You know, a little while ago I wrote a column in which I said some crimes are unforgiveable under any circumstances. If this crime doesn't fit that mold, I don't know what would.


I guess I'm just not a forgiving person.

I know none of you did it for public recognition, but simply because you care.



# Kwajalein dry season approaching

## *Conservation is required as fresh water supply drops*

With the gentle rains and green vegetation abounding, it is hard to imagine that water conservation is an issue on Kwajalein. But it is, according to Stan Jazwinski, Liquid Systems manager.

He said that Kwajalein is now in the dry season, when rainfall drops to less than three or four inches a month for about three months.

In the rainy season, the water tanks are usually full, but during the dry season the water level gets lower.

Without water conservation during the dry months, "We will start running out of both potable and non-potable water," Jazwinski said. Potable water is fit to drink; non-potable water is reclaimed sewage that has been treated but may be hazardous to drink.

Residents can conserve water. "Leaving water on is wasting water," he said. Residents with yards or plants to water should do so every other day with non-potable water, and then only for less than one hour.

"If the ground is saturated, turn off the water," Jazwinski added. He said that you should never waste potable water on plants.

According to documentation provided by Jazwinski, rain contributes the majority of fresh water on the island of Kwajalein, about 100 inches per year. Rain is gathered in the catchments and is pumped directly into the raw water storage tanks, while the rainwater that falls around the catchment area percolates down to the water table and remains on the topmost layer of the fresh water lens.

"Fresh rainwater quickly penetrates Kwajalein due to its coral composition. Since fresh water is lighter than salt water, it floats on top of the salt water," Jazwinski said.

The fresh water, which is trapped in a lens-shaped water table, is harvested by the lenswells. These wells consist of perforated plastic or cement pipes, which are buried just below the level of the water table at the lowest tide. The fresh water fills the pipe and is then pumped to the sump with a submersed pump

in the well. To prevent saltwater intrusion, the chloride level or salt content of the pumped water is closely monitored.

The Kwajalein water treatment plant has three sources of supply: rainwater collected from runway catchments; lenswells skim fresh water from the uppermost region of the water table; or fresh water

lens and reverse osmosis water purification units convert brackish water into fresh water.

Water from the catchments and lenswells is pumped into

one of 11 raw water storage tanks. The tanks, 130 feet in diameter and ten feet high, hold a volume of one million gallons each. These tanks serve as reservoirs of fresh water for the island population. The water drawn from the tanks must be treated prior to delivery into the potable water distribution system.

From the storage tanks, water is drawn into the treatment plant with two raw water pumps. Aluminum sulfate is added as a primary coagulant and then a polymer filtering aid is added prior to the water entering the absorption clarifiers. The treated water forms a floc that adheres to the inert plastic particles inside the clarifier as the water flows upward through it. The floc is retained inside the clarifier, which allows the clear water to flow down over the filter media by gravity into an underground sump outside the building. After filtration, the water is treated with chlorine, sodium carbonate to reduce corrosion and on Kwajalein, fluoride, according to Jazwinski.

In the distribution system, the elevated storage tank level rises and falls depending on the daily water demand from the community

During the dry season, water is barged from Kwajalein to Meck and Carlos. Water is barged to Third Island from Roi-Namur.

Conserving water is the responsibility of the community, according to Jazwinski. For more information on how you can help with water conservation, call 51847.

## *Ebeye, Kwajalein residents observe annual Kwajalein Atoll Memorial Day*

**S**ixty-three years ago the Battle of Kwajalein changed the future of the Marshallese people. Each February 9 the residents of the Kwajalein Atoll celebrate Memorial Day in remembrance of those who lost their lives in the World War II battle.

On Friday the community of Ebeye marked the day with songs, a traditional Jobwa dance and speeches by local and national leaders.

Dr. Clyde Bishop, U.S. ambassador to the Republic of the Marshall Islands, also spoke.

Even though it was a hot, sunny day with only a slight breeze off of the ocean, hundreds of people gathered outside the Ebeye Community Center. Members of the U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll staff and the Kwajalein Junior and Senior High School Marching band represented Kwajalein.

“The battle of Kwajalein was one of the turning points of the second world war,” Bishop said. “Since then, Kwajalein has continued to play a key role in the development of the Marshall Islands.”

He continued, “On Memorial Day, we remember the people who made the ultimate sacrifice to preserve and protect the freedom of their families and their countrymen and women. We pause today to thank and remember the brave men and women who made that sacrifice. We also honor those Marshallese, including many from the Kwajalein Atoll, who are serving with the U.S. military today and are courageously defending freedom and democracy in other parts of the world.”

