# It's time to follow Canada's lead on guest workers

Americans have been told time and time again that 'low wage' workers, a.k.a., illegal immigrants, are good for our economy.

We are told that if not for those people working on American farms, factories, restaurants and on construction that our food and many other items would be much more expensive.

The story goes that a head of lettuce could cost as much as \$10 if employers had to pay 'American' wages and provide health care, Social Security and other benefits that American workers expect.

I have no doubt that's true. If not for the illegal workers, our food and other items *would* cost a lot more.

But, on the other hand, if not for the 12 million or more illegal immigrants in our country today, perhaps our health care costs wouldn't be obscenely high and our health insurance premiums would be lower because our hospitals and doctors wouldn't have to make up the money they don't get paid by uninsured illegals on the backs of those who are insured (that means you and me).

Perhaps, if we didn't have to educate children of illegals, our city, county, state and property taxes wouldn't be so ridiculous. Perhaps the cost of educating our own children wouldn't be so high or at least, the money saved by not having the children of illegals in our schools could be used to buy newer teaching equipment. Maybe school districts could afford to fix some of our schools which are literally crumbling around the student's heads. Perhaps teachers wouldn't be overwhelmed by having 40 or more children in their classes. Maybe our own children would actually get a good education if teachers didn't have so many in each class and could teach in English only. Maybe better teachers could be hired with that saved money.

And then, there's the criminal element that has caused vicious street gangs to spring up in many of our cities.

The influx of criminals and gang members has strained many of our police departments and prison systems to the breaking point. How much does it cost to house and feed criminals in prison? How much do they overburden our courts?

So, *is* it better for our economy that illegal immigrants are here? *Is* it better for our pocketbooks?

I suppose we'd all be shocked if a head of lettuce cost \$10. But I think we're all shocked when we get our tax statements too. I think we're shocked when we find out that we're paying many of the bills for illegals.

If someone sat down and ran a true analysis of cost versus benefit, how do you think it would come out?

So, what do we do about it?

As long as businesses keep hiring them, people will come across the border in search of work. So, if we know this is going to happen anyway, let's at least try to make it orderly.

I think the United States should take a good look at the Canadian guest worker program. To me, it's really very simple and a smart way to have guest workers.

The way the Canadian system works is this. Businesses inform the Canadian government of how many workers they need, what kind of jobs are available, how long the jobs will take and how much they will pay for those jobs.

Then, as long as it is proven that no Canadian citizens want that work, the Canadian government goes to the Mexican government with the list of jobs and other information. The Mexican government then matches people with the jobs available and supplies the workers that are needed.

The workers selected are then flown to Canada on commercial flights paid for by the employers (the airfare is deducted from the worker's pay). Only workers are admitted into Canada. No spouses or children are allowed. While working, they are provided with housing, food and medical facilities if needed. Thus, they are able to save and return home with most of their money. The majority of workers seem to like the way the program operates.


When the job is finished (as in seasonal agricultural work), the workers are flown back to Mexico.

The Canadians do not offer a 'path' to citizenship. The guest workers are exactly that — guests for a limited amount of time. They are not allowed to stay in Canada when their jobs terminate.

This program eliminates the worry of being illegal for the workers, guarantees them a job, and employers don't have to worry about a worker's legal status or about getting enough workers for the jobs they have available. And, Canadian citizens have few costs to bear for the program to operate.

As for security, the Canadian government knows exactly how many guest workers are in their country, where they are and what employers they are working for.

Many people from Mexico and South America who are in the United States working illegally want to return to their

Lifeguard John Landgraff almost escaped the





# New vessels added to Roi Small Boat Marina

## *Aqua Cats available for rent*

Two new recreational water vessels have docked at Roi-Namur.

"The two Aqua Cats came from Johnston Island and are available for rent at the marina," Tony Stephens, Roi-Namur Community Activities supervisor said.


Aqua Cats are a small, 14-foot catamaran-style sailing vessel, along the lines of a Hobie Cat. "Aqua Cats are rigged uniquely and set up to be user friendly for beginners," Paul McGrew, from Kwajalein's Small Boat Marina said. "To begin with, they do not have a boom. The mast takes place of forestay. Instead of shrouds holding up the mast, an A-frame does and instead of a bridle there is a U-frame that is attached to the two hulls and holds the bottom of the mast," McGrew continued.

"There is considerably less sail area than a Hobie Cat, making it move slower and is more stable with lower center of effort. The Aqua Cats have no dagger boards and uses skeg keels for ease of beaching and moderate leeway," McGrew added.

