
Personally, I had a bad time with a heart attack. I was humbled to find out how many people were concerned about me and wished me well. That's almost worth having a heart attack.

Kwajalein is a unique place to live and is filled with terrific caring people.



Rumsfeld lauds 2005 successes

Defense Secretary Donald H. Rumsfeld heralded 2005 as a year of extraordinary contributions by the U.S. military and looked toward the new year as an opportunity to continue building on those efforts and transforming the military into a 21st-century force.

During a recent interview with the Pentagon Channel and the American Forces Press Service, Rumsfeld cited the array of missions the military carried out during an exceptionally busy year.

These include humanitarian efforts following the tsunami in South Asia on Dec. 26, 2004, the devastating Oct. 8 earthquake in Pakistan and hurricanes Katrina and Rita along the Gulf coast in August and September.

While supporting these missions, the U.S. military played a key role in liberating more than 50 million people in Afghanistan and Iraq and enabling both countries to hold historic free elections, he said.

"I appreciate this opportunity to tell the men and women in uniform in the United States and

all across the globe what a truly amazing year ... you have had (and) what you have done," Rumsfeld said in his message to the troops.

These contributions have come through exceptional sacrifice by the military, he said, noting that many servicemembers will be away from their families and loved ones during the upcoming holidays.

"As you go through a period where you are away from family and friends, know that the country is grateful, that we recognize the sacrifice that you make, and we wish you all a very merry Christmas," Rumsfeld said. "And thank you for what you do."

The secretary made it clear where he believes the U.S. military stands. "We have the finest military on the face of the earth. We also have the finest military that we have ever had," he said.

"No one was drafted, no one was conscripted, no one was forced to do anything they didn't want to do," he continued. "They stood up and said, 'Send me.'"

He cited U.S. servicemembers' impact in South Asia in the tsunami, in Pakistan after its devas-

tating earthquake, and in the U.S. Gulf states after the hurricanes, on top of "the fact that they have liberated over 50 million people in Afghanistan and Iraq."

The U.S. military is helping create an environment where these countries can develop democracies and provide all of their people, no matter their gender or their religion, an opportunity to enjoy the benefits of a free system, he said. This "has to be noble work," the secretary said. "(Service-members) know it is noble work. They are proud of it and they should be."

In the year ahead, the U.S. military will continue its progress in Iraq and Afghanistan and stand by, ready to lend its unique capabilities to natural disasters and other extraordinary events, he said.

At the same time, the military will continue positioning itself to meet future challenges, he said. "We have to ... continue transforming this great institution so we can shift our weight more toward irregular warfare and the kinds of challenges we are likely to meet in the 21st century," he said.

This includes refining the military's ability to

contribute to homeland defense and to protect Americans from the threat of weapons of mass destruction in the hands of terrorists and rouge states, he said.

It also means continuing to move beyond the Cold War-era military structure and to extend the expeditionary qualities already in the Navy, Air Force and Marines to the Army. "We have to continue to make adjustments that will enable our military to be swift and agile and deployable," Rumsfeld said.


As the Army increases its number of combat brigades in the year ahead, it also will continue bolstering capabilities within the National Guard and Reserve, the secretary said. "We are going to see that the Reserve brigades have ... the equipment they need and that they are staffed up and trained up," he said.

While transforming the force and increasing its capabilities, Rumsfeld said the focus will remain on the military's most critical building block: its men and women in uniform. "We have to continue to see that we are able to attract and retain the kinds of talent that we need," he said.

Problem solver *Lojkar's work resolves issues, promotes cultural awareness*

If citizens of the Republic of the Marshall Islands have questions or concerns about their employment or relationship with the U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll, they can get answers from Noda Lojkar.

Lojkar is the RMI representative to USAKA as well as acting Ombudsman for RMI citizens.

"I act as the official liaison between the government of the RMI and USAKA. Among my duties are representing the RMI at Compact-mandated coordination meetings like the Community Relations Councils and Joint Labor Relations Board; acting as the Ombudsman for the RMI citizens that are employees of USAKA contractors; processing RMI government paperwork to include birth certificates, death certificates and pet permits; and coordinating USAKA-related activities with the government of the RMI," he said.

