

I mean, how else could I take the story I saw on the Internet about the school in England?



# National Guard troops assist in hurricane search, rescue, security

Thousands of National Guard troops from Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama were on duty Monday as Hurricane Katrina hammered New Orleans, Gulfport, Miss., and other points on the Gulf Coast with 145-mph winds and torrential rains.

The Louisiana National Guard had called almost 3,500 of its members to active duty as of 7 a.m. Monday to assist in missions ranging from assisting law enforcement agencies with traffic control and security; transporting and distributing food, water and ice, conducting searches and rescues; providing generator support; and carrying out other missions to protect life and property.

On Sunday, Louisiana Guardsmen conducted security and screening at the emergency shelter set-up at the New Orleans Superdome, where a reported 9,000 to 10,000 local residents reported after heeding the city's mandatory evacuation order issued earlier in the day.

As Katrina threatened to flood the low-lying city with water from the Mississippi River and Lake Ponchartrain, other Louisiana Guardsmen were setting up other shelters, helping state police with evacuations and preparing to support relief operations in the hurricane's aftermath.

Schneider reported a successful evacuation from the city, crediting the Louisiana Guard's partners in neighboring states for carrying out

"a coordinated effort" that incorporated lessons learned from past evacuations.

Schneider said during an interview Monday with

Fox News the state stood ready to house evacuees at the Superdome "for as long as it takes," reporting that although the massive structure's protective lining tore in the hurricane's Category 4 winds, the roof itself appears to be intact.

The Florida National Guard, just wrapping up its own emergency response to Katrina when it crossed the South Florida peninsula Aug. 25, was preparing to ship 1,000 cots to Louisiana to augment those provided by the Louisiana Guard.

In Mississippi, nearly 900 Army and Air Guard members were on active duty, with as many as

## Former Kwaj Kid gives computers, furniture to Jabro School on Ebeye

**O**n Aug. 20 a load of much-needed school supplies was delivered to Jabro School on Ebeye.

Suzanne Mayo of Honolulu, a former Kwajalein resident, donated a classroom full of furniture and several computers to the Ebeye school. "I knew the day my boss told me she was getting all new furniture for the classrooms here in Honolulu and that if I could find a way to get the furniture to Marshalls that I could have it that I was blessed," she said.

Getting the donated goods to Ebeye did not prove to be an easy task for Mayo. "I thought it impossible until my dad suggested I contact someone from San Juan construction," she said.

Mayo contacted Greg Horner of San Juan who forwarded her e-mails to the right people to get the job done. "Norm Harvey stepped in and came into town to get the furniture. He didn't have to because his directions were that I would deliver the items," she said.

Mayo said that when she left her job at Kaplan to work for Coldwell Banker on her office tour there was discussion of what to do with all of their computers. "Again I knew I was blessed. I felt like I had

won the lottery. Twice.”

All the furniture and computers were stored in the San Juan warehouse in Hawaii awaiting delivery on a space- available basis. According to Tom Levensailor, project manager of San Juan on Kwajalein, it took about three months to deliver all the goods on the monthly construction supply barge. The items were stored in a warehouse on Kwaj prior to delivery to Ebeye. Once all the items were collected they were sent to Ebeye on the LCM.

“I was at the right place at the right time and with a little effort was able to coordinate the movement of these donations, but it was each and every one of you that really made it happen,” Mayo said. “And of course, my dad, Dale Mayo, always gets dragged into my projects to which he gladly took part in by taking pictures and helping to move the things to Ebeye.”

“I must admit that I had not visited Ebeye before accompanying the delivery on the final leg of the trip on the LCM ferry. I can attest that all of the people that we met were very appreciative. I can also attest that the school is truly in need and that this was a worthwhile destination for your goods and efforts,” Levensailor said.

He also added that they are starting work to partition the largest room to separate the ninth, 10th, 11th and 12th grade classes. “They need everything from building supplies, blackboards, school supplies, appliances and hope. Please keep them in mind as you discard items in the future that may still have potential for their use.”

Mayo could not be there for the delivery of the goods

to Jabro School but expressed appreciation to everyone that helped. “I would have loved to be there to move all of the things to Ebeye, but seeing the photos gives me a small taste of the joy it brought to Jabro School. # Safety professional deploys to assist with Hurricane Katrina recovery effort

Joining a 200-member Bechtel disaster recovery management team in the wake of Hurricane Katrina is Norm Black, Kwajalein Range Services special projects manager. The team's work will be performed for the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Black heads to Houston Monday. From there, he will deploy to satellite project areas within the three states that sustained significant damage to serve as a senior manager on the Environmental Safety and Health team.

