But his determination, courage and heart won the admiration and respect of the varsity team members and the coaches.


Rudy's dream finally came true during the last game of the season in his senior year.

May is transition between dry, rainy seasons

Was it just me or did it seem like it rained pretty hard on Thursday?

Thursday was the wettest day of the year so far, according to David Ross, station climatologist at 3D Research Corporation, Reagan Test Site weather station.

He said Kwajalein was doused with 3.01 inches of rain, and more than half of that fell during a 4-hour period from 5 to 9 p.m.

"It made for a wet ride home for some folks, and a dank time at work for others," he said.

The rain dump isn't all that surprising because May is a transition month between Kwajalein Atoll's dry season and rainy season.

"We are gradually making our way into the rainy season. This season lasts from June through October, with November not being too far outside of that range as another transition month. The average rainfall for the rainy season approaches 53 inches when the two transition months are excluded, and increases to almost 73 inches when they are included," Ross said.

"Although it has been rather wet lately, this type of weather is typical for the month of May," Ross said. Based on measurements from the past 61 years, the average rainfall for the month is around 9 inches. As of Monday, the total for the month was 7.78 inches, which is around 3.61 inches above normal for mid-month.

"While this [the May rainfall so far] may sound impressive, there is always the chance of falling below normal for the month. In a way it could be considered unusual weather, but not when it is compared to normal rainfall amounts. Some may look at it as abnormal if they are referring it to May of 2005, because last year we only received 2.68 inches of rainfall, but in reality, that was an unusually dry month. Even if 2.68 inches sounds pretty dry, when measured up to the normal it is not the driest on record; this occurred in 1984 with only 0.53 inches of rainfall,"

Ross said.

According to Ross, the weather cycle on Kwajalein alternates between a dry season (December-April) and a wet season (June-October), with the two remaining months (May and November) acting as a transition period.

"Hearing the term 'dry season,' some people may think we don't get any rainfall; however, this is not the case. The dry season is more commonly characterized by light trade wind showers of short duration, accompanied by the steady blowing of northeasterly trades over the region. That said, it is important to note that showers are still fully capable of reaching strong intensities and dropping significant rainfall amounts across the atoll. The wet season is characterized by increased chances for rain and thunderstorm activity, while being accompanied by variable, lighter winds. This is due mainly in part to the shift of convection to our south, as it gradually pushes northward trying to follow the sun. While it is more common for daylong rain events in the wet season, it is not unheard of for the dry season with most of the wettest 'dry' season months having higher rainfalls than the average of those months in the 'rainy' season," Ross said.

So far this year, Kwajalein has received 22.89 inches of rainfall, which is approximately 1.6 inches or 6 percent below normal. May's rain is making up for a 24 percent below normal rainfall as of the end of April. Ross identified the normal value when determining rainfall averages as a mean over the past 30 years. "We generally see about 100 inches of rainfall each year, with around 72 percent of that being in the wet season. Having said this, we can expect more rainy days as we continue to approach the wettest months of the year, September and October, averaging around 11 inches and 11.8 inches respective-

ly," he said.

Weather on Kwajalein and Roi-Namur is quite similar. "Rainfall amounts across the atoll, as with most places in the tropics, generally decrease the further north you travel. To put this into perspective, we have a wet and dry season at the Kwajalein Atoll, whereas National Weather Service personnel on Majuro define the seasons as 'wet' and 'wetter.' For this pattern, seen from 7°N southward in the Marshalls, rainfall amounts are quite a bit higher than on Kwaj. Majuro's average rainfall over the past 51 years is around 130 inches, a 30 inches surplus over Kwaj's average," he said.

Ross admitted that some days it may appear as if Roi must indisputably get more rainfall, or the other way around, but it is simply variability.

"Whenever you are comparing two sites, whether they are right next to each other, or in this case between 40-45 miles apart, there will always be some sort of variability. On numerous occasions, islands nearby have been drenched, while Kwaj stays relatively dry, and it works the total opposite way as well. Even on the tiny isle of Kwaj there are bound to be rainfall differences. The island is just long enough that it could be pouring on northern portions without a drop falling at the weather station, and vice versa. Like real estate, it's about location, location, location - not to say that the timing isn't important," Ross said.

Petersons take first, second place in race

It took two weeks to complete this year's Kwajalein RustMan triathlon. Typically the top finishers cross at about the two and a half hour mark, but this year they showed up ready to swim on May 2 and didn't make it to the tape until Monday evening.

