

## Mission

USASMDC/ARSTRAT conducts space and missile defense operations and provides planning, integration, control and coordination of Army forces and capabilities in support of U.S. Strategic Command missions (strategic deterrence, integrated missile defense, and space operations); serves as the Army force modernization proponent integrator for global missile defense; and conducts mission-related research and development in support of Army Title 10 responsibilities.

## Command Goal

To provide dominant space and missile defense capabilities for the Army and to plan for and integrate those capabilities in support USSTRATCOM and Geographic Combatant Commanders missions.

It fully supports the national policy of positive and continuing efforts to encourage all small business concerns, including Small Disadvantaged Businesses, Woman-Owned Small Businesses, Service-Disabled, Veteran-Owned Small Businesses, Historically Underutilized Business Zone Small Businesses and Historically Black Colleges and Universities and Minority Institutions, to participate and share in these acquisitions.

USASMDC/ARSTRAT strives to place a fair proportion of its total procurement dollars for supplies and services with small businesses.

Command small business personnel are available to assist small business firms in becoming familiar with the USASMDC/ARSTRAT organization and provide counseling and guidance related to the small business programs.

The Small Business Office will also assist you in understanding the procurement procedures and provide information on sub-contracting opportunities to advance the growth and development of small businesses and HBCU/MIs in becoming competitive contractors.

These guidelines provide a simplified procedure for doing business with the command. The associate director for the Office of Small Business Programs acts as the

point of contact and will respond to inquiries and provide any business counseling that you may require.

#### **Steps to take for doing business with USASMDC/ARSTRAT**

1) Review the command's website at <http://www.army.mil/smdc>. Become familiar with the organization's structure. Click on Small Business Programs and review business opportunities.

3) Discuss your company's capabilities and interests with the small business staff. Request a USASMDC/ARSTRAT organization chart. Request status of procurements in which you are interested.

4) Frequently review the FEDBIZOPPS website at <http://www.fedbizopps.gov> for contracting and subcontracting opportunities.

5) Be alert to announcements of industry briefings, business opportunity conferences, and trade fairs in your area. Make it a point to participate whenever possible. This is an excellent opportunity to meet with technical and/or acquisition personnel who are searching for qualified firms that may serve to support their mission requirements.

6) Follow-up with the Office of Small Business Programs. Be sure your Central Contractor's Registration information is up-to-date and accurate.