Bishop, who was on his second trip to Kwajalein since becoming the ambassador in the fall, said he believed that the relationship between the people of the United States and the Republic of the Marshall Islands was based on shared values and goals for a secure, peaceful, prosperous and democratic Pacific region and world.

“It is my hope that the U.S. relationship with the Marshall Islands, including the Kwajalein Atoll, will grow ever stronger in the years to come. One reason I believe our rela-

tionship is so important is because in the twenty-first century, we are faced with very special challenges and opportunities,” he said.

“Before September 11, 2001, terrorism for most Americans and much of the rest of the world was something that happened in some far away country. Now it affects all of us in practically every phase of our lives.”

He added that weather and health concerns are also real issues for both the Marshallese and American people.

“The War on Terrorism, the tsunami relief efforts and now the threat of an Avian Flu pandemic and the reality of HIV/AIDS, have all taught us that it is vital we work together if we are to overcome these threats and take advantage of new opportunities,” he said.

A Jobwa dance group performed toward the end of the program. The Jobwa is based on the legend about a man named Lorenwa who slept for many days with no food or water. He dreamed about the invisible people called the Noneip, the stick danc-

ers. In his dream, Lorenwa saw a man from underground called Dri Ikjet. The Dri Ikjet was very handsome and an excellent dancer. When the Dri Ikjet danced with the Noneip, all the women were mesmerized by him. The Noneip became jealous and killed the Dri Ikjet. Afterwards, the performing of the Jobwa was limited by the Iroj. It became reserved for war preparation ceremonial or other special occasions. The dance is approximately 30 minutes long. It is many stories woven into one that depicts the many facets of Marshallese tradition.

## Army seeks designs for infantry, armor schools


The Army is accepting design ideas through March 31 for the shoulder sleeve insignia, distinctive unit insignia and motto for the Maneuver Center of Excellence.

The Infantry and Armor schools will collocate and become the MCOE at Fort Benning, Ga., during the next five years. The center will be responsible for all Army land-based maneuver training development, doctrine, and capabilities development for armor and infantry proponents.

"Throughout the history of modern warfare, Infantry and Armor have fought side-by-side as brothers in arms," said Maj. Gen. Walter Wojdakowski, chief of Infantry. "With the creation of the Maneuver Center of Excellence, Infantry and Armor will now train together forging an Army Strong partnership which produces America's best Soldiers, more capable than ever. The selected patch, crest and motto must reflect the historic strength of this partnership and of our Army."

Personnel assigned to the infantry and armor schools will continue wearing current shoulder sleeve and distinctive unit insignias that reflect the contributions, sacrifices and spirit of each branch.

Soldiers assigned to the MCOE will wear the new insignia.



"The challenge in designing the new insignia will be to capture the historic essence of each branch and their collective embodiment of maneuver as a principle of war," said Maj. Gen. Robert M. Williams, chief of Armor. "We're looking for innovative ideas to capture the significance of both Army and the Infantry lineage."

Current and retired military personnel and Department of the Army civilians may provide input for just one or all of the items.

### Submission guidelines

Requirements: A clear, hand-drawn or electronic sketch of the shoulder sleeve insignia, distinctive unit insignia, and a short, succinct motto. The motto must be written in English and is limited to 26 characters (letters and spaces). Individuals may provide a suggestion for just one or two of the desired items if they prefer.

Format: Designs should be drawn on paper or provided as electronic files. Electronic files should be in JPG or BMP format, and may be sent on diskette or CD-ROM via normal mail or as an e-mail attachment. All submissions must include the name, phone number, e-mail address, and mailing address of the individual submitting the designs and motto.



Submissions will be screened by the Maneuver Center of Excellence Board of Directors, which is chaired jointly by the Chief of Armor and the Chief of Infantry. The most suitable and acceptable concepts will be considered for forwarding to the Institute of Heraldry for final production of the patch and crest.

### Acknowledgement

The individual(s) who submits the shoulder sleeve insignia, distinctive unit insignia, and motto design that is selected by the board of directors will receive a framed final patch, while the top entries in each category will also receive an MCOE coin with certificate of recognition for top entries. These acknowledgements will be issued in the fall of 2008.

Disclaimer: The Department of the Army (Army) will acquire ownership of all entries, and each submitter agrees that submission of a design constitutes (1) assignment to the Army of any and all rights in the design, including copyright, and (2) a disclaimer of any trademark rights. **The Departed** As the Boston police force attempts to reign in the increasingly powerful Irish mafia, authorities are faced with the prospect of sending in an undercover agent or seeing their already frail grip on the criminal underworld slip even further. Billy Costigan (Leonardo DiCaprio) is a young cop looking to make a name for himself in the world of law enforcement. Collin Sullivan (Matt Damon) is a street-smart criminal who has successfully infiltrated the police department with the sole intention of reporting their every move to ruthless syndicate head Frank Costello (Jack Nicholson). When Costigan is assigned the task of working his way into Costello's tightly guarded inner circle, Sullivan is faced with the responsibility of rooting out the informer before things get out of hand.

