

Resident questions airport security procedures

I am writing this letter to share an experience, or should I say experiences, I have had with the security personnel at the Kwajalein airport terminal recently.

As my step-daughter and I were checking in on Feb. 19, we were called over by the security people who were checking our luggage. One of my items was a box that I had filled with toiletries, baby items, and food that I was taking to my wife on Majuro who is there having our baby.

I was asked where I had purchased the items, and I said here, on Kwaj, at Ten-Ten. I was then informed that it was against the rules to purchase items on Kwaj for transport to Majuro and that my box of goodies worth \$130 was going to be confiscated and incinerated.

Needless to say, I was not happy. But then, if I was breaking a rule, I didn't really have a leg to stand on.

Here's where my anger stems from. When my wife left on Jan. 26, she took a cooler with her that was filled with similar items, all purchased on Kwajalein. When I took her

to the airport, I witnessed the security personnel open the cooler, check all the items, return them to the cooler, and send it along to be put on the airplane. Before that, on Nov. 24, we sent my mother-in-law to Majuro with a box that was also filled with the same kinds of items also bought on Kwaj. Again I was at the airport at the time and the security people passed the package along without a word.

I asked the head security officer today if this was a new policy, and he said no, it's always been this way.

I can think of several reasons why I have seen this inconsistency. (1) Discrimination because I am an American and my wife and mother-in-law are Marshallese. (2) The incompetence of some security personnel who don't know their own rules. (3) Corruption in that my wife and mother-in-law got preferential treatment. (4) The officer didn't like me.

None of these reasons gives me a very good feeling about our security force on Kwajalein.



Howell steps down as interim superintendent

New superintendent brings enthusiasm, experience to job

High School Principal Steve Howell announced his intention to step down as interim superintendent beginning today at the Wednesday evening Student Advisory Council public meeting.

Howell will continue to serve as Kwajalein Junior/Senior High School principal until the end of the 2007 school year.

Allan Robinson, the newly hired Kwajalein schools superintendent is scheduled to arrive on island today at which time he will take over the reins of this position from Howell.

Howell publicly thanked the community for its support and assistance in fulfilling his responsibilities as acting superintendent, and encouraged island residents to wholeheartedly welcome Robinson.

"He has experience being superintendent. He has done it for years," said Howell, "and I plan on giving him my full support and assistance, and I would appreciate if everyone here would do the same."

Howell also gave a report on the corrective action Kwajalein schools will undertake in response to concerns expressed in surveys parents filled out during the November 2006 parent-teacher conferences.

Junior/Senior high school parents indicated a desire for an update and expansion of book selections in the library/media center. "This suggestion fits well into our school improvement plan goal that states, 'all students will improve their utilization of sources of information across the curriculum,'" Howell explained.

Beginning with the 2007-2008 school year the Library Media specialist will weed outdated materials and books, and purchase replacements more in line with curriculum needs at a cost of \$18,000 over three years.

Elementary school parent surveys identified "a need to improve and make better use of our technology resources." The technology resources parents speak of is more than the location of a computer within the classroom explained Howell; it encompasses student instruction in various program applications such as PowerPoint, and student usage relevant to classroom curriculums.

"I've asked the elementary school principal to establish a committee whose purpose will be to carefully examine this issue and to make a recommendation to us by the public SAC meeting in April," Howell said.

"I want it to be affordable, just as important to me is not the amount of money we spend, but that it be spent usefully and in a way that we will use it all the time," continued Howell. This corrective action taken, in addition to being affordable, must be attainable within the next three years.

Child and Youth Services Coordinator Jodi Yancey announced the hiring of personnel for two key positions. Nicholas Langley has accepted the Youth Activities Assistant Director position and Jason Kettenhofen will take on the position of Youth Sports Director. Both new hires are expected on island by mid-March.

Curriculum Specialist Darcey Hammond informed the SAC board of a public forum on Thursday evening in the multi-purpose room for parents and community members to weigh in on the planned changes to the science curriculum. Copies of curriculum proposals are available at the elementary and junior/senior school offices.

