee Meeting.

"It's all unpredictable and it doesn't stop," he said.

As a member of the Host Nation office, USAKA routinely asks for his and/or the Marshallese perspective on issues.

"It's my job to make sure the best is done for the command and for the RMI population," explained Taylor.

What helps, he believes, is the understanding that comes with knowing the history of the island, contractors and the RMI workforce.

"[I bring] the knowledge of the training programs, the current initiatives, mixed with the history of where Kwaj was in the 60s, 70s and 80s, where we are now, and want to go in the future," Taylor said.

"Speaking Marshallese is a little gravy, as is having a

really good understanding of Marshallese culture and history, and living in the outer islands. It's being able to take all these pieces and put them together...to make the right decisions for everyone."

Taylor moved to Kwajalein in 1964 when he was four years old. That same year, control of the island transferred from the Navy to the Army. He's been here five times; three tours with his parents and two on his own.

After graduating from Kwajalein High School, Taylor headed off to college at Texas A&M in Galveston, where he received a bachelor of science in maritime administration. Then, it was on to graduate school at the University of Hawaii at Manoa where he was also a Fellow at the East-West Center. There, he earned a masters degree in English as a second language.

In 1986, Taylor learned Marshallese while living on Kili working for Kili/Bikini/Ejit local government. There, he taught sixth, seventh and eighth grade English and math.

"It was total submersion 24/7," said Taylor. "I was going to learn very quickly and was extremely persistent. Every night, I would study the dictionary and write. I went to church Wednesdays and Sundays where I could listen and follow along in the Bible – that's a great way to learn Marshallese."

Master the language he has, and today the Micronesian Handicraft Shop carries CDs on the Marshallese language produced by Taylor.

Alice Buck, who translated the bible in Marshallese, suggested that Taylor create the CD.

"She was busy so she said, 'Alan, I'm busy with translating the Bible into Kosrean – why don't you do that,'" he remembered.

On Kwajalein, Taylor first worked as a trainer for the RMI hires where he sought funding to help train RMI to provide opportunities for their advancement. More recently, he headed the RMI Relations office for KRS.

"There are lots of Kwaj Kids here who have come back to work," Taylor said. "Before I was representing the contractors, now I represent the command. I work on a different level. At KRS, I was interested in how things would affect employees – now I'm concerned with how things affect our relationship with RMI employees, contractors, the local and national government."

For the once daily surfer and wind-surfer, "life sure has changed," but Taylor said he is committed as a civil servant on island for at least the next two years. From there, his goal is to continue practicing international relations.
