THE GIRL SCOUTS VISIT THE KWAJALEIN HOSPITAL

HOURLASS REPORT

The Girl Scouts is a global organization that focuses on empowering girls and young women through leadership, community service, outdoor activities, and various other programs designed to help them develop a range of skills. Last Saturday, our local chapter visited Kwajalein Hospital to learn more about the vital role healthcare professionals play in our community.

Nurse Manager Savanna Gastineau and Nurse Christine Leder demonstrated to the Girl Scouts how they save

lives and work as a team to keep people safe and cared for. When asked why it's important for young girls to see strong female professionals, Gastineau said, "Strong female role models show young girls what's possible, inspire confidence, and help them envision a future where they can achieve their goals."

The Girl Scouts received a tour of the hospital and a highlight was the operating room where Leder explained the importance of sterilizing and handwashing to prevent infections. Leder emphasized, "If someone gets an infection during surgery, it could be very serious, maybe even lead to death!" All

of their eyes went wide—it's safe to say that our nurses may have inspired some top-notch hand washers that day.

The visit was also fun for the hospital staff as it was a great break from the usual routine and a rewarding chance to connect with the community and educate the next generation—who knows, maybe there was a future nurse or medical professional in that group!

Thank you Kwajalein Hospital staff for all that you do for us everyday and for inspiring the health care professionals of tomorrow.

MARSHALLESE CULTURE

CHILD REARING IN THE MARSHALLESE WAY

HOURLASS REPORT

Many customs among the Marshallese can be surprisingly recognizable for those outsiders unfamiliar with the people's culture and way of life. Often this is directly related to their deep Christian traditions, brought to them long ago by the sailing missionaries. This includes the Marshallese child rearing practices, as a large family gathering including both sides of the parents' families come to escort the child to his or her formal baptism ritual at the two-year-old mark.

There are some rituals, however, that seem to carry some trace memories that pre-date the Marshallese

Western partnerships, though opinions may vary on exactly where the cultural divide may be. When the child is first born, an elderly woman in a traditional Medicine Administering role called "ri-uno," provides a special tonic to enable the baby to grow up healthy. The medicine is made strictly from the local plant life.

"The navel cord is quickly retrieved and pinned to the grandparents' clothing," said Maggie Timothy of LOGCAP V/V2X. "Some families even keep it in the family bible." At the three-week-old mark, the ri-uno returns to carefully draw a medicinal bath for

the child, made up of coconut oil and select herbs to ensure continued growth. This time period is a critical one for both mother and baby, demonstrated by frequent visits by the ri-uno who will perform both the medicinal baths and massages to the pair for up to three and a half months.

By the time the families gather at the church to dedicate the blessed new life to the Lord, the family is full of joy and confidence that the child has a strong head start towards becoming a healthy and productive member of the Marshallese life.





TEMPORARY BIKE RACKS RELOCATION DOWNTOWN KWAJ





A PROPER WORK/LIFE BALANCE


HOURLASS REPORT

“I never understood it. My husband was this big project manager star when he was at work,” said Zarassa Wyatt, HR Director at Enchanted Rock. “He managed a multi-million-dollar budget and led teams around the world, but then he would come home and just sit on the couch. I did everything at home. I sure could’ve appreciated those high-level budgeting skills. He would become a completely different person once he walked through that front door.”

Some people are great at compartmentalizing. The ability to “leave work at work” can be taken to such extremes, that it can prevent some from using the hard-won skills and basic tools used for a successful career to improve the home life. We all get it — the whole “work life balance” thing. Trust me, I know. We can be so protective of make sure to focus in on our families that we can overlook what’s obvious: those same skills you use throughout the day at the job can translate in the home.

The good thing about it is that it wouldn’t take much. The average American home doesn’t operate on a multi-million-dollar budget, nor is it operated by dozens or even hundreds of people. For the most part, all you’d really have to do is use your effective leadership communication skills and remember to hear your family members with the same thoughtful attention you use with your direct and indirect reports. That way you do not inadvertently take the people closest to you for granted. Proper communication requires intention with a laser focus demonstrated with strained or eager attention. The following bullet points represent tried-true best practices that work just as well on team leads and coordinators as they do for spouses and teenagers:

- *Seek first to understand, then be understood*
- *Hear the message in the way the sender intended it*
- *Summarize & rephrase what you hear to gain clarification/understanding of what has been said*



PUBLIC NOTICE

1. Attend Col. Morgan's TEAM KWAJ brief (either Teammate or Community version), read and adhere to the TEAM KWAJ Teammate Pact, presented at initial town halls, and periodically thereafter.
2. Attend the Island Newcomer's Briefing.
3. Attend at least one group greeting at air terminal for personnel arriving on island. Make them feel welcome and show them we are happy they are on Kwaj with us.
4. Attend at least two garrison after-hours team-building or social events (TEAM KWAJ Happy Hour, Commander's Call, Hail/Farewell).
5. Attend at least two TEAM KWAJ PT/Wellness sessions. Become a regular attender!
6. Visit Marshallese Cultural Center in last 3 months prior to tab award.
7. Visit Ebeye, Third island or Majuro in last 3 months prior to tab, use a Marshallese phrase or two and visit a store/restaurant.
8. Tell three co-workers how to earn the TEAM KWAJ tab.
9. Swim, snorkel, boat or paddle on the lagoon at least once with a teammate.
10. Complete the TEAM KWAJ Circle-island 6-mile ruck march/walk/bike and read all historic battlefield markers. This is an organized USAG-KA hosted event several times per year.
11. Mission Partner wild card event—discuss with your supervisor any additional organizational requirement. Could be knowledge-based, achievement-based, or physical challenge.
12. Final event, "Board of Review" -- meet with Col. Morgan face-to-face individually or in a small group with all requirements fulfilled. Schedule with garrison front office. Discussion items may include but are not limited to; TEAM KWAJ pact - "Healthy Community of Excellence," Kwaj history, Marshallese culture, military/strategic missions and their significance, and future operational potential.

WEEKLY TROPICAL WEATHER THREAT OUTLOOK

RTS WEATHER STATION STAFF

Discussion:

So far in November, the weather station has received 11.22 inches of rain since the 27th. This is 1.26 inches above normal at that point in the month. Up to November 27th, we have received a total of 82.64 inches of rain in 2024, which is still 1.84 inches below normal. We experienced no thunderstorm days this week. This is defined as an “in situ” lightning strike within five miles of the weather station. Thunderstorms did occur in the vicinity of the Kwajalein Atoll, but were limited in the last few days by vertical wind shear. The effects of a rather robust Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) are now rapidly waning over the central RMI, as a well-positioning subtropical high-pressure ridge to the north of the RMI, pushes the ITCZ further to the south, and takes us out of its direct influence. This factor will remove wide-spread shower coverage from our area for the next few days, leaving us with just rapidly moving isolated showers until Monday and Tuesday, when we will see the ITCZ and accompanying broad troughs approach the central RMI once again, bringing us increased show-

er coverage. With the tighter pressure gradient’s arrival for the next few days, it has the effect of increasing winds, and creating an inversion at the mid-levels in the atmosphere, which tends to retard shower growth to just isolated showers that are rather fleeting in nature, and diminishes the thunderstorm risk. There is still a lot of residual moisture deep into the mid-levels of the atmosphere, so the potential for thunderstorms cannot be ruled out completely. Winds will take on more of windy season (Ellap Kutu) feel, that one would expect in second half of December with sustained velocities in the middle to upper teens and a few gusts above 20 knots from time to time for the next few days out of the northeast, finally coming down some on Monday, as we move the ITCZ closer to the central RMI from the south, and become east-southeast on Tuesday. The Madden-Julian Oscillation (MJO), has now firmly entered its negative phase for our part of the Pacific. The negative phase of this global tropical circulation basically has the effect of diminishing shower coverage over the RMI. This means that only the positioning of the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) will be the

defining factor as to whether we see wide spread shower coverage or not. We are expecting to see the MJO bring more of a positive phase to the area in the second half of December, to help augment our shower coverage. The El Nino Southern Oscillation (ENSO) is near neutral with mild La Nina conditions expected to prevail in the eastern Pacific through December with cooler than normal sea surface temperatures (SST) now present in the central Pacific. This factor tends to work against tropical cyclone development to the east of the RMI, where it could pose a threat to the Marshall Islands.

Tropical Cyclones:

No significant tropical cyclone activity expected to affect anywhere in Micronesia, the Mariana Islands, Wake Island or Hawai’i. We are now moving into the winter months for the northwest Pacific, which generally bring a considerable decline in tropical cyclone activity.

Damaging West Winds / Westerly Swell:

None expected.

Swell / Tide Inundation for Kwajalein Atoll and Wake Island:

We are currently entering a spring tide phase with the New Moon on December 1st. High tides will be over four feet from the 29th through the 5th of December with a peak of 4.3 feet on the 1st. Winds during this period will be in the upper teens for extended periods of time, resulting in some minor splash over, but no advisories nor warnings are expected.

Purpose: This weekly briefing is delivered Thursday mornings to island leadership. The intention of this briefing is to provide situational awareness of weather events that may interrupt operations and transportation around Kwajalein, to/from Hawaii and Guam, and in the Wake vicinity. The main threat assessed in this brief is existing and potential development of tropical cyclone activity. This brief also provides an outlook of abnormal winds, sea state, and precipitation guidance for next 7 days around the Kwajalein Atoll. The distribution list will also receive updates on any developing tropical cyclone activity in the Kwajalein region that occur between the weekly outlook product.



E-wareness: Oil/Water Separators (OWS)

What is an Oil/Water Separator (OWS)?

An OWS is a device used to separate oils and greases from a variety of industrial wastewater discharges. The effluent (mostly water) from the OWS is typically discharged to the waste water treatment plant (WWTP). It is important to properly utilize and maintain OWSs to prevent sources of environmental pollution and upsets at the WWTP.
