# **KWAJ TO RECEIVE NEW AIRSTREAM HOUSING**

Fifty Airstream trailers are scheduled for arrival April 2 on U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll as part of a unique new housing initiative to accommodate the island's unaccompanied employee population.

Ísland residents can check out one of the newly arrived units situated just across from Kwajalein High School at the edge of the oceanside dome neighborhood.

"It's ironic that these are going right back in the vicinity of the former Silver City," said one longtime employee.

The neighborhood, which has been dubbed "Silver City 2.0" by the USAG-KA Housing and Billeting Office, will offer occupants a sleek, modern accommodation akin to the island's dome housing. Each of the new two-bedroom units comes from a cache of disused property which originally supported 1960s space programs performed by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. Each comes equipped with modern amenities, a full range and bathtub, as well as a few surprises.

"One thing we are really thrilled about are the foosball tables," said a Housing representative. "Each of these things comes with a vintage foosball table. People pay thousands of dollars for those each year. They are really rare commodities, and the garrison is giving them to people to use for the duration of their stay—for free."

Following this initial delivery, 100 to 200 more units will be delivered to the island over the coming months. Island residents can expect commuter traffic and barge offload operations to be impacted until household shipping is complete. Already, community members are pausing in the road near the first installed units to check out the new living

"These new homes are gorgeous, and I cannot wait to try them out," said an island resident this week.

According to a USAG-KA spokesperson, island residents currently occupying bachelor quarters who would like the opportunity to try out an Airstream living space should visit the office in Building 730 to complete a housing request form. For quality assurance purposes, that form will be retained until Spring 2023, when the installation of all homes is anticipated to be complete. Upon review, if the applicants still reside on Kwajalein, they will be asked to fill out an Army Form 27B to verify their continued interest before also completing a Change of Domicile form at the Housing Office.

# **BICYCLE REGISTRATION, INSURANCE NOW REQUIRED BY PROVOST MARSHAL'S OFFICE**


Attention all Kwaialein residents: All island residents owning bicycles are subjected to these new Army regulations. Please adhere to these regulations at all times. Visit the Kwajalein Security Office for more information.

Beginning May 2, leaving quarantine, all island residents residing in bachelor quarters will be required to

register their bicycles and pay for a Verified Bike Parking Permit. The registration fee is \$50 per year and includes the following amenities: mandatory bike registration; bike insurance; and a removal fee in the event that your bike is abandoned, lost or otherwise left to rust, resulting in a safety hazard for island buildings and grounds employees.

# NEW MWR PARK IS SURE TO DELIGHT DOG OWNERS, RESIDENTS

**During a** town hall for the Kwajalein community in 2021, former Kwajalein resident Lori Alles stood to address the garrison command team.

A dog owner for many years, Alles had identified a safety issue at the island's dog park.

The green space just off Lagoon Road had several spots where over time, hermit crabs and the dirt had settled, leaving holes in the earth where island dogs romp and play.

The holes posed a safety issue, Alles said.

"My dog might step in a hole," said Alles, to explain.

Luckily, an upcoming joint initiative will provide an extra layer of pet exercise safety

With some assistance from the U.S. Space Force, island dogs will soon be walking in style—several feet off the ground—at an antigravity park specially designed for dog owners.

"The anti-gravity dog park is a family-friendly exercise alternative for dogs and their handlers who operate in remote environments that may benefit from additional resources for life, health, safety and morale," said a USSF spokesperson late last week. "Space Force hopes that this park will add something more to the great entertainment offerings on U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll. We are pleased to be able to partner with US-AG-KA Command in this endeavor."

The award for the park has yet to be awarded, but plans are moving forward. A tentative groundbreaking date is set

for early in fiscal year 2027, a project representative wrote to The Kwajalein Hourglass last week.

In that time, plans and engineering discussion are expected to focus on safety, accessibility and sanitation issues.

"One thing we haven't quite worked out yet is how to collect dog droppings in a zero-gravity environment," a spokesperson said. "We are recommending anyone using the park take their dog for a walk before entering, so that everyone can experience the joy of the park without mishap."

This week, USAG-KA Command has

released a few additional tips and details pertaining to use for the future park.

- Per directive of USAG-KA Command Sgt. Maj. Ismael Ortega, dogs and owners will need to wear specialized "zipline" vests which always connect the dog and their owner via a tether. This is for pet and owner safety.
- For safety, no cats will be allowed inside the antigravity chamber
- Considering sanitation issues, each dog resident will be issued a facemask to wear in the mark
- For the convenience of dogwalkers, collection bins for dog waste will be located outside the antigravity park
- The community can also expect special reserved training times for the island's K-9 officers. During scheduled trainings, for the safety of island pets, the park will be off-limits.
- Owners and their dogs can "anchor" at a central flotation station
- There are tentative plans to host MWR aerobics classes in the park



# ARMY FUTURES COMMAND MOVES FORWARD WITH LASER SHARK PROGRAM

**United States Army** Futures Command has announced the budget for phase two of a new experimental weapons test program that combines the research and development efforts of the U.S. Army and

Target-Acquired Augmented Counterattack Object program is the latest iteration in a series of submarine weapons development programs led by U.S. Army Research Laboratory and the U.S. Naval Research Laboratory. According to Department of Defense reports, the target budget for the TACO test program is \$4.5 million. Funding for phase two is slated to begin fiscal year 2025.

