





# Why war with Iran could bring world disaster



A good friend of mine and I were talking about all the perils in the Middle East these days and he asked me if I'd heard the one about the Middle Eastern pessimist and the Middle Eastern optimist. I said no, so he proceeded to tell me.

It goes like this: The pessimist says, "Boy, things couldn't get any worse." The optimist says, "Oh yes they can."

That's exactly where we stand in the saber-rattling duel going on between the United States and Iran right now. Sometimes it looks like the world is on the edge of the abyss and it wouldn't take much of a push to send us over.

If one is looking at a map of the Middle East and the surrounding countries, it's easy to see how a nightmare scenario could unfold in a war with Iran, a nation of 75 million people.

Take a look at the Persian Gulf and especially the Straits of Hormuz on the map on the right. The Straits of Hormuz is the only way for oil tankers to get from ports and oil fields in Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Bahrain and Qatar out to the open ocean. The Straits of Hormuz are 21 miles wide at the widest point, but there are only two shipping channels and both of those are only two miles wide. When you're talking super tankers or perhaps, aircraft carriers, you're

not talking about a lot of room to spare.

Now, look at the map again. Many oil tankers round the Saudi peninsula and go north up the Red Sea and through the Suez Canal to the Mediterranean Sea enroute to Europe and the United States. If not for the Suez Canal, ships would have to sail completely around Africa to get to Europe or the U.S.

So it's pretty easy to see the vital importance of those two waterways to the economic survival of the western world.

If a war with Iran got started, it wouldn't be hard for the Iranians to strike our ships in the Persian Gulf and to hit ports, oil wells, and refineries in Saudi Arabia, Bahrain and Qatar, possibly shutting off the flow of oil from the region for years.



The Iranians could also strike Iraq and our bases there with relative ease. They have a sophisticated modern military with missiles and aircraft that are very capable of doing it.

They could inflict great damage on American forces and while we would strike them hard, we don't know where all their military sites are located.

Iran could easily choke off the Straits of Hormuz in many ways, including sinking some of their own large vessels in the channels and close them to all shipping.

Make no mistake, the United States could pulverize Iran with massive bombing and missile attacks, but the Iranians would definitely get their licks in. A war with them wouldn't be a walk in the park.

A war with Iran would probably incite not only Shiite Muslims the world over, but Islamic people everywhere, especially in North Africa and the Horn of Africa.

Take a look at the map again and observe that the Red Sea is bordered by Somalia and many countries where radical Islamic terrorist organizations thrive. The Red Sea could easily be closed by any of the those countries along its route.

The radical unrest could spread to Egypt and lead to an overthrow of the government, which has been on the verge of being overthrown before.

If that happened, terrorists might be able to greatly damage the Suez Canal which would choke off the other oil lifeline to the west. The loss of both the canal and the straits would be an economic disaster of a magnitude the world has never seen before. The price of what oil could be obtained would be catastrophic.

A war with Iran would undoubtedly involve other

countries in the region.

Look where Afghanistan is. It sits right at Iran's back.

Al-Quida and the Taliban have no great love for the Iranians because they are predominately Sunni Arabs and the Iranians are Shi'ite Persians. There hasn't been any love lost there for centuries.

For example, when the United States invaded Afghanistan after 9/11, the Iranians actually helped us with intelligence and in other ways because they were afraid of Al-Qaeda, the Taliban, and the terror networks being bred in Afghanistan. They wanted them gone almost as much as we did.

As Afghanistan became neglected because of the Iraq War, the Iranians were furious with the United States for not destroying the Taliban and Al-Qaeda completely and capturing or killing Osama bin Laden. They saw it as an opportunity that was horribly wasted.

It would have been nice to build on that little bit of cooperation between the United States and Iran. It might have been a possibility because in that part of the world, 'the enemy of my enemy is my friend.'

But then we went back to being the 'great satan' after the famous 'axis of evil' speech.

Then the United States invaded Iraq, and the Iranians saw a golden opportunity to gain influence over the Iraqi Shi'ite majority.

Look at the map on the left. Afghanistan sits at Iran's backdoor. Al Qaeda and the resurgent Taliban would be drawn into any war with Iran.

Islamic radicals in Pakistan might be so incited by an American attack on Iran they might finally overthrow the government of Pervez Musharraf, which hangs by

a thread anyway, and take control of Pakistan's nuclear weapons.

