## PUBLIC HEALTH COMMAND-PACIFIC'S RADIOLOGICAL ADVISORY MEDICAL TEAM TESTS ITS SKILLS DURING SAGAMI GENERAL DEPOT EXERCISE

**SAGAMI GENERAL DEPOT, Japan** - The Public Health Command-Pacific radiological advisory medical team conducted an exercise March 12 at Sagami General Depot.

Maj. Daniel Arguello, PHC-Pacific's Chief of Health Physics, said the purpose of the exercise was to bring everybody together as a team and to practice individual tasks such as properly equipping themselves and taking environmental field samples.

Ultimately, the exercise allowed the team to practice the techniques required to provide radiological health expertise if they are ever needed.

The team purposely left their home stations and traveled to the depot to ensure they had the ability to put all the necessary equipment and supplies to work in case of emergency situations, Arguello added.

Arguello said the team was able to get the equipment deployed smoothly and complete a lot of tasks done considering it was the first time working with members from Hawaii for the exercise.

"I think we did relatively well," said Arguello. "I was very happy with how we did."

Arguello said he looks forward to more frequent joint exercises with more members from the Pacific region.

Staff Sgt. Kevin Stringer, assigned to Tripler Army Medical Center in Hawaii, said it was beneficial to bring team members together for training as they are usually

stationed at various locations around the Pacific.

Stringer said planning the exercises, getting all the equipment together and transporting it to a remote location required a lot of work and coordination, but the actual exercise went smoothly.

"It was nice to come together even though we've never worked together," said Stringer. "This is really important (training) for us to get together as a team - to know each other and work with each other in case there were a real incident."

Stringer said the biggest takeaway was that the team now has a clear picture of what needs to be improved to make the operation run smoother the next time around.

## **COMMISSARIES ON HAWAII WILL NO LONGER ISSUE SINGLE-USE SHOPPING BAGS STARTING APRIL 30**

- Commissaries on Hawaii will no longer issue single-use shopping bags starting in April, as the Defense Commissary Agency (DeCA) follows local laws to reduce waste and protect the environment, the agency announced.

In accordance with the state of Hawaii Ordinance 19-30 signed December 15, 2019, disposable carryout bags will no longer be available at Hawaii commissaries effective April 30, 2024.

"DeCA is committed to complying with applicable local, territorial and state laws restricting the use of plastic and paper single-use bags," said John Hall, DeCA Director and CEO. "We plan to implement a phased approach to eliminate single-use bags that takes into account our patrons' needs and logistical limitations. Over the years DeCA has been a leader in energy, water and solid waste reduction, as well

as implementing a robust recycling program to help protect the environment."

Commissary customers are encouraged to bring their own reusable bags from home or purchase reusable or hot/ cold bags from the selection available at each store. DeCA will post signs with more details in the Hickam Air Force Base, Pearl Harbor, Kaneohe Bay and Schofield Barracks commissaries to keep patrons informed.

DeCA remains dedicated to environmental stewardship, reducing its ecological footprint, and complying with applicable environmental laws and regulations. DeCA's approach to eliminating non-reusable bags in all four Hawaii commissaries takes into account its patrons' needs, as well as various contractual, fiscal, statutory and operational requirements.

Elimination of single-use bags will be a major shift in commissary patron shopping habits, and DeCA will address potential concerns during the transition process. DeCA will also provide additional resources toward education and awareness to ease the transition. #### **NASA, SPACEX TARGET NEW LAUNCH** DATE FOR NOAA WEATHER SATELLITE

NASA and SpaceX now are targeting Tuesday, June 25, for the launch of GOES-U, the fourth and final satellite in the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) Geostationary Operational Environmental Satellites (GOES) – R Series.

The new launch date allows time for teams to fully repair and test the Falcon Heavy core booster after a liquid oxygen leak was identified during routine new booster testing in February.

NASA and SpaceX teams have resumed preparation of the GOES-U launch. GOES-U will launch on a SpaceX Falcon Heavy rocket from Launch Complex 39A at the agency's Kennedy Space Center in Florida.

