

Time of year for memories, hope, food


It was the day after Thanksgiving so the Christmas season had officially started.

KRS payroll check cashing services start this month

KRS is providing interim cash services until Bank of America arrives, which is estimated to be February. During the two-month interim period, what has been referred to as the "Bank of Bob" will enable employees to cash their paychecks and assume deposit and cash replenishment services for KRS-operated retail facilities.

Starting Dec. 11, KRS will cash paychecks for island employees at Building 900. Hours of operation will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. pay-day Saturdays and from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. the following Tuesdays.

According Mark Paier, KRS Finance manager, employees will be asked to enter Building 900 through the back door. Inside, the area will resemble a movie theater, with ropes designating where the line begins and ends.

"We will get as many people inside as possible, into the air conditioning and out of the elements," said Paier.

He added that after their paychecks have been cashed, employees will exit through the cash office side of the building.

The Finance cash office, now located at Building 702, will not cash

paychecks, said Paier.

On Roi-Namur, paycheck cashing services will be available on payday Saturdays at the current bank location. Employees at both locations must present their badge as proof of identification.

The Kwajalein Police Department will provide security during the interim banking period at both the Kwajalein and Roi locations.

Third-party checks will not be accepted at either location.

Paier encourages employees to consider direct deposit, which would eliminate the wait to have their paycheck cashed.

Credit card services are also being provided by KRS and a portion of the new machines have been installed on both islands. These are a long-term solution, according to Paier, because the Community Bank does not offer this service. Paier clarified that they are in fact Bank of America machines, but are not affiliated with the Community Bank.



"The machines do not accept debit cards, but if the debit card has a VISA or Mastercard logo, it will still go through," Paier said. "Bank of Guam Pacific Express Cards will not work."

According to Paier, reaction to the new machines has been favorable and indications are that they seem a little faster than the previous machines.

New boats are from Australia

Catamarans have state-of-the-art systems

The Sorenson catamaran will be joined in January by the Anderson, modernizing the Kwajalein catamaran fleet.

The Sorenson and the Anderson are 22-meter-long and 8.5-meter-wide Crowler-designed catamarans from Australia. They each have passenger capacity of 149 passengers, according to Bob Babcock, Marine Department manager.

The catamarans are powered by four Detroit Diesel engines with four Hamilton Peri-jet propulsion motors.

Babcock said that although the new cats carry fewer

passengers, they have four versus two engines with a maximum speed of 28 knots, state-of-the-art electronic propulsion controls systems and closed circuit television engine room monitoring systems.

He added that the engine rooms are more spacious, which improves maintenance capabilities. He said that the new catamarans have a designed soft patch system to remove all major propulsion components where the older catamarans required removing the entire superstructure or top of the vessel.

The Sorenson and the Anderson have installed DVD, public address and sound systems for training or entertainment. Babcock said that the two new boats have more durably designed and outfitted interiors.

Concerns, rumors addressed by commander

COL Beverly Stipe, U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll and Reagan Test Site Commander, shared personal likes and dislikes, dispelled rumors and addressed community concerns at her first town hall meeting Wednesday on Kwajalein.

At this time, there are no answers to what Stipe called the "burning budget question," but USAKA recommended paths forward to the Independent Assessment Team which, in turn, will take it to the next higher level.

Stipe commended all who provided the IAT with data and said the team will ultimately determine how much of USAKA's budget will go toward the global war on terror and other military priorities.

Stipe said the team will meet with Lt. Gen. Larry Dodgen, U.S. Army Space and Missile Defense commanding general, with the intent of persuading him to fight the budget battle at his level. Once information on the budget becomes available, Stipe said it will be disseminated through command information channels, such as the *Hourglass*.

The launderette will move to a location closer to the Dock Security Checkpoint, enabling a larger group of Marshallese to use a comfortable place to do their laundry, Stipe said.

"We will do quality of life improvements to make it an air conditioned place and a nice place," she explained. "It will be just a nicer, better place for [the Marshallese]."

Stipe announced that a decision on First Stop, which offers quick treatment for Marshallese [and American] employees, has been postponed pending further study.

In an effort to push a mental change forward that Kwajalein is a military installation, a public address system is being installed on the non-potable water tower, or west tower, to play bugle calls. Stipe said the calls will be audible from the airport to approximately her home on Ocean Road, which is about a half-mile radius.

"I love being in uniform, and love military tradition," said Stipe. "It's my gift to the Kwaj community. I promise you, once you hear it; it won't be a big deal."

Stipe said that the \$19,000 system was paid for using installation funds and can be used by the community for storm warnings, Christmas music in the town square and "hundreds of other uses."

"Reserve comment until after you've heard it once or twice," said Stipe.

Questions from members of the community were addressed by Stipe and representatives from Kwajalein Range Services.

With the reduction of flights to Roi-Namur, a request was made for a daily flight at noon to accommodate those who have only a half day's worth of business there. Janet Burki, deputy program manager for Logistics, said that the plane stays on Roi for the purpose of bringing workers back and that the current schedule was determined after meeting with workers and the Roi community. Burki offered to look at revising the schedule if needed.

Maj. Jud McCrary, director of Logistics and Community Activities, said that there are advantages to the plane's dead time on Roi, in that fuel is not burning and fewer hours in the air mean less maintenance.