If that happened, India's Hindu government, which both hates and fears the Pakistani Muslims, might preemptively attack Pakistan, perhaps even with nuclear weapons, in order to keep from being attacked with nuclear weapons by the Pakistanis. Without Musharraf in control, God only knows what Pakistani radicals might do.

Saudi Arabia, Jordan and Egypt, all Sunnis, would be drawn into a war with Iran to protect their Sunni brothers and to prevent the 'Shia Crescent' that would be formed by Syria, a Shi'ite-dominated Iraq and Iran. They tremble at the thought of such a crescent.

China buys much of its oil from Iran. China also does not want America to have a permanent presence in the Middle East nor undue influence there. They would have every incentive to attack or go through Afghanistan (where American and NATO troops are) and Pakistan to assist Iran.

If India were to attack Pakistan, the Chinese might also make a strike on India as there is no love lost between those two countries either. They have had many serious armed clashes in the past. And India, Pakistan and China are all nuclear-armed.

Vladimir Putin, the president of Russia, feels the same way about American influence and a permanent presence in the Gulf region as the Chinese do. Russia has always had influence with the Iranians. They have had strong economic and military ties to that country since World War II. They are a huge arms supplier to Iran.

The Russians could not allow Chinese or Americans power to dominate the Middle East and its oil. They

would almost be forced to become involved to limit American and Chinese presence in the region.

It would be very easy for the world's three major military powers to be at war with each other over Iran.

In the midst of a war, Turkey might try to grab off the oil fields in the north of Iraq which they have felt are theirs since the days of the Ottoman Empire and were stolen from them after World War I by the British. The Iraqi Kurds would destroy those fields before letting them fall into Turkish hands. Thousands of Sunni and Shi'ite Muslims might come from Somalia, the Sudan and other North African countries to join in the fight.

Yes, it's easy to see how a war with Iran could be a disaster of Biblical proportions for the entire world.

Even if this absolute worst-case scenario didn't happen and the world didn't fall into a total war, any destruction of oil facilities in the region would cause economic fallout that could be felt for decades.

Hopefully, before any such nightmare came about, intelligent people would come together to find peaceful solutions. The escalating saber-rattling on both sides has to stop before it becomes more than just rhetoric.

The leaders of the United States and the world have a mortal and moral responsibility to do all that is possible to avoid war with Iran unless and until it becomes an absolutely no-choice situation and then with consultation and the agreement of China and Russia.

A war with Iran under most any circumstances would have no real winners, except maybe, those 19 terrorists and their partners who started the world down this road on a beautiful September day in 2001.

*Casino Royale* Actor Daniel Craig assumes the role formerly occupied by such screen greats as Sean Connery, Roger Moore, and Timothy Dalton to set out on the character's very first 007 mission. James Bond has earned his "00" status by masterfully executing a pair of death-defying professional assassinations. Now assigned the task of traveling to Madagascar to spy on notorious terrorist Mollaka (Sebastien Foucan) for his maiden voyage as a 007 agent, Bond boldly goes against MI6 policy to launch an independent investigation that finds him traversing the Bahamas in search of Mollaka's notoriously elusive terror cell. Subsequently led into the company of the mysterious Dimitrios (Simon Abkarian) and his exotic girlfriend, Solange (Caterina Murino), Bond soon realizes that he is closer than ever to locating well-guarded terrorist financier Le Chiffre (Mads Mikkelsen), the man who has personally bankrolled some of the most prevalent terrorist organizations on the planet.

*A Good Year* Gladiator duo Ridley Scott and Russell Crowe re-team for this adaptation of author Peter Mayle's best-selling novel about a London-based investment banker who relocates to Provence in hopes of selling a small vineyard he has inherited from his recently-deceased uncle. As a child, Max Skinner (Freddie Highmore) was taught to appreciate the finer things in life while wandering the vineyard estate of his sophisticated uncle Henry (Albert Finney). Life has a strange way of turning out how you least expect it to though, and twenty-five years later Max (Russell Crowe) is now a prosperous money man wheeling and dealing in the cutthroat world of London business.

*Man of the Year Good Morning*, Vietnam duo Barry Levinson and Robin Williams re-team to tell the tale of a quick-witted radio talk-show host whose fanciful bid for the presidency becomes a surprising reality in the one political comedy that truly speaks for the people. When talk show host Tom Dobbis (Robin Williams) makes an offhand comment that he would be a better president than the leader who currently occupies the White House, a grassroots campaign conducted by his legions of fans finds him unexpectedly ushered into the Oval Office and forced to live up to his promise.

# Global War on Terror Honoring fallen heroes


