This Christmas was the second spent in Iraq for a lot of our troops. Many more are on the way. Let's all pray for their safe and swift return.



# Leonard deBrum passes away at 88

Leonard deBrum passed away on the afternoon of Dec. 9 at the age of 88. What a life he had! Born May 17, 1916, the fourth son of Joachim and Lijoan deBrum, Leonard grew up during the Japanese period of Marshallese history. As a boy he lived on Likiep and was sent to the mission school in Jaluit. Growing up the way he did, he learned both traditional Marshallese as well as Western ways of doing things. It seemed he was destined for a life on the sea. He sailed on many different vessels, becoming a sailor, second mate, first mate and eventually captain. In fact, if you ask most older ri-Majol about him today, that is how they know him – as “The Captain.” It was a huge part of his life. He named his oldest daughter Queenie after the Mico Queen - which he captained for the Mico Co. in Majuro.

There are so many stories about Leonard. The most famous one is about when he saved his father, Joachim deBrum’s, glass-plate negatives as WWII was coming to the Marshall Islands. He was in his late 20s. Everyone else in the family had left for other islands. It was known that the Americans were going to come and surely bomb Likiep because of the Japanese presence on the island. As he tells it, he was staying on Enearnij, a small island several islands away from Likiep Island. While there, he approached a man named Lalej from Wotje about borrowing his sailboat, the Morning Glory, to go retrieve his late father’s properties. The next day they sailed back to Likiep Island with several others in addition to Leonard and Lalej: Antakbun from Mejit, Joaj, Hitchfield, Lon and Alas. When they got there they went straight to the darkroom to secure the glass negatives and took them back to Enearnij. When Lalej left for Wotje, they borrowed another boat, the Kamone, and with Joaj, Hitchfield, Lon and the Reverend Kanke, it took them a week to get the rest of the properties up to Enearnij where Herbot, Mass, Ernest and Lejel helped Leonard dig the holes to put everything in underground. On Feb. 16, 1944, four

U.S. war planes attacked and sunk a Japanese war ship, the Sumioshi Maru, in Likiep lagoon. Then they came over Likiep and dropped two bombs close to the house. One of the coconut trees was hit and in falling, severely damaged the darkroom. If Leonard had not gone with those people and gotten the glass plates, all those images of Marshallese culture in transition would have been lost.

After the Americans established themselves in the Marshalls, Leonard went to work on Kwajalein and Roi-Namur and continued his career on the sea, traveling to many different ports all over the Pacific. In his later years, he lived on Majuro surrounded by family. He continued his efforts to save his father’s work for students and scholars of the Pacific as he knew the importance of saving the history of the Marshall Islands for its future generations.


I have only known Leonard for four and a half years – but in that time I got to spend many hours with him, going through his father’s photographs and hearing stories about them and his life. I was lucky – I showed up at the right time, with the right knowledge and passion for history and photography. Within my first six months on Kwajalein, I was introduced to Joachim deBrum’s glass plates and the possibility of working on them by Cris Lindborg and Helen Claire Sievers. A month later I was introduced to Leonard and his family by Helen Claire and we worked out an agreement for the project that has taken up most of my life the last four and a half years. Leonard always flabbergasted me with his amazing memory. At 84 he could identify and elaborate on images his father took as I got them scanned. And I could entirely identify with his passion for saving the work his father had done – the photographs, his papers and the house on Likiep.

We worked hard on Joachim’s photographs, but the memory I think I cherish the most is singing together. On an earlier trip to Majuro this year for his 88 birthday, we had already worked several hours (we got that in before the festivities started) and I needed to do some upkeep work on his old computer in his room. As I worked he was on his bed and I got

him to tell me stories of his sailing days. He was telling about the first U.S. ship he worked on – it went to Oakland, Calif. and he was the only Marshallese person on the crew. I asked him if he was a

little nervous, but he said no – he had worked with plenty of Americans on Kwajalein and Roi-Namur after the war – and he knew English already. He said the sailors taught him songs and he taught them songs. Thinking that sailor songs might be a little bawdy I asked what they taught him and he started singing songs to me – ‘I’ve Got Sixpence’ and other old songs, some I recognized. I asked him if he knew ‘Let Me Call You Sweetheart’ since it seemed like it was from the same time. He told me to sing it to see if he recognized it – so I started in – and then he started harmonizing. We probably sang it six more times in the course of the day. I already loved him, how could I not after sharing this wonderful project with him – but I have to say I pretty much fell in love with him at that point. The hours we spent working on the identifications of the pictures with his daughter-in-law Emita were long, hard and wonderfully productive. Often Emita and I would be exhausted and he’d want to keep going. He was so driven to make sure his father’s work would be saved and shared with students, scholars of the Pacific and the Marshallese people.

All this time I have been working with Leonard on his father’s glass plate negatives, I was always aware that we were working to save a body of work that was truly a National Treasure. This was something incredibly important to Leonard and I developed a passion for it early on, no doubt spurred on by Leonard’s sense of urgency that this be done. In working with Leonard, I was continually amazed at the span of his memory, and the details. I can only hope when I’m in my 80s I remember a fraction of what he did. It hit me the other day

# Infection danger lurks

## *Coral cuts invitation to problems*

Why are coral cuts potentially serious?

One thing that is always available here on Kwajalein is the coral on our atoll. Injuries caused by contact with coral can present some serious problems for a seemingly unimportant cut.