A first draft of the new science curriculum will be presented to the SAC council in March, with a vote of approval scheduled for April.


The next SAC meeting is scheduled for 7 p.m., March 21 in the George Seitz Elementary School music room.

Public Works meets many challenges moving trailers

Many neighborhoods on Kwajalein are changing. Thirty trailers have been removed by Kwajalein Range Services Public

Works.

“The trailers that were and are still being removed, are trailers that have been on the disposal list for some time,” explained Ken Bailey of the housing office.

Getting the trailers out of where they’ve lived for dozens of years isn’t an easy task.

“Major challenges occur when a trailer is located behind another or the trees and other obstacles

make lifting a challenge for the heavy equipment crews,” Fred McNickle of Public Works said.

“For the present we are removing 30 trailers with plans to remove all eventually,” McNickle said.

"This is driven by budgets and funding since removal costs are incurred for each unit including disconnection of utilities, actual move and relocation and site cleanup."

Concrete steps and other debris left behind by the trailer removal will be removed. The steps will be used elsewhere, as needed, "the concrete pillars and concrete pieces will be kept for shore line repairs," McNickle said. Each year the annual work plan forecasts the removal of a certain number of trailers based on budget according to McNickle.

"As we move forward with the removal of the trailers occupants will be advised well in advance of our intentions to remove their trailer," Bailey said. "Timing will determine where they actually go. The resident will be given a list of what is available that they qualify for depending on their housing status. They can then choose from what is available at that time. All moving and relocation costs will be covered by Public Works and our intention is to make the entire process as easy as we can for the resident."

This effort is directly related to "footprint" reduction which is the goal to eliminate structures that are beyond their economical life and exceed reasonable costs to maintain according to McNickle.

Removing the trailers will leave extra space in the housing area. "This gives the area a more open feel to it for all to enjoy, instead of looking at a vacant trailer," Bailey said. He added that neighbors can contact the housing office for guidance on building permits and appropriate procedures for using the recently-vacated areas.

The trailers are stored at

the south end of the island awaiting disposition.

Nine trailers were used by the Kwajalein and Roi Fire Departments as training tools.

"This is highly effective training because nothing simulates fire like real fire," Capt. Stephen Scruton, KFD, said. "Trailers present unique challenges that are difficult to replicate on the training grounds. In addition all firefighters have a semiannual requirement to participate in live fire exercises."

He added, "These training exercises allow the fire department to practice just about all aspects of firefighting except multi-story firefighting. Personnel utilize personnel protective equipment, deployed hose and ran pumping operations. A group of firefighters were placed in a room with fire hoses and allowed to study fire behavior from the beginning of the match falling on paper and other combustibles through the build up to just prior to the entire room being engulfed."

The exercise provided training on ventilation, removal of smoke; hose stream techniques; exposure protection, prevention of fire propagation to adjacent buildings, and external fire fighting were demonstrated and practiced.

"It is a great opportunity to be able to expose firefighters to the

hazardous conditions normally encountered on the job but have the ability to control them in a training environment. These training exercises were conducted without a single injury which is outstanding considering how hazardous the conditions were with temperatures in and around the trailers exceeding 1000 degrees accompanied by fire, smoke, unstable buildings and tropical heat," Scruton said.

Some of the trailers will be heading off to Majuro.

Alan Taylor of the Host Nation Office explained, "Kenneth Kramer will be

coming up at the end of this month with a Pacific International Incorporated barge to take trailers." Similar trailers are now used as residences on both Majuro and Ebeye.

In the meantime, Kwajalein Police Department's Capt. Moses Moreno reminds the community that the trailers are not public property.

"We have instructed our patrol officers to step up security efforts in the area of the trailers to ensure that no property is removed from the trailers unless otherwise authorized and to make periodic checks of the trailer for noticeable damage."

