Let's make Kwajalein look like a poppy field

If you were on Kwajalein last year around Memorial Day I am sure that you noticed people wearing and selling the red poppy. You may have even known that this was a show of support for our active duty military and our veterans. What you may not have known is how the poppy project started and who it benefits.

In the battlefields of Belgium during World War I poppies grew wild amid the ravages of war. The soil being overturned in the battlefields allowed the poppy seeds to be covered and to grow. Col. John McRae wrote a poem about these flowers. The poem is *In Flanders Field*.

This poem so moved Moina Michael that she bought a bouquet of poppies, all that New York City's Wanamaker's Department Store had. She then handed them to business men meeting in the New York YMCA where she worked. She asked them to wear this poppy as a tribute to the fallen. This was November 1918. She later would head a campaign that resulted in the adoption of the poppy as the national symbol of sacrifice.

Today the American Legion Auxiliary asks that every

American citizen wear a poppy in observance of Memorial Day and in addition, the entire preceding week-end. Wear it to honor all veterans, especially those who are currently serving in the Global War on Terror.

Today the poppy also honors the hospitalized and disabled veterans who make these red, handcrafted flowers. The poppy provides a financial and therapeutic benefit to those veterans who construct them, as well as benefiting thousands of other veterans and their families by the revenues collected from poppy distributions.

Please show your support for veterans and all their sacrifices for our great country. Get your poppy and wear it with pride. It tells everyone how much you appreciate the sacrifices of our veterans! Let's see if we can make Kwajalein look like a poppy field in the Pacific!

All aircraft awaiting torque wrench calibration

All U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll aircraft are grounded awaiting torque wrench calibrations. The seven aircraft, both fixed and rotary wing, were grounded Saturday according to Jim Wilhelmi, Kwajalein Range Services vice president and deputy program manager for Mission Operations.

"There were no indications that the aircraft were unsafe. The AirScan procedures for monitoring improper torque did not flag any problems. However, continued use of the aircraft with improperly mounted equipment could lead to an unsafe condition," Wilhelmi stressed.

"The aircraft were grounded as a precaution because of a concern for the accuracy of calibration of the torque wrenches used to tighten a number of the nuts and bolts holding equipment in place on the aircraft," he said.

The Calibration Lab identified a limited deficiency in the calibration tool that has been used for calibrating torque wrenches on Kwajalein Atoll since 1987. "The nuts and bolts were tightened in place on the aircraft, but in some cases the measurement of exactly how tight they

were could not be confirmed. The limited deficiency is in the ranges from 0 to 100 inch-pounds and from 100 to 500 foot-pounds. We need to be confident that the calibration applies over the full range that the tool may be used. While AirScan's processes check for signs of improper torque and none have ever been noted, we need to be 100 percent sure that our equipment is properly assembled," he continued.

"We do not know at this point if any of the torque wrenches used are out of calibration. In fact, we know their calibrations are within standards except for those in the limited ranges noted above."

Wilhelmi said he doesn't think the aircraft will be offline for long. "We are hopeful that the aircraft will be grounded only for a few days. The torque wrench calibrations are being validated at the Army Calibration Lab at Schofield Barracks. If they all check out to be within standards, we will request FAA approval to resume flying the fixed wing. The rotary wing decision will be made locally. If any of the wrenches are found to be outside standard, then those nuts and bolts that were tightened by the out of calibration wrenches will need to be checked. Depending on the number of nuts and bolts, this could take several days.

The Kwajalein Calibration Lab will acquire additional test equipment to assure torque wrench calibrations are verifiable over the full range of potential use. "Our Calibration Lab will be able to document calibrations over the full range of torque wrench operations. AirScan will continue to monitor for appropriate torque for all critical equipment," he said.

In the meantime, customers relying on aircraft for transportation to and from Roi-Namur will need to ride the catamaran.

The KRS Marine Department will operate the catamaran with departures from Kwajalein at 5:30 a.m. and returning from Roi-Namur at 4 p.m.

"All agencies are reminded not to deliver perishable cargo to the airport terminals. Any other cargo delivered to the air terminals will be held until flights resume. Contact the Marine Department for cargo availability on the catamaran," Andrew Havard, KRS air operations manager, advised.

"Roi-Namur and Third Island residents holding reservations for off-island flights on Wednesday should plan to use the catamaran this afternoon," he said.




Hourglass reports




Taking care

American Nurses Association President Barbara Blakeney said "this year's theme embodies what it means to be a nurse today. Today's nurses


