Housekeeping is resident's responsibility

Safety and housekeeping fit like a hand into a glove. Safety involves accident and injury prevention with hazard avoidance so people don't get hurt. Housekeeping 'at work' includes creating a clean and hazard-free environment.

I define a work area as any location where work activity is being done whether it's your official on-duty work location or at an off-duty location. Examples of off-duty sites could include a boat house, wood working shop or a project being completed at your dwelling.

Stacked wood, metal or building supplies, if stacked neatly or screened is fine. If, however, it looks like you are mid-way complete on a major project, and it's been that way for a half of year, neatly stack or dispose of the material.

Many of you have been really creative with your carports, patios and fencing, and I applaud the appearance and the stewardship! You are not on my list!

For those of you with 10 or 15 bicycles, three words: Bicycle heaven and kickstands. Use both and make



sure your children don't leave their bikes in the streets.

Now, there are penalties. I am supposed to give warning and bar letters for offenses, but I can't stand doing that so long as there is proactive movement to take responsibility for your areas. Let's do a spring clean-up over the course of the next month. Get rid of the stuff you no longer use, and put everything else away.

I will be bringing back the Quarters of the Month program. Details will be communicated in the very near future. So, let's take some pride in our surroundings and keep Kwajalein a clean and beautiful place to live.

Marine police aid Roi diver

Woman swept away by current, rescued after three hours

On Sunday a Roi-Namur scuba diver became separated from her partner and was rescued after three hours.

Helen Paige and Gregory Heffner filed a float plan for 6th Island [Edgigen] on the East Reef, but they actually went diving just South of Mellu Island on the West Reef according a Kwajalein Police Department report provided by Maj. Johnny Davis, U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll provost marshal.

"Paige entered the water without her partner Heffner, who didn't have all his gear on, to set the anchor and was swept away in the strong currents," Davis said.

Heffner then entered the water a short time later, could not locate Paige and was himself swept away. "He surfaced some time later and swam to Sand Island where he dropped his gear," Davis said.

Approximately two hours after Paige entered the water; Heffner contacted the boat *Maco* with Joe Minnick, an off-duty KPD officer and his dive partner Sue Van enger to assist. They picked Heffner up from Sand Island and returned him to his boat. KPD patrol boat *Safeguard* with Sgt. Jason Ellison and Constable Morson Langendrik responded and Marina boat R74 aided in the search according to Davis.

KPD was contacted at approximately 11 a.m.

"Approximately one hour later, Minnick and Van enger located Paige approximately one mile off Sand Island in Mellu Pass drifting out to sea—tired but OK. Paige was brought back to the marina where the on-call nurse checked her vitals and declared her fit," Davis said. He said Paige was located after approximately three hours in the water.

People diving off of a small boat must file a float plan with the Small

Boat Marina/Harbor Control. Divers intending to perform a walk-in dive must file their dive plan with the police desk.

"Sgt. Ellison had the presence of mind to ask the Small Boat Marina as to the exact location of the diver's boat. Had he responded strictly off the filed float plan, he would have responded to an area 10 miles away and on the opposing reef," Davis said, stressing the importance of following the filed float plan. He added, "do not enter the water without a dive buddy."

Davis said, "Float plans are filed with Harbor Control. At 15 minutes past the return time filed on any float plan, Harbor Control attempts to

In the Roi incident, I heard second hand that there was a plan to meet up at the anchor. Particularly in areas with a current, it can be impractical to wait on the surface," she said.

She added that if a diver loses sight of their dive buddy and are already under water, they should search for one minute, then surface and look for their buddy there.

"In this case, stay with the boat, and watch from there. Keeping one person on the boat is really important in these kinds of lost diver incidents. A diver on the boat can move up current or even summon additional help if required. A diver in the water is at the mercy of the current," she added.

Shier said that visibility is a factor of consideration when deciding how close you should stay to your diving buddy. "I get annoyed with my students if they get more than about 20 feet away," she said.

"I think the main lesson that should be learned from this incident is to dive within your capabilities. There is a considerable range of difficulty in local dive sites, from relatively undemanding sites like

Emon Beach, to challenging sites like Speedball," she said.

"All divers need to be aware of local conditions such as depth and currents that can make diving more difficult. Sites near passes can have strong currents, and anyone diving there needs to be able to evaluate conditions carefully, and dive elsewhere if conditions are not favorable. Sand Island is just inside Mellu Pass, and can experience strong currents. I have occasionally looked at conditions there, and then dove somewhere else," Shier continued.

Shier identified some areas that might be dangerous for divers. Areas near Kwaj that can have strong currents include: South Pass, Gea

Safety meeting attendance mandatory for divers

The next two Kwajalein Scuba Club membership meetings will also be their annual safety review meetings. The meetings are at 7 p.m., Wednesday and May 10 in the multi-purpose room.

