UNITED STATES WILL REPATRIATE HUMAN REMAINS

The United States will repatriate a collection of human remains from U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll to officials on Majuro next week. The collection contains more than 200 human bones and bone fragments found on Kwajalein and Roi-Namur, said Kwajalein's Senior DynCorp International Archaeologist Grant Day.

This repatriation mission is the first time in Day's tenure on island that an official repatriation will be made. The collection will be returned in a crate that Day will hand carry and deliver himself.

Following WWII, memorial markers were erected on Kwajalein and Roi for fallen Soldiers. However, numerous historic grave sites are unmarked. Human remains may turn up at any dig or con-

struction site on Kwajalein. When bones or remains are recovered in and around the atoll, an archeological assessment must be made.

Day and Gilbertson advise USAG-KA Cultural Resource Manager Derek Miller on how to provide the best solution for artifact handling on site. When the remains are collected, they are transferred back to the Kwajalein Archeology Office.

"It's rare for us to find a complete skeleton," said Gilbertson, DI's resident osteoarcheologist.

Gilbertson and Day study and catalog the human remains found on Kwajalein Atoll using a comparative collection comprised of molded and actual human bones as well as a collection of animal

bones assembled on island. When appropriate, some samples are sent out for carbon dating.

Using archeological context and analysis of the bones, Gilbertson can tell the likelihood of whether remains belong to a Caucasian or Asian individual, an important decision in the process of reporting and returning remains to a country of origin. In some cases, DNA analysis is used to make a more definitive determination.

The opportunity to work behind the scenes of history with the international archeological community is an aspect of the job that appeals to both Day and Gilbertson.

"To be able to work with the RMI and help get these remains back to their homes in Japan or Korea is deeply satisfying," they said.

THE KWAJALEIN HOURGLASS

The Kwajalein Hourglass is named for the insignia of the U.S. Army 7th Infantry Division, which liberated the island from the forces of Imperial Japan on Feb. 4, 1944. MAXWELL RECEIVES AWARD

HOURLASS REPORT

Former USAG-KA Public Affairs Officer Nikki Maxwell received the Commander's Award for Civilian Service in a ceremony attended by family, friends and colleagues at U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll headquarters July 27.

The award was presented by USAG-KA Commander Col. James DeOre. It recognizes Maxwell's impact on garrison public relations and communications for exceptional civilian service while serving as Public Affairs Officer for United States Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll from October 2015 to July 2018.

Maxwell's leadership resulted in increased significant international public exposure for the garrison and Reagan Test Site. American Forces Network and Stars and Stripes visited for the first

time in decades and created a series of video, electronic and print stories. Maxwell personally revitalized the garrison Facebook page as a primary source of information for the community. The Kwajalein Hourglass won numerous awards under her stewardship as contracting officer technical monitor.

All of Kwajalein's cats and dogs know Barbara Kocis.

"It was a dream for a very long time [to become a vet tech]," said Kwajalein Veterinary Technician Barbara Kocis. "I love what I do."

After obtaining her vet tech license in Virginia and working in regional vet clinics, Kocis moved to Kwajalein to look after the island's population of 82 dogs and 80 cats. Her schedule keeps her busy.

"Somedays I don't see any [patients]" said Kocis in a recent interview. "Other days, I work right through lunch."

The Veterinary clinic is located on Laagoon Road. Residents can make appointments five days a week, Tuesday through Saturday, from 7:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. The clinic contains a waiting and animal housing area, a small lab and an operating area.

Kocis can do basic health check-ups for Kwajalein's cats and dogs, as well as medical fielding, basic lab work and tests for animal diseases like feline leukemia. When there's a tough call that needs to be made, she checks in with In-

ternational SOS Veterinarian Support to discuss treatment options.

"I let him know what's going on," she said. "We talk to the vet and see what he thinks. It all depends on what it is."

The Army Veterinarian comes to Kwajalein on a roughly quarterly basis. During those visits the Vet can see privately owned animals when time allows. Check with Vet Services to inquire about tentative appointments Aug. 9 or 10 if your pet has a need to be seen.

Newcomers to Kwajalein can discuss their pet care concerns with Kocis prior to arrival. She is glad to answer anything she can to help assure the new four-legged residents have an enjoyable tour of the atoll and takes residential preventative care seriously.

