

HOURGLASS REPORT

Having come a long way from the sea-faring navigators of old, today, the Marshallese people value little more than their presence on their rightful home islands, living in peace and harmony.

The security they experience is owed in large part to the long struggles and nigh-endless challenges that molded the constitution of the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI) into its current form. The constitution was introduced and accepted by the United States on May 1, 1979 in recognition of the proud people's independent status. After World War II, the relationship with the Western partners was solidified from a foundation of reparatory justice and fairness, which not only cultivated the close interconnected networks between the linked sovereign powers, but it enabled the Marshallese people themselves to hold their heads high with a brand-new cultural identity.

This RMI identity is best represented by the national flag, originally designed and introduced by the First Lady Emlain Kabua, wife of President Amata Kabua and mother of President David Kabua. The flag is a significant symbol that embodies the nation's cultural spirit, challenges and aspirations. As is many others, the Marshallese flag is itself pregnant with symbolism, with the two colored stripes—one orange and one white—representing the two chain ralik ("sun rays") and ratak ("sunset"). The orange color stands for bravery, and the white for peace. The blue background field represents the mighty Pacific Ocean.

The Marshallese stand under this flag shoulder-to-shoulder with over 2,000 foreigners to help the U.S. Army, and the Joint Mission Partners, ensure that Republic of the Marshall Islands remains peaceful and harmonious for years to come.



PUBLIC NOTICE

1. Attend Col. Morgan's TEAM KWAJ brief (either Teammate or Community version), read and adhere to the TEAM KWAJ Teammate Pact, presented at initial town halls, and periodically thereafter.

2. Attend the Island Newcomer's Briefing.

3. Attend at least one group greeting at air terminal for personnel arriving on island. Make them feel welcome and show them we are happy they are on Kwaj with us.

4. Attend at least two garrison after-hours team-building or social events (TEAM KWAJ Happy Hour, Commander's Call, Hail/Farewell).

5. Attend at least two TEAM KWAJ PT/Wellness sessions. Become a regular attender!

6. Visit Marshallese Cultural Center in last 3 months prior to tab award.

7. Visit Ebeye, Third island or Majuro in last 3 months prior to tab, use a Marshallese phrase or two and visit a store/restaurant.

8. Tell three co-workers how to earn the TEAM KWAJ tab.

FOR KWAJ COMMAND TEAM INFO & UPDATES

9. Swim, snorkel, boat or paddle on the lagoon at least once with a teammate.

10. Complete the TEAM KWAJ Circle-island 6-mile ruck march/walk/bike and read all historic battlefield markers. This is an organized USAG-KA hosted event several times per year.

11. Mission Partner wild card event—discuss with your supervisor any additional organizational requirement. Could be knowledge-based, achievement-based, or physical challenge.

12. Final event, "Board of Review" -- meet with Col. Morgan face-to-face individually or in a small group with all requirements fulfilled. Schedule with garrison front office. Discussion items may include but are not limited to; TEAM KWAJ pact - "Healthy Community of Excellence," Kwaj history, Marshallese culture, military/strategic missions and their significance, and future operational potential.

WEEKLY TROPICAL WEATHER THREAT OUTLOOK

Discussion:

In the first four days of December, we have received 2.34 inches of rain, which is 0.82" above normal. For the year, the weather station has received 86.68 inches of precipitation, which is o.8o inches below normal. At the end of November that deficit was about one inch shy of normal. We experienced no thunderstorm days this week. This is defined as an "in situ" lightning strike within five miles of the weather station. We did come close at about seven miles during the week. Last week saw a robust Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) position itself close to the RMI with some rather heavy rain and strong outflow winds. This week we will see a return of the intense ITCZ, but its central axis is expected to be to far south of the central RMI to augment our shower coverage. It will be positioned such that it induces a steeper pressure gradient between itself and subtropical high-pressure to the north of the RMI. This factor will create a strong trade wind surge across the Marshall Islands with speed sustaining mostly in the upper teens and

occasionally crossing the 20knot mark with gust to the mid-20s for the next few days with Saturday being the peak, coming back down on Tuesday. The Madden/Julian Oscillation (MJO) has now firmly entered its negative phase for our part of the Pacific. The negative phase of this global tropical circulation basically has the effect of diminishing shower coverage over the RMI. This means that only the positioning of the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) will be the defining factor as to whether we see wide spread shower coverage or not. Otherwise, speed convergence in the winds will give us the occasional fleeting shower over and around the atoll. We are expecting to see the MJO bring more of a positive phase to the area toward the end of December, to help augment our shower coverage. The El Nino Southern Oscillation (ENSO) is near neutral with mild La Nina conditions are expected to prevail in the eastern Pacific through December. We are now seeing a cool anomaly in the central Pacific to the east of the RMI. This factor tends to work again tropical cyclone development to the east of the RMI, where it could pose

a threat to our region. We are also moving out of the tropical cyclone season as a whole for the western Pacific.

Tropical Cyclones:

No significant tropical cyclone activity expected to affect anywhere in Micronesia, the Mariana Islands, Wake Island or Hawai'i. We are now in climatological winter for the northwest Pacific, which generally bring a considerable decline in tropical cyclone activity.

Damaging West Winds / Westerly Swell:

None expected. Micronesia is northeast trade wind dominant.

<u>Swell / Tide Inundation</u> <u>for Kwajalein Atoll and</u> <u>Wake Island</u>:

The area is currently entering a neap tide situation and the waxing half-moon on the 8th with no high tides over 4 feet. The full moon will be on the 15th and its associated higher tides. With a trade wind surge starting this evening, expect combined seas to build to 7-9 feet on Saturday, coming back down some by noon on Sunday. There could be some minor splashover on east-northeast shore, but nothing to noticeable, as we enter the neap tide lunar phase. No major swells expected from mid-latitude storms in the northern Pacific. We will also be watching for the possibility of issuing a Small Caft Advisory (SCA), if the winds sustain for a period of time at 20 knots or greater for Saturday mainly.

Purpose: This weekly briefing is delivered Thursday mornings to island leadership. The intention of this briefing is to provide situational awareness of weather events that may interrupt operations and transportation around Kwajalein, to/from Hawaii and Guam, and in the Wake vicinity. The main threat assessed in this brief is existing and potential development of tropical cyclone activity. This brief also provides an outlook of abnormal winds, sea state, and precipitation guidance for next 7 days around the Kwajalein Atoll. The distribution list will also receive updates on any developing tropical cyclone activity in the Kwajalein region that occur between the weekly outlook product.