Wahoo-mahi tournament nets more than 3,500 pounds

The Wahoo-Mahi Bonanza Fishing Tournament held Monday was most definitely appropriately named as anglers participating in the tournament weighed in a total of 3,514.7 pounds of fish. Teams brought cooler after cooler up to the tournament weigh in station bursting full of Wahoo and Mahi-Mahi.

A total of thirteen boats, eleven from Kwajalein and two from Roi-Namur, participated in the tournament sponsored by the Kwajalein Atoll International Sportfishing Club. Categories for the tournament consisted of Wahoo, Mahi-Mahi and Aggregate Weight which was the total of all fish caught. Prize money awarded totaled \$2,600. An additional \$100 was awarded for the smallest fish caught in the tournament.

Team "Reel Em In" landed the largest Wahoo weighing in at 38.5 pounds. Captain John Norris, anglers Mary Norris, Alan Godwin and James Chong-Gum won 40 percent of the purse.

The largest Mahi-Mahi, weighing in at 17 pounds, was captured by team "Rueben J." Captain Tom Jack, anglers Chris Maurer, Yoshi Kemem, Brandon Ridens, and Herring Robert also won 40 percent of the purse. Team "Rueben J" also captured the smallest fish category with their 2 pound cawa cawa.

Team "Cudastanks" on Roi-Namur secured the Aggregate Weight category winning 20 percent of the purse with a whopping 701 pounds of fish. Captain Joe Coleman and team members Jeff Smathers, Darren Wilburn, Johnny Mejbon and Danny Nab continued to fill

The Departed As the Boston police force attempts to reign in the increasingly powerful Irish mafia, authorities are faced with the prospect of sending in an undercover agent or seeing their already frail grip on the criminal underworld slip even further. Billy Costigan (Leonardo DiCaprio) is a young cop looking to make a name for himself in the world of law enforcement. Collin Sullivan (Matt Damon) is a street-smart criminal who has successfully infiltrated the police department with the sole intention of reporting their every move to ruthless syndicate head Frank Costello (Jack Nicholson). When Costigan is assigned the task of working his way into Costello's tightly guarded inner circle, Sullivan is faced with the responsibility of rooting out the informer before things get out of hand.

The Black Dahlia Director Brian De Palma returns to the helm for the first time since 2002's *Femme Fatale* with this stylish screen adaptation of James Ellroy's novel detailing one of the most notorious unsolved murders in Hollywood history. Elizabeth Short (Mia Kirshner) was a struggling actress looking to make a name for herself in 1940s-era Tinseltown. Unfortunately for Elizabeth, it was her grim fate that would ultimately overshadow anything she would accomplish during her short and tragic career. When police discover Elizabeth's body cut clean in half and with all of her organs missing, ex-pugilist detectives Lee Blanchard (Aaron Eckhart) and Bucky Bleichert (Josh Hartnett) are the men charged with cracking the case and apprehending the killer.

The Prestige Obsession, jealousy, and deceit define the tense relationship shared between two turn-of-the-century magicians in *Memento* and *Batman Begins* director Christopher Nolan's dizzying tale of slight of hand. Rupert Angier (Hugh Jackman) and Alfred Borden (Christian Bale) are London-based magicians of the highest order, both blessed with spectacular powers of deception and both cursed with unrelenting envy for one another's skills. When Alfred performs an awe-inspiring trick for which there seems no logical explanation, the friendly competition shared between the pair turns to deadly rivalry as the enraged Rupert determines to uncover his rival's deepest secrets.

Mosteiro was assigned to the 1st Squadron, 7th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas.

Lance Cpl. Daniel T. Morris, 19, of Crimora, Va., died Feb. 14 while conducting combat operations in Al Anbar province, Iraq. Morris was assigned to 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, 3rd Marine Division, III Marine Expeditionary Force, Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii.

Pfc. Branden C. Cummings, 20, of Titusville, Fla., died Feb. 14 in Baqubah, Iraq, when an improvised explosive device exploded near his vehicle during combat operations. Cummings was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 12th Cavalry Regiment, 3rd Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas.