TACO testing pairs indigenous shark

species with dorsal laser technology. Similar to the 5-kilowatt Mobile Expeditionary High Energy Laser demonstrated at the Grafenwoehr Training Area in Germany in early March, TACO measures the viability of laser weapons in extreme climes

Preliminary program trials using robotic sharks have been completed at test facilities in Australia, Antarctica and the United States. Testing is expected to begin in the Republic of the Marshall Islands April 1, 2025.

U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll is a likely base of operations for testing, according to recent U.S. Army reports. Sharks in the Marshall Islands will be outfitted with technological super-exoskeletal suits coated in a stealth liquid skin with embedded laser technologies. Real sharks are preferred to remotely operated autonomous underwater vehicles due to the margin for error and desire for real-world testable outcomes.

The TACO force will be used to fortify port security for multinational maritime initiatives as part of the Army's commitment to preparing the future-focused warfighter.

"The Republic of the Marshall Islands is located in a large shark preserve," said a Department of Defense spokesperson. "It is an ideal location to carry out preliminary research. No sharks will be harmed in the implementation of this program. In a few years, everywhere you look you'll see peacekeeping TACOs.'



# **CURRICULUM AND PROGRAM CHANGES** IN 2026 FOR KWAJALEIN HIGH SCHOOL

After more than 60 years providing education services to the island's youngest residents, the Kwajalein School System will close in less than five years—and the programming that comes next will be a first amongst schools in the Indo-Pacific

A garrison employee confirmed this week that, as part of an extended Army-wide vocational training program the school system will be disbanded by April 1, 2026. In its place is an exciting new circus arts and acrobatics magnet school program that will place high school-aged students directly in the workplace with technical experts and practicing performance artists.

Supporting the move from traditional classrooms to hands-on workshops is none other than The Worchester Institute of Circus and Performance Arts, Denbigh-Lendenpouf, said a school representative.

"We believe that our curriculum will help prepare students for success and safety on the job," said Michael Wonderblau, chief executive of WICPA. "It's going to be great, and our course offerings are sure to be a unique and original addition to the typical core curriculum. We look forward to working with school administrators to find the best possible fit.

Among the new course offerings, students will be able to practice fire-twirling, unicycling, juggling, magic, gymnastics, theater and performing arts and everyone's favorite—miming.

"This curriculum change will be a return to the classics—I mean, the real classics," Wonderblau said. "As a discipline, theater arts and performance are ancient, and predate the traditional western university. We hope the students enjoy the chance to learn these exciting new skills."

Presently there is no further information available, and representatives involved in the school transition have declined to comment.

We value our educators, and we want to ensure them that we will look for other places in the contract where their skills and abilities can be utilized," said a garrison employee knowledgeable about the change, who asked not to be named because of their involvement with the project. Tentative employment plans at present involve training all members of current school faculty in several areas to bolster staffing around the island.

Teachers will receive certificates verifying these unique on-the-job training opportunities," said Kwajalein High School Assistant Principal Max Crighton. "Staff will have the opportunity to support USAG-KA Morale, Welfare and Recreation Department to serve as specialists for workshops and community enrichment courses. Those educators who pass the required aptitude tests will also be able to serve as substitute pilots for the garrison's Lakota helicopters and metroliners."

George Seitz Elementary School Karen Brady, who has former experience in theater, said she will miss the old curriculum, but that the school will be a great change

"It will be just like old times," Brady said. "Who would have thought that we'd be able to get back to basics?'

# NOTHING TO SEE, HERE, SAYS KWAJALEIN ARCHAEOLOGY: IT'S A RADIATOR

**Sometimes**, an archaeological find is just that—something that was found. In the case of a recovered object now located at the Kwajalein Archaeology Office, that find is not an exciting piece of futuristic technology or a remnant from ancient Marshallese history. It is a simple car radiator.

Stuck in a bank of sand, no one had seen the item for more than 75 years. Still, for some island residents the vintage car radiator is worth writing home about.

"I find that fairly unique," said Caitlin Gilbertson, Kwajalein archaeologist. "Of all the items stored in the archaeology lab, this is the one VIPs come to see. The stories that radiator could tell! The interest in this piece really surprises me.'

Though the radiator may be mysterious, one thing is certain: It can never be utilized again.