Lojkar has been in this position since October. He replaced Hiram Malolo who is now the Assistant Secretary of Education on Ebeye.

"My position title is the same and my duties are the same with the exception of the Ombudsman tasks, which are new to this position," Lojkar said.

"Our Marshallese employees need to know that they have an advocate with the commander's ear. The RMI Representative's position with Ombudsman duties ensures that USAKA takes into consideration the needs of our 1,400 Marshallese employees, giving them a voice in the Command's decision-making process," said Maj. Jeff Klein, USAKA Host Nation's chief.

Lojkar has been working for USAKA, first as a government contractor in the Host Nation Office, since 2000.

"In 2004, the RMI government's Ministry of Foreign Affairs concluded an agreement with USAKA

to assume responsibility for the position and consolidate it with the RMI Representatives position. "After a year-long transition period, I assumed full-time RMI Representative duties in October," Lojkar said.

Issues brought before Lojkar may cover a vast number of subjects.

"I handle a wide variety of issues — everything from managing the daily commute list from Ebeye to processing requests to visit Bigej to voicing the concerns of the RMI employees to the commander. It is a very diverse and demanding job, but I find it very rewarding," Lojkar said. Lojkar works for the RMI Ministry of Foreign Affairs. "My immediate supervisor is the Secretary of Foreign Affairs," he said.

As Ombudsman, Lojkar may be called upon to mediate a problem between an RMI employee and USAKA. "I try to contact everyone that is a stakeholder in the process and work to resolve the issue.

Most problems are due to miscommunication between the parties involved. The differences in our cultures sometimes create problems and lead to misunderstandings. I find that 90 percent of the time, once we explain the problem, people on both sides of the issue can come to a mutual understanding," he said.

According to Klein, Lojkar fits well with the position. "Noda is extraordinarily qualified for the position. He is well-respected by both the Marshallese and American communities living on Kwajalein Atoll. Noda's experience living in the United States gives him a special insight to the dichotomies that exist between two very different cultures. It allows him to act as a mediator, reducing the friction caused by misunderstandings and misperceptions that invariably exist between the communities. His strength as an intelligent, generous, and understanding man makes him a leader in the eyes of all," Klein said.

"I was chosen for this position because of my long-time relationship with USAKA, my understanding of American culture and finally, my close familial ties to Ebeye and Kwajalein Atoll. It is an honor to serve the people of the RMI and Kwajalein Atoll. I was very lucky in that I was raised and educated on both Ebeye in the RMI and Ohio in the United States, so I can understand both sides of an issue and work to find a solution amenable to everyone," Lojkar said.

"It is a great honor to serve the people of the RMI as their representative to USAKA. I hope to continue the good work of my predecessor, Hiram Malolo, and continue to promote a healthy relationship with USAKA," Lojkar said.

Yard maintenance guidelines established



In an effort to keep Kwajalein in its highest state of readiness and looking pristine at all times, the Kwajalein Range Services Public Works Kwajalein Operations Department has established a yard inspection program to help foster island beautification.

The goal is to offer housing residents assistance by providing them with clear and concise yard maintenance guidelines and a self-help program that will support yard maintenance needs. A high level of support for residential yard maintenance needs ensures a successful island beautification program.

Yard maintenance guidelines:

- a. Residents of family housing and unaccompanied personnel housing trailers are responsible for maintaining the grounds surrounding their quarters. Yard mowing and trimming should be carried out at least 50 feet from the residence, to the road or fire lane, or to the midpoint between adjoining quarters, whichever is closer.
- b. Grass shall not be allowed to exceed 5 inches in height. After cutting, grass shall have a uniform height throughout, free of grass clippings on walks, drives or other-



Resident notification:

First notice. Personnel involved receive a warning from the LHO stating deficiencies. All deficiencies must be resolved within a week of receipt of notification. A copy is also sent to the supervisor.

