ON THE PULSE

SENIOR COMMANDER TOWN HALL — THE WAY AHEAD

HOURGLASS REPORT

The personable 3-star U.S. Army general took the Kwajalein Town Hall mic this past Wednesday, August 21, 2024 at the High School Multi-Purpose room. A full house welcomed Senior Commander, Lt. Gen. Sean Gainey as he joined USAG-KA Commander Col. Andrew Morgan and his leadership team in sharing, "what I have been articulating to my bosses," as well as the *Way Ahead* for Team Kwaj. Including a proposed new command relationships, change benefits to Kwajalein, and a high-level summary of how the community's most pressing issues—both short and long-term—will be managed moving forward.

A spirited question & answer session followed, as several community members used the opportunity to attempt to nail Lt. Gen. Gainey down to specific promises to secure a level of assurance that leadership would diligently walk all projects down to completion. This included the hot button A/C crisis, which prompted Commander Col. Morgan to take the mic. "No one should be without A/C," Col. Morgan stated with emphasis. "The CSM and I have personally intervened to make



sure this item was solved. If anyone is still without A/C, reach out to the team immediately."

In response to queries about the new housing project, Lt. Gen. Gainey and Commander Col. Morgan shouted out the 303rd Maneuver Enhancement Brigade soldiers present in attendance, who are on island for the next few weeks to work on special projects to aid in customer satisfaction.

One community member voiced a concern for building up Kwajalein Atoll resiliency in the wake of the big wave that hit Roi Namur several months months back, with leadership mentioning the purchase of reusable generators to add more power to residential housing as a planned solution.

The Town Hall ended with a note towards an appreciation for Commander Col. Morgan and his team, and a hopeful wish that he could somehow extend his stay. Lt. Gen. Gainey assured the room that he would stay on top of all projects, and expressed the plan to create irreversible momentum which, combined with the flexibilty of the Team Kwaj spirit, would go far towards making the community whole.

Signal battalions to be rebuilt for modern combat, Army says

The Army is restructuring its signal battalions as advancements in technology and a laser-focus on its network dovetail with a shift from brigade to division-centric combat plans.

Final details for restructuring the battalions came after years of merging job specialties in signal fields.

Army Lt. Gen. John Morrison, deputy chief of staff for Army G6, which implements command, control, communications and cyber for the force, shared this update Tuesday at the Armed Forces Communications and Electronics Association TechNet event in Augusta, Georgia.

While details of the restructuring are still being reviewed prior to approval, Morrison said the changes will pull resources to the division level to handle network-centered problems. The move is expected to free up signal soldiers for more unit-level work within the brigades.

As the Army focused its deployments on brigades over the past few decades, the headquarters and supporting units for those brigades ballooned. That meant brigades were both running the fight and trying to analyze what would come next in the battle plan.

But senior leaders, Morrison said, expect a large-scale combat operation to move faster than a brigade can analyze.

"We want brigades moving and fighting," Morrison said.

The Army announced its big-picture force structure transformation in a February white paper, Army Times previously reported. That outline shows reducing authorized troop levels down to 470,000 within the next five years.

The Army is expected to cut positions to reach that lower number; the service previously sought to fill out a 500,000-soldier Army through a challenging recruiting climate.

Coinciding with the Army's plans to make those cuts, the service also expects to add up to 7,500 new positions — mostly in air defense jobs and other high priority formations...

Army tweaking major software effort to be more commercial friendly

The Army is reevaluating its workforce requirements and contract strategies for a major software modernization effort to make it easier for commercial vendors to bid for Defense Department projects.

The service in February released its latest software policy, laying out its plan for managing and developing software as part of a broader digital modernization push. Months later, in May, it unveiled plans to award more than \$1 billion in software development contracts over the next decade, posting a special notice and a draft solicitation.

Following the announcement, some commercial firms expressed concern that the Army's contracting strategy for the effort may not work for non-traditional or smaller companies backed by venture capital firms that favor fixed-price deals.

Speaking on a panel this summer at the Aspen Security Forum in Colorado, Tara Murphy Dougherty, CEO of defense software company Govini, said the Army's approach represents a disconnect between innovation incubators like the Defense Innovation Unit and the Penta-

gon's more traditional acquisition offices.

"No venture capital-backed company that DIU and every other part of DOD has worked so hard to get into the system, none of our companies can bid on that," Dougherty said in July. "Until we get the parts of the department who actually put the billion dollar, 10-year contracts into place to understand what it means to work with companies like ours, this isn't going to work."

