

Past Hollywood movies prove what sells best


We always hear that sex and violence sell, right? They're what advertisers use to get us to buy stuff because they believe that old adage.

Marshallese funeral ceremony rooted in tradition

Our rich, inherited culture and our unique customs set us Marshall Islanders apart from the rest of the world. While many of our traditions have slowly drifted out of our daily rituals, one has remained strong and important within each family household - the funeral ceremony. Though there are many important gatherings in our culture, none will outrank the calling of family members to a funeral ceremony.

With the recent deaths of the parent of a current *Ri-Katak* student as well as the parent of a former *Ri-Katak* graduate of Kwajalein High School, you may be wondering how the Marshallese people observe a tradition funeral ceremony.

A funeral is always carried out in a traditional and timely fashion. It takes five phases to successfully complete a customary Marshallese funeral. Funeral services serve as a time for members of the deceased to assemble and *jit-ram menmenbwij* (obtain knowledge of blood relation from

Fitness Center receiving makeover

Ivey Gym getting new exercise equipment

Thirteen new pieces of fitness equipment will be installed at the Ivey Gymnasium requiring the closure of the facility for two days. The new equipment will replace larger, bulkier pieces and be user-friendly.

Ivey Gymnasium will close at 9 a.m., March 9 and reopen at 7:30 a.m., March 11. When the doors open patrons will find Cybex strength equipment, some replacing machines currently on the floor and some brand new to the facility. The fitness equipment is valued at \$60,000.

"With the base closures in Korea, we were able to obtain the fitness equipment at no cost through our Pacific Morale, Welfare, and Recreation regional representative at Ft. Shafter in Hawaii," said Torrey Landers, Kwajalein Range Services Recreation Programs manager.

The MWR representative had visited Kwajalein and knowing the needs and budget constraints of the Community Activities Office sent Landers a list of available fitness machinery.

"We got first choice in selection," Landers commented. "We were given a list of available equipment and were able to choose which pieces we wanted."

Of the 13 pieces of equipment shipped to Kwajalein, two were completely damaged in transit and two repeat machinery currently on the floor, and "what we have is in better condition," said Landers.

Landers and Community Activities Staffer Billy Coley will hold new equipment orientations for island residents unsure of how to use the new machinery. The orientations will be held 4 p.m., March 11 and

12. For patrons unable to attend the orientations they can request the assistance of Ivey gym staffers, who will receive training on all the new pieces.

"A benefit of this specific line of fitness equipment is that each piece has its own weight stack that can be changed with a pin - you don't have to move


weight plates to increase and decrease resistance," explained Landers.

Another benefit to the current gym-going population is that the new fitness equipment will fit their body type better, in particular women.

The older equipment was originally designed for someone 6 foot, 4 inches, weighing 280 pounds commented Landers. "I encourage everyone to come out, take a look and give it a try."

I started diving in December 1997, and immediately began dreaming about seeing the Yap mantas. I finally made it to Yap in October 2006 at the tail end of my Indonesia and Yap dive odyssey. Wow! What a way to top off a fantastic journey!

Yap is known as the Mysterious Isle of Stone Money and is a fascinating blend of yesterday, today, and tomorrow where ancient traditions, cell phones and computers peacefully exist side by side in the new millennium. English is widely spoken and the U.S. dollar

is the official currency, and yet traditional stone money can be seen throughout the island.

Yap is the westernmost state of the Federated States of Micronesia and an easy airplane ride from Kwajalein.

The friendly travel agents on Kwajalein walked me through this first step in making my Yap dive dream come true. Yap is a magnificent island of nice friendly people. If you are not a diver Yap is still a fabulous place to visit. There are lots of incredible topside activities to enjoy including dances, snorkeling, hiking,

and cultural tours. I really adore Yap. I felt safe and happy there, and can't wait to return.


The full service PADI dive facility I used owned by Dave Vecella, an American dive instructor, was a perfect fit for me. Dave helped me with all my arrangements, and promised me small group excursions and lots of personal attention. He and his cheerful Yapese guides, Morgan Tawer and Charles Tilweyar lived up to this promise, they treated me like royalty.

I also received the royal treatment from the owner of the hotel where I stayed and her staff who treated

me like a long lost friend. She welcomed me with warmth and generosity, and personally took me on a guided cultural tour of her island.

