I've received my Christmas present already. It's one of the most important I've ever gotten.


My wife, Carol, and I have just returned from Hono. We spent a week there enjoying the sights and delicacies like McDonald's double cheeseburgers and super-size fries.


Guys, the rest of this is for you.

Incentive plan pays dividends to employees

Kwajalein Range Services will demonstrate the value of employee accomplishments this month as employees share in an incentive pool of approximately \$800,000 to be distributed in the last paycheck in December.

Each full-time employee of the KRS Team from Oct. 1, 2003 to Sept. 30 of this year, who is still on the payroll today will receive \$407 as a share in the company's savings from fiscal year 2004.

"The KRS Team has been absolutely stellar and we have quite a bit to be proud of this year," Ike Richardson, KRS president, said. "We have made many efficiencies in our processes this past year that have yielded savings in our personal workloads and saved the government money as well."

This is the first year of the company's award-fee-based employee incentive plan, which allows each employee the opportunity to share in the contract cost savings based on the company's performance for the year.

"The money comes from employee incentive to complete all project work statement line items at a savings for the government," Mark Owens, deputy site manager, said. "The government agreed to share some of those savings with KRS employees."

"We didn't eliminate scope in order to produce this pot," Owens said. "It's from savings in FY04, not FY05 scope."

In order for the incentive to apply, KRS must achieve a high composite award fee score and under run the annual operating budget.

"This year our composite score was 92 percent and we performed our requirements below budget," Chiquita Perry, Project Controls manager, said.

Perry explained that full-time employees who were actively employed for the entire fiscal year will receive one share. Full-time employees who were employed for

part of the entire fiscal year will receive a pro-rated share based on the number of consecutive months they were employed. Part-time and casual employees will receive a pro-rated share based on the number of straight time hours they worked in their primary job during the year.

According to Bob Burt, controller, shares will be paid directly into employees' paychecks instead of in a separate check, which gives a processing and time savings advantage to the respective payroll departments.

"The actual amounts per each person will have to be keyed individually into our respective payroll systems and will involve a significant amount of extra effort," Burt said. "We estimate that it will take two days to key and check to ensure accuracy prior to running payroll."

Burt said that KRS employees would see their cost sharing dollars in their Dec. 24 paycheck. The same date applies for Chugach and AirScan employees.

The company initially intended for the cost sharing to be dispersed in the Dec. 11 paycheck, in an attempt to beat the schedule specified in the contract. Instead, according to Brian Ponte, Contracts manager, dispersal will occur right on schedule.

"The employee incentive shares are based on a pretty complex formula, which requires inputs including KRS's award fee scores for the entire fiscal year," Ponte said. "The Logistics score for the last half of FY04 was the last one to get formally approved. The final score approved by the government was one with which we're pretty happy, and it was worth waiting for."

Ponte said it is interesting to note that the scores are continuing to trend up slightly across the board, and that the improved composite scores aren't just the result of improved performance in one or two areas.

"What this represents, in my opinion, is an endorsement by

our customer of the improvements we're making in the overall way we do business," Ponte said.

According to Perry, there were many significant accomplishments and efficiencies that contributed to the company's cost savings and favorable award fee scores this year.

"We streamlined processes, prioritized expenditures, and found ways to work smarter. We initiated our Six Sigma program that also contributed to a successful year and the employee incentive program will reward everyone's hard work and initiative," Perry said.

Richardson said the size of the bonus, or share, was better than forecasted at mid-year. The increase, he said, was a result of the way the KRS Team began to "gel" in the third and fourth quarters.

"Now we need to continue that momentum into the New Year. Last year we did well and there is no reason that we cannot do even better this year" Richardson said.

"The continuation of the bonus program is keyed to efficiently delivering value to our customer. We must continually find ways to become more efficient while delivering great value," Richardson said. "We all have ideas on how we can save money. I ask that you let your managers and supervisors funnel your ideas to the management team to increase our productivity and efficiency."

"There is no doubt that some parts of our team are still over worked," he added. "This is an area that we must make further efficiencies. We want to work smarter not harder."

Richardson said the coming fiscal year will be no different than last year, as it will be full of challenges.

"I am convinced that we have the right KRS Team that will partner closely with USAKA/RTS to identify areas that we can improve," he said. "As I have told you on several occasions, if you are not being innovative and helping the team solve complex issues, then you are just treading water."

