

Today's actions bring tomorrow's consequences

During the summer of 1998, I was visiting my family in St. Louis while on vacation.

My brother had somehow managed to get tickets to a Cardinals' game. That was a miracle because every Cardinal home game was completely sold out far in advance.

Baseball fever was rampant in St. Louis that year. Of course, St. Louis has always been a great baseball town, but 1998 took it to a whole new level.

It wasn't because the Cardinals were playing all that well. In fact, they were way behind in the standings.

The fans packing the stadium that day, and every day the Cardinals played, came to see one man and the amazing quest he was on.

As I watched from my seat behind the Cardinal's dugout, Mark McGwire walked to the plate in the bottom of the first inning, and the cheers were deafening. I had seen him on TV, but being as close as I was, I could see just how huge he really was.

He dug in at the plate, the pitcher foolishly threw a fastball down the middle and McGwire got all of it, and as 50,000 fans watched, the ball majestically sailed into the center field upper deck, a distance of 550 feet. It was one of the most incredible things I've ever seen. I was struck by the thought that I was truly witnessing history.

The game continued and to tell the truth, I don't remember what the score was or who was winning when McGwire came to the plate again in the fifth.

A different pitcher faced him for that at bat and threw a slider down and away.

McGwire swung, and the power of that swing was something to behold as the ball landed in the last row of seats in right field. It was a chip shot for McGwire, only 485 feet.

McGwire rounded the bases and tipped his hat to the crowd giving him a standing ovation. The man had the love of an entire city.

But it wasn't over yet.

McGwire came to bat in the seventh against yet another pitcher and hit a line drive to left field that just cleared the fence for his third homer of the day.

Three homeruns off three different pitchers. It was just another day for McGwire.


I walked out of that stadium at game's end knowing I had witnessed something very special that I would never forget.

As everyone knows, McGwire broke Roger Maris' single season homerun record that year after a thrilling battle with Sammy Sosa.

That season in 1998, and those two men were credited with saving the game of baseball and bringing fans back to the stadiums.

But then came the steroid-use allegations and the humiliation of testifying before congress.

When Shoeless Joe Jackson of the Chicago 'Black Sox' was accused of taking money to throw the 1919 World Series, a young boy in a crowd yelled out to him, "Say it ain't so, Joe."



That's what people wanted McGwire to do. Say it ain't so, Mark.

But he wouldn't say either way.

I love McGwire and Sosa for what they did that year. I loved that magic season they gave to an entire nation. But I hate the way they did it.

This past week, McGwire was turned down for induction into the Hall of Fame. Sosa and Barry Bonds will no doubt share the same fate.

Three of the best to ever play the game of baseball will probably never have their names enshrined in that hallowed place.

The sad part is that they never needed to take steroids or other drugs. They were great players without them.

There's a teacher at Kwajalein High School who tells his students that their actions of today will bring consequences in their tomorrow.

I think Mark McGwire would agree.

A few issues ago, I wrote about 18-year-old Ross McGinnis, who saved fellow Soldiers in Iraq from a grenade blast by smothering it with his body. I would like to pass on that he has been recommended for the Medal of Honor.



The Black Dahlia Director Brian De Palma returns to the helm for the first time since 2002's *Femme Fatale* with this stylish screen adaptation of James Ellroy's novel detailing one of the most notorious unsolved murders in Hollywood history. Elizabeth Short (Mia Kirshner) was a struggling actress looking to make a name for herself in 1940s-era Tinseltown. Unfortunately for Elizabeth, it was her grim fate that would ultimately overshadow anything she would accomplish during her short and tragic career. When police discover Elizabeth's body cut clean in half and with all of her organs missing, ex-pugilist detectives Lee Blanchard (Aaron Eckhart) and Bucky Bleichert (Josh Hartnett) are the men charged with cracking the case and apprehending the killer. This isn't your average murder case, however, and as Blanchard's marriage to Kay (Scarlett Johansson) begins to suffer due to his obsession with the sensational crime, his partner Bleichert discovers a troubling link between the victim and the mysterious Madeleine Linscott (Hilary Swank), a prominent socialite and the daughter of one of the town's most connected key players.

