
# Do we treat strangers better than our friends?

strangers we often act and speak respectfully and courteously, but with those who know us well, they treat us like we said nasty things about their mother or locked their bike to a tree.

This is the same thing that happens with our children. Some terrible, rebellious, mess-making, school-skipping, insolent and ungrateful child visits a friend and the parents tell you, "Your child is so sweet." To which you reply, "Are you blind??" "You've got to be kidding me!" It's a good thing we love our kids.

I think it would be nice, for a change, if we knew one another as friends, but treated one another like strangers. Every once in a while, imagine that the people we see day in and day out will remember who we are by the last way they were treated. A kind word goes a long way.

As for my friends on the soccer field, I know they don't mean it. You get caught up in the excitement of the game and say foolish things about me and my ancestry. I know, I've said the same thing. Just invite me to the post-game celebration and all is well.

The winners were: Men: Jon Jahnke, 44:34 and women: Sharon Shultz, 53:41


There were 14 runners on the 6.2 mile island loop course, most of them training for the upcoming RustMan on April 30.


