NMCB 1, CCAD-MARSHALL ISLANDS FINISHES TOUR, HEADS HOME

HOURLASS REPORT

Seabees with the Navy Mobile Construction Battalion 1, Construction Civic Action Detail-Marshall Islands completed their deployment to the Marshall Islands this week. NMCB 1 first arrived on Kwajalein in Aug. 2015 with a mission centered on conducting humanitarian assistance projects in the Republic of the Marshall Islands. During its deployment, CCAD-Marshall Islands did several projects outside of U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein. A renovation of the Ebeye Elementary School and repairs to the Enniburr Pier steps are a couple of examples. They also worked closely with the RMI National Training Council office on Ebeye, training eight Marshallese apprentices, who successfully completed the training program.

The group also completed many public works projects on both Kwajalein and Roi-Namur, and the team even headed to Majuro to repair the roof of the country's Alele National Museum and Library. Aside from these construction efforts, the team also engaged the local communities of Ebeye and Majuro in tutoring English and Math to students interested in taking the armed forces test. With the departure of this group, another detachment of Seabees will soon arrive Kwajalein.

EBEYE CELEBRATES KWAJALEIN ATOLL MEMORIAL DAY



HOURLASS REPORT

Residents of Kwajalein Atoll observed the 72nd Kwajalein Atoll Memorial Day commemoration Feb. 9. An annual celebration of the U.S. liberation of the Marshallese people from Japanese occupation in 1944, the event brought out thousands of Ebeye residents and folks from adjacent causeway islands like Gugeegue and the Loi islets. Leaders from throughout the Marshall Islands joined U.S. diplomats from Majuro, and U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll Command staff and Kwajalein residents for the celebration.

A festive parade into the town's center kicked off the event. RMI police officers and Kwajalein Atoll Local Government police joined USAG-KA Command staff, State Department officials and the Kwajalein Jr./Sr. High School band in the parade. Afterward, a series of speeches by distinguished visitors hit on the meaning behind the celebration and the decades of inalienable friendship between the United States and the RMI that has blossomed as a result.

MATERIAL HANDLING TIPS

WHAT IS MATERIAL HANDLING? Handling is defined as means by which workers' hands move individual containers manually by lifting, lowering, filling, emptying or carrying them.

Manual material handling can expose workers to physical conditions that can lead to injury. To avoid these injuries, we must improve the relationship between work tasks and the capabilities of the worker. The reason: Due to differing ages and physical abilities, not all employees can perform the same tasks. When preparing to handle loads we need to make sure we are both physically and mentally capable. We can do this by following a three-step process. Stop, Think and Act.

STOP: Assess your own physical and mental state. Make sure you are focused on the task at hand. Also prepare yourself for work by making sure that your body is warm before trying to move anything. Muscles are not as flexible when cold or after sitting for long periods of time; this makes the risk of injury greater. It is suggested that you put your body through the range of motions that you will be doing before you pick up the load. Reach over your head as high as possible taking a deep breath. These exercises will help warm and stretch your muscles and get you prepared to lift.

THINK about the situation, environment and the load. Use the time when you are warming up to look for hazards and see how and where you will be taking the load to ensure it is clear and safe. Make sure you have a clear place to land the load after moving it; you do not want to try to clear a landing site while your hands are full. This will also keep you from having to lift the load twice. Check the size, weight and hand holds of the load. Make sure you are capable of lifting it. If it is over 50 pounds GET HELP! Make sure it is balanced and easy to handle.

ACT in the best and safest manner to avoid injuries. Use lifting and moving equipment as your first choice. If equipment is not available, the use of proper lifting techniques must be instituted and will be covered in the next Simply Safety.

The U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll (USAKA) Environmental Standards require that the operating parameters of US Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll (USAG-KA) activities with the potential to affect the public health and environment must be defined in a Document of Environmental Protection (DEP). The USAKA Environmental Standards further provide that regulatory agencies and the public be allowed to review and comment on a Draft DEP.

The *Draft DEP for Minuteman III Modification and Fuze Modernization Flight Tests*, December 2015, provides the proposed requirements and limitations for flight tests at USAG-KA by the U.S. Air Force for Minuteman III Modification and Fuze Modernization Flight Tests.

Due to a delay in availability of the Draft DEP at some public locations, the public comment review period of 30 days will be extended. Comments should now be postmarked no later than February 19, 2016.

The public is invited to review and comment on this Draft DEP. The Draft DEP is available for review at the Grace Sherwood Library, the Roi-Namur Library, the RMI Environmental Protection Authority (RMIEPA) offices on Ebeye and Majuro, and at www.tbe.com/Minuteman_III_Documents_for_Public_Review. 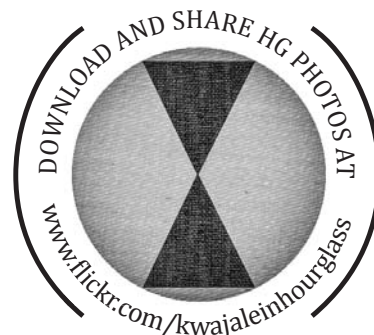