Right from the beginning of the very first dive there were many mantas swimming around us and with us. At that point I decided life was very good indeed. The next day of diving there were many mantas in the water with us - everywhere I looked there were mantas - sometimes dozens at once. It was mind-boggling to say the least.

At times there were four mantas gliding right over me. The guides strictly

told me to not touch the mantas, but they must not have told the mantas not to touch the divers because several came right over my head and gave me a gentle harmless touch as they glided off. The second dive of day two we stopped at a small coral head where two mantas were hovering beautifully a couple of feet above the bottom right in front of me, looking in my direction. They inched a bit closer and finally trusted me enough to hover right over me. It was unbelievable.

On one of the surface intervals two of the mantas had the nerve to jump up out of the water right by the boat - as if showing off for us in the water wasn't enough fun for them. My

guides and I squealed with delight. From the very first minute through the last minute of every manta dive I was lucky to share the underwater world with these lovely majestic animals. The hundreds of pictures I took do not convey the magic I felt while being in the water with these truly awesome lovely animals. Looking back I now know that these dives were the finest, most exquisite dives of my life. These are the dives I would most love to repeat.

Taking Care

National Sleep Awareness is Monday through March 11

National Sleep Awareness Week is Monday through March 11. According to the National Sleep Foundation, if you feel that your sleep is inadequate in some way and there are daytime consequences that appear to stem from the sleep problem, then you may have insomnia. If on the occasions that you do sleep well, your energy and mood improve and problems concentrating subside then this also suggests you have an insomnia problem. Daytime sleepiness is sometimes a result of insomnia, but not a reliable indicator of insomnia.

If you think you have insomnia, what should you do about it? Do the commonsense things. Practice good sleep hygiene. For example, it's important to try to get up every day at the same time and to eliminate or reduce napping during the day. Reduce or avoid stimulants like coffee or tea. Prepare yourself for bed – don't work until the last minute or spend time in bed worrying about problems. Try to create a safe, comfortable sleeping environment.

Behavioral sleep medicine experts or insomnia experts pay attention to the details of the problem which will suggest different causes and different treatments. You may only have trouble falling asleep, or you may have the kind of insomnia that's related to stress, stimulating medications or some other kind of sleep problem (such as limb movements during sleep). The specifics of your sleep disturbance will suggest different approaches to the problem.

The underlying causes of insomnia can include sleep hygiene problems (varying the sleep schedule, for example), stress, psychological problems (such as depression or anxiety), circadian rhythm disturbances (such as an evening type person trying to adapt to an early morning work schedule), pain and discomfort, and ingestion of activating substances (such as certain medica-

tions and stimulants like coffee or tea).

If you have symptoms of insomnia, when should you talk to your physician about it? The question answers itself. When you think the problem is serious enough, you should see your doctor. When sleep problems are impairing your mood or ability to function in any way, you should seek expert advice. You may not need help if these problems occur occasionally,

or if you're anticipating a major event in your life. But if these problems persist for a month or more, see your physician or behavioral sleep medicine expert.


What are the recommended methods of treatment? Cognitive behavioral therapy techniques are usually the first ones recommended because they are effective for a wide variety of causes of insomnia. This approach involves a combination of techniques such as stimulus control instructions, sleep restriction therapy, and addressing the cognitive aspects of sleep problems such as the tendency to worry about insomnia and misconceptions about sleep.

Medications can be effective in many cases, there are many on the market that are safe and effective. Sleeping pills or sedating antidepressant medications vary in how fast they act and the duration of their action. Therefore, choosing the right medication, the dose and timing its administration will depend on the characteristics of the sleep problem.

There are circadian rhythm treatments such as exposure to bright light or the ingestion of melatonin, which reset the body clock to allow you to sleep better at night and function during the day.

For some people, the cause of insomnia is a mood disorder or life problems, and they may find it helpful to seek psychotherapy where they can talk about these issues. There are psychiatric drugs that are effective in treating mood disorders and anxiety disorders.

The important thing to realize is that you don't need to suffer from insomnia. There are effective treatments available. Addressing insomnia may take some effort, but it is well worth it. More information is available from the National Sleep Foundation's Website, www.sleepfoundation.org.

all members of the family tree), paying last respects to the departed and showing family and community support to grieving loved ones.

Some would mistakenly think the process is accomplished within three phases excluding the unnoticeable *anak* and combining *emmej* with *ilomej*. The first phase is what we refer to as *emmej*, a time where family members and community members stay awake with the deceased body until it is buried. Sometimes this takes place at a hospital morgue, the home of the deceased, or a family member's home.

The body is prepared for viewing during the early stage of the *emmej*. The act of lubricating the body and placing pounded herbal medicine inside the nose, mouth, and ear of the deceased is a traditional

way of preserving the body from quickly decaying and acquiring strong odor.

The second segment is set out in a timely manner, it is the *ilomej* process. This is what Americans would commonly refer to as the viewing of the body. Though the process might be similar, there are distinct variations. For one, the *ilomej* could last for days depending on how many groups have requested to visit the body or where family members are flying in from for the burial.

Groups are usually led by a key speaker who speaks on behalf of the group; groups always have something in common with the deceased. Blood relatives and the maternal and paternal sides visit separately. Church members, teammates, classmates, co-workers also visit separately. Even friends, neighbors and co-workers

of close family members of the deceased show their respect by coming in as groups with their offerings such as bars of soap or dollar bills to place in and around the casket.

Killep is the third step, which is the actual burial. During the ceremony it is mandatory for the *Iroj* (highest traditional leaders) and *Alap* (land owners) who provide the burial site to be present or provide a representative on their behalf. Between the opening and closing prayers, speeches are given by the *Iroj*, *Alap* and members of the deceased on both sides of the family. Children and infants closely related to the deceased must walk or be passed beneath the casket right before it is lowered into the grave. This is an action believed to protect the little ones from haunting or bad spirits of the departed.

The fourth step, after the burial, is the *anak* process which lasts for 30 days after the burial. It is commonly understood as a time for family members to wait for the grave site to begin to decompose. It also serves as a time for the spirit of the deceased to end all earthly ties and to begin preparation for the next life.

The final process is the *aorek* ceremony which takes place three days after the burial. *Aorek* is similar to the *killep*, the only difference is white coral rocks are laid on the grave by close family members. This symbolizes their last interaction, the final goodbye. After the ceremony refreshments, towels, bar soap, and detergents are usually passed out to attendees representing the family's gratitude to the community for all its support in their time of hardship and need.

Casino Royale Actor Daniel Craig assumes the role formerly occupied by such screen greats as Sean Connery, Roger Moore, and Timothy Dalton to set out on the character's very first 007 mission. James Bond has earned his "00" status by masterfully executing a pair of death-defying professional assassinations. Now assigned the task of traveling to Madagascar to spy on notorious terrorist Mollaka (Sebastian Foucan) for his maiden voyage as a 007 agent, Bond boldly goes against MI6 policy to launch an independent investigation that finds him traversing the Bahamas in search of Mollaka's notoriously elusive terror cell. Subsequently led into the company of the mysterious Dimitrios (Simon Abkarian) and his exotic girlfriend, Solange (Caterina Murino), Bond soon realizes that he is closer than ever to locating well-guarded terrorist financier Le Chiffre (Mads Mikkelsen), the man who has personally bankrolled some of the most prevalent terrorist organizations on the planet.

Flags of Our Fathers Clint Eastwood's adaptation of the non-fiction book *Flags of Our Fathers* concerns the lives of the men in the famous picture of soldiers raising the American flag over Iwo Jima during that historic WWII battle. Battle scenes are intercut with footage of three of the soldiers - played by Ryan Phillippe, Jesse Bradford, and Adam Beach — who survived the battle going on a goodwill tour of the United States in order to sell war bonds. Many evenings they are forced to reenact their famous pose, something each of them finds more and more difficult to do as they suffer from survivor's guilt.

Man of the Year Good Morning, Vietnam duo Barry Levinson and Robin Williams re-team to tell the tale of a quick-witted radio talk-show host whose fanciful bid for the presidency becomes a surprising reality in the one political comedy that truly speaks for the people. When talk show host Tom Dobbs (Robin Williams) makes an offhand comment that he would be a better president than the leader who currently occupies the White House, a grassroots campaign conducted by his legions of fans finds him unexpectedly ushered into the Oval Office and forced to live up to his promise.

Global War on Terror Honoring fallen heroes

The following 11 U.S. service-members have died in the Global War on Terror: **Sgt. Buddy J. Hughie**, 25, of Poteau, Okla., died Feb. 19 in Kamdesh, Afghanistan, of wounds suffered when his unit came in contact with enemy forces using small arms fire and rocket propelled grenades. Hughie was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 180th Infantry, Oklahoma Army National Guard, Ada, Okla.

