Kwajalein Reclaimed Water Standard Violation

The Reclaimed Water System Document of Environmental Protection (DEP) requires public notification when reclaimed water standards are violated. On 19 September 2024, the Kwajalein Wastewater Treatment Plant observed elevated levels of petroleum oil entering the system. As a result, the reclaimed water generated had higher than normal turbidity levels. Turbidity is the cloudiness or haziness of a liquid caused by individual particles that are generally invisible to the naked eye. From 19-29 September 2024, the 7-day rolling turbidity average at the point of entry into the reclaimed water system and in the distribution system measured above the 2.0 Nephelometric Turbidity Units (NTUs) standard. No health-based restrictions on the normal use (irrigation, vehicle washing, etc) of reclaimed (or non-potable) water are necessary. There is no threat to public health or the environment resulting from this turbidity exceedance. If you have any questions, please contact the V2X Environmental Department at 480-0722.

1. Attend Col. Morgan's TEAM KWAJ brief (either Teammate or Community version), read and adhere to the TEAM KWAJ Teammate Pact, presented at initial town halls, and periodically thereafter.
2. Attend the Island Newcomer's Briefing.
3. Attend at least one group greeting at air terminal for personnel arriving on island. Make them feel welcome and show them we are happy they are on Kwaj with us.
4. Attend at least two garrison after-hours team-building or social events (TEAM KWAJ Happy Hour, Commander's Call, Hail/Farewell).
5. Attend at least two TEAM KWAJ PT/Wellness sessions. Become a regular attendee!
6. Visit Marshallese Cultural Center in last 3 months prior to tab award.
7. Visit Ebeye, Third island or Majuro in last 3 months prior to tab, use a Marshallese phrase or two and visit a store/restaurant.

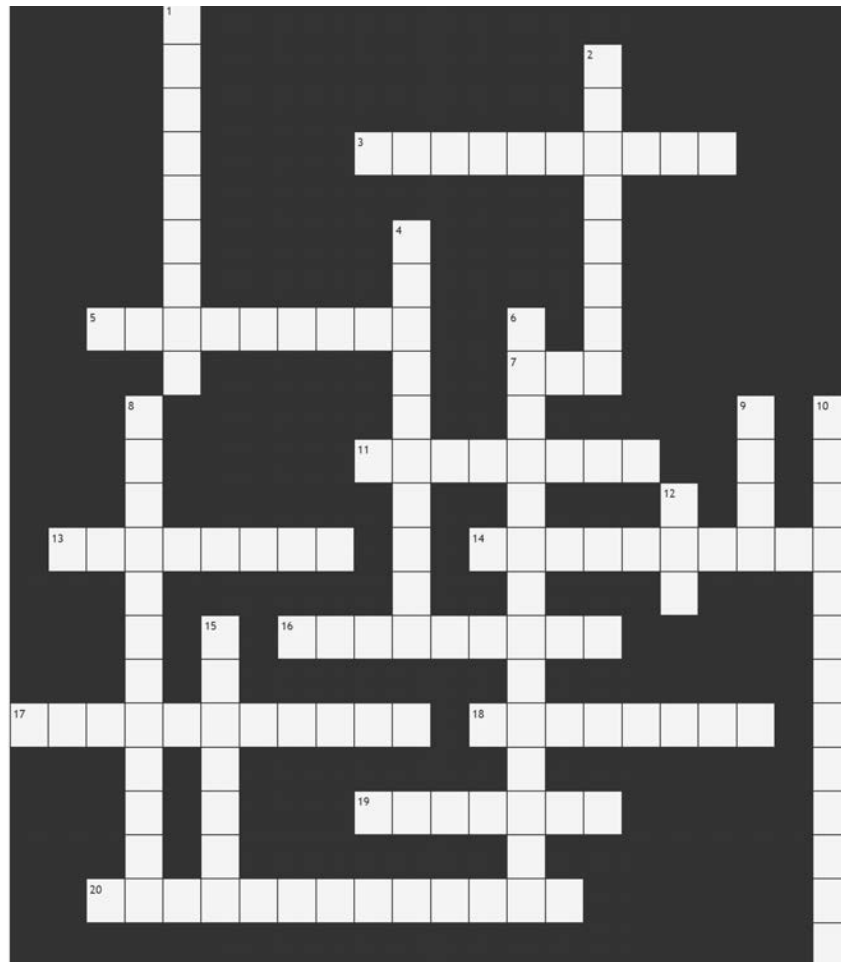

WEEKLY TROPICAL WEATHER THREAT OUTLOOK

RTS WEATHER STATION STAFF

Greeting to all. We are attentively following the potential for a WWSW on Saturday into Sunday. There is little doubt that the west-south-west wind will occur, but the question is to how strong will it be. The protocol for issuing a WWSW is: wind (sustained) at a bearing of 210 to 340 degrees true greater than or equal to 10 knots, at which 50% of each hour in a four hour period maintains the direction and speed threshold. Right now we are looking at forecasted winds in a range of six to 13 knots, so chances are that winds will stay below the speed threshold. Another concern is that we are expecting isolated showers on those days, thus outflow winds created during the decay phase of any showers off

