

MARSHALLESE CULTURE

HOURGLASS REPORT

In the olden days, before the Marshallese Islanders would come to assimilate into the Western culture's ways of doing life, they would build canoes with their own natural resources to travel to the outer islands.

"The families of the individual islands would share in the responsibility to accomplish the task," shared Maggie Timothy of LOGCAP V Information Management under V2X. "Our ancestors made the canoes from breadfruit trees. Then they would interconnect with the outer islanders and collaborate in food-rich family gatherings, race activities, and they would go fishing, too."

Jerbal wanok is the Marshallese term for 'work ethic,' and in their culture, strongly packaged in traditional gender roles, it is closely tied to the spirit of collaboration. Though nothing out of the ordinary, these include standard focus areas of domestic household work, as groups of wives and daughters work together seamlessly to take care, prepare and nurture the family. The men folk likewise bond performing labor and skilled professional tasks.

"Working together is one of the key elements of our people," offered Caston Zackious, a LCV IMD junior analyst. "We love to provide care, love and hospitality—nurturing all the partners within the group—as we accomplish a task."

The strong sense of belonging and working together in a real way is how the Marshallese relate to work, and ensuring the regular satiation of that deep cultural need is how the proud people can accomplish so much. "Watch us at our big church and community events, said Caston. "This is how you can really tell how much the Marshallese people love to work together as a team.





WEEKLY TROPICAL WEATHER THREAT OUTLOOK

RTS WEATHER STATION STAFF

Discussion:

So far in November, the weather station has received 6.51 inches of rain since yesterday the 13th. This is actually just over 1.5 inches above normal at this point in the Up to November month. 13th, we have received a total of 77.93 inches of rain in 2024, which is 1.39 inches below normal. We experienced one thunderstorm day this week. This is defined as an "in situ" lightning strike within five miles of the weather station. The thunderstorm that occurred was primarily induced by colder than normal temperatures at about 22,000 feet, and the fact that height of the -20-degree Celsius layer was lower in the atmosphere. This allows for a deeper layer of ice-crystal formation, which is essential for the development of lightning. Winds will remain rather seasonal, as the RMI continues to move out of the doldrum season into the windy season (Ellap Kutu), which generally

starts at the end of November. Expect the winds to be lowest Friday night into Saturday morning in the middle to upper single digits, and our highest winds will be Monday in the middle teens for extended periods of time with some gusts approaching 20 knots. Currently, the RMI is under the influence of the waning positive phase of the Madden/Julian Oscillation (MJo), and is expected to be neutral for the next week, as the negative phase works its way in for the end of the month. The neutral phase of this tropical global circulation basically has the effect of maintaining average rainfall for its duration. This allows for the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) to be the driving force alone for most of our precipitation. The ITCZ will be building back into RMI tomorrow, bringing troughing in the wind field and increased shower coverage along with possible stray thunderstorms. Gusty winds are possible associated with heavier showers or thunderstorms just off to our east during their decay phase.

Tropical Cyclones:

No significant tropical cyclone activity expected to affect anywhere in Micronesia, the Mariana Islands, Wake Island or Hawai'i. Tropical Storm Man-Yi is developing, but is now west of Guam, and will continue off to the west.

Damaging West Winds / Westerly Swell: None expected.

Swell / Tide Inun

<u>Swell / Tide Inundation</u> <u>for Kwajalein Atoll and</u> <u>Wake Island</u>:

Next full moon will be on the 15th of November with a spring tide maximum of 4.9 feet on the 16th. Expect high tides over four feet from now to the 19th, then settling down to the neap tide ranges. Winds during the whole of the spring tide period are expected to be generally in the upper single digits to lowteens out of the east-northeast, thus no over-wash is expected. We will be watching some higher wave potential toward the end of the month, due to swells produced as a result of transiting mid-latitude storms in the northern Pacific.

Purpose: This weekly briefing is delivered Thursday mornings to island leadership. The intention of this briefing is to provide situational awareness of weather events that may interrupt operations and transportation around Kwajalein, to/from Hawaii and Guam, and in the Wake vicinity. The main threat assessed in this brief is existing and potential development of tropical cyclone activity. This brief also provides an outlook of abnormal winds, sea state, and precipitation guidance for next 7 days around the Kwajalein Atoll. The distribution list will also receive updates on any developing tropical cyclone activity in the Kwajalein region that occur between the weekly outlook product.

WEATHER DISCUSSION

After an active end of the workweek, things on the precipitation front will be settling down some, as the troughing of Friday and Saturday push off to the west. In a climatological sense, we are now at the ebb-end of the rainy season (ellap wot), and by the first week of December, we will be entering our windy season (ellap kutu), which will bring in overall the period of drier conditions for the central RMI that will extend through May. On that theme, expect more of an isolated shower situation on Sunday with even lower shower coverage on Monday with just stray showers induced by convergence of the winds, to remain in the picture. This weekend will also see trade wind recovery, with the RMI experiencing a tightening in the pressure gradient between a well-positioned strengthening high-pressure ridge north of Hawai'i and a lower-than-normal pressure region to the south of the RMI. This factor will see

winds increase to the midteens for long periods of time mostly on Monday out of the east-northeast. The first part of the workweek will see an increase in shower coverage and a decrease in winds with the arrival of an atmospheric wave for the increase in showers and possible thunderstorms along with a relaxation of the pressure gradient, to bring down the winds.

SATURDAY

Partly sunny with isolated showers and a stray possible thunderstorm in the morning, decreasing to stray showers in the afternoon. Winds N-NE at 4-9 knots during the early morning, increasing to NE-ENE at 8-13 knots with higher gusts near showers, mainly in the morning.

SUNDAY

Partly sunny with isolated showers. Winds NE-ENE at 7-12 knots, becoming more easterly by evening with higher gusts near showers.

MONDAY

Partly sunny to mostly sunny at times with isolated showers in the morning, decreasing to stray showers in the afternoon. Winds NE-ENE at 10-15 knots with higher gusts possible near showers.

NEXT WEEK

Looking at widely scattered

showers and possible stray thunderstorms for Tuesday, extending into early Wednesday morning. Winds E-ESE at 9-14 knots, becoming nearly calm for brief periods of times.