Status of the entire air fleet was addressed by Stipe. There are only two to six months left of active life on the helicopters and the Metros are both being air conditioned. Stipe said that they are also working on getting a third Metro. When the helicopters go away, alternate plans are in the works.

According to McCrary, the Army is retiring the UH1 and production lines have stopped on the late 1950's design helicopter.

"We're running out of parts and can't get replacements," said McCrary.

McCrary said that a light utility helicopter was to be available next fiscal year, but availability has shifted further into the future, driven by the Gulf War budget.

"AirScan and KRS will do their best to provide safe and reliable aircraft," said McCrary.

Bingo is in Kwajalein's future, and according to Stipe, will be a 100-percent profit venture. Slot machines are being looked at as another means to help the recreation fund, which pays for community activities.

"It's not set in stone," she said. "Not yet."

In other business

- Members of the community are invited to meet at the gym to join the 23 Soldiers on island at 5:30 a.m. for physical training. "It's a fun, healthy way to loose weight," Stipe said. The group has run twice through the new housing area, but singing "Jodie" calls out of respect for those who may still be asleep.

- Smoking in non-smoking bachelor quarters was raised as a concern, as well as littering. Whether poli-

Commander; the first query concerned the nurse on Roi-Namur. The questioner was concerned that the nurse might be pulled and the Roi community would be left with an Emergency Medical Technician who would not be able to dispense medications.

Stipe responded that she agreed with the concern and felt the community needed more than an EMT. She said, "You're not going to lose your nurse." She added that the medical component would not go away.

cies existed on either was unclear and KRS representatives offered to work at resolving the problem.

- Contractors' ability to contribute to the Combined Federal Campaign was discussed. Currently, only military and government employees are able to do so. 1st Sgt. Dennis Neal offered to look into this.

- Concerns over rumors of double occupancy in BQ rooms arose. Stipe said that the rumor may be associated with one or more of the options being considered by the independent assessment team, but since the study is ongoing, and no decisions have been briefed, it is difficult to state with certainty exactly what impacts will be made in the area of BQ occupancy.

- A request was made that the Dental Clinic be open late one night a week, as it was in the past, to accommodate Meck employees and teachers. Kevin Finn, deputy program manager for Community Services, said now that the clinic is fully staffed, they can look into it.

- Plaques were presented by the command to those groups and organizations that made the Veterans Day celebration and the Pvt. Richard K. Sorenson catamaran christening a success.

On Roi-Namur

In the Thursday night Town Hall on Roi-Namur the colonel reviewed many of the same issues as on Kwajalein, but first she spent a few minutes introducing herself to the audience. She said, "I love coming here. You guys have an aura and it's fun to come up here."

She offered an open forum to the group and said, "Ask of me what you wish, it can be personal if you wish, but if I don't answer, I suspect it's too personal."

Many in the audience were ready to question the

particular concern to many members of the audience was the food at Café Roi. One person stated that people were getting sick from the food. Finn responded, "We have an inspector and the food services manager coming to Roi on Saturday to inspect the facility and access the problem."

Another member of the audience, with the support of several others, asked if the menu at Café Roi could be expanded and improved. He said that many nights a week the primary options are rice and hot dogs. The colonel said that she needed to know what the people wanted to eat and asked the audience member to help with the solution. She tasked him to talk to his co-workers and fellow Roi citizens and come up with some menu ideas.

Television reception, which fails when Roi-Namur receives extended rainfall and the man holes aren't drained, was a concern to many of the attendees. They wanted to know if there was money available to improve the television system.

Stipe and Mark Owens, KRS deputy site manager, said that funds have been allocated to improve the system which might cost as much as \$50,000. The project has not been assigned yet, but there is going to be a resolution to the problem.

The last issue discussed concerned vehicles. An audience member asked if the fleet that is falling apart will be replaced.

Stipe turned the question over to McCrary who said that USAKA and KRS are looking at different ways to fund vehicles. The budget cuts have made replacing vehicles very difficult. Stipe asked the audience to help with the brain-storming. She said that she welcomed their suggestions.

Remote control car track approved

A remote control car track on Kwajalein was recently approved by the USAKA/KRS Installation Master Planning Board. The track will be constructed in the field between the fire department and the American Legion Hall on Lagoon Road.

Since notification of the approval on Nov. 24, the Kwajalein Remote Control Modeling Club has outlined the track and begun gathering materials for its construction.

“Just like the track on the Fourth of July, all the materials to build this one will come from the landfill. A form of recycling if you will,” said Matt Hatfield, club president.

The track was designed by Steve Fuchs, Aaron Yessick and Brad Feisler. Hatfield expects construction to be completed in a week or

two. A fence will border the track to avoid damage to government property or injury to spectators from runaway vehicles.

“The site is being prepped by many folks at this point and anyone who would like to come down to help is more than welcome,” said Hatfield.

The track will be open to anyone with any kind of R/C vehicle. Owners of nitro’s and high-power electric vehicles must first complete a safety orientation, per club rules.

“A track is important in that we now have a place to run and race, and do so safely,” said Hatfield. “My reaction to the approval was at first disbelief. I thought


