Movies rated 'R' can show life as it really is and sometimes make strong statements for reform and change.

Then there are those that are 'R' rated for obvious reasons and a waste of film.


When I was a young man (a long time ago), I might have occasionally read a *Playboy* magazine (for the well-written articles of course). The fact that I can't recall a single one of them doesn't mean I didn't read them. But if you want to know who Miss April was in 1966 . . . well . . .uh . . . I don't remember that either (I swear).

In my younger, wilder days, my friends and I may have accidentally wandered into a theater that showed (as they were politely referred to back then), 'blue' movies. Naturally, as soon as we discovered our terrible mistake we left . . . just as fast as we could find the exit . . . which may have taken an hour or two sometimes.

I guess I'm trying to say in a humorous way that I'm not a 'prude' or 'casting stones' as it were.

If movies contain 'adult' content for adult consumption, that's the choice of adults who make them, adults who are in them, and adults who watch them.

But, if a movie involves children in any inappropriate way, that's crossing the line. The reason I bring this up is a new movie coming out called *Hound*



*Dog*. I don't know much about it other than what I've seen on the news. But what I've seen, read and heard is deeply disturbing.

From what I gather, there is a graphic scene in this film in which child actress, 12-year-old Dakota Fanning, is raped on screen.

I've read that the scene was shot in 'shadows' and that Fanning wore a flesh-colored body suit and so on and so forth. But this is a 12-year-old girl, and what makes it even worse is that the person who commits the rape is her father in the movie. How nice is that?

You might recall that in one of my columns not too long ago, I mentioned this troubling trend of fathers being portrayed as molesters and abusers in movies and on TV programs. I for one am fed up with it. I'm sick of such negative images of fathers when every father I know would die before letting harm come to their children.

A 'mainstream' movie that actually shows (not merely implies) the rape of a child is beyond what I think anyone could call 'art' or 'dramatic license.'

If a film graphically depicts a minor involved in sex, no matter what lighting, shadow, or other cinematic techniques are used, doesn't that border on child pornography? I think it gets close to it.

Fanning is a talented young actress, but she's still only 12-years-old.

Movie or not, this can't have been emotionally healthy for her. There's not enough money for most parents to have allowed her to be involved in this film.

But I've heard that Fanning's mother wanted her to do it because she may win an Oscar for the part. So much for priorities.

Gee, I wonder why so many child stars grow into such messed up adults.

I heard a defender of this film on a news program make the comment that, "We make movies with children being killed — what's wrong with this?"

My answer is that we have enough real life tragedy involving children that breaks our hearts. Don't we have enough young boys and girls abused in our country every year? Don't we hear about it too many times on the news? Do we really need a movie in which a child is raped on screen? Isn't there enough sick child porn for real? Do we really want it brought into the 'mainstream' of our lives?

As I said, I haven't seen the film, so maybe I'm misjudging it. I can only go by the information I have.

But in any case, a movie showing a 12-year-old girl being raped by her father isn't something I believe I'd ever want to see. I think I'd blow out an artery from sheer anger.

I hope people across the country keep their money in their pockets, stay away from this film and send a clear message to Hollywood that this isn't the kind of movie they want to see either.

# Meningitis vaccinations made mandatory

The recommendation to make the new meningitis vaccine an entrance requirement for all 9th graders entering high school during the fall semester of 2007 was approved by the Student Advisory Council at a public meeting on Wednesday.

The Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine, licensed in 2005 in the United States, is recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for use in people 11-55 years of age in preventing the spread of meningitis.

Meningitis is a bacterial infection of fluid surrounding the brain and spinal cord, and infects 2,600 people in the U.S. each year. Even with treatment, 10-15 percent of people infected die. "Of those who live, another 11-10 percent lose their arms or legs, become deaf, have problems with their nervous systems, become mentally retarded, or suffer seizures or strokes," according to a CDC fact sheet.

