I've been married for 33 years now and I still can't figure women out. At least not the one I'm married to.


Marriage is supposed to be like a team. I don't know about that but I do know as long as I say "Yes dear" and "Whatever you say, honey" things will be okay.

Hot topics discussed at SAC meeting

Aug. 12 will be the first day of the next school year for students, according to the calendar adopted by the School Advisory Council Wednesday. This schedule, which was referred to as Calendar B, ends the first semester prior to the winter break. Semester length remains the same under this schedule, but there is an earlier start to the school year.

The schedule was voted in despite teacher and superintendent recommendations for Calendar C, which is similar to the calendar used for the past several years. Calendars have been available for review by the public since the Jan. 16 SAC meeting, with comments solicited through council representatives.

The decision to go with Calendar B was met with strong reaction from Ellis Farris, certified teacher for physical education and meeting attendee.

"What was the sense in offering these [calendars] to the teachers to make a decision if it's going to be changed and the teachers' opinions are not going to be at least considered," Farris asked.

Dan Frazier, Kwajalein Schools superintendent, responded that staff at each of the three school buildings developed the three calendars and recommended Calendar C to the council, as was the superintendent's recommendation. He said the selection of Calendar B by the council reflected the sentiment of the council's various constituencies.

Farris said that a calendar similar to Calendar C had been in use for the past 15 years and that it was a matter of respect that the board honors the teachers' request on this issue. He added that the constituencies spoken of weren't even present.

Maj. Jud McCrary, council chairperson, interjected saying "Everything you've said is false. Sorry, but you represent one population of this island." McCrary clarified that showing up to the SAC meeting is not a

requirement and that individuals speak through their representatives.

"It's not just the final decision of teachers," he said. "I'm offended that you think I don't care. That's just wrong." McCrary said that the way it works is based on the policy set by the school and that people speak through their representatives.

"End of conversation. The subject is closed," he said, offering his apologies for being upset, adding "I take it personally."

Teacher questions

Another point of contention at Wednesday's meeting involved

corporation's Human Resources department for review.

"Answers will be going out," Finn said. He said that ninety percent plus of what was in the comments was discussed verbally by himself, the KRS Human Resources manager and the superintendent prior to the last SAC meeting.

In response to the status provided by Finn, Rubly said, "Why not tell us this? Why not send me an e-mail so that I can tell the teachers 'Hey, we're working on it?'"

McCrary then stated that the topic was considered a KRS internal issue and suggested questions be directed to the deputy program manager for Community Services following the meeting.

All-day kindergarten

Frazier stated at the meeting, "We do not have permission to proceed with all-day kindergarten," adding "At this point, there is nothing to report."

In a later interview, Frazier said that permission was requested in December through KRS and on to U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll by

himself on behalf of the council.

McCrary confirmed in a later interview that a rough order of magnitude was submitted to evaluate the cost of such a move, which was determined to be adding one teacher.

"Now the government is drafting a response back to KRS on that," he said. McCrary added that the government will get back with KRS on the direction to take, adding that he hoped that would occur by the next council meeting.

When asked in a later interview by what point a final decision needs to be reached in order to implement all-day kindergarten for next school year, Frazier answered, "If we get the go-ahead, we will work very hard to get it in this year, regardless of the time. It is that important to us."

questions compiled and submitted by teachers to Kwajalein Range Services' Human Resources department, which, according to Cassie Rubly, teacher representative, had not yet been answered.

First Stop evolving, not going away

First Stop is a limited, company-subsidized health care program for contract employees.

The First Stop clinic was established to promote wellness in the workplace. Recently, rumors have circulated Kwajalein that First Stop is on its way out.

“Please put a stop to First Stop rumors,” Chief Warrant Officer Michael Posey, U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll Medical evaluator asked. “First Stop processes for patients will not change in any way. Patients will present to the hospital, sign in, and be triaged for care and release,” he said in an effort to clarify.

Dr. Eric Lindborg, Kwajalein Range Services chief medical officer, explained the care provided through this program. “These are typically minor acute minor and first aid problems that are amenable to management with over-the-counter medications. The emphasis is on a low threshold for presentation of minor

problems in order to prevent progression to more serious problems and minimize time away from work.”

In layman’s terms, First Stop is the place to go for headaches, nausea, aches and pains.

There are some changes in the works for how patients will be seen at the hospital. Posey said, “What is changing is the dedication of a full-time physician’s assistant to this program because it is a necessary move for her professional development to work throughout the hospital. I think this could be even better for patients as they will now be triaged quicker by the first professional available, which could be a nurse, physician’s assistant or medical doctor. We are trying to ‘tighten belts’ in the program and will always look for cost/time-saving measures.”

Lindborg added, “There will be more emphasis on treatment/management on the basis of standing orders by nursing staff. Although every effort will continue to keep visits short and efficient, there is the probability of some delays in completion of the First Stop service compared to the past.”

According to the doctor, “The core goals of First Stop are unchanged. With variable practitioners providing the service, First Stop patients will more frequently encounter different professionals providing care at the time of their visit.”

“I think the medical care for the community is top notch. While resources are one segment that has to be discussed in program adjustments, the main issue is community service. We want to maintain the best support possible for our community,” Posey said. He added that First Stop is a program for all workers, KRS, USAKA, etc. “Marshallese workers continue to have First Stop and have additional resources through the RMI Healthcare System,” he said.

The updated First Stop program is a result of “Tightening up our belts’ in programs like this will help to ensure that we can maintain them in the future,” according to Posey.

