# **MARSHALLESE CULTURE**

### WHISPERS OF A MARSHALLESE SCOUT DURING WWII

### HOURGLASS REPORT

The greatest generation of Marshallese Islanders, the scouts and interpreters that helped the American forces during World War II, rarely volunteered any informa-tion about their harrowing adventures. It doesn't take much digging into the history to gain an understanding of why—the brutal stories of Marshallese experiences under the Japanese occupancy are objectively difficult to stomach. Fortunately, those same men weren't completely mum, carefully giving up details to trusted relatives with

the patience to probe and listen.

Mr. Jinna Keju was just such a fellow. Recruited as a scout by the U.S. Army, Mr. Jinna performed so well that his new partners retained his services well after the war was over, and he continued to work with the government until his passing in the early 1990s. He shared much of his adventures with his sisters who passed them on to his son Deo LeEddo Keju.

Deo was kind enough to

join the Kwajalein community this week to share his closely-held tales of his father at the before an appreciative crowd at the Island Memorial Chapel. He told of the time during the 1980s, when his father visited Deo while he performed chaplaincy work in an Oahu, Hawai'i hospital. Curiously, Mr. Jinna had been hanging out at a veteran's hangout over in Waikiki where his son picked him up. One day, Deo noticed his father had accidentally left his identification items on the coffee table—a U.S. passport

and U.S. veteran ID card causing a stunned Deo to blurt out, "Is it true that you were once a spy for the Americans during World War II?!" A slightly cryptic eyebrow wag confirmed the rumors, while also letting his son know that such talk was not for him to hear. Deo then made it his mission to find out as much as he could about first his father's war heroism, and then later his greater family line's involvement in the war under both the German and Japanese occupancies. Deo's pride in his family was evident.







### SENSORY PLAY WITH SHAVING CREAM | A KWAJALEIN TRADITION

### HOURGLASS REPORT

No one is around today who knows the origin of the shaving cream social on Kwajalein. The product as we know it was invented in 1919 by Professor Frank Shields of MIT, but does our island community's usage actually go back as far?

"I remember playing with shaving cream when I was little in the 1980s," confessed Jennifer Hill, LOGCAP V HR Generalist for V2X and certified Kwaj Kid®. "I can't say that was when they first started doing the socials."

Kwajalein Atoll contains a wonderfully creative community, so it's no surprise that the shaving cream so-

cial, whatever its true origins, found a home here. With its open-ended activity structure, messy sensory play encourages creativity and an active group of children will demonstrate a wide variety of ways of engaging with the material that compounds as they work together, feeding off one another to come up with even more possibilities to stretch their imaginations. More directed play with adult supervision can also provide benefits for developing young minds, including active lis-tening skills, problem-solv-ing by way of identifying and overcoming obstacles, and even how to set and achieve goals. Of course, Kwajalein children will handily build upon and reinforce their


social and emotional skills through the event's dramatic play opportunities.

### PUBLIC NOTICE

- 1. Attend Col. Morgan's TEAM KWAJ brief (either Teammate or Community version), read and adhere to the TEAM KWAJ Teammate Pact, presented at initial town halls, and periodically thereafter.
- 2. Attend the Island Newcomer's Briefing.
- 3. Attend at least one group greeting at air terminal for personnel arriving on island. Make them feel welcome and show them we are happy they are on Kwaj with us.
- 4. Attend at least two garrison after-hours team-building or social events (TEAM KWAJ Happy Hour, Commander's Call, Hail/Farewell).
- 5. Attend at least two TEAM KWAJ PT/Wellness sessions. Become a regular attender!
- 6. Visit Marshallese Cultural Center in last 3 months prior to tab award.
- 7. Visit Ebeye, Third island or Majuro in last 3 months prior to tab, use a Marshallese phrase or two and visit a store/restaurant.
- 8. Tell three co-workers how to earn the TEAM KWAJ tab.

- 9. Swim, snorkel, boat or paddle on the lagoon at least once with a teammate.
- 10. Complete the TEAM KWAJ Circle-island 6-mile ruck march/walk/bike and read all historic battlefield markers. This is an organized USAG-KA hosted event several times per year.
- 11. Mission Partner wild card event—discuss with your supervisor any additional organizational requirement. Could be knowledge-based, achievement-based, or physical challenge.
- 12. Final event, "Board of Review" -- meet with Col. Morgan face-to-face individually or in a small group with all requirements fulfilled. Schedule with garrison front office. Discussion items may include but are not limited to; TEAM KWAJ pact "Healthy Community of Excellence," Kwaj history, Marshallese culture, military/strategic missions and their significance, and future operational potential.



