Top Defense official advocates 'new investment' in housing, instrumentation

Philip E. Coyle III, director, Operational Test and Evaluation, Office of the Secretary of Defense, had his first look at USAKA/KMR June 9-12. He is principal advisor to the Secretary of Defense on operational test and evaluation in the Department of Defense.

As he prepared to depart after two days of tours and briefings at Kwajalein, Roi-Namur, and Meck, Coyle told the *Hourglass* he will be calling attention to the need for "new investment" here.

"Probably no range was hit harder (by budget cuts) than this one," said Coyle.

He said funds are needed for housing and instrumentation, along with money to continue the Kwajalein Missile Range Modernization and Remoting project.

"Kwajalein is essential for National Missile Defense testing. There is simply no other place with the same capabilities," Coyle said.

"That's why I am urging new investment. We featured this need in our annual report to Congress last year, and we will do that again this year. We're going to have to invest in housing to support the NMD test program."

Theater Missile Defense testing will have to come to the range, also,

he said.

Coyle believes that all test ranges need institutional funding. He said, "Customers should pay their fair share, but taking institutional money away from ranges and then asking customers to make up the difference leads to inequities all the way around."

The Army is supporting an increase in the range budget of \$7 million for FY2000 and \$10 million more for FY2001, Coyle said. That will be an increase of \$33 million since 1998, or about 28 percent. He believes Congress will support those budget boosts, and the House Armed Services Committee is in favor of an even larger increase.

The extent of the instrumentation at the range was a surprise to Coyle. He was also surprised by the progress already made in the modernization and remoting project.

"That project is very important for the range," Coyle said. "It requires money for implementation, but it will pay its own way when it is in place."

Coyle has had many years' experience in testing. He was associated

with Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory for 33 years, serving many of those years as a test director at the Nevada Test Site.


During the Carter administration, he was principal deputy assistant secretary for Defense Programs in the Department of Energy, where he had oversight responsibility for the nuclear weapons testing programs of the department.

Asked to look ahead three to five years, Coyle said he sees USAKA/KMR as a very busy place.



Four helicopters return to flight status

Four of USAKA/KMR's five Hueys returned to flying duty this week after X-ray machines revealed no cracks in their tail booms.

The helicopters had been grounded Armywide since May 8, after a UH-1 crash at Fort Rucker, Ala.

Four Hueys and a spare tail boom assembly passed recent X-ray screenings ordered as a result of the grounding. A possible crack was found in the remaining helicopter, and it will undergo further testing. The spare tail boom will be installed on the fifth helicopter.

In any case, with four helicopters,

"We can meet mission requirements," said Master Sgt. Billy Jarrell, USAKA/KMR aviation maintenance evaluator.

The Army sent to Kwajalein Sgts. James Tweed and James Mitchell, both of the 25th Infantry Division's aviation maintenance unit in Honolulu. They brought an X-ray machine similar to those in hospitals and shot more than 120 pictures of the tail booms.

"It's a lot easier than stripping the paint and looking for cracks," Jarrell said. "This is another example of the Army moving forward into the 21st century."

The KMR Photo Lab assisted in the process, developing the special film.
