Fourth of July sparks patriotic celebration

The only thing louder than the concussion of the fireworks off Emon Beach, was the sound of the "oohs" and "ahhs" from the crowd.

The Kwajalein community gathered on the beach last weekend for the annual Fourth of July celebration, which, along with the fireworks display, included games, food, and fun for children and adults alike.

Planned, coordinated, and hosted by Community Activities, the day

opened with the annual children's bicycle parade that included 58 participants, all on riding machines draped with flags, streamers, and other patriotic paraphernalia.

Next, Col. Gary K. McMillen, USAKA/KMR commander, highlighted opening ceremonies, wishing America a happy birthday and commenting on the signers of the Declaration of Independence.

"We meet on this great battlefield of World War II and celebrate the work of 56 men ... patriots, great men of courage and vision ... 56 men dedicated to the principles of human rights and the spirit of liberty ... 56 men who would change the course of history."

The afternoon took on the atmosphere of a carnival





- Passengers are to board and disembark only at the gangway area. Passengers who are deemed by the captain to pose a safety hazard to the crew, other passengers, or the vessel will not be allowed to board.
- Passengers are never to jump from the pier to the boat, or the boat to the pier.
- Passengers must know where the life jackets are stowed. If in doubt, ask a crew member.
- Boats will not be overloaded. Maximum capacities are: Catamarans, 199 passengers; LCMs, 170 passengers.
