Budget reductions require business change

There are two things I want to talk about today. First, the USAKA/RTS budget funding and the resulting significant changes on our horizon and secondly, some significant changes to our island's access program.

First, with regard to the budget, funding for all U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll operations and therefore funding for the four island support contractors—3D, Alutiiq, KRS and MIT/LL—comes out of Department of Defense Research, Development, Test and Evaluation or RDT&E, funds.

Today, the Training and Equipment pot of that overall fund, from which we receive the majority of our funding, is being deeply tapped in order to support both the Global War on Terrorism and our military operations in Iraq and Afghanistan. Consequently, DoD is looking at all military organizations funded with RDT&E dollars and directing us to find new ways to cut operational and maintenance costs.

This is nothing new to us. As has been done over two decades and 30+



studies, we're constantly looking for the optimum solution to operate this range and community. This year is no different; however, today there is more of a sense of urgency, and we have to start doing things differently. We have to think outside the box! The command group and our contractors' management are working together to use our assets more efficiently.

On a personal basis, you know that if you're told your income is going to decrease, you begin right then reducing your expenses. That's what the command group and the contractor leadership are doing now. Together, we're looking at both immediate and long-term ways to cut our budget. At this time, I can't tell you—because we don't know—the exact measures we'll take, but I can tell you that our Commanding General has said we will not convert every job at USAKA to unaccompanied tours and we will not close the Kwajalein schools.

What we will do, and are doing now, is look at redundancies and amenities, and although we have not been directed to do so, we're also looking at the feasibility of moving positions off-island—both government and contractor—because in almost every case, if a job can be performed off-island, it's less expensive to do it there. You may see some changes that you won't be happy about and I understand that. Information on this issue will be forthcoming and ongoing—I ask you to read it, listen to it, understand it and help me keep rumors to the minimum.

Already a handful of actual and possible personnel actions which have happened for a variety of reasons have grown into an inflated number of "layoffs". In his KRS Newsline Update, Sept. 11, Ike Richardson asked everyone to "avoid spreading and/or magnifying rumors that can be detrimental to our productivity

and success...". I ask the same.

The second issue I wanted to describe is a significant revamping of our island access program, which is scheduled to begin 12:30 a.m., Oct. 5. These changes are being brought about due, in part, to the results of our command inspection earlier this year when we were cited for lapses in security and in part by my desire to effect good order and discipline on the installation.

Our Army, nation and the world continue to tighten security in response to Sept. 11, 2001, and the subsequent realization that the world is not as safe a place as it once was. It's my job to protect this community and all USAKA employees and visitors. In addition, the tremendous cost of replacing personnel lost to duty due to access violations, alcohol abuse and an overall lack of good order and discipline significantly impacts our mission—a cost we simply cannot continue to support.

Furthermore, the leadership on our neighbor island of Ebeye has repeatedly requested our assistance in tackling alcohol abuse problems and loss of job issues related to administrative bar actions.

All of the changes are based on the premise that no one should be on the island without a legitimate reason and no one should be on the island without an island resident or tenant organization sponsoring them. Furthermore, all enforcement activities will focus equally on sponsors and visitors. But, there is a flyer insert in today's *Hourglass* that gives the specifics of the revamped access program. Please read it and make sure your American and Marshallese co-workers read it. It's printed in English and Marshallese for everyone's convenience.

I appreciate your hard work and your support through this time of change and uncertainty. Thank you.

Boaters must avoid caution areas during missions

A B-Boat found in the caution area before a recent mission resulted in revoked boating privileges for the driver and has prompted USAKA officials to stress the importance of following safety procedures at mission times.

"Folks show up in the Viper/Meteorological [MET] launch area at Kwajalein about once a year," Tom Gibson, range safety officer, said. He explained that two boaters in the last six months have been in violation.

"This causes mission 'holds' until the area is cleared," Gibson said. "This is not a good trend."

Gibson added that people are found in the mid-atoll area during closure times nearly half the time, which is one of the reasons why the Kwajalein Police Department must do a reef sweep of the area prior to missions.

To raise public awareness in advance of all missions, USAKA regularly creates safety advisories that are published in *The Kwajalein Hourglass*, posted at the Small Boat Marina and given to marine police.