"Unlike Hobie Cats that are great for flying hull, we do not recommend hull flying Aqua Cats as there are no mast floatation at this time," McGrew said.

"The cats rent for three dollars an hour, and a day sailing certification is required to take one out," Stephens added.

"Reservations are not recommended at this time, however they will probably become a necessity in the future," Stephens said.

countries. After all, that's where their families are. That's where their homes are. And, in their native countries, the wages they earn buy a lot more than in the United States. What is a pittance in America is a fortune in some countries. Given the choice of coming here to work legally and then returning to their homes, I'm sure that most, if not all, would return to where they can live a more decent life on those wages than they could in the United States.

But, the way it is now, either they can't afford to return home, or they're afraid they won't be able to get back across the border if they do.

So they stay, and the United States government has no idea of how many are here, where they are, who they are and if they're working or not.

Many pregnant Mexican and South American women cross the border illegally. They know that once they are in the United States, even illegally, if their baby is born in America, according to current law, that child is an American citizen. Folks, that's a huge reward for breaking the law and it's a magnet drawing them to our country. The law has to be changed so any child born to an illegal immigrant does not receive American citizenship. That would remove a great incentive for them to come.

Simply put, if the United States doesn't get control of the immigration situation, I'm afraid that some day we will have the same problem that many European countries face — millions of people who can't or won't assimilate into our society, don't speak the language and who might become a seething, angry and perhaps dangerous underclass.

Some people say the Canadian system wouldn't work in the United States because we have so many more immigrants coming into the country.

But, no 700-mile long fence or the hiring of more Border Patrol agents or even the military on the border will ever stop the flood of illegal immigration unless the job magnet is turned off.

Our government must do whatever it takes to accomplish that goal, up to and including fines and prison sentences for employers in the United States who hire illegals. Only then will the flood pouring across our southern border cease.

As long as there is no orderly system for employment of immigrants and as long as we have the utter chaos that exist now, the flood will continue until we drown in it.

# Records program designed to promote sportfishing, add avenue to track big catches

The Kwajalein Atoll Sportfishing Records Program was started in May of this year. It is administered by the Kwajalein Atoll International Sportfishing Club and is open to all anglers trolling the waters of Kwajalein Atoll - residents and visitors. The purpose of the program is to promote sportfishing, establish a program to track the really big catches and of course, to provide an avenue for Kwajalein anglers to show off their trophy fish. And, for those anglers that have just the slightest bit of "competitive nature" — there is also that little bit of pleasure and satisfaction received in capturing and maintaining the record for the "largest catch within Kwajalein Atoll."

The following is a list of the various fish species included in the records program: marlin, sailfish, spearfish, wahoo (ono), dogtooth, yellowfin (ahi) tuna, mahi mahi (dolphin fish), aku, rainbow runner and yes, even stinky barracuda. To be eligible for entry into the records program, fish must meet minimum weight requirements and/or exceed the weight of an existing record holder.

How can anglers enter their trophy catches into the records program?

Well, it's fairly simple but it does take a bit of work; captains must complete a Kwajalein Atoll Records Program Application (available at the Small Boat Marinas Kwajalein and Roi-Namur) which requires detailed information about their record catch, i.e. names of captain and anglers, place of catch, official weight of fish (fish must be weighed on one of three approved scales), measurements of length and girth of fish, as well as information about the equipment used to land the record catch. The completed application must be submitted to

KAISC along with a photo of the record catch.

A total of eight record catches have been entered into the program since May. Current leaders in the program are as follows:

- Capt. John Norris and crew— 451.8 pound marlin.
- Capt. Walt Erb and crew — 31.4 pound mahi mahi.
- Capt. Tom Jack and crew— 111.5 pound yellowfin.
- Capt. Joe Theriault and crew - 44.6 pound wahoo.

Anglers capturing a record in the records program receive a formal records program certificate as well as a sportfishing hat from the KAISC.

A display case has been placed at the Kwajalein SBM which includes photos of captains and crew with their trophy catches. Included in the display case is information about the records program as well as a variety of photos taken of many different fine catches from the waters surrounding Kwajalein and Roi-Namur.

More information for the program is available at the SBM or from the KAISC.

**Staff Sgt. Ronald L. Paulsen**, 53, of Vancouver, Wash., died Oct. 17 in Tarmiya, Iraq, from injuries sustained when an improvised explosive device detonated near his vehicle. Paulsen was assigned to the Army Reserve's 414th Civil Affairs Battalion, Utica, N.Y.