Kwajalein school policy 4000.30 states that, "immunization guidelines shall be based on recommendations of the Center for Disease Control Advisory Committee of Immunization Practices and school health requirements of the Hawaii Department of Health." The chief medical officer researches the recommendations and then determines the Kwajalein

immunization requirements subject to the approval of the SAC.

In his presentation to the public, Dr. Eric Lindborg, Kwajalein Hospital chief medical officer, endorsed the CDC recommendation. He said the MCV4 vaccine did not require a round of boosters and is believed to provide better, longer-lasting protection, unlike the older vaccine.

At present, the risk of complications from the use of the new vaccine, including serious allergic reactions, are extremely minimal, and "the concern in increased incidents in neurological problems has not been confirmed," Lindborg said. "So, it seems to me to be safe."

The new vaccine is available on-island, and parents are advised to get their child vaccinated sooner rather than later to avoid the back-to-school rush. The vaccination is covered under the Aetna insurance plan.

Ri-Katak commuter students should get their school-mandated vaccinations from Republic of the Marshall Island medical facilities; if the vaccine is not available in the RMI then those children can get the vaccination from the Kwajalein Hospital at no charge, according to Lindborg.

The council voted four-to-one in favor of the vaccination requirement; three members were not present to vote. The SAC vote to accept the vaccination as a new school entrance policy becomes a recommendation to Col. Stevenson Reed, U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll commander for final approval.

In other business, the Kwajalein school improvement team is on target, having completed five of the 16 steps toward school improvement required by the school accreditation agency North Central Association.


Two other steps are near completion pending approval by the school improvement team, and another three steps will be discussed at the staff professional development day slated for February.

One step, specific to Kwajalein, called for collaboration between Marshallese parents, community members and teachers to identify and support strategies that would increase graduation rates for Marshallese students.

The NCA will return in March to review the team's accomplishments and provide continued guidance with another set of improvement requirements for the coming

year.

The next public SAC meeting is Feb. 14.



## Start Smart program teaches tots basic sports skills

What comes to mind when you think about three-year-olds? Boundless energy? Short attention spans? Emerging personalities? Probably all of these, but how often do you connect the dots between the under-four set and athletic ability? Every Wednesday and Thursday evenings for the next few weeks some of the island's youngest are learning how to connect their feet to soccer balls.

Child and Youth Services, through the Start Smart Program, is introducing soccer to tots.


"Start Smart is a program

developed by the National Alliance for Youth Sports that is designed to provide three- through five- year olds with developmentally appropriate activities before they are placed on a team," explained Alex McGlenn, School Age Services instructor and Start Smart coordinator. "Their philosophy is that most young children placed on a team without any prior training or exposure to the sport lose interest by the time they reach adolescence and/or do not have a positive experience. By offering children the opportunity to learn the basic skills of a sport under the tutelage of a coach, with the encouragement and participation of their parents, and without the pressure of immediate competition, Start Smart believes that children will not only learn to enjoy the sport, but they will also be equipped with the proper skill set to succeed in that area."

Start Smart is designed to appeal to children under the age of seven. "To coincide with the Child and Youth Sports programs, we offer the class to three - five year olds," she said.

"I'm amazed at how much a three-year-old can grasp about a sport. Although they may be unable to comprehend more difficult concepts initially, the repetitive na-



ture of the program gives them six weeks to practice basic skills. The material is also presented in a way that builds on the skill they learned the week before and then introduces a new move at an advanced level of difficulty," McGlenn said. "By using the step-by-step approach, the children are consistently practicing their moves, allowing for a higher rate of mastery. As a teacher with beginnings in the kindergarten classroom, I know that one of the best ways for younger children to learn is through demonstration, consistency and endless practice opportunities."

McGlenn said she is surprised by the endurance, stamina, concentration and determination of the young athletes-in-training. "I have seen children give up or become easily frustrated when they are unable to achieve their own or their parents' ideas of perfection," she said. "The children that I have been fortunate enough to work with on Kwajalein are amazing - they continue to try until they are pleased with their own abilities. They definitely exceed my expectations daily. I am also surprised by their concentration."