Coral is a live marine animal that produces an outer skeleton with sharp edges. These sharp edges

are immobile when under water, and somewhat mobile when broken up and lying on a beach or other coral or reef beds. The coral rocks and rubble that make up the dry surface of atolls are made of the calcific skeletal coral that has died.

When an injury occurs after contact, a small amount of foreign material containing bacteria can be deposited and left inside the wound. Left to chance or poor cleaning of the wound, coral injuries can lead to serious wound infections in a short period of time.

## What to do for coral cuts

### **What should someone do immediately for a coral cut/abrasion?**

- Wash the area initially with lots of tap water, and if available, soap or antiseptic such as povidine (Betadine). Early and abundant irrigation is critical! Wash the wound out with tap water, placing the wound directly under maximum pressure. Running water removes debris and displaces bacteria.

- For minor cuts, gently pull the edges of the skin open. All visible foreign bodies should be removed by either rinsing with copious amounts of water, or by using tweezers to remove large pieces.

- Scrub with a clean cloth soaked in clean water.

- Apply a thin layer of antibacterial ointment and cover with a dry, sterile non-adherent dressing.

- Remove the dressing gently and remove any loose material and replace with antibiotic ointment and a clean dressing.

- Clean and redress twice a day during the initial first few days. Be gentle with the wound. Continued vigorous scrubbing/cleaning after initial cleaning of the wound can delay healing.

- Seek medical attention if there are signs of infection.

### **What are signs of infection to be on the look out for?**

Swelling, redness and increasing tenderness (especially two - four days after the injury) can be early signs of infection. Infection may progress into a festering sore or ulcer with a pustular discharge.

Local spreading of the redness or swelling of the skin surrounding the wound suggests more serious, expanding infection and requires immediate medical attention.

### **What is available to self-clean wounds here on Kwajalein?**

Kwajalein Hospital can provide, for a nominal fee, a "Wound Care Kit" if a patient feels they do not need medical attention. This is provided both during and after hours at the Kwajalein hospital.

### **What else do I need to know?**

- It is not true that using povidone-iodine or other iodine solutions to wash coral cuts will cause coral to grow inside the wound as coral cannot grow inside the human body.

- Urinating on a wound may wash away broken pieces of coral, but urine can discharge nematocysts and possibly worsen the problem.

- Other home remedies such as meat tenderizer, baking soda, papaya or commercial sprays containing aluminum sulfate and detergents should not be used.

### **What's the best thing to do for coral or other minor wounds?**

- Always immediately clean any small wound no matter how insignificant it appears.

- Seek medical attention as soon as the wound looks like it is not improving, usually within the first 24 - 48 hours.


## Joy of Christmas celebrated with song, dance

# Shopping privileges for C-badge workers extended at Gimbel's

Beginning Tuesday, Marshallese workers from Ennubirr, or C-badge holders, will enjoy shopping privileges at Gimbel's equal to those of similarly badged Ten-Ten patrons.

The change brings consistency to the policies of the Roi-Namur and Kwajalein convenience stores, which are similar in the items they offer, according to Paul Divinski, Retail manager, Merchandising and Provisioning.

Shopping privileges at Ten-Ten and Gimbel's put into effect about three years ago capped purchases for C-badge workers at \$10 and limited items to food for individual consumption on island.

"With the new access policies taking effect recently, some additional changes were made to the shopping privileges at Ten-Ten, i.e., dollar limitations lifted, and items not restricted," Gerry Wolf, Community Services chief said. "Gimbel's remained unchanged at that time. This change brings shopping privileges on Roi in line with those on

Kwajalein. All items purchased in both locations are still restricted to on-island use and consumption, and are not allowed to be removed from the island."

Items available to C-badge workers will include all food items, personal care products, bike accessories, newspapers, most magazines and items "modeled after what Ten-Ten has to offer," Divinski said. No alcohol, tobacco or adult magazines are permitted to be sold, and the same goes for clothing, of which Ten-Ten has a limited amount.

"KRS partnered with USAKA to make things equitable," Divinski explained. "Ten-Ten and Gimbel's are equivalent stores. I think this is a win-win for everybody. It allows C-badge workers the same kind of privileges [as are allowed] at Ten-Ten. It takes away the restriction of \$10 and should make life a little easier for workers."

Wolf expects the reaction to be positive adding that the change "eliminates the difference in privileges for C-badge workers on Kwajalein Atoll and supports our Marshallese neighbors and workforce."







# Dry cleaning services off-line starting Jan. 7

Dry cleaning services on Kwajalein will be off-line for two weeks beginning Jan. 7.

Paul Fritz, Retail Services manager, said that the Laundry Department will be installing a new dry-cleaning machine and that service will be restored on Jan. 21.

"The current dry cleaning machine is beyond its economic repair," he said.

He added that the new machine is more environmentally friendly.


"The new machine operates on a petroleum-based solution unlike the old machine, which operated with Perchloroethelene, also known as PERK, which is not environmentally friendly," he said.

Fritz explained that PERK waste had to be shipped off island for proper disposal, while the new petroleum-based solution can be disposed of in the incinerator plant

on Kwajalein.

The turnaround time for dry cleaned items is three days, according to Fritz. He said that customers can request a 'special' cleaning, which can be done in one day.

He anticipates that the new machine will be more reliable than the old, making the dry cleaning process more consistent. "The new machine will provide a reliable service compared to the previous machine," Fritz said.
