



Soldiers remembered for bravery at 'Battle of Bulge'



Sixty years ago, more than 600,000 American soldiers fought at the Battle of the Bulge in the Ardennes Forest region of Belgium and Luxembourg. What began as a German surprise attack on Dec. 16, 1944, became the largest land battle involving U.S. troops in World War II and ended with an Allied victory on Jan. 25, 1945. By the end of the

battle, there were 81,000 American casualties, including approximately 19,000 who had sacrificed their lives. This formidable stand was a turning point in the war and was critical to the defeat of Nazi Germany and the liberation of Europe from tyranny.

Americans continue to be inspired by the valor and integrity of

Extended-life dairy products coming

Beginning the second week of February the dairy aisles within U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll and Reagan Test Site will change.

Pasteurized dairy products from Hawaii will be replaced with ultra-pasteurized dairy products from California, according to Michael Proudfoot, Kwajalein Inventory Control manager.

In a study at the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, Cornell University, Ithaca, New York experts in the dairy and nutrition arenas say that the ultra-pasteurized dairy products have the same nutritional and health benefits as traditional pasteurized dairy products with the added benefit of being able to be 'on the shelf' for up to 80 days, and must be consumed within seven to 10 days after opening. Conventional pasteurized dairy products have a shelf life of 12-16 days and should be consumed as soon as possible after opening, or within two to three days.

Maj. Jud McCrary, USAKA Logistics and Community Activities director, said, "Defense forces in Korea switched to extended shelf-life [ultra-pasteurized] dairy many years ago and it has been a success."

He added that the milk served in our dining facilities, Café Roi and Café Pacific has been extended shelf-life for a couple of years now."

Bringing ultra-pasteurized dairy products to Kwajalein is a win-win situation for the consumer, contractor and the U.S. Army. "It is cost effective," said Proudfoot. "We're moving the transportation from air transport to surface." The ultra products will come in via the barge, not only saving money but also releasing one-in-eight skids to other cargo. Proudfoot said that shipping the ultra products by barge will open space on the ATI flights for cargo such as mail and material, which means an almost 12 percent increase in volume on those aircrafts. Past studies have shown significant savings, including substantial savings in labor required in loading the product in Honolulu.

Conceivably using the ultra products should mean no more dairy shortages in Surfway, Ten-Ten, Gimbels or the dining facilities.

If the need arises, "we will still have access through the supply chain for traditional dairy products," Proudfoot said.

Some variety products, such as butter and Danon Yogurt

will still come from Honolulu according to Proudfoot.

Pasteurization and ultra-pasteurization are heat processes that are designed to kill bacteria, or germs, in milk that may be harmful and/or may cause spoilage of milk products. These bacteria are sometimes found in raw milk from the farm, which is why drinking raw milk is not recommended. Milk from farms is transported to dairy processing plants and is generally heat processed within a few days after milking to prevent spoilage and to prolong its shelf-life.

Pasteurization: "pasteurized" means that the milk has been heated to a minimum of 161°F for a minimum of 15 seconds (or 145°F for 30 minutes for equivalent kill of bacteria), and packaged under clean and sanitized conditions. Some bacteria will survive pasteurization in very low numbers, though they are not considered harmful and will not spoil milk under normal refrigerated holding conditions. Pasteurized milk that spoils quickly is most often the result of contamination after the pasteurization process. Most dairy processors prevent this type of contamination, though it still occurs at times due to errors at the processing plant. Typical spoilage bacteria found in milk do not cause disease or illness, though the consumer will often find the spoiled product to be offensive.

Ultra-pasteurized milk: "ultra-pasteurized" means that the milk is heated to a minimum of 280°F for a minimum two seconds. This temperature and time combination is much more lethal to bacteria, killing virtually all of concern in milk. Ultra-pasteurized milk is also packaged under near-sterile conditions, which makes recontamination with spoilage bacteria unlikely and rare. Though ultra-pasteurized milk is processed to be free of spoilage and harmful bacteria, it is not considered sterile because it is not hermetically sealed (i.e., canned), thus, it requires refrigeration. Ultra-pasteurization is most often used for creams and specialty dairy products though its use for milk is becoming

more popular. Ultra-pasteurized milks will often have more of a "cooked" flavor when compared to conventionally pasteurized milks.




Pasteurized dairy products from Hawaii such as the one shown will be replaced with ultra-pasteurized dairy products from California.



The event is unlike other Christmas drops in that residents from Ennubirr travel to Roi-Namur for the annual celebration, hosted by the Ennubirr Children's Christmas Fund Committee. The committee works year-round raising money to bring holiday cheer to the island's children, this year raising nearly \$20,000 through events such as the Chili Cook-off.

According to Joe Coleman, ECCF president, more than 300 bags full of goodies tailored to suit infants to 12-year-olds were distributed at the event.

"In the gender and age-specific bags were things like clothes, flip flops, coloring books, crayons and pencils," Coleman said.

Among the more popular items given were pogs - 8,000 of them Coleman ordered online. Groups of children found space in the Tradewinds Theater to begin playing the game,

throwing to the ground disc-like objects featuring pictures in an attempt to knock down a stack and walk away with all the pogs.

Highlighting the day was a musical program featuring spirited song and dance by children from the Santo Assembly of God Church and the Ennubirr United Church of Christ, followed by a presentation of gifts of hand-made jewelry to American visitors and volunteers.

"We plan this event year-long to share the tradition and cultures between the two communities," Floyd Corder, Roi-Namur Operations manager, said. "They bring joy to us with the dancing that they bring."

Children walked away from the day with a Polaroid photo of their visit with Santa, a bag full of goodies and smiles; volunteers and guests left knowing they made a difference. Something that could be seen, "Looking at all the kids' faces today," Lt. Col. Gerald Davie, United States Kwajalein Atoll, said.

Ebeye neighbors share Christmas with Kwaj

Sailors and missionaries from Northeastern United States, where Christmases are icy, windy snow-bound affairs, introduced Christmas to the people of the Marshall Islands in 1857. "These people brought the good news, the word of God and that was how Christmas started," said Billy Samson, representative of the Sunlight Jepta, Monday night at the Marshallese Christmas Celebration at the Community Recreation Center.

In the years since 1857 the Marshallese made the season their own, developing traditions which shine with the loving spirit of these people.

"We start Christmas in October or November," he said. "So there is lots of time to make Christmas in the Marshall Islands." When Samson said they start Christmas in October or November he was referring to when the Jeptas begin to learn new songs and dances to perform during Christmas holidays.

On Monday evening the Sunlight Jepta performed first. The traditional performances are in three parts – entrance with dance, singing and then dancing and the gift throwing.

A buzz of excitement hummed through the gymnasium as the standing-room-only crowd waited for the Sunlight performers. Music began to resonate through the building and the shuffle of feet could be heard. Led by men in sunflower gold shirts and black slacks the 25 performers came into the room two-by-two, moving to a beat which embodied the island feel with a catchy drum base.

The women wore ankle-length nuknuks of gold, beige and bronze.

After forming up in the center of the gym, the group began the first of three songs they performed that night. The first piece was a miraculous blending of the voices of the men and women.

Following the singing the performance reformed into dance lines and began to rhythmically interpret the music with their feet and bodies. Many of the women were wearing battery-operated accessories, adding a sparkly, festive look to the natural tones of their hand-woven head gear and jewelry.

The dancers were exuberant and subtle at the same time, telling, as all Marshallese dances do, a story with their moves. The young and not-so-young moved side-by-side while smiles dazzled the audience.

The Jeptas are competitions between groups in the community, "no prizes are awarded other than knowing you are the best for that year," said Sue Rosoff, Historical preservationist, KRS Environmental Dept., Marshallese Cultural Center.

Samson introduced the different selections, often making friendly verbal jabs at audience members from other Jeptas. He said, with a competitive twinkle in his eye, that some dances are "stolen" from

other Jeptas on other islands, and once a dance is stolen that the original Jepta would not perform it as a group. That did not keep members of the audience who were familiar with the steps from joining in with the intricate steps.

Samson said, "This is how we celebrate Christmas in the Marshall Islands," as members of his Jepta tossed goodies into the audience, including candies and beautiful, hand-made crafts. Rosoff recalled the first Jepta she attended and said that some performers "threw" canned goods into the audience and that on Ebeye on Christmas Day, plastic cups and handtowels are also among what is thrown to the audience in the third part of each Jepta's performance. It's all a part of the tradition of giving at Christmas in the Marshall Islands.

The second Jepta to perform were young people from the U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll school system.

The more than 50 performers bounded onto the floor, in synchronized precision, with enthusiasm and energy that made the first lively group seem low-key in comparison.

Dressed in reds, whites and blues combinations, the youthful dancers translated their music as Noda Lojkar, Host Nations Office, introduced the group and said, "Let's rock and roll."

The enthusiasm of the dancers was contagious and the audience often joined in by keeping the beat with clapping and swaying. Some of the performers didn't seem to be able to control their exuberance, and would leave the lines of dancers, stepping out and adlibbing bringing cheers and hooting from the audience.

At the end of the performance, Samson invited the audience to travel to Ebeye on Christmas and see how the Marshallese really celebrate this holiday.

Band of Brothers, Band of Heroes

the Bulge organization, spoke for his fellow veterans during the ceremony in recalling “those dark days when we stood together and fought toward victory.”

He called the 60th anniversary of the battle’s opening day a fitting time “to pay homage to our comrades who made the supreme sacrifice” and told his fellow veterans, “We know you have not forgotten them.”

Checken said the veterans of the Battle of the Bulge will also never forget the tragic scenes they witnessed – nor the friendships they forged, between soldiers and between nations.

“Thank you for remembering us,” Checken told the Luxembourgers and Belgians at the ceremony. “We will never forget you.”

The ceremony at the Luxembourg American Cemetery and Memorial included a 21-gun salute by the Luxembourg Army and a wreath-laying to honor the fallen veterans of the Battle of the Bulge.

A flyover initially planned for the ceremony was cancelled due to thick fog. Ironically, U.S. air support for ground troops during the first days of the Battle of the Bulge was scrapped 60 years ago because of similar inclement weather conditions.

“We were lucky to be liberated by you,” said John Milmeister, secretary of the National Liberation Memorial Association. “Thanks to you, we in Western Europe are living in liberty and prosperity.”

Nico Loes, mayor of Schumann, thanked the veterans for “your courage, your determination and your tenacity” in freeing Luxembourg from oppression. “We owe you one of the most precious commodities on this earth: freedom,” he said. “Luxembourg will never forget what you have done for us.”


“We live in freedom because of you,” Roche told the veterans gathered at the memorial, noting that they hold “a place of honor in the history of civilization” that continues to inspire others today

Veterans of the Battle of the Bulge called the ceremonies a time of reflection and healing.

Alfred Grossenbacher, a private first class with the 28th Infantry Division during the battle, called his visit to the Luxembourg American Cemetery and Memorial an opportunity to honor his fallen comrades. “I thought the loss and the pain was over, but it’s not,” he said, tears welling up in his eyes. “They’re the ones who allowed me to come home.”

Michael Samberg, a private with the 26th “Yankee” Infantry Division during the battle, said he’s worked through the sadness and the apologies he feels toward his comrades who died. “Now I’m here to honor them and their memories,” he said.

Looking back, Samberg said he’s proud the actions he and his fellow soldiers took at the Battle of the Bulge. “When I look back at the contribution I was able to make, I feel that in some little way, I helped to make the world a better place,” he said.

Citizens of Luxembourg and Belgium joined veterans of the Battle of the Bulge in Luxembourg Dec. 16 to commemorate the 60th anniversary of the opening day of the battle and to honor the 19,000 U.S. soldiers who died during what proved to be one of the largest and bloodiest encounters of World War II.

In the cold, fog-shrouded Luxembourg American Cemetery and Memorial, the veterans paid tribute to 5,000 of their comrades buried here following what Luxembourg Prime Minister Jean-Claude Juncker acknowledged were their “most terrible days.”

Juncker praised the “courageous young men” who endured what many said felt like overwhelming odds to free Luxembourg from five years of German occupation. “This is a day to pay tribute and to show our deepest gratitude,” he told the veterans.

The prime minister vowed to pass the story of the courage demonstrated by the U.S. military on to future generations. “We must never forget” the debt Luxembourg owes the United States for “the sacrifices made by young American GIs” on its behalf, Juncker told the veterans and their families.

U.S. Ambassador to Luxembourg Peter Terpeluk delivered a proclamation from President George W. Bush thanking the veterans of the Battle of the Bulge for their critical role in defeating Nazi Germany and freeing Europe from tyranny. “When it mattered most, the entire generation of Americans showed the finest qualities of our nation and humanity,” the president wrote.



"Glow as you go"

Custom bikes appear on Kwaj

Bicycles "unlike any that have been on Kwajalein previously," according to David Fearon, Macy's West manager, will soon illuminate the island's streets and pathways.

Three hundred and fifty fifth-generation custom Sun bikes are now available at Macy's West and Gimbel's. The bikes feature rims and handle bars with special luminous paint that glows a bright green at night.

Fearon said the bikes are made for Kwajalein with specifications based on customer comments and suggestions.

Seven different color aluminum bikes are available all with extended frames, which are approximately six inches longer than the normal Huffy frame. Sizes include men's 21-inch and ladies 19 and 15-inch frames. Fearon added that fenders are included.

Cost for one of the new four-speed bikes is \$285 unassembled and customers have the option of converting the four-speed to a one-speed, which runs \$200. Assembly may take up to 10 days initially, but Fearon expects that after the initial rush, it will take only one or two days for customers to receive the assembled bikes.

"Bicycles at RTS are the most hazardous device that we have. Anything that can be done to reduce the hazard of injuries on bicycles at night, as the result of being able to be seen, we applaud," Norm Black, Environmental Health and Safety manager, said. Beyond the issue of safety, Black said this new glow-in-the-dark material is cool.

"I applaud Dave Fearon's initiative for seeking out this material for the bicycles and then stocking them. Great safety initiative. Thumbs up," Black said.

Omelek Island launches studied

The U.S. Army Space and Missile Defense Command has completed an Environmental Assessment (EA), prepared in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969 and the Council on Environmental Quality regulations implementing NEPA. The EA analyzes the environmental consequences of conducting two proof-of-principle launches of the Falcon launch vehicle from Omelek Island at the U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll/Ronald Reagan Ballistic Missile Defense Test Site (USAKA/RTS). The Falcon Launch Vehicle Program is a venture by Space Exploration Technologies, Inc. (SpaceX), a privately held company, to provide space launch operations.

SpaceX is developing the Falcon as a light-launch vehicle to put small spacecraft into orbit with high reliability and low cost. The Falcon is a two-stage vehicle; the first stage could be attached to a parachute and recovered, while the second stage is not intended to be recovered. The Falcon vehicle uses only liquid fuels: liquid oxygen and kerosene. The Falcon Launch Vehicle Program is designed to require minimal time for vehicle assembly or payload processing on the launch pad; much of the assembly would be accomplished at SpaceX facilities in California. The goal is to launch within a few days to one week of payload arrival at the launch site. This requires minimal time for processing the payload and minimal use of the launch pad. No additional flights are planned at this time.

Launch activities have not been conducted at

Omelek since 1996. Therefore, SpaceX would need to conduct limited refurbishment of existing buildings on Omelek; bring in some additional temporary buildings; construct a missile assembly building and launch pad; and make infrastructure improvements in order to operate a launch facility for the Falcon launch vehicle. Two new mooring buoys would be added to the lagoon to the west of the two arms forming the harbor at Omelek. Refurbishment activities and launch of the Falcon launch vehicle would comply with all of the USAKA Environmental Standards and the USAKA/RTS Range Safety Requirements.

Based on this analysis the U.S. Army has determined that proposed activities are not expected to result in significant impacts to the environment.
