PUBLIC SAFETY

UNEXPLODED ORDNANCE SAFETY PROCEDURES ON KWAJALEIN ATOLL

EXTERNAL REPORT

Darren Wheeldon, a UXO (Unexploded Ordnance) safety specialist supervisor at the U.S. Army Garrison Kwajalein Atoll, plays a crucial role in ensuring the safety of personnel on the island. Mr. Wheeldon, who works under RGNEXT, has extensive experience in identifying, recovering, and safely disposing of UXO gained from 11 years in Army EOD and civilian UXO contracting all over the world.

Recently, Mr. Wheeldon outlined the procedures for handling potential UXOs discovered on Kwajalein. Upon discovery of a suspected UXO, the first step is to

recognize that the item is a potential UXO. Mark the location of the item so that it can be found again easily. Retreat from the area. Report the location to the security dispatch desk at 480-4445 on Kwajalein and 6445 on Roi Namur.

Maintain a safe distance of at least 300 feet from the item. It is imperative that no one touches the item until it can be identified by a UXO specialist as safe to move or not. If the item is safe to move the UXO team will safely transport the item to the explosive storage bunkers for storage until disposal. If the item is unsafe to move the UXO team will blow up

the item in place utilizing approved engineering controls to reduce the fragmentation and blast hazards. There will be close coordination with the USAG-KA command team to ensure no personnel are within the area before detonation and all property is protected from damage as much as possible.

"My team has over 50 years of combined UXO experience. We are trained professionals in identifying UXO and determining whether they are safe to move or not," said Mr. Wheeldon.

This rigorous protocol highlights the commitment to safety on Kwajalein Atoll

and the expertise of professionals like Mr. Wheeldon in mitigating the risks associated with unexploded ordnance on Kwajalein Atoll. Just one of many hazards to be aware of when living on a WW2 battlefield.



Kwajalein Reclaimed Water Standard Violation

The Reclaimed Water System Document of Environmental Protection (DEP) requires public notification when reclaimed water standards are violated. On 19 September 2024, the Kwajalein Wastewater Treatment Plant observed elevated levels of petroleum oil entering the system. As a result, the reclaimed water generated had higher than normal turbidity levels. Turbidity is the cloudiness or haziness of a liquid caused by individual particles that are generally invisible to the naked eye. From 19-29 September 2024, the 7-day rolling turbidity average at the point of entry into the reclaimed water system and in the distribution system measured above the 2.0 Nephelometric Turbidity Units (NTUs) standard. No health-based restrictions on the normal use (irrigation, vehicle washing, etc) of reclaimed (or non-potable) water are necessary. There is no threat to public health or the environment resulting from this turbidity exceedance. If you have any questions, please contact the V2X Environmental Department at 480-0722.

1. Attend Col. Morgan's TEAM KWAJ brief (either Teammate or Community version), read and adhere to the TEAM KWAJ Teammate Pact, presented at initial town halls, and periodically thereafter.
2. Attend the Island Newcomer's Briefing.
3. Attend at least one group greeting at air terminal for personnel arriving on island. Make them feel welcome and show them we are happy they are on Kwaj with us.
4. Attend at least two garrison after-hours team-building or social events (TEAM KWAJ Happy Hour, Commander's Call, Hail/Farewell).
5. Attend at least two TEAM KWAJ PT/Wellness sessions. Become a regular attendee!
6. Visit Marshallese Cultural Center in last 3 months prior to tab award.
7. Visit Ebeye, Third island or Majuro in last 3 months prior to tab, use a Marshallese phrase or two and visit a store/restaurant.

WEEKLY TROPICAL WEATHER THREAT OUTLOOK

RTS WEATHER STATION STAFF

Discussion:

Another good week for rainfall, with 3.05" measured at the Kwajalein weather station over the last 7 days. Upper-level troughs, largely absent for much of this year over our region, have reappeared, enhancing lightning activity significantly at times. "When thunder roars, go indoors". If a lightning warning is issued for your area, or if you hear thunder, move as quickly and safely as you can to an enclosed building. Please see the July 6th Hourglass article from RTS Weather on lightning safety. The ITCZ will remain active over Kwajalein for the next several days, with occasional periods of rain and showers, along with isolated thunderstorms. Strong wind gusts

will be possible near precipitation. Dry conditions look to become more dominant for a few days next week. Rainfall over the next 7 days is expected to be near normal; normal weekly rainfall for this time of year is app. 2.7 inches. A strengthening monsoon trough over the Philippine Sea and Marianas could lead to tropical cyclone development near Guam around the middle of next week. We are experiencing above normal Spring tides with the 17 October Full moon; please see below for more details.

Tropical Cyclones:

A strengthening monsoon trough over the Philippine Sea and Marianas could lead to tropical cyclone development near Guam around the middle of next week. Otherwise, none expected for Kwajalein, Wake Island, and Hawaii over the next 7 days.

Damaging West Winds / Westerly Swell:

Risk remains low for the next 7 days.

Swell / Tide Inundation Risk for Kwajalein Atoll and Wake Island:

We are experiencing above normal Spring tides with the 17 October Full moon. Tidal flooding is not expected at this time. Daily peak tides will be near/exceed 5 feet through 19 October and will exceed 4 feet through 21 October.