Posey said that the changes were “in everyone’s best interest to be financially responsible.”

Posey added, “We will continue to update the community if changes are necessary. I would request that the community not respond to rumors, but respond to facts from the appropriate sources. We all work very hard to support the community and a rumor like ‘First Stop going away,’ when it in fact it is not, takes so many hours to get rid of.”

The latest First Stop adjustments have evolved from several ideas on the drawing board. “Far more radical changes in First Stop services were in the planning stages at one time. We are pleased to continue the key components of this valuable service at this time. Even so, it is important to stress that medical/dental services and staffing will continue to evolve as we address critical budget and cost/benefit issues in the future,” Lindborg said. He added that there is no change in the basic first aid services provided at the Roi-Namur dispensary.

- The next Elementary School Parent Teacher Organization meeting is Wednesday.

- Parent-teacher conferences are Friday from 2 to 8:30 p.m. School will dismiss at 11:30 a.m. on Friday and Feb. 26.

Suspect Zero (R), follows the disgraced FBI Agent Thomas Mackleway (Aaron Eckhart), who was transferred to the most desolate area in Oklahoma as punishment for botching a procedure which ultimately led to the release of one of the most notorious criminals on the FBI's list. Mackleway is given an opportunity to redeem himself, however, when he is called in to investigate the strange murder of a traveling salesman. Mysteriously, the mark of a circle with a line through it is the only clue that the killer left behind. Before long, the prime suspect is identified as former agent Benjamin O'Ryan (Ben Kingsley), who is seemingly obsessed with hunting down serial killers and murdering them rather than turning them in to the proper authorities. Though Mackleway believes he knows the area where O'Ryan is living, he has no idea what he looks like — a problem that the rogue agent exploits with great success. Despite his brilliance, Mackleway finds himself caught in a psychological labyrinth of sorts, and is faced with an even greater quandary after learning that O'Ryan is looking for none other than Suspect Zero, a murderer of hundreds and the FBI's most wanted man.

The Incredibles (PG), revolves around former high-profile superhero Bob Parr (aka Mr. Incredible, voice of Craig T. Nelson), who has not-so-successfully settled into suburban life along with his wife and kids under the watchful eye of the Superhero Protection Program. A far cry from the "glory days" during which "supers" were a welcome addition to society, the Parrs' living situation was brought on after a series of superhero-related lawsuits forced them into hiding. When not trying to fight small-time crime undercover with fellow former superhero Frozone (Samuel L. Jackson), Parr is muddling through the corporate world as a paunchy, emotionally unsatisfied insurance claims adjuster. His family is like any other with some notable exceptions — his daughter has the uncanny ability to become invisible and create impenetrable force fields at will; his son, Dash, can run at incredible speeds; his wife, Helen (Holly Hunter), is known in super circles as Elastigirl, one of the most respected (and pliable) superwomen of her time. Just when it looks as if things can't get any worse for Bob, he gets a summons to show up at a remote island to receive instructions for a highly classified assignment, which he promptly accepts. Thrust back into the world of fighting crime, the Incredible family is back in familiar territory — saving the world from Syndrome, a jilted former fan of Mr. Incredible.

As he continues his travels, he finds he can trust no one, and that many people are out to do him harm in order to secure the contents of his package.

Casualties mount in Iraq

The following 12 U.S. servicemembers have died in the Global War on Terrorism.

Spc. Jeffrey S. Henthorn, 25, of Choctaw, Okla., died Feb. 8 in Balad, Iraq, from non-combat related injuries. Henthorn was assigned to the 24th Transportation Company, Fort Riley, Kan.

Sgt. Jessica M. Housby, 23, of Rock Island, Ill., died Feb. 9 in Route Golden, Iraq, when an improvised explosive device detonated near her convoy. Housby was assigned to the Army National Guard's 1644th Transportation Company, Rock Falls, Ill.

Staff Sgt. William T. Robbins, 31, of North Little Rock, Ark., died Feb. 10 in Taji, Iraq, of non-combat related injuries. Robbins was assigned to the Army National Guard's 39th Infantry Brigade, Little Rock, Ark.

Lance Cpl. Richard A. Perez Jr., 19, of Las Vegas, died Feb. 10 as a result of non-hostile vehicle incident in Al Anbar Province, Iraq. He was assigned to Marine Forces Reserve's 6th Motor Transport Battalion, 4th Force Service Support Group, Las Vegas.

Spc. Robert A. McNail, 30, of Meridian, Miss., Feb. 11 in Iskandariyah, Iraq, when his HMMVW struck another military vehicle. McNail was assigned to the Army National Guard's 150th Combat Engineer Battalion, 155th Brigade Combat Team, Quitman, Miss.

Staff Sgt. Kristopher L. Shepherd, 26, of Lynchburg, Va., died Feb. 11 in Baghdad, Iraq, when an improvised explosive device detonated during clearing operations. Shepherd was assigned to the 767th Ordnance Company, 63rd Ordnance Battalion,

52nd Ordnance Group, Fort McNair, Washington, D.C.

Air Force Staff Sgt. Ray Rangel, 29, of San Antonio, Texas, died Sunday while performing a canal rescue mission in Balad, Iraq.

Rangel was assigned to the 7th Civil Engineering Squadron, Dyess Air Force Base, Texas.

Three Soldiers died Sunday in Balad, Iraq, when the vehicle they were riding in overturned. All were assigned to the Army's 5th Squadron, 7th Cavalry, 3d Infantry Division, Fort Stewart, Ga. 


