community of Kwajalein Atoll, are working hard cooperatively to prepare for the upcoming Water Safety classes tentatively scheduled for October 3.



Typhoon's affect on Wake Island assessed

Damage not as extensive as military officials, meteorologists feared

A Coast Guard assessment team is wrapping up a detailed storm damage evaluation on Wake Island after Super Typhoon Ioke slammed the island.

Typhoon Ioke hit Wake Island with 155 mph winds and 40-foot waves giving rise to speculation by military officials and meteorologists that damage on the island would be severe.

A Coast Guard C-130 performed an initial aerial assessment of Wake Island on Sept. 3, taking photos of damage less extensive as expected. Photos showed roofs torn off buildings with most structures still intact and the airfield free of significant debris. Following the flyover, the C-130 flew into Kwajalein to refuel before heading back to Coast Guard Air Station Barbers Point, Hawaii.

The Coast Guard assessment

team flew into Kwajalein later that evening to hitch a ride to Wake Island with the Coast Guard Cutter *Sherman* when it was unclear if the airfield would be operational.


The Coast Guard Cutter *Sherman*, based in Alameda, Calif., was first detoured to Kwajalein from Guam to avoid running into Typhoon Ioke. The *Sherman* departed for Honolulu after refueling on Kwajalein, and was later diverted back to Kwajalein tasked with transporting the assessment team and equipment to the typhoon-ravaged island according to USGC *Sherman* Ens. Brian Trapp.

On Labor Day the *Sherman* left Kwajalein, with the Coast Guard assessment team aboard, and headed for Wake Island, arriving on Thursday.

The 188 Wake Island evacuees, the majority who are Thai nationals employed by Chugach Corporation, continue to be housed at Hickam Air Force Base and various Honolulu hotels.

Wake Island is used primarily as a refueling station for military flights crossing the Pacific Ocean, and is located approximately 615 miles north of Kwajalein.

Ocean walk-in dive planned for Sunday

Hardcore divers on Kwajalein have probably explored every inch of and every wreck in the lagoon, but one dive eludes them – a walk-in east reef dive. Get ready to check that off the list.

The Kwajalein Scuba Club is sponsoring the first reef walk-in ocean dive since the club was founded in 1964 for Kwajalein divers.

The walk-in dive is scheduled for 1:30 p.m., Sunday, rally point behind the Adult pool. If conditions are unfavorable, the dive will take place the following day, Sept. 18. The club will celebrate the dive with a cookout immediately following exit from the water. Divers interested in participating should be fully equipped with mask, snorkel, fins, exposure suit, Buoyancy Control Device, regulator, alternate air source and surface signal device, according to Michael Malone, KSC Chief Dive supervisor.

The dive is open to KSC and Roi-Namur Dolphin members with an Advanced Open Water certification or higher. "Individual divers within this group must determine if the dive is within their limitation," said Malone.

Divers can expect to see a wide range of coral and reef fish while swimming along the reef wall at a maximum

depth of 130 feet. "Everything out on ocean side is much more spectacular than in the lagoon," said Master Diver Elliott Moseley.


An east reef dive will give divers the opportunity to learn about surf entries, tides and currents, said Bill Williamson, KSC president. Divers will develop a new set of skills in understanding how the ocean works at the shoreline contrasted with their knowledge of a lagoon dive.

Walking to a dive from the shore can be physically challenging depending on the water conditions; large waves can knock down a diver. The real challenge is at the conclusion of the dive, trying to exit the water.

"A large surge comes in and the water shoots back out into the ocean before the next wave comes," said Moseley. "So you are underwater and all of a sudden you're getting a wave that may surge you 25-feet back towards the ocean."

To get back to shore, the diver must grab onto the rocks waiting for the surge to pass, and then slowly work his way forward, hand-over-hand. If conditions are deemed unsuitable on Sunday, then the dive will be postponed.

A walk-in dive off the east reef is a unique social event on Kwajalein precisely because it is a rare occurrence. An added bonus is the ease and simplicity it affords divers in planning a dive.

“It’s just easy. Pack up your gear. Put it in your bike. Come over to the ocean side and just walk into the ocean,” said Moseley. “Right now, in order to get ocean side you have to get into the club, go down to the marina and drive out through one of the passes.”

“The main attraction is not having to sign out a boat,” agreed John Fraser, KSC member. “All you have to do is get a tank and take it to the shore, basically.”

East reef dives are unheard of around Kwajalein and normally off limits, prohibited under US Army Kwajalein Atoll water safety regulations. “KSC has been working closely with USAKA Safety for a year to open

this up to a one-time dive,” said Williamson. USAKA approved the dive on the condition KSC provide extra safety precautions.

Although an east reef dive is still prohibited, KSC has been evaluating the possibility of providing more walk-in dive opportunities. Two previous test dives were conducted over the past year with KSC and USAKA working together to evaluate conditions of walking in during different tides and gather data, said Williamson. The test dive

Making beautiful music

Renowned classical pianist will give third Kwajalein concert Sunday at high school

Classical pianist Roman Rudnytsky enjoys taking the occasional detour from conventional concert hall performances to perform in musical venues off the beaten path. This globetrotter has performed in major cities and rural villages in 85 countries, with future tours scheduled in Guatemala and Azerbaijan.

The well-traveled pianist is revisiting Kwajalein to perform a public concert this weekend on Kwajalein. This will be his third appearance on Kwajalein as he kicks off his Micronesian tour with performances in Guam, Saipan and Pohnpei.

The free concert will be 7p.m., Sunday in the Davye Davis Multi-Purpose Room on the high school campus.

"We only get to hear a classical performer of this stature every few years. People won't want to miss it," said Dick Shields, Kwajalein High School band director. "This is a rare opportunity to hear a very accomplished musician. He brings a tremendous amount of excitement to his musical interpretations."

Rudnytsky's recital will include selections by Mozart, Chopin, Beethoven and mix things up with "a short, very flashy and effective work called 'Trez Danzas,' by Guatemalan composer Manuel Herrarte," said Rudnytsky.

Attending a Rudnytsky piano recital is unlike any other night at a typical concert. Rudnytsky interacts with the audience before each piece, hoping to share with concertgoers some insight into the music.

It is his attempt to break through the perception that classical music is stiff, formal and boring and have the audience understand "this type of music has a lot of richness and variety, and has stood the test of

time over centuries."

"If there are people in the audience attending a classical recital for the first time in their lives," said Rudnytsky, "I would like them to have this be a positive experience for them, to have them see how beautiful and enjoyable this type of music can be, and thus to overcome any negative perceptions they may have had when they heard the words - classical music."

The son of Ukrainian musicians, Rudnytsky studied piano at the age of four performing his first solo recital just three short years later. He went on to attend Juilliard School in New York, followed by graduate studies at Peabody Conservatory in Baltimore. Rudnytsky is a piano faculty member at the Dana School Music at Youngstown State University in Youngstown, Ohio.

"I love and enjoy performing for whatever audiences are willing to listen," said Rudnytsky, "and I enjoy going to all sorts of places around the world to do this."