# WEEKLY TROPICAL WEATHER THREAT OUTLOOK

RTS WEATHER STATION STAFF

### **Discussion**:

It has been a wet first week of November, with the weather station receiving 4.30 inches of rain so far in November. Our normal precipitation value at this time in the month is 2.40 inches. So far this year, the weather station has received an annual total of about 77 inches of rain, which is actually about one inch shy of normal. We have had two thunderstorm days in a row over the week. Defined as in situ lightning strikes within five miles of the weather station. The main reason for the bump in thunderstorms over the area, was the very high amounts of moisture at the surface and a well vertically-ventilated atmosphere, allow for more explosive growth of the cumulonimbus clouds that produce lightning. Gusty winds moved through the area on Thursday morning, as a result of strong winds at the mid-levels being brought down to the surface during the decay phase of thunderstorms off to the east. Currently the RMI is under the influence of the positive phase of the Madden/Julian Oscillation (MJo). The positive phase of this tropical global circulation allows for increased rainfall, and this factor will be the case going into the coming seven-day period, with numerous troughs being amplified by the MJO. Eventually, the negative phase of the MJO will work its way over the RMI, and diminish our shower coverage toward late November, unless the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) can become dominant in our area. As is typical, in the waning end of the wet season, the trade winds will start to take center stage with the start of the windy season (Ellap Kutu) by the end of the month. Into the next seven days, we are not anticipating any significant periods of doldrums like conditions, with winds mostly in the upper single digits to low-teens.

Late Sunday and into Monday will see the highest winds out of the northeast in the middle teens, with Wednesday experiencing the lowest winds in the middle single digits. Gusty winds are always possible associated with heavier showers or thunderstorms just off to our east.

### **Tropical Cyclones**:

No significant tropical cyclone activity expected to affect anywhere in Micronesia, the Mariana Islands, Wake Island or Hawai'i. A minor tropical disturbance is anticipated to pass over the northern Marianas.

### <u>Damaging West Winds /</u> <u>Westerly Swell</u>:

None expected.

### Swell / Tide Inundation for Kwajalein Atoll and Wake Island:

Next full moon will be on the 15th of November with a spring tide maximum of 4.9 feet on the 16th. Expect high tides over four feet from the 13th to the 19th, then settling down to the neap tide ranges. Winds during the whole of the spring tide period are expected to be generally in the upper single digits, thus no over-wash expected.

Purpose: This weekly briefing is delivered Thursday mornings to island leadership. The intention of this briefing is to provide situational awareness of weather events that may interrupt operations and transportation around Kwajalein, to/from Hawaii and Guam, and in the Wake vicinity. The main threat assessed in this brief is existing and potential development of tropical cyclone activity. This brief also provides an outlook of abnormal winds, sea state, and precipitation guidance for next 7 days around the Kwajalein Atoll. The distribution list will also receive updates on any developing tropical cyclone activity in the Kwajalein region that occur between the weekly outlook product.

- Three species of Giant Clams are found at Kwajalein Atoll, *Tridacna gigas*, *Tridacna squamosa*, *and Tridacna maximus*.
- Both are protected throughout the atoll by the USAG-KA Environmental Standards (UES) and the Endangered Species Act (ESA)
- Please DO NOT harass or collect living species
- Please DO NOT collect or export Giant Clam shells
- Giant Clam shells in pack-outs or mailed packages can result in large fines.

### WEATHER DISCUSSION

There is an area of investigation (Invest 93W) currently over Kwajalein bringing increased shower and thunderstorm coverage. Invest 93W is not well organized, so no significant winds or waves are expected as the circulation moves to the northwest. Winds will be calm at points Friday, but slowly shift to the southeast and winds will return to the accustomed 8-13 knots. As the work week comes to an end a slightly drier weather pattern will make for a partly cloudy Saturday afternoon. As the weekend starts Inter-tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) will begin to reorganize over the RMI, bringing increased shower and thunderstorm coverage for Sunday. Monday, looks to be the driest over the weekend, but winds will be in the mid to upper teens with gust into the mid 20's out of the east as the trade winds recover over the region. Tuesday models are picking up on a weak atmospheric wave bringing early morning showers. Fortunately, as the atmospheric wave moves past the atoll winds will drop to about 7-12 knots.

#### **SATURDAY**

Partly sunny with stray showers, mainly in the morning. Winds ESE-SE at 7-12 knots with higher gusts near showers. Winds will be highest in the early morning into the afternoon.

### **SUNDAY**

Mostly Cloudy with isolated showers throughout the day. Winds NE-ENE at 15-20 knots with higher gusts expected near showers.

### **MONDAY**

Mostly sunny with stray to isolated showers throughout the day. Winds E-NE at 15-20 knots in the morning decreasing in the afternoon to 10-15 knots, with possible gusts near any showers.


### NEXT WEEK