NOAA oversees GOES-R Series **Program** through an integrated NOAA-NASA office, managing the ground system, operating the satellites, and distributing their data to users worldwide.

NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center manages the acquisition of the spacecraft and instruments and also built the Magnetometer instrument for GOES-T and GOES-U.

NASA's Launch Services Program, based at Kennedy Space Center manages the launch services for the GOES missions.

Lockheed Martin designs, builds, and tests the GOES-R series satellites. L<sub>3</sub>Harris Technologies provides the primary instrument, Advanced Baseline Imager, along with the ground system, which includes the antenna system for data reception.

## **Zamperini Demo**


Phase 1 of the Zamperini Dining Facility has begun. From now through June 1 is the demolition for the old kitchen in the back.

- 1. Attend Col. Morgan's TEAM KWAJ brief (either Teammate or Community version), read and adhere to the TEAM KWAJ Teammate Pact, presented at initial town halls, and periodically thereafter.
- 2. Attend the Island Newcomer's Briefing.
- 3. Attend at least one group greeting at air terminal for personnel arriving on island. Make them feel welcome and show them we are happy they are on Kwaj with us.
- 4. Attend at least two garrison after-hours team-building or social events (TEAM KWAJ Happy Hour, Commander's Call, Hail/Farewell).
- 5. Attend at least two TEAM KWAJ PT/Wellness sessions. Become a regular attender!

- 6. Visit Marshallese Cultural Center in last 3 months prior to tab award.

Drink a cup of cool water every 20 minutes, even if you aren't thirsty. For long, strenuous jobs, drink a beverage with electrolytes.




Take regular breaks to rest. During hot conditions, skipping breaks is not safe!





#### WEATHER DISCUSSION

Kwajalein Atoll will enjoy seasonally dry and breezy conditions this weekend ahead of a trade wind surge next week. The subtropical high-pressure ridge north of the RMI continues to dominate the weather pattern, driving pleasant weather across the region, and is expected to strengthen through the start of next week.

Winds will sustain in the upper teens to around 20 knots by Monday night and remain elevated in this range for much of the coming workweek. This will drive larger-than-usual trade swells across the RMI, which will coincide with the arrival of April King tides leading to rough, elevated seas.

While this event will not be as impactful as the March King tides, minor shoreline inundation can be expected 1-2 hours on either side of daily peak tides, particularly for 8-12 April.

These conditions may necessitate a Small Craft Advisory for the early half of next week as winds sustain near 20 knots at times. Shower activity will remain low for the extended forecast period due to the prevalence of dry, sinking air aloft and weak forcing mechanisms at the surface. However, isolated shower bands can be expected from time to time as trade winds ramp up, associated with small increases in low-level convergence.

Any such shower activity may also see a boost during pre-dawn hours due to nocturnal instability, but overall will remain shallow and short-lived.

Shower chances will slightly increase during the mid-week period as a broad near-equatorial trough increases showers over the southern half of the RMI, but most of this activity will stay well south of Kwajalein. By the end of next week, the subtropical ridge will see more frequent disruptions in the form of mid-latitude low-pressure systems, which will act to lower the pressure gradient and bring wind speeds down by the following weekend.

Combined seas on the open ocean will be 5-7 ft through the coming weekend, increasing to 6-8 ft on Tuesday through next week

#### **SATURDAY**

Partly to mostly sunny with isolated showers in the morning, decreasing to stray showers. Winds ENE-E at 13-18 knots with higher gusts near showers.

#### **SUNDAY**

Mostly sunny with stray showers. Winds ENE-E at 13-18 knots with higher gusts near showers.

#### **MONDAY**

Mostly sunny with stray showers. Winds ENE-E at 14-19 knots with occasional higher gusts, especially near showers.

#### **NEXT WEEK**

Partly to mostly sunny with stray showers, increasing to isolated showers during the late overnight and early morning hours. Expect slightly higher shower chances on Wednesday-Thursday as a near-equatorial trough boost showers across the southern half of the RMI. Winds NE-E at 16-21 knots for the first half of the workweek, gradually decreasing to 14-19 knots by the end of the week. Expect occasional higher gusts in the mid- to upper 20s, especially near