Christmas

In any other words,
it's still a happy holiday

If someone greeted you with “Anaurri Anirug and Paglaun Ukiutchiaq,” and you aren’t one of the 50,000 or so Inupiaq-speaking people of the world you may not know that they were wishing you a Merry Christmas.

Whether the seasonal message comes across as Joyeux Noël et Bonne Année!, Feliz Navidad y Próspero Año Nuevo or a Happy Ho Ho, the sentiment is international. It’s Christmas or to be more politically correct, it’s the holiday season.

How much do you know about the traditions of this season?

The idea to celebrate Christmas on Dec. 25 originated in the fourth century. The Catholic Church wanted to eclipse the festivities of a rival pagan religion that threatened Christianity’s existence. The Romans celebrated the birthday of their sun god, Mithras during this time of year. Although it was not popular, or even proper, to celebrate people’s birthdays in those times, church leaders decided that in order to compete with the pagan celebration they would themselves order a festival in celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ. Although the actual season of Jesus’ birth is thought to be in the spring, the date of Dec. 25 was chosen as the official birthday celebration as Christ’s Mass so that it would compete head on with the rival pagan celebration. Christmas was slow to catch on in America. The early colonists considered it a pagan ritual. The celebration of Christmas was even banned by law in Massachusetts in colonial days.

Christmas has a different meaning for each; some people are holiday merry

makers and just as many are scrooges.

In Sweden where Sabrina Bauml was born and raised, the holiday greeting is “God Jul och Gott Nytt År.” She said that Christmas was introduced to Sweden by Germany in the 1700s. “Feasting and celebrating begin on Dec. 13 with Lucia Day, which legend says is the longest night of the year,” she said. The Swedish Christmas tree is not brought into the home until one or two days before Christmas and the height of the Christmas celebrations is Dec. 24, Christmas Eve.”

She added, “After the Christmas Eve meal, the Tomte comes. He is our version of the Christmas elf who lives under floorboards of the house. The “Tomte” brings us gifts.”

She said that Swedes go to Church early in the morning rather than attending midnight mass. And while Christmas Eve is important, “The Christmas spirit and enjoyment linger until January 14--Knut’s Day--the day appointed to discard the Christmas tree,” she said.



“Being the oldest daughter, I was the one that dressed up for Lucia Day, Dec. 13 “Little Yule” is what we called it. I dressed up in the traditional long white gown with a red ribbon around my waist and a crown made with straw that had nine candles on it. I remember I had to get up very early and wake everyone for our first day of the celebration that would be started with a big breakfast,” she recalled. Bauml said she and her husband Johann have kept some of the Swedish traditions in their home during the holidays, even though he is German. “We still keep the Christmas tree until mid January and Christmas Eve is still the height of our celebration,” she said.

Many of the holiday traditions depicted in old movies and stories came from European folklore and customs. But areas of the world where there is no snow have deeply entrenched holiday practices.

Haiti, which is in the Caribbean west of the Dominican Republic, is as far removed from Sweden as possible. The weather,

climate and lifestyles are strikingly dissimilar from Sweden, but the holiday traditions and spirit aren't.

Evelyne Pierre-Mike, Property Management supervisor, is from St. Marc, Haiti. She described Haitian holiday celebrations as a mixture of local and international traditions. "Haitians, being predominantly Catholics, go to the midnight mass followed by a party called 'Reveillons.' There is usually a lot of food and dancing. This is the only time of the year when kids are allowed to stay up late," she said.

Recalling special Christmases from her childhood she said, "My fondest memories are listening to my parents telling me stories and waiting for Papa Noel to bring me a giant doll I thought I had to have."

French and Creole are both official languages of Haiti, in French Merry Christmas is Joyeux Noël et Bonne Année!, Feliz Navidad y Próspero Año Nuevo, while Bonn e Erez Ane is the Creole holiday greeting.

Pierre-Mike moved to Massachusetts in 1974. She brought some of her family's traditions with her. "We have continued going to midnight mass. Upon returning from mass, each person picks one gift under the tree to open, saving the rest for Christmas morning," she said.

The religious theme guides many holiday practices, in the Republic of the Philippines. According to Rodolfo Geronimo, Catholic's attend the daily midnight mass from midnight to 1 a.m. beginning Dec. 16 and continuing through Christmas Eve.

"It's a tradition that once you attend the first mass, you have to attend all the mass up to the

midnight of Dec. 24," he said.

"Also in the Philippines, Christmas carols started playing on the radios, stores and shopping center in the month of September and Christmas caroling started on the first of December thru Dec. 24," he said.

