

In the Chief's Corner this week I will begin with a few announcements.


First, we say goodbye to two fine officers: Sgt. James Bradley and Officer Pete Morrissey.

# Reed meets with leaders in Majuro

Col. Stevenson Reed, U. S. Army Kwajalein Atoll commander, met with Republic of the Marshall Islands leaders in Majuro Saturday.

Having taken command two weeks ago, Reed is hitting the ground running in meeting with the local leaders and extending the hand of partnership. "We are going to be good neighbors," he said in a meeting with Minister of Foreign Affairs Gerald Zakios, as the subject of the current power problems

on Ebeye was raised. Reed sees the current situation as a humanitarian issue and is standing by with two generators to provide immediate assistance to Ebeye.

"Kwaj may look small, but there is much to do," advised Zakios to the new commander. "I look forward to working together with you and the leaders on Kwajalein."

During a subsequent meeting with President Kessai Note, Reed offered his theory on partnering and being a good neighbor. "We are greatly appreciative to all the RMI who serve in the U.S. Army.

We work together in Iraq and Afghanistan; why not work together here?"

Saturday's visit was in conjunction with a farewell ceremony for Ambassador Greta Morris, who will be leaving the RMI next week.

Last week President George W. Bush nominated Clyde Bishop, PhD, of Delaware, to serve as the next U. S. Ambassador to the Republic of the Marshall Islands. Bishop, a career member of the Senior Foreign Service, currently serves as Counsel General in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic.

## *U.S. military uses flexibility, adaptability in Iraq*

Commanders will shift U.S. forces in Iraq to deal with insurgent threats, but this does not mean more American troops will go into the country, nor that the announced rotation will change.

Multinational Force Iraq commander Army Gen. George W. Casey Jr. will shift forces already in Iraq to Baghdad, Army Gen. John P. Abizaid, commander of U.S. Central Command, said in an interview with New York Times reporter Michael Gordon.

"There is a very serious effort to make sure that it is not just weighted with additional U.S. capability, but also additional Iraqi capability," Abizaid told Gordon. "Clearly, it will require that we move whatever combat power that the commanders on the ground there think is appropriate, whether Iraqi or American. And I think it will be a combination of both."

Pentagon officials said Casey has the leeway and the experience to do whatever he thinks right. "It is a dynamic security environment - things change all the time," Pentagon spokesman Bryan Whitman said today. "It is a testament to the way the United States military operates that it is a flexible and adaptable force."

Whitman said Casey regularly makes adjustments to force posture in Iraq. "With respect to Baghdad, the environment is what it is right now, and ... he will make adjustments to where military forces are within

the country based on his best military judgment on where they can best be used," Whitman said.

There are 127,000 U.S. troops in Iraq at present. Abizaid's statement does not mean that number will rise or fall. Whitman said the number of U.S. troops in Iraq is "conditions-based" and will change if commanders on the scene call for it.

The rotation of U.S. troops into Iraq will not change, DoD officials stressed. Some 92,000 U.S. troops will deploy to Iraq in the 2006 cycle. DoD announced some of the 2006 rotations on Nov. 7, 2005. They were: Division Headquarters, 25th Infantry Division, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii; 13th Corps Support Command, Fort Hood, Texas; 1st Brigade, 34th Infantry Division, Minnesota Army National Guard; 2nd Brigade, 1st Infantry Division, Schweinfurt, Germany; 3rd Brigade, 2nd Infantry Division, Fort Lewis, Wash.; 3rd Brigade, 82nd Airborne Division, Fort Bragg, N.C.; 3rd Brigade, 25th Infantry Division, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii; and 2nd Brigade, 10th Mountain Division, Fort Drum, N.Y.

On June 20, DoD announced further units included in the rotation. These were: 3rd Corps Headquarters, Fort Hood, Texas; 2nd Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Lejeune, N.C.; 1st Cavalry Division Headquarters, Fort Hood, Texas; 2nd Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas; 3rd Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas; 4th Brigade, 25th Infantry Division, Fort Richardson, Alaska; and 2nd Brigade, 2nd Infantry Division, Fort Carson, Colo.

# *So where's dinner?*

## Café Pacific kitchen closes for repairs

*Provisions are made for food service to meal-card holders*

**E**ating out will take on a new twist beginning Tuesday. The kitchen at Café Pacific will be closed for at least six weeks while work crews pull up the floor and replace faulty drains.

The cast iron piping system under the Café Pacific kitchen has failed in several areas according to Ed Black of the Kwajalein Range Services Public Works.

"The Kwaj operations group has spent an excessive amount of time struggling to maintain and keep the current piping system functional. Presently, there are areas that have been validated by a TV camera system where the piping no longer ex-

ists," Black explained.

Black estimated that the removal and replacement project will take approximately 45 days. While the work is being done, meal service will be provided via food prepared at Three Palms, the Dock Security Checkpoint snack bar and the mobile kitchen. The food will be transported to the serving line at Café Pacific where meal-card holders and temporary duty personnel can eat.

