

I had recently put in a very nice concrete patio in my very nice back yard and the duck loved that patio.


Now, let me tell you something about ducks. They can't go 30 seconds without making doo doo. Do you know what gobs of duck doo doo make out of a concrete patio?

New school superintendent arriving in June

Dr. Cynthia Clary has been hired to be the Kwajalein School superintendent.

Clary has more than 21 years in education and is the Riviera, Texas schools superintendent where there are 525 children in grades pre-kindergarten through 12.

This will be her first overseas job, "My family and I believe it will be a wonderful opportunity, both professionally and personally," Clary said.

If Clary's name sounds familiar it could be because she was originally hired to work on Kwajalein prior to Dan Frazier's tour, but due to a family situation had to decline. "During the medical exam process, it was discovered that my husband was in the early stages of Type II diabetes. It was truly a blessing that we found out! It is under control now with medication," she explained the earlier change in plans.

She's on her way now, with her husband, Paul, and their three children, Allison, 16, Lauren, 14 and Zachary, 12.

Clary believes she will bring "a hands-on approach to education and increased involvement" to the position of school superintendent. "I

am completely involved in every aspect of the school. Having three kids helps because it allows me to see a different view of decisions I make as administrator. I get the students' perspective, too," she said.

"During the last 10 years, I have accomplished a great deal both personally and professionally. I have met three of my 'life goals.' These goals have impacted my educational philosophy," Clary said.

She identified the goals, "The first was the completion of my doctorate. It took me the entire 10 years available to finish. I'm especially proud that my children participated in my efforts and now realize the importance of education in their lives," she said.

She continued, "The goal I reached in the past eight years was to move into a district-level administration. The position allowed me to see the operation of an entire district, not just one campus or one program."

And her third goal was met when she moved into the superintendent position.

Clary said that the personal attention students receive in a small-school environment such as Kwajalein is perhaps the biggest opportunity they get.

However, she recognized that liv-

ing in an isolated location such as Kwajalein could have its downside, and that there might be "a sense of isolation and difficulty in transitioning back into a bigger place."

She said she believes a good school district is one that cares about its students. "Regardless of the student's ethnicity or socioeconomic level, each child has the right to an education that will provide him or her with the skills necessary to choose his or her path in life," she said.

She added that a good leader is someone who is approachable by all and is an excellent listener. "Everyone has an opinion that is important to them. Thus, all stakeholders should be heard. Only then can a truly collaborative, informed decision be made that is in the best interest of the children."

Clary has a master and doctor of education from the University of North Texas. Her major for her doctorate was educational administration and her major for her master's was public school administration. Her bachelor of arts is from the University of Texas at Arlington and her major was in English and French.

She has been the superintendent at Riviera School District since May 2002.

Strengthening security

National Guard to support Border Patrol

Southwestern border states will deploy up to 6,000 National Guardsmen to provide support to border patrol missions, President Bush said Monday evening in a nationally televised speech.

"For decades the United States has not been in complete control of its borders," Bush said from the White House.

He said he intends to see that an additional 6,000 Border Patrol agents are trained to join the existing 12,000 by the end of 2008. The National Guardsmen will act as an immediate stopgap measure in the interim.

Bush stressed that National Guardsmen will not be involved in direct law enforcement activities, but will help exclusively in support functions. "The Border Patrol will

remain in the lead," he said. "The Guard will assist the Border Patrol by operating surveillance systems, analyzing intelligence, installing fences and vehicle barriers, building patrol roads, and providing training."

The initial commitment of Guard troops would last one year, Bush said. "After that, the number of Guard forces will be reduced as new Border Patrol agents and new technologies come online," he added.

Bush said Monday and government officials have said repeatedly over the past several days that the United States is not seeking to militarize its southern border. "Mexico is our neighbor and our friend," the president said. "We will continue to work cooperatively to improve security on both sides of the border, to confront common problems like drug trafficking and crime, and to reduce

Date Movie - The glorious Hollywood institution of the romantic comedy gets raked over the coals in this broad parody of any number of boy-meets-girl flicks. Julia Jones (Alyson Hannigan) is a young woman who wants nothing more than to find the man of her dreams and settle down. Julia meets Grant Fonckyardoder (Adam Campbell), a handsome and charming Englishman who falls head over heels for her.

Eight Below - An American geologist (Bruce Greenwood) flies to Antarctica where he teams up with arctic guide Jerry Shepard (Paul Walker) and his best friend, Cooper (Jason Biggs). The scientist soon discovers that Shepard also has eight other valuable friends — a pack of sled dogs he's worked with for years, who have rescued him from a number of tight spots. As the three men explore a frozen mountain region, an unexpected accident coupled with a massive storm front forces them to fly to safety, leaving the dogs behind. Shepard is determined to rescue his canine friends, but he has to wait until the weather will allow him to travel back to the mountain, while the dogs struggle against the elements to survive as they attempt to make their way back home. *Eight Below* was inspired by a true story involving Japanese researchers exploring the Antarctic in 1957.

However, while Wendy may have survived the night at the park, she soon discovers that a malevolent spirit is following her and her classmates as they begin dying in strange and horrible ways.

illegal immigration."

In an earlier briefing that was embargoed until after the president's speech, Fran Townsend, the president's assistant for homeland security and counterterrorism issues, explained that the departments of Defense and Homeland Security will work together to determine mission requirements for the National Guard troops, then the National Guard Bureau will help identify units to meet those requirements.

"Think of things such as intelligence, surveillance and infrastructure," she said. "There will be a combination of both Guard deployments and contractors to fulfill those mission assignments, depending on the expertise that's required and available."

National Guardsmen should

begin taking up duties in these missions "sometime in early June," Townsend said.

Townsend also noted that officials believe 3,000 Guardsmen will be needed for such missions during the plan's second year. She said the Guardsmen will be under operational control of the governor in whose state they are operating but that the federal government will pay for the deployments.

Having 6,000 National Guardsmen supporting border enforcement efforts for a year should not be construed as deploying 6,000 servicemembers for the year, Townsend said. Instead, officials hope the mission requirements can be fulfilled by carefully managing the two- to three-week annual training require-



Meck oceanside caution area is wedge-shaped centered on Meck latitude 9N, longitude 167 43.4E.



45.8E, then to a point at latitude 08 52.8N, longitude 167 45.8E and then to a point north of the high tide mark on Ninni Island on the west reef. Bigej Island, including the inner reef, is specifically excluded and is not part of the mid-atoll corridor.


In order to ensure clearance of non-mission support personnel from the mid-atoll corridor by the window opening time, Kwajalein Police Department island clearing procedures will begin at 7:30 a.m., Tuesday and continue until evacuation has been accomplished. Egress of all air and seacraft will be required when requested by authorized clearance personnel. Subsequent to lagoon clearance, the hazard area will be in effect until mission completion.

ments for Guardsmen. This would help meet mission needs without assuming additional costs, she said. In all, she said, nearly 160,000 Guardsmen could rotate through southwest border duty in this period.

The temporary National Guard deployment is part of a comprehensive plan to deal with the vexing problem

of illegal immigration. In addition to deploying Guardsmen and increasing the number of Border Patrol agents, Bush proposed improving administrative procedures to cut the average deportation time for those captured along the border and a guest worker program to reduce the number of people trying to sneak across the bor-

der illegally.

"All elements of this problem must be addressed together," Bush said, "or none of them will be solved at all."

Officials Monday stressed this mission will not detract from the National Guard's roles in the war on terrorism and in supporting its home governors.