"You will see kids with their invented musical instruments going house to house singing Christmas songs. Tradition is to invite the kids for quick snacks or give them some money," he added.

He said that another thing you will notice in the Philippines is that, regardless your status (rich or poor), you will see Christmas lanterns (purchased or home made) in every house windows.

Family and friends are important to Geronimo during the Christmas season. He said that some of his fondest memories of Christmas in the Philippines come from talking to friends after attending the midnight mass and visiting the several food stands close to the proximity of the church where hot assorted Filipino dessert delicacies were sold. The national language in the Philippines is Tagalog, and Merry Christmas is Maligayang Pasko at Manigong Bagong Taon.

As Christmas approaches members of the small community on the islands of the Kwajalein Atoll prepare to celebrate, each in their own way.

Monono ilo raaneoa Nejin and Jeraman ilo iio in ekaal.

Aviation to receive third Metroliner in January

They're fast, dependable and are designed to go anywhere at any time. Next month, a "sister" airplane will join two Metroliners used primarily for commutes between Kwajalein and Roi-Namur bringing the total to three fixed-wing aircraft.

Considered a sister plane because the new Metroliner 697 was built so closely in time to the existing Planes 680 and 691, the addition makes for a "great parts and maintenance program," according to Leonard Lollar, AirScan Pacific program manager.

Getting the airplane here requires that the passenger seats be taken out and stowed in the cargo compartment so that ferry tanks filled with enough fuel to get nonstop from Honolulu to Kwajalein may be put in their place.

While used for short commutes between islands in the atoll, Metroliners will go as much as 320 miles per hour, up to 25,000 feet and can fly at night and in any weather. They have a 14,500-pound maximum weight limit and two 1100-horsepower jet engines directly driving a propeller.

When the Kwajalein Range Services contract began, officials didn't anticipate keeping the Metros. According to Lollar, the two original planes were to be used only for 60 days and were on short-term lease.

"We brought the planes, but had other plans," Lollar said.

With cycle rates back and forth to Roi of only 22 minutes each way, the Metroliners withstood the demand better than airplanes used in the past. That's when the lease progressed to longer term, according to Lollar.

Because the Metroliners did a good job and met requirements for operation over the ocean that the

King Air 350 plane, or Twin Otters, could not meet, officials within KRS decided to propose using solely the Metroliners.

But, in order to meet the demand, a third Metroliner was needed. On approval of the decision, COL Beverly Stipe, U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll and Reagan Test Site commander, cited one condition, according to Lollar: the Metroliners must be air conditioned.

After finding a manufacturer whose air conditioning unit was Federal Aviation Administration-approved, AirScan was faced with a choice. Delay the third plane until it is air conditioned or install the air conditioning here. They elected to install it here, because the other planes would require the same.

Because the units are backlogged, they will be installed when they arrive in late January, a process that takes about two weeks.

"The unit goes in the nose cargo compartment where the stool goes. It won't take up any cargo area,"

Lollar said. "At the end of January, we'll modify 697 with air conditioning. As the other units come in, we'll do the same [with the other planes]."

Other FAA-mandated modifications required for all three planes are dual global positioning systems and high-frequency radios. Lollar said that the three also require corrosion prevention measures, which involves painting.

According to Lollar, these requirements will be met over time.

"The faster you do it, the more it costs. The plan is doing it the most economically for the contract," he said.

By May, Lollar said the planes will all look the same and will be air conditioned and painted.

"We'll have three nice, air conditioned Metros online," he said. "Maintenance is driven by the number cycles and flight time. Having three planes will make operation simpler and probably more cost effective," Lollar said.

Missile Defense flight test conducted

The Missile Defense Agency announced Wednesday it was unable to complete a planned flight test after the interceptor missile experienced an anomaly shortly before it was to be launched from the Ronald Reagan Test Site, Republic of the Marshall Islands.

A target missile carrying a mock warhead was successfully launched from Kodiak, Alaska at 8:45 p.m.

Alaska Standard Time, Tuesday (12:45 a.m. EST, Wednesday). This was the first time a target missile was launched from Kodiak to support an integrated flight test.

As the ground-based interceptor at Kwajalein Atoll was preparing to launch approximately 16 minutes later, it was automatically shutdown due to an unknown anomaly. Program officials will review pre-launch data to determine the cause for the shutdown.

They board a vessel called the Reef Explorer with a group of other scuba divers, traveling 15 miles out to sea. Since they are certified to dive in open waters, the couple breaks off from the group to go exploring. 