"The restrictions or local notices are for short periods of time," Mike Moore, installation and ground safety officer, said. "Our folks put a lot of work into safety notices and hazard

areas to ensure missiles and rockets go where they are supposed to, plus inform people where not to go."

Moore's role as ground safety officer during MET missions involves closing off Mount Olympus, the highest point on Kwajalein, and positioning an observer from KPD with binoculars and a hand-held radio with direct communication back to the MET launch pad. Their job is to watch for both marine and air traffic in the restricted area.

"Missiles and rockets are intended to land within a designated area out in the ocean - far away from Kwajalein and any other inhabited islands," Moore explained. "Missiles and rockets can fail."

If a missile has a destruct system on it, Range Safety can send a destruct signal to it and destroy it if necessary, but the NASA EQUIS II and MET rockets do not have such a system.

"Any destroyed missile could send fragments back to the surface or an errant rocket could also cause serious injury, damage or possible death if someone was in an area that they shouldn't be in," Moore said.

To a lesser degree, a stray boater can halt a mission when time is a critical factor. According to Moore, if a target missile is coming toward Kwajalein, the launch must

be conducted at a particular time to intercept it. In other instances, scientists use ALTAIR to find an optimal upper atmospheric condition to launch in order to get required scientific data.

Consequences for being in a restricted area during mission time include license suspension. According to Simone Smead, Community Activities manager, the duration of that suspension depends on the circumstances.

"Be advised that impeding a mission is viewed very seriously and the suspension would be reflective of that," Smead said.

On mission days, the Small Boat Marina requires all boaters to sign a form indicating that they are aware of the hazard areas, in addition to their boat plan.

"If someone was in the caution area and held up a mission - best case scenario is that they could hold up the mission and lose boating privileges -- worse case is that they get themselves or others hurt," Chief Warrant Officer Michael Posey, USAKA Community Activities, said. "We must remember that we're all here to support the mission first. Boating privileges are secondary and can be taken away in the interest of safety, and it's very easy to take those privileges away for everybody if it interferes with a multimillion dollar mission."

Some of the Enniburr children were given the task of pushing the button to launch the Alpha rockets.


Excited children and adults watched as the rockets shot into the air, deployed chutes and gently floated back to earth.

School Advisory Council holds first meeting of year

Dan Frazier, school superintendent, characterized Wednesday's School Advisory Council public meeting as "a get-to-know-you session," adding that the council is not making any tough decisions at this time.

New teachers and council members were introduced at the meeting held in the George Seitz Elementary music room.

The council then voted to pass school polices for special education/special needs and home schooling with the caveat that changes will be made to both. Approval of these policies is contractually required at the first SAC meeting.

The special education/special needs policy will be revised to enable decisions in this area to be made by a committee instead of solely by the superintendent. The home schooling policy is being reviewed by USAKA legal council to update terminology.

The council was asked whether a student may reapply for services after being denied. Maj. Jud McCrary, chairman, offered to investigate and reply at the next meeting.

Curriculum committees are forming, according to Steve Howell, high school principal. Kindergarten through 12th grade physical education, health and library are being reviewed against national standards.

Although the computer sciences curriculum was reviewed two years ago, a scaled-back review is also being conducted in this area. Parents are invited to serve on the committees to share their views and suggestions. Interested parties may contact Howell, 52011.

School enrollment is stable, according to Frazier, with a net loss of eight students this year. This year's graduating class numbers fifteen students.



In other school business

·Projects by high school students are in the works to care for the turtle pond, upon USAKA approval, and to characterize plants on Kwajalein. Next week, high school students will celebrate Manit Day by teaching the elementary school students Marshallese traditions.

·The Parent Teacher Student Organization announced a social for the new superintendent, Oct. 6 at 7 p.m. in the Davye Davis Multi-Purpose Room.

·School-age services are being recredited by the National School Age Service Alliance. Also, 4-H Club recruitment is underway, and an awards ceremony and social for the previous 4-H Club session will be held tonight at the George Seitz Elementary School Music Room.

·The high school is planning mock elections focusing on the Democratic and Republican parties. The elections will feature campaign rallies and speeches. Votes from Kwajalein students will be forwarded for inclusion in the national mock election project.

Arelong, Maie and Karon discovered the cash, which was lost in the step van, the morning after the band's arrival while unloading equipment at the Yuk Club.




