
Reed looking forward to command

Florida sheriff on island to train KPD dog handlers

Although the last two weeks have been extremely busy with the demolition of the pacific bachelor quarters and the change of command ceremony, the department has managed to squeeze three in-depth and vital training courses into the mix.

Deputy Sheriff Frank Campbell of the Pinellas County [Florida] Sheriff's Office, a K9 unit trainer, returned to conduct the Level II, Advanced Canine Detector Training Course.

Campbell is the USPCA Region 1 vice-president, and a Florida certified instructor/evaluator; he brings to the training more than 25 years of experience working with and training patrol, narcotic, and explosive police working dogs.

Campbell assisted the Kwajalein Police Department by certifying and brining the K9 section online and up-to-date with current canine handling practices, methodologies, training/utilization procedures.

Campbell stated "I could see the fruits of the [KPD] canine handlers' labor and witnessed first hand a drastic improvement in the handlers' abilities, techniques, and an increase in the canines' detection capabilities."

Additionally, Detective Sergeant Stephanie Campbell instructed courses covering online predators and interview/interrogation techniques. She runs the crimes against children section for the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office and has served in the sheriff's department for more than 20 years. She is an active member of the Florida Children's Abduction Response Team.

Stephanie's classes were not only attended by KPD patrol officers and access control officers, but also one lieutenant and one detective from Ebeye's local and national police departments.

Failure to Launch, A overgrown mama's boy who hasn't found the courage to take flight from the nest gets a little help from the girl of his dreams in the one comedy that proves it's never too late to strike out on your own. Tripp (Matthew McConaughey) may have hit 30, but that doesn't mean that he's ready to give up the many benefits of living at home with mom (Kathy Bates) and dad (Terry Bradshaw). His desperate parents have had enough, though, and after years of gentle nudging they soon realize that it's going to take a concerted effort to get Tripp out and enjoy their twilight years in peace. Realizing that their only hope for ridding themselves of their reluctant-to-leave offspring rides on the off-chance of his meeting the ideal female companion, mom and dad enlist the help of a beautiful and talented woman (Sarah Jessica Parker) in providing the romantic incentive needed to finally get their son out of the family home.

Slither, A mysterious meteor infected with a deadly alien plague brings chaos to a small hunting town in the feature-length directorial debut of screenwriter James Gunn (*Scooby-Doo, Dawn of the Dead*). Booted out of bed by his young, trophy-wife Starla (Elizabeth Banks), and in desperate need of some female companionship, wealthy Grant Grant (Michael Rooker) picks up bar local floozy Brenda (Brenda James) and heads into the woods for a hedonistic night of extramarital excitement.

The Shaggy Dog, An unexpected transformation helps a workaholic attorney learn that there's more to life than the courtroom in this remake of the 1959 Disney canine classic of the same name. Deputy District Attorney Dave Douglas (Tim Allen) takes his job in the halls of justice very seriously — so seriously in fact that his wife and family see considerably less of their frequently-absent husband and father than they would prefer. Douglas' luck takes a turn for the worst after he is inadvertently infected by a top-secret genetic-mutation serum that transforms the two-legged lawyer into a four-legged sheepdog.

Global War on Terror Honoring fallen heroes

The following 11 U.S. service-members have died in the Global War on Terrorism.

Petty Officer 1st Class Jerry A. Tharp, 44, of Muscatine, Iowa, died July 12 as a result of enemy action when his dismounted patrol was struck by an improvised explosive device while operating in the Al Anbar province of Iraq. He was assigned to Naval Mobile Construction Battalion 25, Rock Island, Ill.

Sgt. Alkaila T. Floyd, 23, of Grand Rapids, Mich., died on July 13 in Landstuhl Regional Medical Center, Landstuhl, Germany, of injuries sustained on July 8 when an improvised explosive device detonated near his Mine Protected Vehicle in Ar Ramadi, Iraq. Floyd was assigned to the 54th Engineer Battalion, 130th Engineer Brigade, Bamberg, Germany.

Spc. Manuel J. Holguin, 21, of Woodlake, Calif., died on July 15 in Baghdad, Iraq, of injuries sustained when his dismounted patrol encountered enemy small arms fire and an improvised explosive device. Holguin was assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 6th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade, 1st Armored Division, Baumholder, Germany.

Sgt. Robert P. Kassin, 29, of Las Vegas, died on Sunday at Larzab Base, Afghanistan, when his platoon encountered enemy forces small arms fire during combat operations. Kassin was assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 4th Infantry Regiment, 4th Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division, Fort Polk, La.

Staff Sgt. Jason M. Evey, 29, of Stockton, Calif., died on Sunday of injuries sustained when his Bradley Fighting Vehicle encountered an improvised explosive device during combat operations in Baghdad. Evey was assigned to the 1st Squadron, 10th Cavalry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, Fort Hood, Texas.

Cpl. Nathaniel S. Baughman, 23, of Monticello, Ind., died of injuries on Monday in Bayji, Iraq,

when his HMMWV encountered enemy forces rocket-propelled grenades during patrol operations. Baughman was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 187th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division, Fort Campbell, Ky.

Staff Sgt. Michael A. Dickinson II, 26, of Battle Creek, Mich., died on Monday in Ar Ramadi, Iraq, when his dismounted patrol encountered enemy forces small arms fire. Dickinson was assigned to the 9th Psychological Operations Battalion, 4th Psychological Operations Group, U.S. Army Special Operations Command, Fort Bragg, N.C.

Cpl. Kenneth I. Pugh, 39, of Houston, died on Monday in Baghdad, of injuries sustained when his M1A2 Abrams tank encountered enemy forces small arms fire. Pugh was assigned to the 3rd Battalion, 67th Armor Regiment, 4th Brigade Combat Team, 4th Infantry Division, Fort Hood.

Sgt. 1st Class Scott R. Smith, 34, of Punxsutawney, Pa., died on Monday in Al Iskandariyah, Iraq, of injuries sustained when an improvised explosive device detonated during a controlled ordnance clearing mission. Smith was assigned to the 737th Explosive Ordnance Detachment, 52nd Ordnance Group, Fort Belvoir, Va.

Staff Sgt. Robert J. Chiomento, 34, of Fort Dix, N.J., died on Monday in Khwaya Ahmad, Afghanistan, when his patrol encountered enemy forces using rocket-propelled grenades and mortars. Chiomento was assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 4th Infantry Regiment, 4th Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division, Fort Polk.

Sgt. Mark R. Vecchione, 25, of Tucson, Ariz., died on Tuesday in Ar Ramadi, Iraq, of injuries sustained when an improvised explosive device detonated near his M1A1 Abrams tank. Vecchione was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 37th Armor Regiment, 1st Armored Division, Friedberg, Germany.