That's endurance. Or I guess you could blame it on the weather since the May 2 competition was postponed due to heavy rains.

Fortunately, the weather cooperated on Monday with the occasional light misting more of a cooling aid than a hindrance.

For the first time in the 27 RustMan competitions a wife and husband team came in first and second overall. Krystal Peterson beat her second-place husband Brent by almost 10 minutes and shaved a minute off her personal-best time. Krystal finished in 2:24:09.

Krystal is a three-time RustMan entrant and said before the start she knew it would be a "mind over matter" type of race. When I go for this type of distance it's not about who is in the field."

The Peterson one-two finish wasn't the only record maker this year. Julianne Kirchner set a new

junior high girl's record with a 2:50:06 finish, breaking Lee Shoemaker's 2:57:23 race from 1985. Julianne's mother, Judy, is a RustMan veteran having first competed in the late 1980s before Julianne was born, according to Bob Sholar, Kwajalein Running Club president and RustMan guru. On the other end of the age spectrum, Ray Smead, 67, broke his own Social Security Eligible record by 2:13 even though he completed his swim-bike-run on rainy May 2.

Three other athletes competed on May 2, as they were not going to be on island Monday. Mike Howard, who was on Kwajalein for temporary duty, joined the sub-2:20 club with a 2:19:22 finish. "Two-time winner Tom Cardillo followed Howard by just 25 seconds that day, turning in his

second sub-2:20 and sustaining his 'fast-run segment' reputation," Sholar said. He added that Howard had been warned of Cardillo's running speed and worked hard to build a bike lead that proved just fast enough to hold Cardillo off.

"I don't have a strong event, but I prefer the run the most for two reasons," Krystal said. "It is that portion of the race that you have the most control over, no bike can break, no one to kick your goggles off, your not clipped in (to the bike) when children run in front of you, etc. and it is the last segment."

She admitted that the swim segment is her weakest, "Because I never swam before coming to Kwajalein, along with biking or running and it's not something that I am comfortable with. It feels like you're swimming in a washing machine at times out there."

Krystal has learned some lessons in three competitions, helping her to improve her times and strategy. "The toughest part of the race is not allowing myself to come off the bike too fast and trying to run quickly right away. I learned the hard way my first year and cramped up within minutes. Your legs are in good enough shape to take off from the transition, but your body is thinking something else entirely. I have learned to ease into the first loop and increase the speed slowly from there. Its hard to hold back when you want to go faster and the crowd is cheering you on, but then you also know what can happen if you do," she said.

Anyone who has seen Krystal running, biking or swimming recognizes her dedication to fitness. She said that personally there's always room for improvement and recommended that if someone wanted to compete they should, "Set a goal, start early, get a buddy, and do it, or a segment, at

least once before you leave. It also helps to consult someone who has done it before to gain from their lessons learned in training.”

Krystal trained for 11 weeks for this year's RustMan, running, biking and swimming plus lifting weights twice a week. “I would like to thank my training buddy, my husband, Brent. It was fun to travel over 900+ miles with you swimming, biking and running Kwajalein in the last few months. Thanks for keeping the pace,” Krystal said. She added with a smile, “You really didn't have to let me win.”

Sholar identified two other RustMan highlights: Jack Carey became only the third person to compete in the SSE Division, and team runner Doug Hepler, after several years of methodically dropping weight and time for the RustMan smashed through the 1-hour, 10K barrier with a time of 55:44.

“I know of no accidents Monday, unless we count the minor sprocket marks on Jim Stepchew's leg. Jim was a support-staff bike catcher again this year. There were some individual contestants with

significant dehydration afterwards, but none required fluids through needles,” Sholar said.

The RustMan is a 1 kilometer swim, a 42-km bike ride and a 10-km run. “There were 13 individuals and 34 team members on the course Monday. The large volunteer support staff about matched them 1-to-1,” Sholar said.

“I would like to add that Bob Sholar is what makes this event so fun for everyone. Without his effort and support, the RustMan would not be so anticipated every year,” Krystal said. “I love to see his face after each event when you have set a personal best; his face gleams with pride like it's your own parent and it makes you want to see that smile again the next year. And thanks to the water crews for tossing water on me every lap. The Hill boys were great! Also thanks to all the volunteers, the course felt extremely safe. Everyone participating really appreciates all the volunteers and cheers around every lap.”