McGlenn knows what she's talking about. She has a master's degree in elementary education as well as a bachelor's degree in Spanish language and literature. "Before I knew that I wanted to be a teacher, I found myself taking jobs that were with children in one capacity or another - somebody was trying to tell me something," she said. Prior to coming to Kwajalein McGlenn coached gymnastics in Louisiana, provided Kids' Club services at a hotel on Saipan, was a lead teacher at a Montessori school

in Wyoming, and taught school in Saipan, Japan, and North Carolina. "It would be appropriate to say that working with children is the only thing that has been consistent in the last 15 years of my life," she said.


"At our first Start Smart soccer class, one of the younger girls was practicing her trapping skills. While most of the children were able to lift up their legs high enough to stop the ball with the bottoms of their shoes, this little girl had to back up against the wall, hold herself steady with both hands, and only after she had stretched out her body to full length was she able to get her leg high enough to stop the ball. She had no intentions of letting a minor issue such as height become a setback for her, however. When I offered her a smaller ball, she politely declined and said, "No, I like the green one.""

The young people's determination motivates McGlenn. "I particularly enjoy the seriousness with which the children take themselves and the sport. At the end of a Start Smart session last week, I noticed a soccer ball wedged at the very top of the CRC gym. As we were all stretching our necks out and gazing upwards I asked the crowd, "Did you do that?" Every single child solemnly answered, "No," but they believed that I had faith in their ability to kick the ball that high and that far. Believe that children can reach the stars or the gym ceiling and they will."

Start Smart offers several programs: A skills development program which touches on the basic skills needed for soccer, baseball, basketball, golf and football. For more information on the program, call McGlenn at 51722.


Nine golfers on this year's teams were participants in the very first Atoll Cup in 1996: Andy Frase, Russell and

# Navy christens new carrier *USS Gerald R. Ford* Ship will be first of Gerald R. Ford carrier class

Secretary of the Navy Donald C. Winter announced today the selection of *USS Gerald R. Ford* as the name of the first aircraft carrier in what will be the Gerald R. Ford class of carriers.

This selection honors the 38th President of the United States and pays tribute to his lifetime of service in the Navy, in the U.S. government and to the nation.

“President Gerald R. Ford provided the United States great leadership at a time of constitutional crisis,” said Winter. “I am honored to have the opportunity to name the first ship in the new class of aircraft carriers after this great Sailor, this great leader, this great man.”

Born in Omaha, Neb., in 1913, he grew up in

Grand Rapids, Mich. He starred on the University of Michigan football team where he was a center and team most valuable player in 1934. After graduation he attended Yale Law School, where he served as assistant football coach while earning his law degree.

During World War II he attained the rank of lieutenant commander in the Navy, and served on the light carrier, the *USS Monterey*. After the war he returned to Grand Rapids, where he began the practice of law and entered political life.

Ford was the first vice president chosen under the terms of the Twenty-fifth Amendment and, in the aftermath of the Watergate scandal, succeeded the first president ever to resign; serving as the 37th vice president (1973–1974) and the 38th president of the United States (1974–1977). Prior to becoming vice president, he served for more than eight years as the Republican Minority Leader of the House of Representatives as a representative from Michigan’s 5th congressional district.

The *USS Gerald R. Ford* will be the premier forward asset for crisis response and early decisive striking power in a major combat operation. The carrier and the carrier strike group will provide forward presence, rapid response, endurance on station, and multi-mission capability.

The *USS Gerald R. Ford* and subsequent Ford class carriers will provide improved war fighting capability, quality of life improvements for Sailors and reduced acquisition and life cycle costs.