**Flushed Away** A previously pampered society mouse must fight his way back to the comforts of Kensington after he is sent spiraling into an underground world filled with scavenger rats and villainous toads in a fun-filled family adventure produced by DreamWorks Animation and Aardman Features and featuring the voices of Hugh Jackman, Kate Winslet, Ian McKellen, and Jean Reno. Roddy (Jackman) was living the high life when he first met Sid the sewer rat (Shane Richie), but that's all about to change when Sid decides to send the hapless mouse down the pipes and stealthily take his place in the lap of luxury. Though the bustling sewer city of Ratropolis isn't without its fair share of kind citizens, it is certainly no place for a pampered mouse with a taste for life's finer things.

**The Prestige** Obsession, jealousy, and deceit define the tense relationship shared between two turn-of-the-century magicians in *Memento* and *Batman Begins* director Christopher Nolan's dizzying tale of slight of hand. Rupert Angier (Hugh Jackman) and Alfred Borden (Christian Bale) are London-based magicians of the highest order, both blessed with spectacular powers of deception and both cursed with unrelenting envy for one another's skills. When Alfred performs an awe-inspiring trick for which there seems no logical explanation, the friendly competition shared between the pair turns to deadly rivalry as the enraged Rupert determines to uncover his rival's deepest secrets.

# Honoring fallen heroes

Two Soldiers died Jan. 30 at Ramadi, Iraq, of wounds suffered when an improvised explosive device detonated near their vehicle during combat operations. They were assigned to the 1st Battalion, 77th Armor Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry Division, Schweinfurt, Germany. Killed were: **Sgt. Corey J. Aultz**, 31, of Port Orchard, Wash. and **Sgt. Milton A. Gist Jr.**, 27, of St Louis.

**Cpl. Stephen D. Shannon**, 21, of Guttenberg, Iowa, died Jan. 31, in Balad, Iraq, of wounds suffered when his vehicle was hit by a rocket during combat operations Jan. 30 in Ramadi. Shannon was assigned to the 397th Engineer Battalion, Wausau, Wis.

**Sgt. William M. Sigua**, 21, of Los Altos Hills, Calif., died Jan. 31 in Bayji, Iraq, of wounds suffered when his unit came in contact with the enemy using small arms fire during combat operations. Sigua was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 505th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division, Fort Bragg, N.C.

**Gunnery Sgt. Terry J. Elliott**, 34, of Middleton, Tenn., died Feb. 1 while conducting combat operations in Al Anbar province. Elliott was assigned to 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, 3rd Marine Division, III Marine Expeditionary Force, Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii.

**Hospitalman Matthew G. Conte**, 22, of Mogadore, Ohio, died Feb. 1 while his unit was conducting combat operations against enemy forces in the Al Anbar Province, Iraq. Conte was assigned to 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, 3rd Marine Division, III Marine Expeditionary Force, Kaneohe Bay serving as a hospital corpsman in Iraq under the command of I Marine Expeditionary Force.

Two Soldiers died Feb. 2 in Ramadi of injuries sustained when they came in contact with enemy forces using small arms fire. Killed were: **Spc. Alan E. McPeek**, 20, of Tucson, Ariz. He was assigned to the 16th Engineer Battalion, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 1st Armored Division, Giessen, Ger-

many and **Pvt. Matthew T. Zeimer**, 18, of Glendive, Mont. He was assigned to the 3rd Battalion, 69th Armor Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, Fort Stewart, Ga.

**Staff Sgt. Ronnie L. Sanders**, 26, of Thibodaux, La., died Feb. 3 in Baghdad of wounds sustained when an improvised explosive device detonated near his vehicle. He was assigned to the 407th Brigade Support Battalion, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division, Fort Bragg, N.C.

**Cpl. Richard O. Quill III**, 22, of Roswell, Ga., died Feb. 1 from a non-hostile cause in Al Anbar province. Quill was assigned to 2nd Battalion, 4th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division, I Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Pendleton, Calif.

**Sgt. Randy J. Matheny**, 20, of McCook, Neb., died Feb. 4 in Baghdad of wounds suffered when an improvised explosive device detonated near his vehicle. He was assigned to the 1074th Transportation Company, Sidney, Neb.
