

HUNT BROTHERS PIZZA GETS A SLICE OF THE ACTION

The aroma of bacon and pepperoni filled the AAFES Food Court this Wednesday, as customers lined up at Hunt Brothers Pizza.

The new pizza eatery on U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll held a community taste testing event with free samples ahead of a soft opening on Thursday.

At the counter, hungry and curious customers carried away cardboard trays with slices of hot pizza.

"Pizza is quick, it's easy, and it hits all the right spots," said AAFES General Manager Ian Morales of the popular comfort food. "We wanted to give the community a chance to try some new flavors."

The former vendor, Anthony's Pizza, was one of few left in the world, Morales said. Over the years, the brand diminished until recent developments made Kwaj sales no longer an option.

"The vendor that supplied all of our ingredients is no longer able to support," he said.

Many residents of Kwajalein and Ebeye have grabbed stacks of pizzas to go over the years to share at potlucks and gatherings. Morales said he hopes that the new dining option will be enjoyable for the Kwaj community. The best may be yet to come.

Some visitors on taste-testing day chose a meat lover's option loaded with crispy bacon and sliced pepperoni. Others tried something new: a slice of breakfast-style with unique toppings.

"Just wait until we receive our chopped bell peppers," said Camacho, of the breakfast-style pizza. "It will taste just like an omelet."


U.S. ARMY SPACE AND MISSILE DEFENSE COMMAND HISTORY

Lockheed Martin held a roll-out ceremony for the Terminal High Altitude Area Defense or THAAD weapon system and fire control communications unit on April 13, 2009, at its facility in Camden, Arkansas.

The ceremony marked the delivery of the first THAAD ground segment vehicles to come off the Camden production line. The equipment was later delivered to Soldiers at Fort Bliss, who will have a fully operational THAAD battery by the end of the year.

As U.S. Congressman Mike Ross noted during the ceremony, "The THAAD system will play a pivotal role in our nation's missile defense, and today's rollout is an encouraging sign of the tremendous progress we're making in this vital technology.

GLASS BEACH UPDATE

The area at the south end of the runway, known as Glass Beach, is the nesting site for green turtles, also known as Chelonya mydas, from May through October.

Green turtles are protected under U.S. law, the U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll Environmental Standards in the Republic of the Marshall Islands. They are also protected by the United Nations worldwide.

Last year, the beach was closed while the nesting season occurred primarily due to ongoing construction activities at the end of the runway.

This year, the beach will not be closed. Here are the rules to safely enjoy the beach, and to help ensure the safety for the turtles as well.

- The top crest of the beach area, to include all vegetation near the orange fencing, is off limits.
- There is a single point of entry to Glass Beach. It is located at the end of the orange safety perimeter fence. There is a small

palm tree denoting the entry and exit spot.

- No large groups or party gatherings are permitted in this area. Visitors must retrieve any trash before leaving the area.
- Violators of these safety orders must be reported to USAG-KA.
- During flight-operation hours, observe all applicable airfield/runway restrictions and safety rules.
- Visitors must not park golf carts near the Glass Beach entry and exit point during airfield operation times. Carts must be parked away from that spot.

New signs will be posted soon to indicate the beach vegetation zone, areas to keep out, and the entry and exit spot onto the beach.



Updated entry requirements for the RMI by air or seaport include the following requirements: Adults aged 18-years-old and up must have completed one primary COVID-19 vaccine series. Primary series: Johnson & Johnson single dose; Pfizer completed series (two doses); or Moderna completed series (two doses) Boosters are not currently mandated. There is no vaccination requirement for children under age 18.



NOTIFY THE VET. Pet owners must notify Kwaj Vet Services before taking vacation. A pet sitter authorization form for treatment is required prior to departing the island. Reach Veterinary Services at 480-2017 Tuesday through Saturday from 7:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

POST OFFICE. Customers must notify the post office before leaving for 30 days or PCS'ing. Per DOD 4525.6-M, mail is only allowed to be held for 30 days with or without prior notice. Mail is considered unclaimed on day 31 and will be returned to the sender. Email the post office to authorize pick up for your mail and packages. When PCS'ing, provide a forwarding address. SAFETY TIP FROM THE OFFICE OF FIRE PREVENTION: PARKING NEAR FIRE PROTECTION DEVICES.

- Never park or chain a bike to red painted fire protection piping.
- Do not park in front of a fire hydrant.
- Do not block facility EXITS with bikes or vehicles.
- Do not store items within 3 feet of fire sprinkler systems.
- Combustible storage is prohibited in electrical mechanical rooms.
- Do not store bikes or other items underneath inside stairwells.

REGULATIONS

TOBACCO USE. USAG-KA Policy Memorandum 600-8 protects others from the negative impact of tobacco use. On US-AG-KA, smoking is permitted in designated smoking areas only. Smoking and cigarette butt receptacles must be at least 50 feet from the entrance of facilities.