Purpose: This weekly briefing is delivered Thursday mornings to island leadership. The intention of this briefing is to provide situa-

tional awareness of weather events that may interrupt operations and transportation around Kwajalein, to/from Hawaii and Guam, and in the Wake vicinity. The main threat assessed in this brief is existing and potential development of tropical cyclone activity. This brief also provides an outlook of abnormal winds, sea state, and precipitation guidance for next 7 days around the Kwajalein Atoll. The distribution list will also receive updates on any developing tropical cyclone activity in the Kwajalein region that occur between the weekly outlook product.

RMW generated at the Hospital, Dispensaries, Dental Clinic, and Vet Services is collected by trained personnel and escorted to the incinerators for disposal.

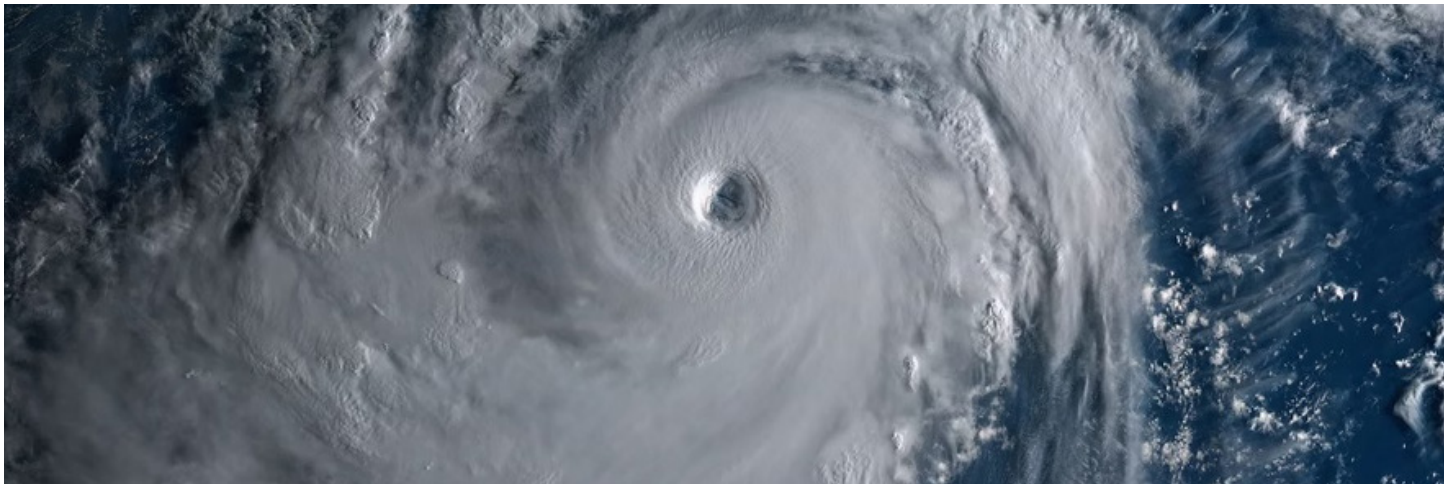

WEATHER DISCUSSION

Drier conditions are expected across Kwajalein Atoll on Saturday as an atmospheric wave that produced rainy conditions Thursday night and Friday morning, continues to move off to the north and west. The Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) has become fragmented and retreated back near the date-line, ushering in relatively dry conditions in the short term. Only stray showers are expected over the Atoll through Saturday night before the ITCZ begins to rebuild over the central RMI and sends an atmospheric wave that will increase shower coverage just in time for the weekend. Isolated showers will arrive by noon on Sunday with a peak in shower activity expected on Monday. Thunderstorm chances will be low on Saturday with upper-level support having moved off to the west of the Atoll and relatively warm temperatures still lingering aloft. Favorable upper-level support will move



overhead by Sunday evening, elevating thunderstorm risk through the weekend. Winds will be east-southeasterly Saturday morning before gradually come back out of the northeast in the upper-single digits to around 10 knots during Saturday afternoon. As the atmospheric wave moves through the Atoll on Monday, winds will become southerly and remain in the upper-single digits. Westerly winds are not expected to be an issue on Monday at this time. The ITCZ will continue to be the main factor affecting our weather through the upcoming workweek with the potential for more waves pushing through the central RMI by mid-week following a possible lull in shower activity Tuesday and Wednesday.

SATURDAY

Mostly sunny with stray showers and a possible stray thunderstorm. Winds NE-E at 5-10 knots with higher gusts possible near any showers.

SUNDAY

Partly cloudy with isolated showers and a possible stray thunderstorm. Winds ENE-ESE at 7-12 knots with higher gusts near any showers.

MONDAY

Mostly cloudy with widely scattered to scattered showers and stray thunderstorms. Winds SE-S at 5-10 knots with higher gusts possible near

any showers.

NEXT WEEK

The early part of the workweek will bring modest shower activity following the wet weekend. By the middle part of the week, the ITCZ will begin to reorganize, bringing more atmospheric waves and increased shower coverage to the central RMI.
