

Minor outages possible

Power plant returns to original design

Powered by four 4,000-kilowatt to 4,400-kilowatt Caterpillar diesel generator sets for the past year, Kwajalein's electrical plant returned to using only three on March 1. Such a move may cause intermittent, unplanned outages in the event that one of the engines fails.

"With three, if we lose one because of mechanical failure, the others won't be able to carry the load," Kevin Ehart, Utilities department manager, said. "The result will be shedding of power feeders based on criticality."

Though critical loads will be protected and will not shed, the housing area will likely lose power in the event of a mechanical failure, causing outages.

Ehart said that outages would last approximately 15 minutes, which is about the time it takes to restart power from the engine. He advises residents that there is no need to call either the plant or the Service Desk

when this happens.

Use of four engines this past year was necessary because of an anomaly, which has since been discovered, with the help of the manufacturer, and resolved. Before that, the island had always relied on just three engines.

Ehart said savings from returning to the use of three engines is about 265,000 gallons of diesel fuel a year. With the current cost of diesel fuel at \$1.33 per gallon, the bottom line factored into the decision. A Six Sigma process improvement plan was developed on the topic.

"The plant was designed for the use of three engines and has returned to that state, enabling the three engines to perform better at the higher loads for which they were designed," Ehart said.

Though there is no way to know when an engine is going to break, he said that outages are not going to be common.

"Our primary goal is reliable power as effectively and efficiently as we can do that," Ehart said.

Sports account for one-half of off-job injuries

Softball season is in full swing on Kwajalein. With that come injuries, creating what might be considered the island's 'walking wounded.' Although injuries that occur on the softball field may not count against the company's 'hours without a recordable or lost-time injury,' they do count.

"Sports injuries are off work. We keep track of the number of them internally and we see that they are rising, particularly in the past few months with softball season," said John Feldman, Safety manager.

Feldman explained that injuries that occur at work are easily tracked against hours worked using payroll data. Off-hours injuries are harder to discern, based on the fact that there's no way to account for how much time people spend on recreation.

Because Kwajalein Range Services considers safety a top priority both on and off the job, the company keeps track of injuries in an effort to "determine how well we are protecting ourselves and our fellow workers," he said. The goal is zero accidents, wherein no one gets hurt, he added.

"In the event of an injury, most KRS contract employees are covered for medical and certain

disability benefits under the Defense Base Act," Feldman said. "It provides coverage for employees working at overseas bases and in remote locations. It usually covers employees whether or not they are injured on or off the job. It does not cover medical conditions or family members. They should be covered by personal medical plans."

At present, the numbers of on and off-the-job injuries are about evenly divided. On the job, KRS has worked nearly 1.2 million hours without a recordable or lost-time injury.

The U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration has certain criteria on which it bases recordable injuries. Such an injury is one that requires medical treatment more than first aid or a work restriction involving major job duties for more than one week.

An injury that occurs while commuting to and from an employee's usual place of work via bike, plane or ferry would usually not count be-

cause it does not occur in the workplace. But, significant aggravation of prior or chronic injury would be counted if it requires a higher degree of medical treatment than in the past.

Feldman said that KRS boasts an injury rate less than half that of a typical service organization performing similar work.

"Although our performance is good, we continue to strive for no injuries through a comprehensive workplace safety program," he said.

Next to sports injuries, bicycle injuries make up the largest group of off-the-job injuries, with some serious enough to require specialized treatment off island.

"Outside of work, many of us forget we are on a remote island. While we have excellent medical care, we don't have all the diagnostic equipment and specialists you would find in a large hospital or medical center," Feldman said.

He said that risky behaviors both on and off the job sooner or later lead to accidents.

"Don't wait until you have an injury and can't partake in family or sports activities that you realize the value of working and playing safe," Feldman said. "And if you observe somebody doing something risky, let them know it in a caring manner. By saying nothing, you are just reinforcing the behavior."

This year's Kaleidoscope proved that local talent is abundant on Kwajalein. And, as Howard said, "We're always looking for new adult performers."