Asked his expectations of the job, Black said, "I expect this to be a project of disaster recovery, managing the procurement, delivery and installation/repairs of housing, water systems, waste systems, roads/bridges and other major infrastructure elements."

The challenge that lies ahead, he said, is redirecting disaster recovery "bravado" exhibited by numerous emergency personnel or private parties into a safe and sane well-managed disaster recovery effort.

"The most unsafe element I expect to see are

homeowners/business owners attempting to perform recovery work which they are ill equipped or untrained to do," he explained. "As far as my own safety, a situation is only unsafe if I choose it to be unsafe. As long as I choose to do my job safely without injury, there is no reason why I would perform a task which would result in injury to me or others."

Black's voice is one of experience, as he was one of three Bechtel employees to arrive at the World Trade Center disaster. For three months, he served as part of the Bechtel ES&H team that assisted FEMA and the City and County of New York recover from the World Trade Center disaster.

"There are many skilled people who will be part of the recovery team," Black said. "I consider myself exceedingly fortunate to be part of this team and to represent Kwajalein/Roi, KRS and Bechtel."

600 more expected to join them by the day's end, to support what Army Lt. Col. Tim Powell called the worst storm to hit the state in more than 30 years.

Powell said the guardsmen will help conduct the "huge mission" of removing debris from roadways, distributing water and ice until power is restored and doing "whatever we can to help the citizens of Mississippi."

Engineer teams assigned to three emergency operations centers on the Gulf Coast were also expected to provide search-and-rescue support and assist with evacuations in flooded areas, he said.

The Oklahoma, Pennsylvania and Arkansas National Guards were working together to provide four UH-60 Black Hawk and three CH-47 Chinook helicopters requested by Mississippi.

An estimated 160 Alabama National Guardsmen were on duty in the southern part of the state, where they pre-positioned generators and trucks and helped with sandbagging and other disaster response operations, officials there reported.

The National Guard activated its Emergency Operations Center in Mobile, with support from the 711th Signal Battalion and the 226th Area Support Group. Officials said Army and Air National Guardsmen were also monitoring the hurricane and emergency response operations from the Guard's Joint Operations Center in Montgomery.

Although not on active duty at this time, Alabama has about 9,000 more guardsmen available to respond to disaster relief operations in Alabama as well as neighboring states, as required, officials said.

Meanwhile, the Arkansas National Guard was preparing to open an armory in Monticello with 100 cots and blankets for people seeking shelter from Hurricane Katrina, officials reported. The Guard sent another 100 cots and blankets to Lake Village to be set up in a local high school.

Although the Arkansas National Guard was not on an official alert status on Monday morning, officials said more than 9,000 Soldiers and airmen were standing

ready and available should the need arise.


At Keesler Air Force Base, Miss., the Air Force Reserve's 53rd Weather Reconnaissance Squadron was busy tracking Katrina for the National Hurricane Center in Miami. Crews were launching aircraft at regular intervals for missions that typically last eight to 12 hours, during which they collect a full range of weather measurements.

On another level of assistance, the Coast Guard closed ports and waterways along the Gulf Coast Sunday and evacuated its own people and resources out of harm's way in anticipation of Katrina's landfall Monday.

Coast Guard aircraft, small boats, patrol boats and cutters were positioned in around the region, prepared to conduct immediate post-hurricane search, rescue and humanitarian aid operations, waterway impact assessments and waterway reconstitution operations, officials reported.


In addition, the Coast Guard has a Web site providing regular updates about the hurricane and response efforts.

**Mr. & Mrs. Smith.** Many married couples have secrets, but one pair of lovebirds discover they've both been living dangerous secret lives in this action thriller laced with comedy. Angelina Jolie and Brad Pitt and play Jane Smith and John Smith, a suburban couple whose marriage has started to go a bit stale after five or six years. Both wish for more excitement in their relationship, but as it happens, each of them is finding plenty of thrills elsewhere. Both Jane and John are world-class assassins who will take on perilous missions for the right price, but neither is aware of the other's secret life - Jane thinks her husband runs a successful construction company, and John believes his wife works on Wall Street. However, when John and Jane are both assigned to take out the same target, one Benjamin Danz (Adam Brody), they become aware of each other's secret lives, and suddenly both their careers and their marriage go through some dramatic and potentially deadly changes. Mr. and Mrs. Smith also stars Vince Vaughn as an assassin with John's company who still lives with his mother and Kerry Washington as one of Jane's associates.