An Army official said Tuesday at AFCEA's TechNet conference in Augusta, Georgia, that in response to feedback from non-traditional firms, the service is working to clarify and in some cases rethink the way it buys software through this new contract vehicle.

Jennifer Swanson, deputy assistant secretary of the Army for data, engineering and software, said that while the service isn't likely to awarded fixed-price contracts for software development projects, it's looking for other flexible contracting mechanisms that...

Fire Extinguishers

<u>YOU</u> are required to inspect each fire extinguisher in your areas of operation on a monthly basis (every 30 to 31 days).

CHECK FOR THE FOLLOWING:

I. Properly mounted in its assigned location.

II. Immediately accessible (unobstructed) and visible.

III. Tamper Seal and Safety Pin is in place and nozzle is free off obstructions.

IV. Pressure Gauge in the "GREEN" to indicate it's charged; and cylinder in good shape.

V. After inspection, initial off on the extinguisher tag for that month.



WEEKLY TROPICAL WEATHER THREAT OUTLOOK

RTS WEATHER STATION STAFF

Discussion:

3.93" of rain was recorded at the Kwajalein weather station over the last 7 days, which is a nice rebound from the dry start to August. The rain was accompanied by a fair amount of lightning, which is not unusual for Kwajalein's wettest period of the year. After mostly dry conditions for the next couple of days, chances for showers and thunderstorms should increase markedly Saturday evening into Sunday morning. Rain chances look to be significantly higher again next Tuesday and Wednesday. Winds will be light to gentle NE-SE, with periods of calm; a few strong gusts will be possible near precipitation. A period of breezier winds is expected from late Monday night into Wednesday morning of next week. Rainfall over the next 7 days is expected to be near normal.

Tropical Cyclones:

None for Kwajalein, Guam, and Wake Island over the next 7 days. INVEST 91E will be watched closely as it continues west towards the Hawaiian Islands; current consensus takes the developing storm south of the Big Island late Sunday Kwaj (Saturday HST). On the heels of 91E is Hurricane Gilma, also a possible threat to Hawaii late next week. Please follow the latest updates from the National

Weather Service at Honolulu and from NOAA's Central Pacific Hurricane Center.

West Wind / Westerly Swell Risk:

Risk remains low over the next 7 days.

Swell / Tide Inundation Risk for Kwajalein Atoll and Wake Island:

Risk remains low over the next 7 days.

Tides:

We are experiencing Spring tides with the 19 August Full moon; daily peak tides will exceed 4 feet through 24 August.

Purpose: This weekly briefing is delivered Thurs-

day mornings to island leadership. The intention of this briefing is to provide situational awareness of weather events that may interrupt operations and transportation around Kwajalein, to/from Hawaii and Guam, and in the Wake vicinity. The main threat assessed in this brief is existing and potential development of tropical cyclone activity. This brief also provides an outlook of abnormal winds, sea state, and precipitation guidance for next 7 days around the Kwajalein Atoll. The distribution list will also receive updates on any developing tropical cyclone activity in the Kwajalein region that occur between the weekly outlook product.

WEATHER DISCUSSION

A return to somewhat wetter conditions appears likely from Saturday into Sunday before drier conditions resume for the end of the weekend. A broad, relatively weak, atmospheric wave is set to slowly move across the RMI on Saturday and Sunday. This will enhance the low-level convergence and lead to an increase in shower activity on both of these days. A heavy shower or two will be possible during this time period, as mid-level moisture looks to be on the higher side. The presence of enhanced low-level convergence and light vertical wind shear could allow for a stray thunderstorm or two, but a lack of colder upper-level temperatures or divergence aloft will make a greater, more widespread thunderstorm risk unlikely. By Monday, the atmospheric wave should exit the area, allowing drier conditions to return. Winds on Saturday will be a bit stronger as the atmospheric wave enhances the pressure gradient somewhat, before another doldrum-like period of very light winds is possible late Sunday into early Monday.

SATURDAY

Partly sunny with isolated showers and a possible stray thunderstorm. Winds ENE-ESE at 8-13 knots with higher gusts near showers.

SUNDAY

Partly sunny with isolated to widely scattered showers and a possible stray thunderstorm. Winds ENE-ESE at 4-9 knots becoming nearly calm for periods of time with higher gusts possible near showers.

MONDAY

Partly sunny with stray showers. Winds ENE-ESE at 5-10 knots with higher gusts near showers.

NEXT WEEK

Another wet period appears likely next week as the

Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) looks to reorganize near the central RMI. Periods of significant shower activity are likely for at least the early-middle part of the workweek, and some stray thunderstorms may be possible as well. Gusty winds may be possible near showers, especially early in the week when some stronger mid-level winds look to be present.