Attendance annually at a safety review meeting is mandatory of all KSC members according to Bill Williamson, club president. A third presentation will be held May 27.

In order to streamline the process, renewing members will no longer have to fill out a new membership application, medical statement or liability release," Williamson said. He added that those forms are on file. "Of course, new members will still have to complete all three. All members will have to sign a statement of understanding, which is the same form that most signed while attending scuba classes," he said. He requested that members who have upgraded their certification since last April bring their cards with them to the meeting.

achieve radio contact with the overdue craft. In the event radio contact cannot be established, Harbor Control will notify the marine police who will initiate search and rescue procedures. Dive plans for walk-in dives are filed with the police desk. At 15 minutes past the completion time filed on any dive plan, the police desk will notify the Marine police who will initiate search and rescue procedures."

Lisa Shier, a member of the the Roi-Namur Dolphins Scuba Club and certified by the Professional Association of Diving Instructors, said that it is uncommon for everyone to get in the water simultaneously. "Usually, people will wait on the surface or in a designated location (such as the anchor) for their buddy.

The Ringer, A guy trying to do the right thing ends up taking part in one of the most morally dubious con games in history in this comedy. Steve Barker (Johnny Knoxville) is an office drone who wants to move up the corporate ladder, but when he asks his boss for a promotion, it comes with a condition — Steve has to fire Stavi (Luis Avalos), who has been the firm's janitor for years. Steve decides to soften the blow by hiring Stavi to do his lawn and garden work. However, an accident robs Stavi of several of his fingers, and since he doesn't have medical insurance, Steve needs to find a way to pay for his surgery. Steve's uncle Gary (Brian Cox), a sleazy type who will bet on anything, also needs some fast cash, and comes up with a get-rich-quick scheme — Steve was a track star in high school, and with the Special Olympics Championships coming up, all Steve has to do is pretend to be mentally challenged, enter the competition, and win the running events against six-time medalist Jimmy (Leonard Flowers).

The Chronicles of Narnia, Four siblings — Edmund (Skandar Keynes), Lucy (Georgie Henley), Peter (William Moseley), and Susan (Anna Popplewell) — are sent from their London home to the country estate of an eccentric professor in order to ensure their safety during World War II. The house is very dull, except for a large, ornate wardrobe discovered by young Lucy during a game of hide-and-seek. Venturing inside of it in the hopes of finding a hiding place, Lucy is transported to a snowy alternate universe: a magical world called Narnia. The land is populated by talking animals and ruled over by the benevolent lion god Aslan (voiced by Liam Neeson), but sadly, the world is also in a state of perpetual winter. The white witch Jadis (Tilda Swinton), lustful for power and governed by narcissism, has cursed Narnia with a tyrannical decree that it will always be winter but never Christmas.

Staff Sgt. Brock A. Beery, 30, of White House, Tenn., died in Habbaniyah, Iraq on March 23, when an improvised explosive device detonated near his LMTV followed by enemy small arms fire during combat operations. Beery was assigned to the Army National Guard's 2nd Battalion, 123rd Armor Regiment, Bowling Green, Ky.

Sgt 1st Class Randy D. McCaulley, 44, Indiana, Pa., died in Habbaniyah March 23, when his dismounted patrol came under enemy small arms fire during combat operations. McCaulley was assigned to the Army National

Guard's 1st Battalion, 110th Infantry, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 28th Infantry Division, Indiana.

Spc. Frederick A. Carlson, 25, Bethlehem, Pa., died in Taqqadum, Iraq on March 25, from a non-combat related cause. Carlson was assigned to the Army National Guard's 228th Forward Support Battalion, 2nd Battalion, 28th Infantry Division, Bethlehem.

Staff Sgt. Christopher L. Robinson, 36, Brandon, Miss., died in Sangain District, Afghanistan on March 25, when his HMMWV came under enemy small arms fire during combat operations. Robinson was assigned to the Army National Guard's 2nd Battalion, 20th Special Forces Group, Jackson, Miss.

Sgt. 1st Class John T. Stone, 52, of Norwich, Vt., died Tuesday in Lashkagar, Afghanistan as a result of enemy mortar and small arms attacks during combat operations. Stone was assigned to the Army National Guard's 15th Civil Support Team, South Burlington, Vt.

Sgt. Michael D. Rowe, 23, New Port Richey, Fla., died in Rutbah, Iraq on Tuesday, when an improvised explosive device detonated near his HMMWV during combat operations. Rowe was assigned to the 46th Engineer Battalion, Warrior Brigade, Fort Polk, La.






