


# Who's really guilty of intolerant behavior?

## Beer, barbecue contest draws 20 entries

**F**or many, the combination of barbecue and beer is a natural. Apparently on Kwajalein the lure of that combo is irresistible.

Sunday evening a group gathered at the American Legion Veteran's Hall to try eight distinctive flavors of home brew and 12 pulled-pork barbecue samples ranging from mild to spicy.

Event organizer Bud Teague said "You have to make your own fun on Kwaj." He

added combining the brewing and barbeque seemed like a good way to get people out.

Five independent judges were chosen for each competition. And were told to rate the entries from one to five using the criteria of 'what tastes best.'

The brewer who won the judges' choice admitted he prefers wine over beer, but that didn't keep him from entering and winning this competition. Rick Funk's Honey Pale Ale took first prize. He said he cooks the brew for a day, gives it a week to ferment, then bottles it and it is ready to drink within a couple of weeks. "My next door neighbor, at West Point [New

York] was a home brewer. I asked him 'how do you do it?,' Funk said. Funk added that learning to brew was easy and he had been doing it since 1997 but preferred making wine over beer.

Funk's beer, a light golden color, is made with 3 pounds of honey for each 5 gallons of beer. Many of the other beers in the competition were dark.

The Brew-B-Q was the first of its kind on Kwajalein, though home brewers also compete during the Spring Break Music Festival in April.

Teague, who is an avid, self-taught chef, thought combining brew with barbeque would add a little something extra.

The pork was prepared with a slow-cook; dry-rub and smoked technique meaning the sauce was served on the side.

Pork judges took small tastes of each of the 12 entries, with comments such as "it's really good," or "some are very spicy, some are sweeter" and a

couple of "hard to chose." Funk, was not only the brewing champion, but also a judge in the barbeque competition. He said between bites, "There's none that I would throw out."

In the end, using the prevailing criteria of 'what tastes best,' there was a winner. Steve Hill's pork took the top prize, even though he was not personally at the competition.

"A lot of people like to cook," Teague said. Adding many people enjoy the planning and process that goes into feeding a large group. "This is an option for them," Teague added.

Teague expected as many as 300 people for the free event, and was not disappointed as brew and barbecue fans came by throughout the evening.

"If we do this again next year, we'll check for conflicts in the schedule," Teague said. Also on Sunday night was the first performance of Kaleidoscope of Music. Teague anticipated people would stop by the Vet's Hall after the show.

# Taking care

## February is National Healthy Heart Month

February is Healthy Heart Month and according to the National Coalition for Women with Heart Disease, heart disease is the leading cause of death among women, killing six times more women than breast cancer. Although awareness is growing, it continues to be seen as a man's disease. In a survey conducted 4 years ago of more than 1,000 U.S. women, only 34 percent recognized heart disease as the leading cause of death in women. When the survey was repeated in 2003, this rose to 46 percent. Even so, most women don't believe they are personally at risk — only 13 percent of the women cited heart disease as their greatest health threat. Not surprising, since less than 40 percent of the women said their physicians had discussed heart disease with them.


Women are also confused about the seemingly contradicting scientific findings reported in the media. 63 percent of the women surveyed said they were confused about how hormones affect the heart.

Current recommendations for the treatment and diagnosis of heart disease are based on studies conducted primarily on white, middle-aged men. A review of more than 15 years of research concluded that there are not enough data to determine whether many established tests and procedures

work equally well in women. A key problem is even when studies include women, results are not always broken down by gender, making it difficult to determine whether the findings apply to women.

A new study backs previous research showing that daily aspirin affects men and women differently. A combined analysis of six large studies found that aspirin reduces a woman's risk of having a stroke by 17 percent, but does not significantly reduce her risk of a heart attack. For men, aspirin reduced the risk of heart attack, but not stroke. The results were published in the January issue of the *Journal of the American Medical Association*.

The six studies analyzed involved more than 95,000 people who did not already have heart disease, but who may have had risk factors. Most study participants were in their 50s and 60s.