NOT ALLOWED ON USAG-KA: bow and arrow, air guns, paint ball and other projectile weapons.

VEGETATION. Per USAG-KA Regulation 420-1, vegetation may not be planted in the ground without approved permits. Residents may be asked to remove items if planted without approval. Do not place sprouted coconuts in yards.

CANDLES and open flames are not permitted in BQ rooms. The Kwajalein Fire Department thanks you for keeping your neighbors safe.

STOP FOR AIRCRAFT Stop and look both ways for aircraft traffic on Zeus Blvd. or Ocean Rd.



METAL DETECTORS are not allowed on Kwajalein according to Army Regulation. Unexploded Ordnance exists and could be dangerous if disturbed.

PULL OVER. All vehicle operators must yield to right of way to emergency vehicles that sound their sirens.



UXO SAFETY REMINDER

PUBLIC SAFETY ANNOUNCEMENT

Unexploded ordnance should be treated like dangerous sea creatures: Look, but do not touch.

You can play an important role in keeping Kwajalein safe by knowing what to do when you spot unexploded ordnance.

Remember the three R's of UXO:

- Recognize an item as possible unexploded ordnance;
- Retreat from the area of the UXO;
- Report suspected UXO immediately.

If you discover an object that could be UXO, notify Kwajalein Explosive Ordnance Disposal immediately by calling 480-1433. You can also call CPS at 480-4445. Provide the following information about what you found:

> Location. Note helpful details like the building number, GPS coordinates and any prominent landmarks

HELP FOR SOLDIERS (And Military Dependents 18+)

WHO CAN HELP?

SEXUAL ASSAULT RESPONSE COORDINATOR (SARC)

Soldier or Civilian who oversees sexual assault awareness, prevention, and response training; coordinates medical treatment, including emergency care, for victims of sexual assault; and tracks the services provided to a victim of sexual assault from the initial report through final disposition and resolution. Conversations with SARCs are confidential. SARCs can take Restricted and Unrestricted Reports of sexual assault.

VICTIM ADVOCATE (VA)

Soldier or Civilian who provides non-clinical crisis intervention, information on available options and resources, and ongoing non-clinical support to victims. Conversations with VAs are confidential. VAs can take Restricted and Unrestricted Reports of sexual assault.

SPECIAL VICTIMS' COUNSEL (SVC)

Military attorney who assists you in a confidential, attorney-client relationship, whether or not you choose to file a report. SVCs can't take a report of sexual assault.

HEALTH CARE PROVIDER

A privileged health care provider who has been designated for Clinical Services, to manage sexual assault patient's medical treatment related to the sexual assault incident from initial presentation to completion of all follow-up visits.

CHAPLAIN

Military officer who provides confidential, spiritual advice and the opportunity to privately discuss your concerns, even if you aren't religious. Conversations with a chaplain are confidential and protected by military law. Chaplains can't take a report of sexual assault.

VICTIM WITNESS LIAISON (VWL)

Specially trained legal worker who supports the military prosecutor throughout the courts-martial process. They can help you get to military proceedings, arrange for transportation, and apply for crime victim's compensation. Conversations with VWLs aren't confidential. VWLs can't take a report of sexual assault.

DoD SAFE HELPLINE APP



The Safe Helpline App is a free mobile resource created to meet the unique needs of members of the Department of Defense community affected by sexual assault. By downloading the App, you can access 24/7 support through the Safe Helpline phone and on-line website and helplines. You can also obtain information, resources, and practical exercises to help address the short- and long-term effects of sexual assault so you can manage your self-care.



WEATHER DISCUSSION

There will be a weak trade wind trough passing through the area on Saturday with isolated to widely scattered showers and abundant cloud cover.

As the trade wind trough exits the region on Saturday night into Sunday, showers will dissipate with partly cloudy skies and only stray to isolated showers, although this will be short lived as showers return by Sunday evening.

A developing disturbance situated well to the southwest will bring deeper moisture back into the region by Monday with shower coverage once again increasing with a possible thunderstorm and mostly cloudy skies.

The subtropical high will be centered well to the north of Kwajalein Atoll and remain fairly weak with a relaxed pressure gradient through Saturday before northeast to easterly trade winds increase between 11-17 knots Sunday and Monday.

SATURDAY

Mostly cloudy with isolated to widely scattered showers. Winds NE-E at 9-14 knots with occasional higher gusts, mainly near showers.

SUNDAY


Partly sunny with isolated showers increasing to widely scattered showers during the evening. Winds NE-E at 12-17 knots with occasional higher gusts, mainly near showers.

MONDAY

Mostly cloudy with scattered showers and a possible thunderstorm. Winds NE-E at 11-16 knots with occasional higher gusts, especially near showers.

NEXT WEEK

A weak disturbance will continue to meander to the west of Kwajalein Atoll with southerly flow providing abundant moisture to remain in the mid and upper levels over the region, bringing periods of scattered showers and possible stray thunderstorms.
