Investigations show alcohol is target of break-ins

It has been a few weeks since my last installment of the Chief's Corner. The unfortunate business of providing law enforcement is that at times poor decisions are made by people that lead to activity involving violations of established laws and regulations. Recent burglaries, thefts and shopliftings are examples of those poor choices and decisions.


Most everybody on the island has heard, through the rumor mill, some account or another of these recent incidents. As your chief, I feel compelled to provide you, the community of Kwaj, some insight to dispel some of the rumors and share the progress of Kwajalein Police Department's investigation of these recent series of burglaries.

First thing is to announce the investigation is ongoing with one of the burglaries yet to be solved, and that the reward of \$250 is yet to be paid for information leading to the apprehension of those responsible. KPD has made progress, which has included inquiries leading to confessions of some found complicit. Presently we have made charges of burglary on two persons and theft on one other. Two others were charged with

regulation violations relating to alcohol possession and use.

Our investigation, though ongoing, has shown that the target of opportunity has been isolated exclusively to the theft of alcohol. Those of you in the community who have been identified as victims already have been contacted, but some of our evidence suggests that there may be more victims of these crimes who may not be aware they have been victimized. I encourage all residents to take inventory of their stored alcohol beverages as well as valuables. If you feel that you are a victim, please contact the KPD hotline at 50966. Leave a message which includes your name and phone number. This will enable us to follow-up more efficiently and determine if your incident may be linked to the events currently being investigated.

For those of you who find yourself victims, I want to put your mind at ease by providing you and the rest of the community, my assurance that we will see this case to its very bitter end. No one in our small, quiet community should have to go to bed at night without the peace of mind that they and their families are safe



and secure.

On a lighter note, KPD had its holiday party on Nov. 19. It was well attended by both our Marshallese and U.S. officers along with many family members. Santa even made a grand appearance with plenty of gifts for all. Our Marshallese officers added a special touch by providing beautiful door prizes of Marshallese handicrafts and blessed us all with songs and the gift of shell lei's. Kemem who provided the wonderful music to help in our celebration.

Until next time, be well, be safe and look out for each other!


It's not profiling, it's plain common sense




said Junior John Landgraff.

Second pre-kindergarten classroom opened to accommodate increased requests to enroll

Youngsters in the pre-kindergarten age group have a second option for classes at the Kwajalein Range Services Child Development Center.

"The CDC is opening up a second Pre-K classroom to accommodate the number of families wanting to enroll in the Pre-K age group, and because we've reached the capacity in regard to physical space and teacher-child ratios," Aimee Pang, KRS Central Registration and CDC/School Age Services director said.

Prior to Tuesday, there was a waiting list for slots in the morning-only class. By adding an afternoon class, Pang said there is no waiting list and there are 24 children enrolled in the program.

"With this second session, there are two Pre-K programs for this age group. These children are one year from entering kindergarten," Pang said. She added, "We need to have spaces open for high-priority, i.e. military personnel families."

The morning session is from 8:30 to 11:30 and the afternoon session is from 12:30 to 3:30.

The decision to open a second class was determined last week by KRS management personnel.

"This option will allow us to do the following: provide immediate care for a high-priority family, allow families to increase program time, lessen the amount of children per session and increase the quality of teacher-child interactions."

"We also ran into an issue of needing to have open spaces for high-priority families," Pang explained. "And being at capacity with room space and teacher-child ratios, the best way to resolve this issue we thought would be to open an afternoon session." She continued, "This option will allow us to do the following: provide immediate care for a high-priority family, allow families to increase program time, lessen the amount of children per session and increase the quality of teacher-child interactions. We are hoping that this move is seen in a positive light, as it would have been difficult for us to cap the registration and displace current families enrolled."

The decision of placement for each child depended

anyone say that the action taken by those U.S. Airways personnel was not justified? I don't think they overreacted. If I was on that plane or indeed, any plane these days, I'd be grateful that perceived threats were taken seriously.

Our police and security agencies tell us that we citizens are the first line of defense against terrorist acts. That's especially true of airline passengers. Ordinary passengers have stopped several possible disasters such as the shoe bomber, Richard Reid, and others by being alert and becoming suspicious. I applaud the passenger(s) who alerted the flight crew to those six men even though it turned out to be a false alarm. How much better is it to be politically incorrect than dead?

It's terribly unfortunate that Muslims are looked upon with suspicion. No, it's not fair to paint all Muslims with the same brush, but when every terrorist act in the last decade has been carried out by Muslims, it's hard not to focus on them as a group.

I would think that even though they might be greatly upset by being scutinized, Muslims would like to be

safe when they fly as much as anyone else. Do they want to be blown up or crashed into buildings anymore than the rest of us?

A Muslim cleric said that taking the Imams off that plane would be like taking Catholic bishops off a plane and searching through their robes. Well, I for one wouldn't have the slightest problem with that if Catholic bishops had flown planes into the World Trade Center, bombed the London and Madrid subways, and had been on the verge of blowing up ten airplanes over the Atlantic Ocean which would have killed thousands of people.

Muslim groups are now calling for a boycott of U.S. Airways and of course, there'll be lawsuits. The Department of Homeland Security Civil Rights office has opened an investigation.

But just what exactly will they investigate — that a pilot who just wanted to get from Minneapolis to Phoenix that day didn't feel political correctness or sensitivity was more important than the safety of his plane and his passengers? He should be given recognition for diligence and good sense. He can fly a plane I'm on any day.

There's no doubt that Muslims have a terrible problem in the climate of fear that exists in the world today. They have every right to pray, but doing so might provoke suspicion in fellow travelers. Can they pray in such a way as to avoid that? I don't know.

Muslims say they shouldn't have to change the way they live and the way they practice their religion.

No, they shouldn't have to. But then, 80-year-old grandmothers and 6-year-old children shouldn't have to be stopped and searched at security checkpoints. None of us should have to take off our shoes and go through the incredible hassle we endure just to get on an airplane. None of us should have to be afraid of terrorism when we travel.

But the threat is constant and it's not going away anytime soon. And, as we have been told so often, vigilance and suspicion are necessary if terrorist acts are to be prevented.

That's the world we live in, and it's not a world anyone would wish for.

But all of us must adjust to the new reality and learn to deal with it, and that includes our Muslim friends.

on status and needs. "Opening two classes gave parents an option to choose an afternoon session versus morning," Pang said. "Some children were moved to lessen the amount of children currently in the morning session. A few parents volunteered to switch, and those parents who had reasons for wanting their child to maintain in the morning session were asked to write an exception to policy letter."

Pang explained that all Army CDCs follow the Creative Curriculum which focuses on different areas of development: Cognitive Development, Social-Emotional Development, Physical (Gross and Fine Motor) Development and Language Development. "Instructors do daily observations on all children and use their observations and children's interests to help format their lesson plans. Lesson plans are also developed to target specialized learning centers. In each class you will find

the following learning centers: Blocks, Manipulatives (i.e. Puzzles), Art, Science, Library, Dramatic Play, Sensory Table, Quiet Area and an area for music and movement, which all deliver educational value and prepare children for their next level of development," she said.

"Army Child Development Centers are here to support readiness by reducing the lost duty time due to conflict between parental responsibilities and unit mission requirements," Pang said. "The Kwajalein CDC has opened its doors to the community regardless of their military status. This year we've experienced higher enrollment in certain age groups which forced us to look at other options to provide care for everyone desiring it."