"Our USAKA/RTS/KRS [U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll/Reagan Test Site] residential dining program will be greatly affected," Steve Cummings, KRS Dining Services manager said. "The dining services mission will be to offer services to only meal card holders and USAKA/RTS, TDY personnel that are eligible. We will not have the main kitchen to operate from. We will continue to serve a hot breakfast menu and a hot dinner menu. Luncheon service will be dramatically different as we go to a cold bread board deli selection with hot soup and cold salad choices," he said.

Cummings continued, "We will be changing our

dining menus. The scope or number of different items will be reduced at each meal period. We will have limited use of cooking equipment and these limits will constrain our choices.”

Dave Nobis, manager at Café Pacific, said serving hours will be reduced. The hours will be: Breakfast - 5:30 – 7 a.m.; lunch - 11 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. and dinner - 4:30 – 6:30 p.m.

The work will include replacement of the under slab, or foundation, sanitary sewer lines in the kitchen and serving line areas of the Café Pacific. “This will require excavation of the concrete slab and replacement of the exiting cast iron piping. While the kitchen is closed down we will correct some long standing safety problems with the kitchen floor covering system currently in place by replacing the currently installed floor tile with a slip resistant flooring system. As part of an on going project we also will be replacing some steam food service equipment with electric powered equipment. This will include the replacement of the food serving lines and several

pieces of kitchen equipment,” Black said.

The entire kitchen floor will be replaced with new tiles and new steam equipment will be installed both in the main kitchen as well as in the serving area. “Much preplanning has gone into this emergency repair effort to make this as least disruptive to the general public as possible. This is not a modernization effort but a emergency repair effort that must be completed to allow the kitchen to operate,” Black said.

Cummings explained that food safety and sanitation will continue as usual. “Satellite cooking and delivery poses some logistical challenges. Cooking times and temperatures are an everyday concern and will continue to be closely monitored. We would like to take this opportunity to encourage everyone to utilize the hand

sanitizing stations at Café Pacific, Three Palms, and the DSC Snack Bar every time you enter. Also, wash your hands at every opportunity several times a day,” he said.

## Spearfishing still requires caution, training

Hunting and fishing with spears has been around since the time when people lived in caves and grunted for communications.

Though the waters surrounding Kwajalein and Roi-Namur abound with fish, not all areas are approved for fishing. "Spearfishing can be enjoyed by all in all of the same areas as scuba and skin diving. U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll Regulation 385-9 specifically highlights those authorized areas," Joe Barnes, Kwajalein Police Department chief said. The Kwajalein Marine Police, a department within KPD, oversees enforcement of regulations pertaining to marine-related activities.

Safety is a paramount concern with spearfishing. "The primary safety concern is that an untrained person, young or old, takes part in this activity that could cause serious bodily harm to themselves or someone else. Bottom line, spear guns shoot spears, projectiles that have the capability of causing a penetrating trauma to themselves or another. Penetrating trauma can cause serious bodily harm or death. Even if the injury is not serious, the unwelcome attention it can draw from predator sea animals could also be disastrous," Barnes said.

The chief added "Although the regulation does not specify restrictions based on age, we would encourage all parents to be responsible for their family members assuring that they are fully capable to engage responsibly in the activity of spear fishing. See 8.8 specifically regarding 'Spearfishing' in the USAKA Regulation 385-9. KPD is responsible to

enforce the requirements of the regulation, but will make every effort to make on the spot corrections if safety is ever an issue."

Spearfishing is not permitted when people are swimming in nearby waters or within 300 feet of roped off Emon Beach area. "So, if it is unauthorized at these locations, anyone with spearfishing equipment should not feel the freedom to enter the water close to these locations," Barnes said. Chapter 1 paragraph i2 of USAKA Regulation 385-9 states that anyone 'report unsafe water activity to KPD' and paragraph i1 states recreational water participants will 'share in the responsibility for safety, accident prevention, and the protection of property and the environment.'

If a member of the community sees someone fishing in a 'no fishing' area, they should, "First, take it upon yourself to make the 'on the spot' correction. In most cases when you point out to someone their offense, they will stop. However, don't ever feel you should have to engage someone beyond that if they fail to comply. KPD should be contacted immediately," Barnes said.

Another spearfishing concern is transport of equipment. "As with any type of weapon used for hunting, spear guns should never be transported loaded and ready to fire. An accidental release of the spear could cause serious injury to the fisherman or an innocent bystander. Most weapons have safety measures that are required to be 'physically' adjusted to prepare it for firing. However, never assume that those mechanical safeties are enough. Always assume that a loaded weapon can maim or kill something or someone, so best to never have the weapon loaded while in transport," Barnes said.



As you can see KPD has a lot of things going on and I'm pleased to say that we only keep getting better for our community which we proudly serve. Our KPD Marine section's Lt. Mike Herrington not only has been recognized as our 'employee of the

month', but he and his crew have, within the last couple of days, been responsible for recovering some extremely heavy duty commercial fishing line from the lagoon waters. Herrington said that there were more than two miles of this line recovered, and if a boat driver had not seen the line, it could have crippled it.