Second notice. Personnel involved receive a letter from the LHO stating that if the deficiencies are not corrected within seven days the work will be done by Public Works and the resident will be billed for the effort. A copy will be sent to the Deputy Project Manager, KRS President and Base Commander.

Third notice. Personnel involved receive an invoice from Finance for \$50 Public Works service fee.

wise finished surfaces. Trimming within the improved area shall be accomplished each time such areas are mowed. Trimming includes cutting back grass in areas that are inaccessible to mowers; i.e., around potted plants, fences, tree trunks, etc.

c. Hedges and shrubs shall be trimmed or pruned prior to attaining a new growth of eight or more inches. All clippings shall be bagged and/or neatly bundled and left at the curb for trash pickup.

d. Fallen leaves shall be removed from yard areas and shrubbery. Removal shall be done no less than once every two weeks so as not to allow for accumulation of leaves to the extent that the grassed areas underneath could become smothered or damaged. Leaves shall be bagged and left at the curb for trash pickup.


e. Potted plant placement and quantities should be reasonable to allow for pest control management, building maintenance and emergency access to quarters. Residents are not allowed to plant hedges, shrubbery, tree or other plants without the written authorization of the Logistics Housing Office.

f. Trashcans shall be returned to side or back yard of quarters after trash pickup. Residents assigned to new housing must return trashcans to enclosed area located at front of quarters.

g. Personal items such as storage lockers, bicycles, children's toys and other accessories stored in front or back of quarters shall be neatly kept; cannot block fire lanes and roads; cannot prohibit pest control management, building maintenance and emergency access to quarters.

h. No amount of building material; i.e., lumber, brick, concrete blocks, pipe, etc., shall be kept at quarters. Residents have 90-days from purchase and/or transfer of ownership of such items to make use of them or remove them from the premises.

Stormy weather



November saw many rainy cool days

Last month residents of Kwajalein pulled out their sweatshirts and raingear as the sky opened up and attempted to set a new weather record for the rainiest and coolest day in November. No



records were broken, but the weather summary for the day was quite atypical. Nov. 29 was the wettest November day Kwajalein experienced in 11 years, with an accumulated 24-hour precipitation total of 4.44 inches. In the weather records for Kwajalein Atoll, which date back to 1960, only four other November days were wetter, making this event significant. The record precipitation event occurred on Nov. 24, 1975, with a 24-hour rainfall of 7.24 inches, followed by 4.85 inches on the 11th in 1994 and 4.59 inches in 1983. The latter is the daily record for Nov. 29.

Not only was it a soggy day on Kwaj, it was also a relatively cool one. The high and low temperatures for the day were 83 and 75, respectively. Normal maximum and minimum temperatures for this time of year are 86 and 78. Even though just 3 degrees doesn't seem like much, it is unusual for the tropics. In the spirit of the holidays, it was as much of a taste of autumn as Kwajalein

could hope to get. The 'chilly' temperatures occurred because as the rain fell to the surface, it dragged cooler air from above along with it. Known as entrainment, this is the process by which many of Kwajalein's coolest temperatures have been achieved. The lowest recorded temperature in November is 70 degrees, which, not surprisingly, occurred on the 24th in 1975, the same day as the record precipitation event.

Also unusual is the time of day these temperature extremes occurred. The temperature reached a high of 83 degrees in the early hours of the morning. This is abnormal, as high temperatures typically occur in the afternoon hours, when the atmosphere has absorbed the maximum amount of heat from the sun for the day. The lowest temperature usually occurs just before sunrise, when the earth has cooled off as much as it will before the sun starts warming it up again. However, as we witnessed on Nov. 29, as the heavy rains fell under overcast skies, temperatures continued to decrease after dawn, and reached the low of 75 around 9 a.m. Temperatures began to rise slightly after the rains died down, but not to exceed the earlier recorded temperature of 83 degrees.