**The Longest Yard.** One of the toughest and best-remembered sports movies of the 1970s gets a humorous makeover in this comedy. Paul "Wrecking" Crewe (Adam Sandler) was once a famous professional football player, but after several years out of the limelight and an alcohol problem have taken their toll, Crewe is arrested for a serious traffic accident aggravated by the fact he was drunk. Crewe is sentenced to Allenville Penitentiary, where Warden Hazen (James Cromwell) is something of a football fan. Hazen had organized his guards into an impressive football team, and clears a healthy profit by taking bets on their games. Looking to make the competition more interesting, Hazen suggests that Crewe put together a team from the inmate population to play his guards. With the help of fellow prisoner Caretaker (Chris Rock), Crewe recruits the heaviest hitters from the cell block for the team, but the guys don't play like a unit until Crewe and Caretaker get some help from Nate Scarborough (Burt Reynolds), a former college and NFL coach doing hard time. # Honoring fallen heroes

The following 10 U.S. servicemembers have died in the Global War on Terrorism.

**Master Sgt. Chris S. Chapin**, 39, of Proctor, Vt., died on Aug. 23, 2005, in Ar Ramadi, Iraq during combat operations when he was attacked by enemy forces using small arms fire. Chapin was assigned to the Army National Guard's 2nd Battalion (General Studies), 124th Regiment (Regional Training Institute), Colchester, Vt.

Three Soldiers, **Sgt. 1st Class Trevor J. Diesing**, 30, of Plum City, Wis.; **Master Sgt. Ivica Jerak**, 42, of Houston and **Cpl. Timothy M. Shea**, 22, of Sonoma, Calif. died on Aug. 25, in Husaybah, Iraq, of injuries sustained when an improvised explosive device detonated near their position. Diesing and Jerak were assigned to the U.S. Army Special Operations Command, Fort Bragg, N.C. Shea was assigned to the Army's 3rd Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment, Fort Benning, Ga.

**Staff Sgt. Damion G. Campbell**, 23, of Baltimore, died on Aug. 26, in Khayr Kot, Afghanistan, where an improvised explosive device detonated near his HMMWV during a combat patrol. Campbell was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 508th Infantry Regiment, Vicenza, Italy.

**Spc. Joseph L. Martinez**, 21, of Las Vegas, died on Aug. 27, in Tal Afar, Iraq, where his dismounted patrol was engaged by enemy forces using small

arms fire. Martinez was assigned to the 2nd Squadron, 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment, Fort Carson, Colo.

**Sgt. 1st Class Obediah J. Kolath**, 32, of Louisburg, Mo., died on Sunday, in Landstuhl, Germany, of injuries sustained on Aug. 25, in Husaybah, where an improvised explosive device detonated near his position. Kolath was assigned to the U.S. Army Special Operations Command, Fort Bragg.

**Chief Warrant Officer Dennis P. Hay**, 32, of Valdosta, Ga., died on Monday, in Tal Afar, where his OH-58D Kiowa helicopter came under attack by enemy forces using small arms fire. Hay was assigned to the 4th Squadron, 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment, Fort Carson.





# Range operation scheduled for Wednesday

A range operation is scheduled for Wednesday. Caution times are 7:01 p.m. through 3:01 a.m. Thursday. In conjunction with this operation, a caution area will exist within the Kwajalein Atoll. The caution area is bounded on the north by Boked Island on the east reef and Yabbernohr Island on the west reef. On the south, the area is bounded by a line drawn north of Bigej Island on the east reef to a point at latitude 08 54.2N, longitude 167 45.8E, then to a point at latitude 08 52.8N, longitude 167 45.8E, and then to a point north of the high tide mark on Ninni Island on the west reef. Bigej Island, including the inner reef, is specifically excluded and is not a part of the Mid-Atoll corridor. Illeginni is designated as an evacuation island. All Mid-Atoll Corridor islands are designated as sheltered islands. Additional areas specified outside the mid-atoll are designated as caution areas, see maps.


In order to ensure clearance of non-mission support personnel from the Mid-Atoll Corridor by the window opening time, Kwajalein Police Department island clearance procedures will begin at approximately 7:30 a.m. on Sunday and continue until evacuation has been accomplished. Egress of all air and seacraft will be required when requested by authorized clearance personnel. Subsequent to lagoon clearance, the hazard area will be in effect until mission completion.

In the event of a mission slip, the caution times and areas will be in effect for the following days:


