She came over to me and said, "You better not do it."


My mind raced through the multitude of things I better not do and I couldn't think of any I had done that could get me in trouble.

# Do-it-yourself repairs reduce service calls

When the “honey do” list hangs overhead like a dark, heavy cloud, residents have two distinct resources to which they can turn; Self Help and the Service Desk.

Self Help offers tools, materials and instructions to help people help themselves. The advantage of using Self Help, according to Billy Abston, preventative maintenance lead, is that, if it's a simple fix, occupants eliminate the time spent waiting for a craftsman.

“Our aim is to provide occupants with the necessary means and materials to get their government quarters in a presentable state,” Abston said. He said the purpose of Self Help is to alleviate the craftsmen of simple maintenance.

The most popular items are trash bags, which Abston says enable people to tie up their trash and are, in effect, a form of pest control. Paint and caulk are also popular items.

Tools are available at Self Help. Non-power tools and equipment may be checked out for seven days, power tools for three days. Timely return of checked out items, such as tools is Abston's biggest challenge. He spends five or six hours a week following up via phone calls and e-mail, and that's after

workers at the front desk make two reminder calls.

Lawnmower reservations are taken by Self Help, but repair, delivery and pick up is performed by the Small Engine Repair Shop. Abston says lawnmowers are delivered right after lunch, but realizes at times frustration occurs when they are borrowed by requestors' neighbors.

For two months, Self Help had eight lawnmowers available for distribution, which caused problems. Now, 18 new lawnmowers have arrived, of which 12 are put into rotation, leaving several available for swap-out when needed. Other items available for check out at Self Help include garden hoses, which customers can keep for the duration of their residence here, as well as hose repair kits. Among the newer items are shower splash guards, which keep water from damaging sheetrock and floors.

Also available are, pest control items, plumbing, limited electrical, painting and caulking, air conditioning filters, grass seed and plant and grass fertilizer, fasteners, nails and screws. All materials are to be used on government property.

The other avenue for home repair assistance is the Service Desk, which coordinates “house calls” when specialized knowledge or expertise is required.

Two dispatchers man the phones at the Service Desk daily, handling on average 50 calls a day. Some days, as many as 100 calls are received. Work coordinated through the desk entails maintenance and repair on facilities that require 40 hours or fewer of work.

*Anaconda: The Hunt for the Blood Orchid*, (PG-13), is the sequel to 1997's tongue-in-cheek *Anaconda*, though none of the original cast have returned. The film chronicles a fateful mission ordered by a pharmaceutical giant: to travel deep in to the jungles of Borneo, where a rare black orchid — one that can be used to attain immortality — has bloomed for hundreds of years, unbeknownst to man. The eager horticulturists sent have no idea that an indigenous population of bloodthirsty anacondas has been privy to the orchid's properties for years.

*Alien Vs. Predator*, (PG-13), follows billionaire Charles Bishop Weyland and his team of drillers, scientists, and archaeologists, to an obscure pyramid site in Antarctica. Among the icy ruins, allegedly, lies the proof of an empire predating humankind. Once there, however, the group finds more than ancient sarcophaguses and hieroglyphics; rather, their discovery consists of dismembered human skeletons and fossilized remains of the alien creatures that appear to have violently burst out of their chests.

*Liquid Bridge*, (R) is the boy version of *Blue Crush*. The coming-of-age plot is secondary to the intense surfing action, which exudes the glory, beauty, and dangers of a life spent chasing waves. Nick is a mechanic who dreams of surfing stardom. His father, now confined to a wheelchair after a surfing accident, is over protective and controlling. In an attempt to claim his independence, Nick unwittingly teams up with a corrupt drug smuggler who poses as a surfing manager.

# War casualties continue, 35 die in Global War on Terrorism

Thirty-five servicemembers have died in support of the Global War on Terrorism since Dec. 19.

U.S. Army Staff Sgt. Donald B. Farmer, 33, of Zion, Ill. and Sgt. Berry K. Meza, 23, of League City, Texas died Dec. 19 in Shuaybah, Kuwait, when a vehicle struck them. Both soldiers were assigned to the 180th Transportation Battalion, 13th Corps Support Command, Fort Hood, Texas.

Lance Cpl. Neil D. Petsche, 21, of Lena, Ill., died Dec. 21 due to injuries received in a non-hostile vehicle incident in Al Anbar Province, Iraq. **WHILE RECYCLING** is a term generally applied to aluminum cans, glass bottles and paper, water can be recycled as well. On Kwajalein, there are two separate water systems, one for drinking water and one for reclaimed water. Drinking water is used for sinks, showers, washing machines, drinking fountains and making ice at the ice plant. Reclaimed water is for use outside buildings such as lawn watering and vehicle, boat and airplane washing. Reclaimed water is used inside buildings only for toilet flushing. Reclaimed water is from the sinks, showers, washing machines and toilets on island that has been treated at the wastewater treatment plant to remove contaminants. Before it is pumped into the non-potable water system, it is filtered and disinfected with chlorine to make it safe to use. It is NOT fit for drinking or cooking, but is safe for incidental contact. The Utilities Department monitors the quality of the reclaimed water as closely as it monitors the quality of the drinking water.

At this time, we are unable to bill Aetna directly for prescription medications. Kwajalein Hospital and KRS Benefits continue to work toward that goal. Aetna patients will be required to pay for

prescription medications and submit their claims directly to Aetna.