A few rumbles of thunder may have been heard just before lunchtime as well. It was the third thunderstorm to move over Kwajalein this November. This makes 12 thunderstorms for 2005, which is also the average number of thunderstorms on Kwajalein annually. Thunderstorms are a relatively rare occurrence in this part of the world because updrafts are rarely strong enough to create the conditions necessary for lightning. Even though thunderstorms came out about average last month, the infrequent event is always a noteworthy one.

Now, as we enter the dry and windy season, feel free to put away those umbrellas for awhile, but you may want to hold onto your hats. More information on the climatology of Kwajalein can be found on the Reagan Test Site Weather Station Web site www.rts-wx.com.

Just Like Heaven. A couple who live on different sides of the divide of life and death discover just how many boundaries love can cross in this romantic comic fantasy. Elizabeth (Reese Witherspoon) is a hardworking and dedicated medical resident who, after 20 hours on duty, is heading home when she falls asleep at the wheel of her car and is involved in a fatal auto accident. Several weeks later, a man named David (Mark Ruffalo) takes over the lease on Elizabeth's apartment, but he discovers that she hasn't quite vacated the building. Elizabeth's body may be dead, but her spirit is still quite lively, and her ghost is insisting that the apartment is still hers...and that she wants him to move out. Global War on Terror

Honoring fallen heroes

The following 17 U.S. Servicemembers have died in the Global War on Terrorism.

Three Soldiers died at Tallil Air Base, Iraq, on Dec. 2, of injuries sustained earlier that day when their truck accidentally rolled over. The Soldiers were assigned to the Army National Guard's 148th Forward Support Battalion, 48th Brigade Combat Team, Forsyth, Ga. Killed were: **Staff Sgt. Philip L. Travis**, 41, of Snellville, Ga., **Sgt. Philip A. Dodson, Jr.**, 42, of Forsyth, Ga. and **Spc. Marcus S. Futrell**, 20, of Macon, Ga.

Sgt. Timothy R. Boyce, 29, of North Salt Lake, Utah, died at Landstuhl Regional Medical Center in Landstuhl, Germany, on Dec. 15, of a non-combat related cause. Boyce was assigned to the Maintenance Troop, Support Squadron, 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment, Fort Carson, Colo.

Spc. Joseph A. Lucas, 23, of Augusta, Ga., died in Balad, Iraq on Dec. 15, when an improvised explosive device detonated near his HMMWV during combat operations. Lucas was assigned to the 5th Squadron, 7th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, Fort Stewart, Ga.

Sgt. 1st Class John D. Morton, 31, of Stanton, Ky., died in Shah Wali Kot, Afghanistan on Dec. 15, when his dismounted patrol came under attack by enemy forces using small arms fire. Morton was assigned to the 74th Infantry Detachment (Long Range Surveillance), 173rd Airborne Brigade, Vicenza, Italy.

Cpl. Adam R. Fales, 21, of Cullman, Ala., died Dec. 16 from a non-hostile gunshot wound in Fallujah, Iraq. He was assigned to Combat Service Support Detachment-21, 2nd Marine Logistics Group, II Marine Expeditionary Force, Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, N.C.

Lance Cpl. Samuel Tapia, 20, of San Benito, Texas, died Dec. 18 from small-arms fire while conducting combat operations in Ar Ramadi, Iraq. He was assigned to 3rd Battalion, 7th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division, I Marine Expeditionary Force, Twentynine Palms, Calif. During Operation Iraqi Freedom, his unit was attached to 2nd Marine Division, II Marine Expeditionary Force (Forward).

Staff Sgt. Johnnie V. Mason, 32, of Rio Vista, Texas, died in Al Mahmudiyah, Iraq on Dec. 19, when an improvised explosive device detonated near his HMMWV. Mason was assigned to the 717th Ordnance Company, 184th Ordnance Battalion, 52nd Ordnance Group (Explosive Ordnance Detachment), Fort Campbell, Ky.

Two Soldiers died in Taji, Iraq on Dec. 20, when an improvised explosive device detonated near their HMMWV during combat operations. Both Soldiers were assigned to the 1st Battalion 15th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division, Fort Benning, Ga. Killed were: **1st Lt. Michael J. Cleary**, 24, of Dallas, Pa. and **Spc. Richard Junior D. Naputi**, 24, of Talofofo, Guam.