Anyone who wishes to adopt a cat or a dog can speak with Kocis about what animals may need concerning regular medical care while on island and requirements based on housing eligibility and pet ownership on USAG-KA. The vet clinic can accommodate owners whose pets need vaccines, spays, microchips and other preventative care. The vet tech

also works with incoming owners to ensure medical files and care plans are in order.

Kocis encourages all pet owners to be aware of how the heat and climate may affect their pets. Wiping dogs down after a walk can help them avoid nasal irritation from pollens and coral dust. She says it's best to carry a water bottle on walks to make sure dogs do not become dehydrated.

VET TECH TIPS FOR A SAFE AND HEALTHY KWAJ PET

Knowing what to do if your dog gets overheated on these hot humid days is key to a happy healthy life on Kwajalein. Check out these tips to get informed. For more information, please contact Barb Kocis, LVT – Vet Tech at Kwajalein Veterinary Services at 5-2017.

First signs your dog may be getting overheated

- Heavy panting
- Drooling
- Slowing down
- Stopping frequently
- Lying down

What to do

- Find a shaded spot
- Give small amounts of water (tepid or cool)
- Allow frequent rests
- Head for home

Once you get home:

- Get your pet in air conditioning as soon as possible
- Use a fan if you have one
- Continue offering small amounts of tepid or cool water

- Place cool, wet towels on your dog's abdomen, head, inguinal area (privates), feet, legs and back
- Do not put your pet in a cold bath

Continue monitoring

- Watch your dog carefully – Gums need to be pink. Breathing should be easing up a bit
- Continue offering small amounts of water (no gulping)
- Cooling down needs to happen slowly. Shock is a concern if the temperature drops too fast. Check rectal temperature frequently (normal 100 – 102.5/103).

Call the Vet Clinic if your pet exhibits any of the following symptoms:

- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Weak
- Lethargic
- Unsteadiness
- Inability to stand or respond

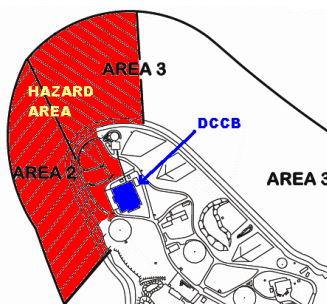
The Koenig Jabar Tennis Court is now open! Grab your gear and come play on the resurfaced court!

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The last couple days of quiet weather will end Sunday and Monday as moderate trade winds and a surface wave with scattered and numerous showers and a few thunderstorms push into our area. After wave passage, winds will weaken considerably, and a monsoon trough will begin to take shape over western Micronesia, with some intrusion eastward into the RMI. Light winds and periods of scattered showers are expected next week. Some west winds are a good bet, but the threat of a strong or significant west wind event is low.

Average to slightly above average precipitation is expected over the next seven days.

SATURDAY/SUNDAY/MONDAY FORECAST: Isolated showers on Saturday, increasing to scattered and numerous showers and a few thunderstorms over the weekend due to a passing trough. Winds – NE-E at 4-9 knots on Saturday; ENE-ESE at 8-13 knots on Sunday; and E-SE at 6-11 knots on Monday.

MID-WEEK FORECAST: Return to doldrums with light and variable winds and periods of scattered showers and stray thunderstorms.

DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT**

Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA); the Council on Environmental Quality regulations for implementing the procedural provisions of NEPA (40 Code of Federal Regulations [CFR] 1500-1508); Department of Defense (DoD) Directive 4715.9, Environmental Planning and Analysis; 32 CFR Part 651, Environmental Planning and Analysis; the United States (U.S.) Army Space and Missile Defense Command/Army Forces Strategic Command (USASMDC/ARSTRAT) prepared an Environmental Assessment (EA) analyzing the potential environmental effects the effects of the replacement of a fiber optic cable on the southwest side of Kwajalein Island, Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI).

The fiber optic cable experienced abrasion and failed near the Kwajalein Island cable landing site and required immediate repair. This cable is part of a critical Pacific communications network that links in various Micronesian islets, and its failure greatly affected resident and mission related communications. This EA also considered the alternative of No Action.

If this alternative had been chosen, the USAG-KA would have been without critical communication capabilities and the Federated States of Micronesia and the RMI would have been without internet capability. On-going and future activities for which potential environmental effects have been analyzed and documented would continue. Following analysis of the Proposed Action, the USASMDC/ARSTRAT determined that no significant environmental impacts resulted from the repair activities. The Draft Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) and the Draft EA are available for a public review from July 27 to August 27, 2018, at the following locations:
