

TRADITIONAL MARSHALLESE MEDICINE "UNO"

HOURGLASS REPORT

Not as widespread across the Marshall Islands as it once was back in the pre-Western partnership era, Traditional Marshallese Medicine, or "Uno" in the local native tongue, has managed to stick around in some form in the modern day.

Composed of a deep knowledge of the medicinal capabilities of the plants and herbs that grow around the islands, Uno "combines them to create the medicine that cure some illnesses and provide good health," said Anjowest Naisher of LOGCAP V, V2X. The ancient Marshallese peoples knew how to treat cuts, nausea, headaches, and

toothaches. Of course, as the world has now changed into a more modernized lifestyle, where the people have mostly come to rely on over-the-counter drugs for simple ailments, and a need to travel abroad to high-tech medical facilities for those issues that are more complex, the families who still practice Uno hold to some levels of secrecy.

These families have quasi-formal medicine administers, called "Ri-Uno."


"These medicines come in different forms, depending upon how sick you are," said Jakio Lanwe, of LCV/V2X. a secret technique for preparing a remedy that can be either eaten or drank, "made out of leaves, roots, coconut water, etc." Knowledgeable curers practice their profession with the utmost secrecy, giving the impression of a certain amount of competition between the families. Another aspect of Uno is the simplicity.

"Learning how to use Marshallese medicine requires no higher knowledge and has no risk," said Anjowest. "It's all about skills and hands-on learning." The most important aspect of Uno is its cultural significance; it is one of the few remaining gifts left to the people from their ancestors.



COMMUNITY GOSPEL DAY IN THE MARSHALL ISLANDS

The Irooj Kaiboke Kabua or "Paramount Chief" and his men watched the big boat as it slowly closed the distance to shore. The natives of the plethora of islands that would one day be named after the British sea captain John Marshall, watched the approach of the *Morning Star* with an outward stoicism that didn't quite match the unease many of them felt within.

"Rube ke Ereke?" the Irooj Kaiboke Kabua wondered aloud. His lieutenants looked over at him expectantly. He had asked whether they should break the vessel, sinking it and its crew to the sea bottom, the quicker they could return to normal. A murmur erupted among them, about 35 strong, brown-skinned men in their traditional garb, ready for action. They briefly debated the wisdom of the attack plan, but in the end, clearer heads prevailed.

"Jen kejidak tok," said the Irooj Kaiboke Kabua firmly. They would welcome these alien beings—whoever they may be—and err on the side of peace.

In the end, the decision was indeed a wise one, as the crew of the *Morning Star* contained only Christian adventurers, eager to spread the Words of God as far and wide as they could. This event represents a sketch illustrating Gospel Day, the first Friday of December, a day set aside to honor the American missionaries who first introduced Christianity to the Marshall Islands.

"Today, we celebrate Gospel Day with songs and performance," said Jakio Lanwe, Information Technology Associate I with LOGCAP V/V2X. "Every village provides their own songs and performances related to the story of Gospel Day, one of the most respected observance days on the Marshall Islands."

- 1. Attend Col. Morgan's TEAM KWAJ brief (either Teammate or Community version), read and adhere to the TEAM KWAJ Teammate Pact, presented at initial town halls, and periodically thereafter.
- 2. Attend the Island Newcomer's Briefing.
- 3. Attend at least one group greeting at air terminal for personnel arriving on island. Make them feel welcome and show them we are happy they are on Kwaj with us.
- 4. Attend at least two garrison after-hours team-building or social events (TEAM KWAJ Happy Hour, Commander's Call, Hail/Farewell).
- 5. Attend at least two TEAM KWAJ PT/Wellness sessions. Become a regular attender!
- 6. Visit Marshallese Cultural Center in last 3 months prior to tab award.





WEEKLY TROPICAL WEATHER THREAT OUTLOOK

RTS WEATHER STATION STAFF

Discussion:

So far in November, the weather station has received 8.56 inches of rain since the 20th. This is 1.55 inches above normal at this point in the month. Up to November 20th, we have received a total of 79.98 inches of rain in 2024, which is 1.55 inches below normal. We experienced no thunderstorm days this week. This is defined as an "in situ" lightning strike within five miles of the weather station. Thunderstorms did occur as close as about 25 miles to the east of the atoll. Winds will become more of a greater force in the coming week with fewer periods of average wind speeds below 10 knots. Monday will see the lowest average wind speed in the upper single digits to low teens. The strongest winds will occur, as we approach Thanksgiving weekend, and they will remain in the middle to upper teens with gusts routinely over 20 knots. The direction of the winds will generally be between the east-northeast and east-southeast. The Madden/Julian Oscillation (MJo), has entered a neutral phase for this week, as the negative phase works its way in for the end of the month. The neutral phase of this tropical global circulation basically has the effect of maintaining average rainfall for its duration. This allows for the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) to be the driving force alone for most of our precipitation, and it will be the quite a force to be reconned with, as it will keep periods of increased shower coverage and a shot at thunderstorms over the central RMI for the entire seven day period with Sunday being greater than the other days, as we see troughing work its way through the area, augmented by the close proximity of the ITCZ. Gusty outflow winds are possible associated with heavier showers or thunderstorms, mainly just off to our east during their decay phase.

Tropical Cyclones:

No significant tropical cyclone activity expected to affect anywhere in Micronesia,

the Mariana Islands, Wake Island or Hawai'i. Tropical Depression Man-Yi has diminished near mainland China, and is now no longer a concern for any DoD locations.

<u>Damaging West Winds /</u> <u>Westerly Swell</u>:

None expected.

Swell / Tide Inundation for Kwajalein Atoll and Wake Island:

We are currently in the neap tide phase of the moon with the waning Half-Moon on the 23rd. Spring tides will occur again toward the end of the month with the New-Moon on December first with the peak tide of 4.3 feet on the first through the third of December, at which time, we will move back toward neap tide levels. Winds during the whole of the neap tide period are expected to be generally in the lower teens, crossing into the mid-teens from time to time, and as one would expect, will not an is-We will be watching the potential for issues with wave heights toward the end of the month, as the atoll will

be in spring tides with the New-Moon, and we are anticipating a trade wind surge out of the northeast around Thanksgiving with sustained winds in the upper teens for extended periods and gusts in the low 20s (knots).

Purpose: This weekly briefing is delivered Thursday mornings to island leadership. The intention of this briefing is to provide situational awareness of weather events that may interrupt operations and transportation around Kwajalein, to/from Hawaii and Guam, and in the Wake vicinity. The main threat assessed in this brief is existing and potential development of tropical cyclone activity. This brief also provides an outlook of abnormal winds, sea state, and precipitation guidance for next 7 days around the Kwajalein Atoll. The distribution list will also receive updates on any developing tropical cyclone activity in the Kwajalein region that occur between the weekly outlook product.