Wicker Man A young child has gone missing and it's up to a haunted, but determined policeman, to travel to the remote island community where she was last seen and solve the lingering mystery of her disappearance in director Neil LaBute's updated reworking of Anthony Shaffer's 1973 cult horror classic. Upon receiving a letter from his one-time fiancée, Willow (Kate Beahan), imploring him to search for her missing daughter on the secluded island of Summersisle, California highway patrolman Edward Malus (Nicolas Cage) quickly makes his way to the island to locate the girl and seek an answer as to why Willow suddenly and inexplicably disappeared shortly before their wedding date. Once there, Malus is troubled to discover that although there are traces of the child to be found in such locations as the local schoolhouse, the residents of Summersisle seem reluctant to offer any specific details as to the girl's apparent death.

Global War on Terror

Honoring fallen heroes

The following 12 U.S. servicemembers have died in the Global War on Terror:

Sgt. Aron C. Blum, 22, of Tucson, Ariz., died Dec. 28 at Naval Medical Center, San Diego, Calif., of a non-hostile cause after being evacuated from Al Anbar province, Iraq, on Dec. 8. Blum was assigned to Marine Aerial Refueler Transport Squadron 352, Marine Aircraft Group 11, 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing, I Marine Expeditionary Force, Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, Calif.

Sgt. Thomas E. Vandling Jr., 26, of Pittsburgh, died Jan. 1 in Baghdad, Iraq, of wounds suffered when an improvised explosive device detonated near his vehicle while on combat patrol. Vandling was assigned to the 303rd Psychological Operations Company, Oakdale, Pa., a subordinate unit of the U.S. Army Civil Affairs and Psychological Operations Command (Airborne), Fort Bragg, N.C.

Staff Sgt. Charles D. Allen, 28, of Wasilla, Alaska, died Jan. 4 in Baghdad, of injuries suffered when his unit came in contact with enemy forces using small arms fire during combat operations. He was assigned to the 296th Brigade Support Battalion, 3rd Brigade, 2nd Infantry Division, Fort Lewis, Wash.

Tech. Sgt. Timothy R. Weiner, 35, of Tamarac, Fla., **Senior Airman Elizabeth A. Loncki**, 23, of New Castle, Del. and **Senior Airman Daniel B. Miller Jr.**, 24, Galesburg, Ill. killed Sunday by a vehicle-borne improvised explosive device while performing duties in the Baghdad area supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom. The Airmen were assigned to the 775th Civil Engineer Squadron, Hill Air Force Base, Utah.

Maj. Michael L. Mundell, 47, of Brandenburg, Ky., died Jan. 5 in Falujah, Iraq, of wounds suffered when an

improvised explosive device detonated near his vehicle during combat operations. Mundell was assigned to the 1st Brigade, 108th Division (Institutional Training), Spartanburg, S.C.

Cpl. Jeremiah J. Johnson, 23, of Vancouver, Wash., died Jan. 6 in Baghdad, Iraq, of wounds suffered when his vehicle rolled over Dec. 26 in Baghdad. Johnson was assigned to the 3rd Battalion, 509th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 4th Brigade Combat Team (Airborne), 25th Infantry Division, Fort Richardson, Alaska.

Spc. Raymond N. Mitchell, III, 21, of West Memphis, Ark., died Jan 6 in Baghdad, of wounds sustained during route security operations. He was assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 14th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division, Fort Drum, N.Y.

Spc. Eric T. Caldwell, 22, of Salisbury, Md., died Sunday in Iraq of wounds sustained when his unit came in contact with enemy forces using small arms fire. He was assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 8th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas.

Sgt. James M. Wosika, Jr., 24, of St. Paul, Minn., died Tuesday in Fallujah, Iraq, of wounds suffered when an improvised explosive device detonated near his unit while on combat patrol. Wosika was assigned to the 2nd Combined Arms Battalion, 136th Infantry, Crookston, Minn.

Pfc. Ryan R. Berg, 19, of Sabine Pass, Texas, died Tuesday in Baqubah, Iraq, of wounds suffered when his unit came in contact with enemy forces using small arms fire. Berg was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 12th Cavalry Regiment, 3rd Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas.