**Lady in the Water** M. Night Shyamalan writes and directs this self-proclaimed, grown-up "bedtime story" about an apartment building superintendent named Cleveland (Paul Giamatti) who discovers a magical sea-nymph named Story (Bryce Dallas Howard) who's been transported to this world and is living in the building's own swimming pool. As this bizarre revelation sinks in, Cleveland becomes enraptured by her other-worldly charm. As he shelters her in his apartment, other inhabitants of the building begin falling into place as representations of characters from an Eastern myth in which these mermaids, or "narfs," co-exist unhappily with more beastly and violent characters. In human reality, the forces of darkness that threaten the heroes of a fairy tale prove to be much more terrifying, and the victory of good over evil is by no means guaranteed. Jeffery Wright, Jared Harris and Mary Beth Hurt co-star, as well as Shyamalan himself, playing the visionary writer Vick.

**The Grudge 2** Japanese horror specialist Takashi Shimizu returns to the mythology that terrified audiences the world over with this terror-inducing sequel to the hit 2004 frightener. When a cursed Tokyo home is burned to the ground, the baneful spirit once confined within its walls is suddenly unleashed to terrorize anyone and everyone who crosses its dark path. Original producers Sam Raimi, Rob Tapert, and Taka Ichise return to help Shimizu realize his hair-raising vision with this tale that finds Karen's (Sarah Michelle Gellar) sister, Aubrey (Amber Tamblyn), teaming with spellbound journalist Eason (Edison Chen) to investigate the spectral mystery. Meanwhile, the ghostly grip of Toshio (Oga Tanaka) and Kayako (Takako Fuji) tightens on a Chicago housewife (Jennifer Beals) halfway across the globe.

**Gridiron Gang** The true story of the football team that proved sometimes second chances can make a difference comes to the screen in director Phil Joanou's tale of self-respect and social responsibility on the gridiron. Sean Porter (The Rock) is a detention camp probation officer who oversees the inmates at Camp Kilpatrick in Los Angeles and isn't willing to simply write off the violent offenders who have been placed in his care.

# Honoring fallen heroes

The following nine U.S. servicemembers have been killed in the Global War on Terror:

**Maj. Michael L. Mundell**, 47, of Brandenburg, Ky., died Jan. 5 in Fal-lujah, Iraq, of wounds suffered when an improvised explosive device detonated near his vehicle during combat operations. Mundell was assigned to the 1st Brigade, 108th Division (Insti-tutional Training), Spartanburg, S.C.

**Cpl. Stephen J. Raderstorf**, 21, of Peoria, Ariz., died Jan. 7 in Balad, Iraq, of wounds sustained during combat operations. He was assigned to the 3rd Battalion, 8th Cavalry Regiment, 3rd Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas.

**Pfc. Ming Sun**, 20, of Cathedral City, Calif., died Jan. 9 in Ar Ramadi, Iraq, of wounds suffered when his unit came in contact with enemy forces using small arms fire during combat patrol operations. Sun was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 9th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 2nd Infantry Division, Fort Carson, Colo.

**Spc. James D. Riekena**, 22, of

Redmond, Wash., died Sunday in Bagh-dad, Iraq, of wounds suffered when an improvised explosive device detonated near his vehicle. Riekena was assigned to the 145th Brigade Support Battalion, Post Falls, Idaho.

**Sgt. Paul T. Sanchez**, 32, of Irving, Texas, died Sunday in Baghdad, of wounds suffered when an improvised explosive device detonated near his vehicle. Sanchez was assigned to the 543rd Military Police Company, 91st Military Police Battalion, 10th Sustain-ment Brigade, 10th Mountain Division, Fort Drum, N.Y.

Four Soldiers died Monday in Mo-sul, Iraq, of wounds suffered when an improvised explosive device detonated near their vehicle during combat operations. The soldiers were assigned to the 2nd Squadron, 7th Cavalry Regiment, 4th Brigade Combat Team, 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Bliss, Texas. Killed were: **2nd Lt. Mark J. 
