# We would have seen an even worse tragedy

A young man walked into a Salt Lake City mall on Wednesday, and for reasons which will forever be known only to him, started shooting people he didn't know and had probably never seen before with the intention of killing many.

Five people were killed before an armed off-duty police officer, who just happened to be in the mall, shot and killed the assailant. How lucky for those who weren't injured or killed that the police officer was there to stop the shooter from killing any more people.

But what would have happened if that officer had not been there? How many more innocent people who were in that mall to shop, go to a movie, have a bite to eat and just have a good time, would have been wounded or killed?

For many years now, gun control has been a hot-button issue in America. There are those who want almost no restrictions on gun ownership and those who want absolutely no one to own a gun besides the police.

I have always been on the side of those who supported gun rights and the right to keep and bear arms as the Second Amendment allows. I own many firearms and when I lived in the states, I possessed a concealed carry permit for the firearms I owned. I took the time to learn the law concerning self-defense situations in which deadly force could be used. I was properly trained in the use of a firearm. I was a card carrying member of the National Rifle Association.

When I return to the states, whenever that might be, I will once again obtain a concealed carry permit and join the NRA.

I don't consider myself a 'gun nut.' I don't agree with the extremists or some in the NRA who believe that ordinary citizens should be able to own military-style assault weapons. I've never seen anyone I know hunt deer or ducks with an SKS or AK-47. Nor do I believe that citizens need to have armor-piercing ammunition or ammunition that will penetrate a police officer's body armor. There are many positions that some gun-rights advocates take that I think are ridiculous.

On the other hand, I vehemently disagree with those who want to take firearms away from every citizen in the country. On that score, I have to admit I'm with the 'from my cold, dead hand' group.

I've been a member of the NRA because I believe in the right of a citizen to have the means (a firearm) to protect himself and his family from criminals or some crazy who starts shooting people. There really is truth to the saying that 'when guns are outlawed, only outlaws will have guns.' How many mentally disturbed people have walked into a workplace, a restaurant or a shopping mall with the intention of killing as many people as they could?

And, unless a police officer just happens to be standing there, or unless a citizen has a gun and can take the

assailant down before they can harm too many people, what could anyone do?

Try to find a place to hide and hope that it's not their time or their family's time to meet their maker?

Think, just think, what would have happened if that police officer hadn't been in that mall at that precise moment.

How much more tragic would that day have been? How many times have we heard about a disgruntled employee walking into a place of business and leisurely strolling from office to office shooting defenseless workers? What if one of those people had a gun to fight back with?

Now, I don't think that just anybody should be able to walk into a gun store or a gun show and buy a handgun or a rifle. I believe in records checks and waiting periods so that someone's records can be thoroughly reviewed. I also think that someone's mental-health status should be made available if he or she wants to purchase any type of gun.


Of course, there'll always be the illegally-obtained firearms. So, proponents of strict gun control say it doesn't make any difference how many record checks or mental health checks are done on people. If someone wants a gun, they'll get one no matter what. So to their way of thinking, *nobody* should be able to get a gun, period. But what that *really* means is that no law-abiding citizen would be able to get a gun legally with which they may some day have to defend themselves against a criminal or mentally ill person.

I don't propose a return to the days of the Wild West when everybody wore a gun on their hip. But I do think that if a law-abiding citizen takes an intense gun safety course, learns how to properly fire a weapon and learns the laws concerning the use of deadly force in whichever state he or she lives, then they should be able to legally carry a concealed weapon on their person.

Some gun control advocates say that it would be like old Dodge City on a Saturday night if people carried firearms around with them. But I've carried a firearm for many years and so has my wife and we've never shot anybody. Many of my friends and family members have carry permits and they've never shot anybody either.

My wife used to have a job in the states that she worked many long hours at. She also attended night school. There were many nights she would drive deserted country roads in the wee hours of the morning. I always worried about her being alone those times, but I worried a little less because I knew she was armed and could defend herself if she had to.

Yes, thank God the police officer was there. But what if he hadn't been? That tragedy would have been far worse.

# President's Day celebrates Washington, Lincoln

## Hourglass reports

The U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll community will celebrate President's Day on Tuesday. The original version of the holiday was as a tribute of George Washington's birthday in 1796 (the last full year of his presidency). Washington, according to the calendar that has been used since at least the mid-18th century, was born on Feb. 22, 1732. By the early 19th century, Washington's birthday had taken firm root in the American experience as a bona fide national holiday. Then along came Abraham Lincoln, another revered president and fellow February baby (born on the 12th of the month). The first formal observance of his birthday took place in 1865, the year after his assassination, when both houses of Congress gathered for a memorial address. While Lincoln's birthday did not become a federal holiday like Washington's, it did become a legal holiday in several states.

In 1968, legislation (HR 15951) was enacted that affected several federal holidays. One of these was Washington's birthday, the observation of which was shifted to the third Monday in February each year whether or not it fell on the 22nd. This act, which took effect in 1971, was designed to

**Borat** Master of disguise Sacha Baron Cohen hits the road to explore America as the crude Kazakstani reporter Borat in a feature mockumentary that brings one of the *Da Ali G Show* star's most popular characters to life on the big screen. Sent by the Kazakh Ministry of Information to gain a better understanding of American culture and bring his findings back home, Borat and faithful producer Azamat (Ken Davitian) set their sights in New York City. When the citizens and interview subjects of the Big Apple seem less than receptive to Borat's distinctively unrestrained approach and the curious Kazakh television personality stumbles across an episode of *Baywatch* while channel-surfing in his hotel room, he becomes instantly smitten with screen siren Pamela Anderson. Now confident that the only way to discover the true essence of America is to travel to California and make the bikini-clad beauty his bride, Borat purchases a ramshackle ice-cream truck in which he and Azamat will make their way across the Great Plains and on to the sunny West Coast — all the while coming into contact with a wide variety of "typical" Americans. Within this loose, scripted framework, Borat engages in his usual misbehavior with unsuspecting strangers, from accidentally releasing a chicken from his suitcase on a New York subway ride to a formal interview with Alan Keyes.

**A Good Year** *Gladiator* duo Ridley Scott and Russell Crowe re-team for this adaptation of author Peter Mayle's best-selling novel about a London-based investment banker who relocates to Provence in hopes of selling a small vineyard he has inherited from his recently-deceased uncle. As a child, Max Skinner (Freddie Highmore) was taught to appreciate the finer things in life while wandering the vineyard estate of his sophisticated uncle Henry (Albert Finney). Life has a strange way of turning out how you least expect it to though, and twenty-five years later Max (Russell Crowe) is now a prosperous money man wheeling and dealing in the cutthroat world of London business. When Max learns that Henry has recently passed away and that he has been named the sole beneficiary of his late uncle's modest estate, the keen businessman hastily arranges a flight to France in order to assess the value of the old property and get it prepped for sale.

# Honoring fallen heroes

**Pfc. Tarryl B. Hill**, 19, of Shelby Township, Mich., died Feb. 7 while conducting combat operations in Al Anbar province, Iraq. Hill was assigned to Marine Forces Reserve's 1st Battalion, 24th Marine Regiment, 4th Marine Division, Mount Clemens, Mich.