to our immediate west-south-west, could further expound the wind speeds that are already present, and push more (fetch) water onto west facing lagoon side.

The greatest risk during this event, if the threshold is reached, is the threat to small vessels that are docked at any pier facilities, as there will be little protection from the fetch of the winds and waves produced across the lagoon. Damage mainly arising from constant beating of the hull against the pier, especially if the vessel is not well fendered against the pier. Securely moored boat will be fine, they will just be facing a reciprocal direction to their normal one.

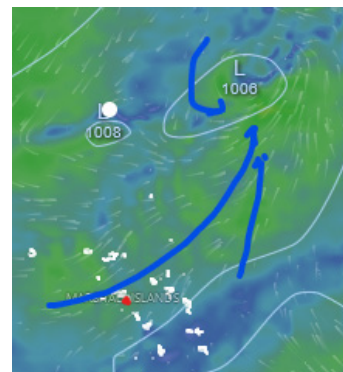
The below depiction shows the dynamics leading up to this anomalous wind direc-

tion. A tropical depression will be forming well north of the RMI, and will draw air into its center, resulting in a southwest wind for the central RMI. The red dot is Kwajalein Island, and the white polygons are the rest of the Marshall Islands.

UPDATE ~ Friday, October 25, 2024

More refinement and better model alignment are now indicating that the threat of a WWSW will be greatest tomorrow afternoon from about noon to 1600L, and it now appears the wind speeds out of a nearly western direction will reach the violation threshold (>10 knots for an uninterrupted 30 minute period each hour in a four hour span). This appears to be the only period at which the

WWSW threshold will be violated over the this west wind event. I received a separate email from Harbor Control, and they intended at the moment of that conversation, to issue a west wind warning. This may help them narrow that down. The weather station will issue the warning, if this trend holds by tonight or early tomorrow morning.



E-wareness:

Trimming and Removal of Vegetation

A Vegetation Trimming and Removal Permit is required for the following actions:

- Complete removal of any established vegetation.
- Major trimming of vegetation, defined as greater than 20% of each plant/tree volume.

Vegetation permits are obtained through the Environmental Department by calling 480-0722.

Removal of root balls below six inches requires an approved Dig Permit from the Service Desk (480-3550).

WEATHER DISCUSSION

The most significant weather feature for the central RMI this weekend will be an anomalous southwest direction for the winds. Winds will not be particularly strong, but will come out of a direction that is rarely seen by residents of Kwajalein Atoll. At the writing of this article, the winds have already veered to a south-southeast direction, and are expected to work their way over to the southwest, as we progress through Saturday and into Sunday, with Monday becoming a light and variable doldrum-like day. The issue with having winds out of the southwest, is that there is little protection for small boats that are docked alongside piers, as the wind will be unobstructed across the lagoon from the west. This only becomes an issue, when the winds are greater than 10 knots for at least a 30-minute period in each hour, at which point a West Wind/Swell Warning is issued. Be-

sides the winds situation, the weekend will be quite nice for outdoor activities, as rainfall will only be stray to isolated coverage at best through the weekend with little lightning risk, due to the lack of good surface lifting mechanisms and warm temperature aloft. Trade wind recovery and a reestablished Intertropical Convergence Zone back into the RMI will bring a return to wetter conditions for the start of the work week.

SATURDAY

Partly sunny with stray showers, mainly in the afternoon. Winds SW-W at 7-12 knots with higher gusts near showers. Winds will be highest in the early afternoon.

SUNDAY

Partly sunny with stray showers, mainly in the morning. Winds SW-W at 4-9 knots with higher gusts near any showers.

MONDAY

Partly sunny with only stray possible showers. Winds S-SW at 3-8 knots, becoming calm at times with higher gusts near any showers.

NEXT WEEK

Look for an increase to isolated showers on the second half of Tuesday with winds increasing from the middle single digits in the morning to the upper single digits

and low teens, as the afternoon progresses out of the east-northeast. Wednesday early morning will see widely scattered showers, decreasing to isolated by about noon.