## School Advisory Council holds monthly meeting

### Hourglass reports

The North Central Association Accreditation team visit, scheduled for March 1-3, was a primary topic of discussion at the Feb. 15 School Advisory Council meeting.

Dan Frazier, superintendent Kwajalein Schools, explained the importance of the NCA accreditation. "Kwajalein School is held to a higher standard than the average public school because we earn our accreditation through the North Central Association."

He added, "Three NCA officials will be here to review our current school improvement plan and ensure that we are doing all the things in practice that we have targeted on paper. At this point, our school leadership and administration are completely comfortable

and confident in where we are in terms of preparation for our NCA visitors. We have a quality school, and we are sure it will be reflected in our NCA Peer Review."

In other business, four policies passed unanimously. They were:

- Policy 2000.07 Line of Authority – which was revised to clarify communication channels between students, parents and other members of the community with school faculty. It was renamed Policy 2000.07 Communication Channels.

- Policy 3000.01 School Calendar – was revised to clarify that the school calendar will be recommended by the superintendent no later than January each year.

- Policy 3000.08 Child Care Services – was revised to read services are available for resident children age 2 through 6.

- Policy 3000.20 Testing Policy – was revised adding flexibility for the school to target specific areas for school improvement and adapt their metrics toward measuring student growth. "Our school needs a policy that outlines the parameters of our testing program in general terms," said Dan Frazier, Kwajalein School's superintendent.

Frazier reported he attended the University of Northern Iowa Overseas Recruiting Fair in early February. He conducted nearly 50 interviews for the following positions: Junior/Senior mathematics with advanced placement and computers and elementary third and sixth grade teachers.

Teri King, representing adult education, announced electronic

- Do not cross between the tram trailers at any time
- No children under 12 without responsible individual

- One beep of horn signals stop
- Two beeps of horn signals ready to move forward

"The new tram system will make loading and unloading of passengers much easier and safer. With only a single 15-inch step adults and children will have an easier time climbing aboard. Also, loading luggage will be more convenient," he added.

Metelak admits the new tram will take some getting used to and learning the safety rules may take time. A primary safety issue is children on the tram. Parents are asked to educate their children on the safety re-

quirements of riding the tram. If any passengers become unruly, the driver will radio for assistance from the Kwajalein Police Department.

The vehicle which pulls the trailers is an aircraft tug, and drivers require special training.

Metelak said using this new system will save money. The 4-cylinder engine tug is less expensive to run than the busses and the trailers are primarily plastic and stainless steel so they will have a longer life than the currently-used busses.

The tram, with a licensed driver, will be available for rent by private organizations and individual when it is not used for its daily routes. For more information, call Metelak at 53596.

Three trials included only men, one included only women, and two trials included both genders. More than 51,000 women were involved in these studies.

Previous trials found that aspirin had a positive effect in reducing the risk for heart attacks and had no effect on strokes. But most of these studies involved only men. This latest analysis shows the folly of assuming what is true in men must also be true in women.

Overall, aspirin reduces the likelihood of experiencing any heart-related troubles (such as heart attacks, strokes and heart disease-related deaths) in men and women. However, when looking specifically at heart attack, aspirin did not appear to help women.

Aspirin, however, was helpful in reducing a woman's risk of certain kinds of stroke. For ischemic strokes (those caused by blockages in the arteries that supply blood to the brain), aspirin reduced the risk by 24 percent in women. Ischemic stroke is the most common type of stroke. For hemorrhagic stroke

(one caused by a burst blood vessel in the brain), aspirin had no effect on a women's risk. However, aspirin increased a man's risk of hemorrhagic stroke by 69 percent.

The researchers believe the sex difference may have several explanations. First, women experience more strokes than heart attacks, while men experience more heart attacks than strokes. Second, men and women process aspirin differently; women are more likely to experience aspirin resistance, in which a person's blood does not thin in response to the aspirin.

It is important to note these findings refer only to women who have not had a heart attack or been diagnosed with heart disease. Regular aspirin reduces the risk of dying or having a heart attack in women who have already had a heart attack, been diagnosed with cardiovascular disease, or undergone angioplasty or bypass surgery. Taking aspirin during a heart attack is also a lifesaving measure.