Spc. Louis G. Kim, 19, of West Covina, Calif., died Feb. 20 in Ramadi, Iraq, of wounds suffered when his unit came in contact with enemy forces using small arms fire. Kim was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 26th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry Division, Schweinfurt, Germany.

Three Soldiers who were supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom. They died Feb. 23 of injuries suffered when an improvised explosive device detonated near their HMMWV during combat operations in Ramadi, Iraq, on Feb. 22. All three Soldiers were assigned to the 1st Battalion, 9th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 2nd Infantry Division, Fort Carson, Colo. Killed were: **Staff Sgt. Joshua R. Hager**, 29, of Broomfield, Colo.; **Pfc. Travis W. Buford**, 23, of Galveston, Texas, and **Pfc. Rowan D. Walter**, 25, of Winnetka, Calif.

Spc. Ethan J. Biggers, 22, of Beavercreek, Ohio, died Feb. 24 in Indianapolis, Ind., of wounds suffered while on combat patrol in Baghdad, Iraq, on March 5, 2006. Biggers was assigned to the

1st Battalion, 502nd Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), Fort Campbell, Ky.

Army Sgt. William J. Beardsley, 25, of Coon Rapids, Minn., died Feb. 26 in Diwanayah, Iraq, of wounds suffered when an improvised explosive device detonated near his vehicle. Beardsley was assigned to the 260th Quartermaster Battalion, 3rd Sustainment Troop Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division, Fort Stewart,

Marine Lance Cpl. Anthony Aguirre, 20, of Channelview, Texas, died Feb. 26 of wounds suffered during combat in Anbar province. Aguirre was assigned to 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, 3rd Marine Division, 3rd Marine Expeditionary Force, Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii.

Pfc. Daniel Zizumbo, 27, of Chicago, Ill., died Feb. 27 in Bagram, Afghanistan, of wounds suffered from an improvised explosive device. Zizumbo was assigned to 1st Transportation Movement Control Agency, 21st Theater Support Command, Kaiserslautern, Germany.

Sgt. Chad M. Allen, 25, of Maple Lake, Minn., died Feb. 28 while conducting combat operations in Al Anbar province, Iraq. Allen was assigned to 2nd Light Armored Reconnaissance Battalion, 2nd Marine Division, II Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Lejeune, N.C.

Pfc. Bufford K. Van Slyke, 22, of Bay City, Mich., died Feb. 28 while conducting combat operations in Al Anbar province, Iraq. Van Slyke was assigned to Marine Forces Reserve's 1st Battalion, 24th Marine Regiment, 4th Marine Division, Saginaw, Mich.

cents to see a movie, think how much the older films really grossed in terms of today's money.

Now, some of the movies on that list had a taste of sexual situations and some had violence necessary to the story they told, but mostly they are about good versus evil, good values and love.

They have good plots, good acting and good stories. They don't have to rely on gratuitous sex and *mindless* violence to sell themselves. Families can go see them. They can be 'date' movies for young teens who can go see them without being embarrassed or uncomfortable. They can give young people a sense of what love, honor, sacrifice, courage and family values are really all about.

By contrast, movies such as *Show-girls* and *Striptease* which had noth-

ing to sell but sex were total flops and aren't quite in the same league as the movies I've listed in money earned.

No matter how much sexual content a movie has, it can't overcome a bad script and lousy acting (at least, not in a mainstream movie).

But, still, everyone says sex sells.

I don't know. When I was in my teens and I saw a commercial with a guy guzzling beer and two or three buxom blondes hanging all over him, I never really got to thinking that . . . gee . . . if I just chugged that brand of beer or smoked that brand of cigarette or chewed that brand of tobacco or wore that brand of shirt or wore that brand of shoes or whatever they were selling, that it would get me a date on a Saturday night.

The only thing sex sells is . . . maybe . . . sex. But let's take a look at that.

Estimates are that the 'mainstream' adult industry, including cable, DVDs, Internet and magazine sales total about \$1.33 billion annually and some estimate it at \$4 billion per year. Now, that's a lot of money no doubt, but even at the highest end of the estimates, the adult industry brings in less than two of the more successful movies in Hollywood history.

So, does sex sell? Of course it does. It always has and it always will.

But it's nice to know that for the most part, the moviegoing public still wants to see decent films more than stinkers that have sex in them.

One would think Hollywood studios and independent movie makers would pay attention to their own history and see what *really* sells best.

It isn't sex and violence.

It's *good* movies.