Measuring approximately 50- to 75-inches, the vintage mechanism is crushed and crumpled beyond repair—a possible reason for it having been discarded all those years ago in the first place.

Intermixed with the sand and dirt impacted into radiator, numbers and a semblance of its basic shape are still discernable. The archaeology team believes the piece may have come from a small Jeep or another American utility vehicle utilized by the Army or Navy.

Based on what she has been able to verify about the part, Gilbertson estimates that this could date the radiator back to post-WWII era on Kwajalein, when increased activity during cleanup operations would have required more work and transport vehicles.

Still, the find is unique and continues to draw interest among residents in the community.

"The guys from Kwajalein Automotive are all about this radiator," said Gilbertson. "Two employees came to check it out. They started trying to guess what type of vehicle it might have come from.

The fascination with finding lost objects might stem from our love of adventure and history, Kwajalein Archaeologist Susan Underbrink said-even if that item can technically be categorized as "trash." On an island where historical objects are sure to turn up at a moment's notice, locating a relatively mundane object helps fill in the blanks in the lives of those who used it.

"Also, I think some people just really like owning pieces of history,'

#### Underbrink said.

Someone offered me a soda in trade for the radiator to use it as a decoration. I told them, 'no, that's ridiculous and unethical, and archaeology doesn't work like that.' It can be exciting to find something that's been lost for a long time. Still, that doesn't necessarily mean it's up for grabs. It's trash, but it's historic trash. Eisenhower could have driven around in the car attached to this radiator. We'll never know."







GoogleMaps image of Kwajalein Atoll



# KWAJ POST OFFICE TIPS FOR SUCCESS

**Here are some** helpful tips from the Kwajalein Army Post Office. Whether you are departing or arriving on the garrison, these tips are for you.

#### **Here's What To Do**

- Present your ID badge when receiving postal services, including package pickup.
- Check and pick up mail at least biweekly.
- (If you get a larger amount of mail, check weekly).
- Check packages before you leave the pick-up window to ensure they are yours.
- Complete your customs forms before coming to the window.
- Put a completed mailing label inside your package.
- If you are PCSing, include a copy of your travel orders inside the package. Give a second copy to the postal clerk.
- Use correct mailing addresses (PCS 701 is for personal mail and Unit 17001 for company mail).
- Please bring tracking numbers for missing packages to the finance window, as we can usually provide more tracking information.
- If your package arrived damaged and is missing something, please visit the postal office and ask. We occasionally find loose items.
- If mailing sea glass, be sure to clean it thoroughly before shipping. We have had sea glass returned.

#### **Here's What Not To Do**

- Don't leave empty boxes outside the Post Office.
- Don't slam the P.O. Box doors shut. They are fragile.
- Don't PCS without providing a change of address form. (Remember to also change your address on USPS.com).
- Refrain from using Gorilla cases for shipping. They become fragile in cold weather and may shatter in shipment. If you do use a gorilla case, include an additional completed mailing label in the case inside prior to shipping).
- Don't attempt to mail shells or items from the beach without checking to see if you are allowed to mail them. Your package will get returned.
- Don't mail items from the local shops without including a good description on the customs form and a sales receipt inside.
- Don't expect insurance to make up for poorly packed items. Claims have been denied when items are not properly prepared.







If a Fluorescent Antibody Virus Neutralization (FAVN) is needed for your PCS, it could take eight weeks to receive results.





#### **WEATHER DISCUSSION**

A strong subtropical ridge will loosen its grip over the Marshall Islands, allowing an Intertropical Convergence Zone disturbance to overspread heavier showers and rain over Kwajalein Atoll this weekend.

At this time, it looks like the heaviest and most persistent showers will be from Sunday morning into Monday morning. A stray thunderstorm or two can't be ruled out, and strong wind gusts will be possible near precipitation. Wind direction could veer at times to the southeast, especially on Sunday.

Heavier seas are expected, diminishing a bit on Monday. Spring tides will bring minor splash-over around times of peak high tides to more vulnerable spots with northeast exposure at Roi-Namur and Third Island.

#### **SATURDAY**

Partly sunny and breezy with isolated to widely scattered showers. Winds NE-ENE at 16-22 knots with higher gusts, especially near showers.

#### **SUNDAY**

Mostly cloudy to overcast with showers likely and a stray thunderstorm. Winds ENE-SE at 10-18 knots with higher gusts, especially near showers.

#### **MONDAY**

Mostly cloudy to partly sunny with scattered showers and a stray thunderstorm possible, mainly in the morning. Winds NE-ESE at 10-18 knots with higher gusts, especially near showers.

#### **NEXT WEEK**

Partly sunny Tuesday and Wednesday with winds NE-E at 14-19 knots, and mainly isolated showers. Increased showers could return by Thursday.
