

# Military mother supports veterans

Earlier this year we had a letter in the 'Hourglass' from Faith Fullerton reminding us of our obligation to shake off our complacency – I guess that message did not take with those who make our movie selections.

## One life lost is too many

With Americans killed in Operation Iraqi Freedom surpassing 2,000, many Americans feel we are crossing a solemn threshold.

"Each loss of life is heartbreaking," said President George W. Bush Oct. 25 at an annual luncheon honoring military officers and their wives at Bolling Air Force Base in Washington, D.C. "And the best way to honor the sacrifice of our fallen troops is to complete the mission and lay the foundation of peace by spreading freedom."

Heroes are more than numbers to those left behind.

News headlines depict the number as a "milestone," but this may be a lackluster description to the seriousness and sensitivity of America's loss of life. "The first life lost was the milestone," said retired Sgt. Maj. Gary G. Beylickhian, a combat veteran of the Korean War and Vietnam Conflict. "I'm not sure where the news organizations got the idea that 2,000 lives lost is a milestone. This is a reality that should be left out of semantics when we're talking about real human beings here, not numbers."

# Code talker answered ‘call to duty’

He became a legend in the Army, as well as in his native Comanche tribe in Oklahoma.

Charles Chibitty, 84, the last of the Comanche code talkers, died July 20 this year in Tulsa, Okla. He also reportedly was the last hereditary chief of the Comanche, having descended from the great leader, Chief Ten Bears.

Code talkers is the term used to describe Soldiers from various Indian tribes who communicated on radios, telephones and telegraph during World Wars I and II. They spoke in their own languages and dialects, many of which were not written down and all of which were indecipherable by enemy forces. Chibitty was among the 17 Comanche code talkers who served throughout the European Theater during World War II with the 4th Signal Company, 4th Infantry Division.

Since there were many military words that had no meaning in the Comanche language, Chibitty and other Soldiers had to invent their own unique military lingo. For example, they used the Comanche word for “turtle” to signify “tank.”

Chibitty saw plenty of fighting at the landings at Utah Beach dur-

ing the D-Day Normandy invasion in June 1944. He immediately put his skills to use, directing aircraft and naval gunfire to targets and informing other Comanche code breakers at higher headquarters of the tactical situation on the ground and relaying information back to his unit commander.

Chibitty survived the landings and saw a lot more action throughout France and during the Battle of the Bulge. He and

his unit were among the first Americans to liberate Paris and later to enter Germany. In addition to code talking, Chibitty became a champion boxer in the Army. Later in life, he became a much acclaimed and prize-winning Comanche war dancer.

The French presented Chibitty and other Comanche code talkers with their second-highest medal for valor, the Chevalier de L’Ordre National du Merite.

In 1999, the Department of Defense recognized Chibitty who was then 78 and the last surviving member of the Comanche code talkers. He was honored in the Hall of Heroes inside the Pentagon for his extraordinary bravery and achievements.

At the ceremony, he didn’t dwell much on his own combat actions, preferring rather to speak of the achievements of his fellow Comanche code talkers. He recounted the story of one code talker who was wounded in the back with shrapnel. That Soldier refused to be evacuated to the rear and continued to fight and code talk. His wounds were treated and he survived the war. Other Comanche code talkers were wounded as well, but all survived the fighting.

## U.S. Army medic saves Iraqi policeman

An Iraqi police officer owes his life to a U.S. Army medic who treated his wounds as terrorists fired on their position Oct. 10.

“I didn’t have time to think about it,” said Spc. Andrew “Doc” Suchanek, 1st Battalion, 87th Infantry, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division. “I just knew I didn’t want that guy to get hurt even worse. I just reacted.”

While on a routine patrol in west Baghdad, Iraq Suchanek and other Soldiers of C Company, 1/87 Infantry responded to assist Iraqi Police who had come under fire from automatic rifles and rocket-propelled grenades. Encountering a critically-wounded police officer, Suchanek began immediate life-saving treatment.

Then a terrorist suddenly fired an RPG at both of them. Without hesitation, Suchanek threw himself on the police officer, shielding him from danger. The grenade exploded harmlessly and Suchanek continued treatment to save

the life of the policeman. As his fellow Soldiers secured the area, Suchanek coordinated evacuation for his patient to a local hospital.

American care for the wounded — civilian or military — does not end in the street, said Capt. Douglas Hermann, 1/87’s medical officer.

“Combat medics like Suchanek provide live-saving care, and under fire,” Hermann said. “But the job isn’t done after the injured are pulled away from combat. Other medics respond after the casualty has left the front lines. There, other medics stabilize the injured and get them safely to a hospital.”

The battalion medics at Forward Operating Base Hawk in Baghdad receive casualties and get them to the combat support hospital. Hermann said providing follow-up care and getting the wounded aboard medical helicopters are life-saving tasks.

“These medics do their job with amazing speed and motivation,” he added. “They know mere minutes can mean life and death to their patients.”

# Smoking linked to lung cancer

You know you should, you've seen the commercials, the statistics; you know it is bad for you, it would be so hard, and continuing makes you feel good, you like it.

November is Lung Cancer Awareness month and Nov. 17 is The Great American Smoke out. This is an annual event dedicated to helping smokers quit cigarettes for at least one day, in hopes they will quit forever.

Lung cancer is responsible for 30 percent of all cancer deaths and will kill more people this year than breast cancer, prostate cancer, colon cancer, liver cancer, kidney cancer and melanoma combined. Approximately 85 percent of all lung cancers are in people who smoke or who have smoked.

Tobacco addiction is the leading risk factor in the development of lung cancer. Cigarette smoke contains more than 4,000 different chemicals, many of which are proven carcinogens (substances that cause cancer). Approximately 123,386 lung cancer deaths a year are due to smoking.

To get ready to quit smoking,

ask yourself these three questions:

- Why do I want to quit smoking?
- What method will I use to quit smoking?
- How do I stay smoke free?

Then create a plan. You may want to discuss ways to quit with your health care professional – 'cold turkey,' gradual quitting or Nicotine Replacement Therapy (gum/patch). When choosing an appropriate tool, consider these factors:


- How long you've been smoking

- How many cigarettes you smoke a day
- What triggers your urge to smoke
- Whether you smoke on a regular schedule or randomly
- Whether you experience intense morning cravings
- Whether you've tried to quit in the past
- Why you had problems quitting or staying off cigarettes

Don't keep your intention to quit a secret. Tell your friends and family you are trying to quit. Keep cigarettes, lighters, matches and ashtrays out of your home. Ask friends and family not to smoke around you.

The American Cancer Society offers programs to help you through your quit attempt. Its hotline is 1-800-ACS-2345. If you already have lung cancer, the Lung Cancer Alliance has a toll free information and referral service at 1-800-298-2436. You may obtain information and counseling through Kwajalein Hospital. The Employee Assistance Program clinical psychologist may also be contacted at 55362.