Two Soldiers died in Baghdad, Iraq, on Dec. 22, when an improvised explosive device detonated near their position during a dismounted patrol. Both soldiers were assigned to the 1st Battalion, 502nd Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division, Fort Campbell. Killed were: **1st Lt. Benjamin T. Britt**, 24, of Wheeler, Texas. and **Spc. William Lopez-Feliciano**, 33, of Quebradillas, Puerto Rico.

Two Soldiers died in Baghdad, on Friday, when an improvised explosive device detonated near their HMMWV. 

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE RECLAIMED WATER SYSTEM AND DRINKING WATER SYSTEM (SOUTHWESTERN TIP, INDUSTRIAL END OF KWAJALEIN ISLAND)

The Kwajalein Island reclaimed (non-potable) water system and drinking water (potable) recently exceeded a chlorine residual standard (chlorine residual below the compliance level) at one of the sampling points within both the potable and non-potable water distribution system(s). Although this situation does not require you to take any precautions, public notification is required under these circumstances.

The United States Army Environmental Standards requires that water entering, and within the water distribution systems meet certain residual chlorine levels to reduce the potential for bacteriological growth. Recently, one of the sampling points at the southwestern portion of Kwajalein was changed to better reflect the extremities of the distribution systems. This new sampling point shows residual chlorine levels which are less than the minimum compliance standard. The low chlorine residual is associated with user locations north of Building 1500, Reutilization and Disposal, on the industrial end of the island. For reference, this includes Building 1517, Liquid Nitrogen Plant and Building 1499, Ground-Based Radar. It is important to note that the water entering the distribution systems is acceptable and all other sampling points meet compliance standards.

What does this mean?

As a precaution, samples will continue to be collected and analyzed for coliform bacteria to ensure the water is protective of human health. Samples taken thus far have been negative for the presence of bacteria.

What is being done to correct the problem?

In the future the distribution line will be modified at the southwestern end of Kwajalein to help increase the flow and decrease stagnation of the water. Currently no health-based restrictions on drinking water use or the normal use of reclaimed water (irrigation, vehicle washing, etc.) are necessary.



Ducks on Roi test negative for signs of avian bird flu

Hourglass reports

In early November, several dead ducks were found on Roi Namur. In order to increase surveillance of possible avian flu in Micronesia, specimens for viral studies were taken from the birds and forwarded to the USGS National Wildlife Center laboratory in Wis-

consin. Kwajalein Hospital has now received a final report that the tests are negative for avian flu.

Please continue to contact Kwajalein Hospital when any dead fowl are encountered. Additional studies will be performed on migratory ducks if specimens meet criteria for submission.

Increased bike traffic calls for extra caution

As usual, with the increase numbers of visitors associated with the holidays and missions, we have a corresponding increase in vehicle traffic. Without safety precautions, bike riders could easily become involved in an accident. Please follow the rules for safe bike operation, as stated below. Parents are urged to review and enforce these rules with their children.

- Unless otherwise noted, bicyclists must observe and obey traffic signs just as operators of motor vehicles are required to do.

More bikes are on the road during the holidays due to visitors and children being out of school. Increased awareness of safety rules helps prevent accidents.



- Bicyclists must yield the right-of-way at all Stop and Yield signs to other pedestrians, bicycles or motor vehicles.

- Bicyclists should not impede the flow of traffic for any reason. Pull off the road if you must stop.

- Hand signals are required when turning on a bike.

- Park bikes in bike racks, not in front of doors, walkways, on the ground or in the road.

- Bicycles must be ridden on the right side of the road and kept off sidewalks. Ride single file when vehicles are present.

- No bicyclist may cling to another bicycle or motor vehicle while moving along a roadway.

- Lights are required sunset to sunrise. Be safe. Use them!

- Carrying passengers on bikes is prohibited except for infants in an approved child seat.

- At least one hand must be on the handlebars at all times.
